

September was quite a busy month, on Thursday 25th the committee met with two representatives of Playford Council to examine and discuss plans for the up-grade of both the bar and kitchen areas of the hall.

Both are being refitted with modern commercial equipment which will bring them into line with Occupational Health & Safety requirements and make the facility more user friendly.

In addition, the air conditioning system will also be replaced and both halls will be painted, with the original being refitted with different lighting and soft furnishings.

The council is very aware that the hall is of significant heritage value and has selected materials in keeping with this requirement.

As these works are expected to take approximately 8 weeks,

there will be considerable disruption to regular hirers. At this time, the proposed commencement of works is expected to start immediately after the ANZAC Day weekend until the end of June.

Arrangements are being made to see what alternatives may be available, regarding re-locating regular hirers to other facilities - we will keep you all informed, through Pat, the hall manager, in the first instance.



ONE TREE HILL GRAPEVINE CFS REPORT OCTOBER 2014



Incident Report

It had been another quiet month with three call outs for vehicle related incidents involving minor injuries. Unfortunately, as we go to press, the CFS has attended another tragic accident resulting in a fatality. Nothing can replace the loss of a loved one, and the thoughts of all CFS members go out to the family and friends affected by this terrible tragedy and to all others affected by death or injury on our roads. Please drive carefully.

Football season has finished, time to get out and do it!

Our training over the month has focused on fire-ground safety so that we are prepared once the fire season starts, how prepared are you? Finals season marks the time when you should be most active in preparing your property for bushfire attack, and it's good to see that many land-owners have begun their preparations. Some of the measures you need to take are listed below, but one measure you need to keep in mind is the size of a CFS truck. We need about 4 metres wide x 4 metres tall to safely fit one of our trucks through a gate or up your drive, could we get on to your property if there was a fire?

A: Slash or mow long grass and remove cut material, within 20 metres of the home.

B: Remove weeds around sheds and fences.

C: Cut back trees overhanging the roof.

D: Remove fallen branches and other debris.

E: Check all fire equipment, including water pumps, sprinklers and extinguishers.

F: Remove leaves from gutters.

G: Review and update your Bushfire Action Plan.

H: Also spraying fence lines helps reduce damage to wooden poles and galvanising.

Councillor's Report OCTOBER 2014

Firstly some "facts" that may be of interest to ratepayers. The City of Playford boasts a 19.5% population of youth aged from 12 - 24 years of age that are categorised as "Disengaged Youth", not something to boast about. A graffiti tag is categorised as 1 square metre section of graffiti, in the 13/14 financial year Council and its volunteers removed 160,000 tags at a cost of \$4.40 per ratepayer, it seems that some youth (perhaps for the want of a better word some Adults too) are "Engaged" in some sort of activity.

The Food Co-op cost ratepayers \$3.80 per ratepayer and lastly the combined cost of providing the Northern Sound System, the Shedley Theatre and the Civic Centre costs \$5.38 per ratepayer.

Council will be considering its response to the draft planning review paper arrived at by an "Expert Panel" it virtually wants to do away with local and Council input into land use and development and have Three Regional Assessment (North, South and Central) panels determine planning outcomes for the State. No guarantee is given that planning development, and approvals will be any simpler or quicker, so why the review? I guess because we haven't had one for 20 years and someone determined it was time we did. I will not be supporting the review as each Council and indeed area within Councils have unique and individual characteristics that cannot/may not, be taken into consideration on a regional level.

Council Elections will be in progress throughout October and November. As always voting is not compulsory and will be by postal ballot. Voting material will be forwarded to electors from Monday 20th to Friday 24th October, 2014. To be accepted ballot papers must reach the returning officer by NO LATER than 5pm, Friday 7th November, 2014. Ballot papers can be posted or returned in person to the ballot boxes at Council Offices during normal operating hours. In our Ward, Ward 3, two representatives are required, and in order for your vote to be valid you must have had at least a number 1 & 2 marked in the boxes of your choice. I will be running for re-election and would appreciate your support

as the only local on the ballot paper; the other three are from the urban areas. I have teamed up with Cr Andrew Craig (who has been supportive of our needs) to try and ensure fair and balanced representation for the ward. **PLEASE VOTE**, do not take it for granted that your preferred candidate will be elected, the only way to ensure our choice is to fill in the ballot paper in a valid format and to post that paper by the due date.

If you are not already aware, after many years of lobbying by myself and local identities, the government has finally seen reason, and committed to building a \$3.5 million roundabout at the Kersbrook, Gawler-One Tree Hill, Humbug Scrub and One Tree Hill Roads intersection. Congratulations to all who have fought so hard to make this possible and also to the government for coming to the party.

Council is now in caretaker mode but this will not affect normal Council operations.

Horse Care - Cost of buying a horse - Part 2: Maintenance

We discussed the purchase and set up costs in the last article, now we will look at the ongoing costs. Don't forget that this will also include the feed mentioned in the previous article (a set up essential but also ongoing).

Maintenance (yearly) costs will include **dentist** once a year (\$50), **farrier** every 6 weeks (\$400 per year if barefoot, up to \$1000 if shod), **worming medicine** (4 x \$20), **rug repairs** (varies on your pony and those it is paddocked with but mine is about \$20 per year and my pony is good on rugs).

Vet Bills: (let's not even go there.) They can easily add up to \$1000 per year although I have only had a vet to my horses for one emergency in the last 15 years. Budget for \$1500 because if you have a big one, the bill will be big. Most people seem to have at least one vet call out per year. I am not sure why I have avoided it, possibly because I don't work my horses very hard.

Club fees: Unless you are going to ride at home all the time (and this is certainly possible), you will want to join a club, possibly a Pony Club, dressage, Equestrian Australia (essential for some shows), trail riding or whatever takes your fancy to compete and learn. Annual fees for most clubs are around \$100 to \$150. Some special classes will require extra payments (usually guest instructors). You will also need uniforms, or activity-specific riding clothes. Budget for another \$400 if you are lucky.

Transport: Well, if you want to ride with a club you will have to get your pony there. Floats cost from \$2000 and up to \$40,000. You need a towing vehicle. Beware of the family car. It may have the power but will it stop two tonnes of horse and float? Two and a half if towing 2 horses. Or you can use a professional floating company, starting at \$120 per trip, each way. Don't forget you will also be paying for fuel to tow. 80 cents per km?

Instruction: Pony Clubs are great for helping and giving you the opportunity to ride in company. But to improve your riding skills you really need a private instructor.

This is especially important when you start out and again when you are getting good and want to excel. There is a gap in the middle where you can just have fun in the saddle and will gain skills without even knowing it. Lessons cost around \$70 per hour and you need at least 1 every 2 weeks to improve quickly. Budget for 25 lessons at \$70 for the first year (\$1750). Then you can probably manage to have a few lessons at a club and just get saddle time to improve. In a few years (2 or 4) you will want more lessons to start the next stage of rapid improvement.

Competition Fees: If you wish to compete (mostly for the fun of it at beginner stage) you will need to pay fees. Gymkhanas abound and usually cost about \$3 per class. Plan to go in 3 or 4 classes per outing, so that's another \$12 per gymkhana and maybe 4 per year, \$50?

Ok that's the \$\$ costs. Next edition for the other costs.



History: Comes from the Malaysian word amog


which describes the behaviour of tribesmen who, under the influence of opium, became wild, rampaging mobs that attacked anybody in their path.

1 large brown onion, chopped

1 tablespoon tomato sauce

1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce

Salt and pepper to taste

2 teaspoons mixed herbs

1-2 eggs lightly beaten

1/2 cup flour

1 cup of fresh breadcrumbs 2-3 tablespoons tomato relish

Extra flour for rolling
Extra Virgin Olive Oil



Sauce:

1 x 450g can pineapple pieces, reserve juice

1/₂ cup brown sugar

2 tablespoons corn flour

2 tablespoons soy sauce

Method: Place mince, sausage meat, onions, salt and pepper, tomato sauce, mixed herbs, Worcestershire sauce, fresh breadcrumbs, eggs and flour into a large bowl. Combine and form into golf ball sized balls. Roll in extra flour to stop them sticking. Place Olive oil in large preheated frying pan. Fry meatballs until well browned. Place enough meatballs for the meal in a casserole dish, add pineapple pieces.

Make the sauce by combining pineapple juice and remaining sauce ingredients. Pour over meatballs and pineapple. Bake for approximately 1 hour at 180°C or until cooked through.

Note: This mixture will make approximately 12-16 meatballs. Serve with vegetables and mashed potatoes. You can even add cooked rice to the mixture to make it go a little further. You could also add brown onion gravy over the meatballs instead of the pineapple sauce.



The Lone Changer



From The Past - Sherlock Holmes in Humbug Scrub

Sir Arthur Ignatius Conan Doyle, noted author of the detective Sherlock Holmes visited Australia in 1920.
Before he came to Australia he had already decided there was one man whom he wanted to meet This was Thomas Paine Bellchambers of Humbug Scrub.

Thomas Paine Bellchambers was born in England in 1858 and arrived in Australia in 1874 in search of work. Tom was intensely interested in the environment being greatly influenced by his mother. Tom was a well known naturalist and conservationist. At the age of 57, Tom decided to buy some land at Humbug Scrub. He devoted himself to a wildlife sanctuary at Humbug Scrub, near One Tree Hill, South Australia, the oldest sanctuary in Australia.

Tom wrote many articles for the local papers on the topic of conservation and the native flora and fauna which he saw slowly degrading due to the destructivism of man.

In addition to running the Sanctuary and raising his large family, Tom founded the Nature Lover's League and wrote two books, 'Nature, Our Mother' and 'A Nature Lover's Notebook'.

Thomas studied marsupials and conducted unique work on Mallee fowls, and was the first person to breed Mallee fowl in captivity. With Captain Samuel White, he was instrumental in the South Australian Government setting up Flinders Chase on Kangaroo Island in 1918. He has been described as a man of vision and passion.

Sir Arthur arrived in Adelaide on 21st September 1920 as part of a four month lecture tour of Australia and New Zealand. A meeting was arranged with Bellchambers and a small party which included the then Director of the South Australian Museum, Edgar Ravenswood Waite made the journey to Humbug Scrub.

In a newspaper article, Sir Arthur describes their meeting;

I will not easily forget my day. Bellchambers is a mixture of the New Forest Brusher, a famous character whom I knew in my youth, who lived and died in a bark hut in the forest, and Thoreau, the American philosopher. He is half-way between those points - more refined than the first, less literary than the second. He is a kind eyed, unkempt man in his fifties, with no thought of appearances, but with the look and the voice which bespeak the gentle soul within. There is the real gentleman. 'Yes, I am mostly vegetarian, except fish,' said he, 'you see, I know the beasts so well that I can't bring myself to pick their bones'

I have come back from a long day with mixed impressions. There are vivid colour impressions - deep green of the Australian Spring; slate grey of eucalyptus trunks with untidy molting bark; light yellow budding wattle; purple pink of the carpet of knot grass; and everywhere the familiar home flowers, but all a little altered in their new home - the dandelion, the buttercup, the mustard plant, each imprinting its tiny yellow dot upon the variegated ground work of Nature. Of my conversations, too I had the same mixed impression. It was a nature talk. We spoke of those things which may seem slight to the world, and yet are more permanent than thrones and dynasties. I learned of the strange storks, the 'native companions' who meet 500 at a time for their stately balls; of the bower birds who decorate their homes with glass and pebbles; of the little Ted beetles who fertilize the insectivorous plants without being eaten like other insects; of all manner of nature secrets. Some deep things were drawn from Mr Bellchamber's store of knowledge.

Sir Arthur gave some advice to the Government and praised Mr Bellchambers and the nature reserve he had created. He suggested that the government purchase land around Bellchambers area so that it could be expanded. Improving the roads and employing Mr Bellchamber's as a Ranger would

create a great asset that could become a tourist attraction.

Sir Arthur ended his article with this quote; "If people would only get nearer to the beauty of nature, how much better, brighter and purer the world would be".

Thomas Bellchambers with his ideas and beliefs was truly ahead of his time. He was a remarkable man with a remarkable vision. He died in 1929 at his beloved Sanctuary where he now rests.

The Humbug Scrub Wildlife Sanctuary has been kept going by the Bellchambers family in conjunction with volunteers.

On Monday the 6th October the Sanctuary will be holding a family fun day where you can feed wallabies, emus and birds and stroll through the bush.

The History of Humbug Scrub

"There's Gold in them there hills"

Winding along the top of a ridge on the eastern side of Para Wirra Park is the Barossa Goldfields Road. When the government prospector, George Goddard, found gold on the One Tree Hill side of the South Para, miners rushed to the new site. A town grew up around Lady Alice, Lady Edith, Try Again, Hamlin and Young Australian mines including inns, churches, school, post office, blacksmith's workshop, butcher shop and a population of about 500 people. The Lady Alice realised about £20,000 in gold (with a wage of £2 per week or less, that was a lot of money).

Some 20 years after the gold petered out, Tom Bellchambers bought much of the land to establish his dream of a sanctuary. (more detail of Tom is on our history page which is on page 14)

Tom had a dam which was built for the miners, it was a haven for black swans, ibis, ducks and the land was for Western Grey Kangaroos and Swamp Wallabies as well as all the smaller species that chose to live there. He also had some wild Dama (sometimes called Tamar) wallabies whose trust he won. He mourned the loss of many species of animals and birds and tried to protect them, noting their disappearance in his note books.

His first cottage was built in 1905 and was replaced in 1919. The "new" cottage is today used as a display area for photos and newspaper clippings of the history of the area.

After Tom Bellchambers passed away his family continued to run his sanctuary, his youngest son, Raynor, took over for many years to be followed by Ray's son Phillip for a few years. Neville, another son of Ray, is now caretaker.

Today, the Humbug Scrub Wildlife Sanctuary is a trust, operated by volunteers under the guidance of Neville Bellchambers. It is about 88 acres, with cages and human occupation on about 10 acres

There are two dams for the wild birds. The original dam, now named Chowilla, is a short stroll along a quiet path. The new one is close to the cottage where Tom lived for the last 10 years of his life without electricity or running water.


When you visit, you will see many caged animals. Most are pets that have been re-homed with the sanctuary. Some are injured wild creatures.

Nick, a long time resident is a wild Western Grey Kangaroo. Recently he hopped into an enclosure of his own accord, where he is recuperating from a minor injury. He knows he will get a free feed every day and be protected.

Annabelle is a long term resident koala who is injured in her front feet. Although the damage is no longer visible, she is slow to climb and this makes her vulnerable. She has her own enclosure and servants collect fresh gum leaves for her every day. Her son, who arrived with her, has been released back to the wild.

The sanctuary is open 363 days a year, with two major fund raising days per year when there are various stalls, a barbecue, games and other activities.

Unlike many wildlife parks, Humbug Scrub is not a commercial venture. Entrance fees are charged just to meet the cost of running the park, including insurance, animal feed and provision of water for caged creatures. The caretaker's only payment is free housing and the satisfaction of protecting the creatures in his care.

The Sanctuary encourages you to hand feed the creatures. Pellets are available for purchase. Please do not supply your own as incorrect feeding will cause digestive upsets or even death.

The Humbug Scrub Wildlife Sanctuary is holding their family fun day on Monday 6th October, please see the advertisement on the back page for further details. If you haven't been up there for a while now is the time to make the effort, with Spring here you will have the bonus of seeing all the spring flora as well as the fauna.

If you received a letter from Council recently about Chilean Needle Grass, please refer to it for additional information regarding the timing of your bushfire prevention measures.

You must ...

- · Clear 20 metres around your house
- Clear five metres around other buildings and structures on your property
- Cut long grass on your property (occupied and vacant land allotments)
- · Prune tree limbs and branches which overhang your home
- Create fire breaks.

You should ...

- Remove 'dead' branches, 'dead' undergrowth and leaf litter from your property
- Remove bark, heavy mulch, wood piles and other flammable materials close to your home and shed
- Regularly clean your gutters
- Create access to an alternative water supply (at least 5,000 litres) such as a swimming pool or water tank.

You can ...

Clear vegetation further than 20 metres from your house for fire prevention

WITH A PERMIT FROM THE CFS. Native vegetation is protected by law, under the Native Vegetation Act, and permission is required to clear it on your property.

Please be reminded that any mowing or alterations on roadsides requires permission to be obtained from Council in accordance with the Local Government Act 1999. The City of Playford will conduct flammable undergrowth inspections prior to the 2014/2015 fire danger season to ensure landowners comply with the Fire and Emergency Services Act.

If you know or suspect that Chilean Needle Grass (CNG) is present on your property, please do not slash until you have surveyed and controlled CNG during the flowering and seeding period from October to December. This will reduce the risk of spreading the pest weed.

Our local State MP, Mr Jon Gee is pleased to announce two transport improvements for the local area.

Jon has advised the Grapevine that \$3.5 million will be spent to install a roundabout at the intersection of the Kersbrook, Gawler-One Tree Hill, Humbug Scrub and One Tree Hill Roads.

The intersection saw 12 crashes between 2008 and 2012 resulting in one death, three serious injuries and four minor injuries.

The work will be completed over two years with design work during the 2014-15 financial year and construction in the 2015-16 financial year.

Jon has told the Grapevine that "He is very pleased with this

announcement as he knows the community have been looking for a safe solution to this intersection for many years".

Jon has also advised the Grapevine that a new 190 space carpark with disability spaces and quality lighting has been installed at the Smithfield railway station. This was promised by Jon prior to the election.
