

ONE TREE HILL GRAPEVINE CFS REPORT DECEMBER 2013 Incident Report



. The early fire season has once again been very busy with the most significant calls being for out of area support. Several of our members went to New South Wales to help out in the Blue Mountains. We also had two of our vehicles dispatched to NSW as part of a convoy of 35 SA CFS vehicles. The largest fire in the area was a rekindle from a burn-off that had smoldered for 3 weeks before reigniting. This took several attempts and the assistance of a back-hoe and infra-red equipment before it was finally put out. If you have had a burn-off recently, it pays to check for several days to ensure that it has been completely extinguished. Our sincere thanks go to several local families, who have offered their best wishes as well as donations for the season ahead.

The CFS One Tree Hill Brigade extends our Best Wishes for a Safe and Happy Holiday Season.

Grass Cutting/Slashing

It is that time of the year again and you should be well into your preparations for the Fire Danger season. Looking around the area, there are still a large number of properties who have left their slashing late, increasing the danger of accidental ignition. With the start of the fire danger season on the 1st December it is an offence to operate a mower/slasher without a portable water sprayer in good working order and also have a hand shovel or rake on hand. Spark arresters must be fitted and heated parts must not come into contact with flammable material.

BURNING IN THE OPEN IS PROHIBITED ACROSS THE ENTIRE CITY OF PLAYFORD DURING THE FIRE DANGER SEASON WITHOUT A PERMIT.

Councillor's Report December 2013

ast month I reported that I was hoping to have a more detailed report this month as I am on the mend. Council is in the process of bringing reports to elected members for "Aspirated Services" these are not enhanced services or new services but aspirated services, as far as I can understand "an improvement (Expansion) on existing services" such as Planning. City presentation and various miscellaneous services. This month we looked at OPAL, a service introduced by SA Health targeting school kids from 8 – 18 with the aim of teaching them healthy eating practices. This wonderful program costs the City \$438,000 of which SA Health funds a significant amount and council and other organisations contribute the rest. SA Health recognised the need for such a program throughout the City of Playford (however the mobile van and school involvement) does not extend to Virginia, Angle Vale or One Tree Hill. Aspirated services (more Ratepayer monies) will aim to rectify this oversight. Since this is such an important health initiative SA Health will withdraw its contribution leaving Council to pick up the shortfall or abandon the program, typical government cost shifting. Elected members will make a decision on this later in the year.. Meanwhile a frustrated land owner has volunteered \$30,000 toward resealing his road but Council has viewed this as an attempt to jump the queue and reassessed the road citing that the Nexy Highway has seen a shift of traffic volume from that road and therefore placed the road 1 year further down the list for scheduled resealing. Has Council gone mad and is it providing equitable services to the City as a whole? I leave that to your judgement. Oh the joys of being a Councillor! Sometimes I wonder but won't give up.

I would also like to have commented on Councils Strategic Planning Committee's agenda item 9.1 Playford Projects; Infrastructure Negotiations, but that is confidential. Agenda item 9.2 Playford Projects: Prudential Review provided valuable information of great interest to the community at large but I can't comment on that as it is confidential.

Agenda item 9.3 Playford Projects – infrastructure Negotiations – Angle Vale and Playford North Extensions affects a wide cross section of the City's Ratepayers <u>BUT</u> I can't comment on that as it is confidential. I would also like to comment on the CEO's

performance and contract renewal discussions but I can't <u>because</u> they are confidential. It appears that there is a lot of confidence in the City but a huge lack of transparency.

As this will be the December Issue of the Grapevine I will take this opportunity to wish everyone a **SAFE** and enjoyable festive season and a very **MERRY CHRISTMAS**. Hope to see you all safe and sound in the New Year.



Michael O'Brien's office sends through their newsletter each month to the Grapevine, maybe you don't get the newsletter so here is some very useful information that we would like to share with you.

Health Investment for the Future

Mothers and children across the North will benefit from the recently opened new 25 bed children's ward and Women's Assessment Unit at the Lyell McEwin Hospital.

The opening of the children's ward will be in two stages with 18 beds now and seven more opening in December. The ward will provide our youngest patients with safe and comprehensive health care in a child-friendly environment.

The new ward contains 15 single rooms and 5 double rooms. Children will receive all treatment in a treatment room so they feel safe in their own room.

The Woman's Assessment Unit, which has eight cubicles and two consult rooms, is significantly larger than the current unit

and for the first time at the Lyell McEwin Hospital it will allow patients to be cared for in single rooms.

Pregnant women will also benefit from two ultrasound rooms within the new building. A dedicated ambulance drop-off area will provide mothers to be with direct access to the unit in an emergency situation.

Public Transport Improvements

The State Government will progressively introduce new incentives between December 2013 and April 2014 to encourage more people to travel on Public transport, including: A new 28 day unlimited travel pass that will make daily travel on public transport cheaper. A reduced cost to catch public transport on Sundays and public holidays. Extended free travel for seniors after 7pm and before 7am on weekdays.

Horse Care - Length of Lessons


ecently, a client was told our lessons are too long; that we are cruel.

Don't get lessons and sessions mixed up. A lesson is when something is learned. A session is the overall time of the whole training period. Each session should have many lessons. I aim for ten per hour session. If the horse is not stressed, then the session may be extended to help the lessons stick. If it is stressed, the session is ended on a good

For example, in my first jumping lessons, a horse, faced with a pole on the ground, may sweat around his shoulders and neck. He is stressed. If he stands near the pole, we end the lesson. Ending a lesson is done by walking quietly or standing, whichever the horse prefers to do, always with a rub and "good boy". The next lesson, twenty seconds later, is to step over the pole. If he achieves this quietly, the lesson is ended. The next lesson is to walk over three or four poles. scattered around the arena, without stress. When achieved, end the lesson. In a good session, this may end with the horse stepping over crossed poles, raised to make a small jump. Ideally, it is so low he can easily walk over it, but it is still a far cry from his initial objection to going near a pole. This session may take anywhere from ten minutes to forty minutes, depending on the horse.

Returning to the session in question: much time was spent discussing the aids and position of the rider, with the horse dozing (yes, dozing) during our practices.

Many of my clients' horses brighten up when they see me approaching. They know they are going to get an interesting session on the arena, not a hard one.

Between 30th Oct & 11th November Serious Criminal Trespass - Non Residential. Williams Road, GOULD CREEK Vacant house broken into during above dates.





The Snake Gully Bridge

The idea of a bridge over the Little Para River was conceived by early settlers unable to transport their goods and produce over a waterway which could only be crossed on foot or by horseback. A group of residents on the northern side of the river first raised 318 pounds and approached the District Council of Tea Tree Gully for assistance to build a road. The Council, seeing the advantages involved, agreed to their submission.

On 5th August 1859, in front of about 60 people, the completed road was officially opened by Miss Jane Roberts, who, "In a firm voice, and a much firmer hand, dashing a bottle of very superior colonial wine on a stone in the bed of the river, proclaimed it The Snake Gully Road on and after that date". The road, not withstanding, has more recently been renamed the "One Tree Hill Road".

Although a general improvement to transport, the new road was still difficult to negotiate with a horse drawn carriage or a wagon. Residents, represented by Percival Gaylard, a prominent local figure of the day, approached the House of Assembly for funds to build a bridge over the river. Intent on pointing out first hand to his captive audience, the urgent need for a bridge, Gaylard entertained some of the MPs at the proposed bridge site, in "the Gully of Snakes", with an "excellent luncheon"- the result - a vote from Parliament promising 1,000 pounds. In January 1873, the SA Government called for tenders "to build a stone bridge over the Little Para River, also the making, metalling and fencing the approaches". On 11th March 1873 the contract was awarded to Mr. J. Coad of Chain of Ponds. "He was to receive 684 pounds 10 shillings and the job to be completed by 1st July 1873".

In May 1873 the foundation stone was laid by Miss Cecilia Wilson McEwin daughter of Mr R. McEwin "an old and much respected settler in the neighbourhood" (Miss McEwin later became the wife of Robert Kirk)

There was a penalty clause in the contract of 2 pounds per day, but it was not enforced, although the bridge was not completed until February 1874. Coad was paid 724 pounds 5 shillings on the 20th February of that year. This included payment for some extras to the original contract.

Wednesday 11th February 1874, the day of the official opening of the new bridge, was a very auspicious occasion for the local community. It was reported as being quite a hot day, but the district, augmented by prominent MPs, turned out in force to witness Miss Gaylard, daughter of Percival Gaylard, the Chairman of the Tea Tree Gully District Council open "One of the prettiest bridges in the colony".

The following quotes are from information recorded when in 1980 the bridge was added to the Historic Register of the National Estate. They describe the bridge as: One of the largest stone bridges in South Australia. It is important also for the way it displays 19th century craftsmanship. This barrel-vaulted bridge has a rock-faced limestone arch and stone parapets and is built on foundations of solid rock. All stone was quarried from the nearby hillside. The water opening is

approximately five metres by seven metres at its maximum. The bridge is in good condition, though some fears are held for the bridge's continued soundness due to the heavy amount of traffic which is using it.

Today the daily traffic using that same "Snake Gully Bridge" on the "One Tree Hill Road at Golden Grove" is witness to the foresight of all those dedicated people whose efforts are still benefitting us today.

The Poet of One Tree H

Henry Hamilton Blackham was born in the North of Ireland, in the neighbourhood of the Morna Mountains, on the 14th January, 1817. He came to South Australia with his parents and siblings on board the Birman in 1840. In October 1851 he married Elizabeth Kathleen Lynch. The couple settled at *Trevilla*, (Kersbrook, Para Wirra intersection—Later Alf Tuckwell's property) One Tree Hill where they engaged in agriculture and sheep farming, and raised their six children. He is also listed as a carpenter and cabinet maker. For a short period during the years 1851-2 Mr Blackham was absent from One tree Hill, having caught the then ubiquitous epidemic — the Victorian gold fever. For 28 years he was clerk of the Para Wirra District Council.

Henry had a talent for poetry and was frequently published in the South Australian press. His most pretentious work was the Bard of Clanrye which was published in Dublin after his death in 1932.

Mr Blackham was devotedly attached to the land of his birth, and never claimed to be other than a true Irishman, though he was of English decent. The family were of Warwickshire and Staffordshire extraction.

He died as he had lived, leaving nothing behind him to mar the pure memory of a friend and neighbour. In his late years he was deaf, the result of an accident, causing him to withdraw from society more than he had done in earlier times. He was a truly honest, upright, and unassuming man. Henry and Elizabeth were very involved in the building of 'Precolumb School', where their children received their only schooling.

When he died in 1900, he left four sons (Richard, Henry Hamilton, Desmond, and James Lynch), one daughter (Mrs Payne), and several grandchildren. His wife preceded him in death by several months.

His remains were interred in the One Tree Hill Wesleyan Church cemetery. Blackham land was sold to Trinity College in 1994. The College has 535 acres of natural bushland, adjacent to the Para Wirra Recreation Park known as the Blackham Environmental and Conservation Centre. The property contains remnant vegetation typical of the Northern Mt. Lofty Ranges. The land is used to teach students in a variety of subjects including environmental science and conservation values. It is also used for camping and orienteering.





Chocolate and Coconut Balls

Preparation time: 15 to 30 minutes. These are nice at Christmas time however they are suitable for any time of the year. No doubt they will disappear in a very short time no matter what time of the year it is.

Ingredients

50 grams grated milk chocolate 2 packets plain sweet biscuits (crushed) 2 tablespoons cocoa 250 grams roasted hazelnuts (chopped) 200ml sweetened condensed milk 20ml dark rum

half cup shredded coconut (plus extra for rolling the balls in).

Method

Place the biscuits in a plastic bag and crush finely using a rolling pin. Place the crushed biscuits in a large bowl and add the hazelnuts, grated chocolate, cocoa and coconut, and mix well. Add the condensed milk and rum and mix well. Take a small amount of mixture and form into a small ball. Dip the ball in shredded coconut. Repeat with the remaining mixture.

Recipe notes: The texture should resemble the texture of dough, it shouldn't be very moist though.

Chocolate Hedgehog Slice

Ingredients

2 x 250g packets of Scotch Finger Biscuits 1 cup (160g) icing sugar mixture, sifted 400g dark chocolate, finely chopped 150g roasted peeled hazelnuts, chopped 200g unsalted butter, chopped 1 teaspoon vanilla extract 1 egg, lightly beaten

100g raisins or chopped candied fruit soaked in 40ml brandy (optional)

Method

Line a 20 x 30cm slice tin with baking paper. Cut 16 biscuits in half lengthways then chop 8 biscuits into crumbs. Place butter, sugar, vanilla and chocolate in a bowl over a saucepan of simmering water. Stir over medium heat until smooth. Remove from heat. Whisk in egg, then stir in hazelnuts, biscuit crumbs and fruit (if using). Spoon half the mixture over base of tin. Top with biscuit halves, width ways in 4 lines. Spoon over remaining mixture to cover biscuits. Refrigerate overnight or until firm then turn on to a board and cut into squares.
