ONE TREE HILL GRAPEVINE CFS REPORT FEBRUARY 2012



Incident Report

The last two months have been busy for the OTH CFS, a grass fire on 3/12/11 started on Uley Road and Chapman/Viney Drive. The fire was difficult to access and required considerable resources to contain. It took a couple of hours before the situation was under control and there was the need to monitor the fire ground into the next day to ensure no outbreaks occurred. There was another fire on 1st January on the southern side of Uley Road was started in the early hours of the morning and proved difficult to access and contain.

The usual number of car fires and road accidents continued throughout the area. Unfortunately an accident occurred at the One Tree Hill Road and Kersbrook Road intersection on the 8th January, this resulted in a fatality. The intersection was closed for 7 hours which caused considerable confusion and delay to all. Please take extra care at this intersection even if you have the right of way.

One Tree Hill provided a truck and crew to fight the Wilmington fire near Pt. Augusta, the crew were away for 3 days and was involved in helping save a number of properties and to contain the fire.

In total 13 incidents have been attended by the Brigade.

<u>Siren Use</u>

The CFS siren may occasionally sound at various times due to testing or other reasons, (please note that it is tested weekly on a Monday at 7.30pm) it is wise to always venture outside to inspect the area for any signs of a fire nearby. While the Brigade will always strive to sound the siren when required it should not be relied upon as the sole notification of a local fire. Other methods that may be used include your local and Community Fire Safe 'Phone Trees', the CFS website, local ABC radio 89.1 or emergency phone alerts.

Reminders

The Fire Danger Season for Mount Lofty Ranges starts on the 1st December and finishes on the 30th April 2012.

BURNING IN THE OPEN IS PROHIBITED ACROSS THE ENTIRE CITY of PLAYFORD DURING THE

FIRE DANGER SEASON WITHOUT A PERMIT.

Councillor's Report by Joe Federico

I am pleased to take this opportunity to wish everyone A HAPPY NEW YEAR.

Unfortunately is has not been a very good start to the New Year with the tragic and fatal car accident at the corner of Kersbrook Road intersection.

The minutes of the December 13 Council meeting will show the I raised concerns in relation to the potential for fatal accidents to occur at this intersection and that Council has asked for a report from DPTI (Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure) in order to make an informed decision on what actions should be taken. Subsequently the Bunyip has done a story on the intersection and is in the process of doing a follow up story and the Advertiser has also done a story on the intersection. I will raise the issue again at January's Council meeting and have forwarded all of the emails I have received in relation to the issue onto Council. Please be aware that this intersection is a dual ownership intersection with both Council and DPTI having control over the intersection with DPTI having priority over Council. It may be an idea for concerned residents to also take up the matter with our local MP, Mr Michael O'Brian who the direct line to Mr Patrick Conlan MP, who is Minister for Transport.

OTH and other northern areas were subjected to a very unseasonal deluge when the skies opened up and caused areas of Flash Flooding, even in OTH. I understand that at such times people turn to their local councillor for support and action, unfortunately other than coming out to have a look at the damage and offer words of empathy there is little I can do, the best course of action is to take pictures or video of situation and if assistance is needed phone Council's 24 hour emergency on 8256 0333 or the SES and access help that way. Council has funded the installation of an emergency water supply system for the OTH CFS to use in the situation where SA Water supply is cut to the township on days of catastrophic fire danger.

Council's District Bushfire Prevention Committee identified the water supply issue as a priority and undertook to have a new system in place prior to Christmas 2011. The new double head hydrant is located at the front of the cemetery on Black Top Road and is connected via high pressure pipe to the former town water supply tank. Part of the traffic island has been removed and a section of the road painted out for CFS vehicle parking only. This will provide an efficient and safe filling point for CFS vehicles during an emergency fire situation. This initiative shows the great community outcomes possible when Council partners with other local organisations like the CFS.

I am again disappointed with the failure by Council to action the delivery of the new rural numbering addresses, I will be bringing this up yet again at Council (the previous excuse has been DTEI now DPTI have not supplied the information) if there is a hold up with the roll out yet again I will be asking the DPTI for a contact phone number or email address which I will publish in my report so as people can deal directly with the alleged culprits.

On a personal note I would like to thank the OTH Progress Association (for the lovely flowers) and all the other people who sent messages of support and condolences on the passing of my father, Domenico Federico, on the 6th January, 2012. He will be sadly missed but always remembered in my heart.



History of the One Tree Hill Institute

The One Tree Hill Institute was erected in 1906. It is now owned by the Playford Council and administered by the One Tree Hill Progress Association.

Much interest, planning and fund raising went into the project long before the building was commenced. Until then the local school was the venue for all community functions.

In 1906 an interested group of citizens led by E. A. Kelly and R. Fiebig, encouraged by a local Member of Parliament S. B. Randal, who raised £207 towards the project. This with the promise of a loan from Arthur Thomas for the remaining amount needed, led to the hiring of Adelaide architect W. Walls to draw up plans. Later, contractors R. Hymers (masonry) and W. Wright (carpentry) were hired to begin building.

The foundation stone quarried from nearby Cornishmans Hill Road was used for the building which was completed in February 1907.

At the opening ceremony onlookers were encouraged to place donations for the project on the newly positioned foundation stone with a generous amount being raised.

The original building included a piano and furniture, total cost was £687.

The opening ceremony was performed by former Premier R. Butler who grew up in the district and it was very well attended. The event was followed by a bazaar organised by local ladies, many of the names of those involved are recognizable today by people still living in the area.

The Bazaar had things for sale, fun activities and displays which together with a 'promenade concert' in the evening raised a further £100 towards costs.

The building consisted of a hall and stage with two underground rooms connected by a staircase and was in constant demand for a variety of functions which included concerts by well-known local and visiting artists, a monthly dance, table tennis, school concerts, agricultural bureau meetings, tennis and other club meetings as well as many individual and fund raising functions.

The downstairs area was used as a library for a time but was never very successful owing to the dampness of the area and eventually the area was closed off from inside.

A monument honoring those residents who served or gave their lives in two World Wars was erected outside the building and more recently a flag pole was erected. A supper room was added after WWII with further additions in the late 1970s.

Late last century, local fund raising assisted by Council grants doubled the size of the original building; the extension was built using materials that were closely matched with the original stonework. The Institute now boasts a fully enclosed playground and modern restrooms inside.

Landscaping around the building was performed by the Playford Council and the generous donation bequeathed to the Institute by the Clucas family. The Institute is now a very well equipped building to cater for a variety of functions and is a valuable asset to all of the residents of One Tree Hill and districts.





Man arrested after a fire at Uleybury

Police have arrested an 18 year old Uleybury man after a fire at Uleybury yesterday. The fire started at about 4.00pm and burnt for several hours and burnt approximately 107 hectares of paddocks. It is believed that the fire started when a vehicle was driven into a dry paddock on Uley Road, Uleybury. The 18 year man has been charged with recklessly causing a bush fire and will appear in the Elizabeth Magistrates Court in January. Police remind the public of the dangers of driving vehicles onto areas of dry flammable bush or grass.

There has been a decrease in offences in our area over the last month - let's hope this continues. SAPOL need members of the community to be proactive within their area and report anything out of place. Remember to have a pen and paper in your car and note down any rego numbers of vehicles which you don't recognise.

The Horse Owners Garden

That useless pile of manure you have been collecting all spring can now be used. It should have been done a month ago, but hev. it's not too late. By being in a pile, it has started to break down. Now you can spread it onto the garden where it will act as a mulch, or water retaining cover.

If you have been feeding your horse good nutrition you also have a good source of fertiliser. Horse manure has nitrogen, phosphorus and many micro nutrients; all the things you have to pay for in fertiliser. Raw urine may be too strong, but if it has sat in a heap for a month it is ready to put on the garden. Weeds only come from horse manure if the horse is being fed weeds. So remove the barley grass from his paddock and remove the Salvation Jane and buy weed free hav.

Feed micronutrients (there are many commercial mixes, of which I can personally recommend seaweed meal, Equilibrium and Mega Horse) and get a healthier horse and a healthier garden while removing your problem of too much manure. Never too much if you have a garden or trees. Fruit trees and vegies will get a boost just as they are producing edibles, so you win again.

Horse manure harbours few micro-organisms that may harm humans. Tetanus toxoplasmosis (from cats using that lovely soft pile) are the most dangerous offenders so keep your tetanus vaccine up to date and always wash your hands thoroughly when handling the manure.

Basic Information on Bathing Your Pets

Preparation is the key to any project and bathing your pet is no different so take the extra bit of time to set things up before the bathing actually starts. A simple example of this is when people stress out because the soaking wet pet runs through all of the rooms of the house jumping on all the beds and rolling on the clean carpet or shaping up against the wall in an effort to dry itself. There is no point in chasing and screaming at your pet for doing something that is perfectly natural so the preparation for this would be to close the doors to all areas that the wet pet is not welcome before you bath the pet. Here are a few basic hints on the bathing of common pets but you will get the general picture for many other pets as well:

DOGS

- * As a guide your dog should be bathed at least every 3 months or so, perhaps more frequently if it spends a great deal of its time outside.
- * Start by giving your dog a good brushing to remove dead hair, grass seeds or knots.
- * Place a rubber mat in the bottom of the tub as this will provide grip for the animal and reduce some of its anxieties.
- * Fill the tub with about 100mm of lukewarm water.
- * Wet your dog using a spray hose, or plastic jug taking care not to get water directly into its ears, nose or eyes. Water should be lukewarm.
- * Using a mild dog shampoo, gently massage into the coat working from the head down to the tail.
- * Use the spray hose or plastic jug to thoroughly rinse your pet once again taking care to avoid getting water directly into its ears, nose or eyes.
- * Run your fingers through its wet coat to feel for any strange lumps and bumps that may require further investigation. Any doubts, make a booking to see your vet.
- * Use a very mild solution on cotton balls to clean the outer part of the ear but do not insert anything into the ear canal.
- * Take the time to check the ears for any foul smells or debris that might suggest that all is not well within.
- * Dry your pet with a large towel or blow dryer that is set to a safe heat level.

CATS

Cats tend to do their own thing pretty well but if the situation arises where a bath is required then preparation is a must.

- * Consider the time of the day that your cat is most docile.
- * Try to tire it somewhat by playing games with it for awhile.
- * Give your cat a good brushing to remove dead hair, grass seeds or knots.
- * Trim its claws if they are particularly sharp (for your own protection).
- * Place a rubber mat in the bottom of the tub.
- * Fill the tub with about 75mm of lukewarm water.
- * Wet your cat using a spray hose, or plastic jug taking care not to get water directly into its face, ears and eyes. Water again should be lukewarm.
- * Lather up your cats coat by using a very mild cat shampoo and working it in starting at the head and working back to the tail. Do not use human shampoos as these could lead to dryness or skin disorders.
- * Thoroughly rinse off the shampoo to remove all traces of residue using a spray hose or plastic jug taking care not to get water directly into its face, ears or eyes. Remember to use lukewarm water again.
- * Wet a washcloth in plain water to wash about the cat's face taking care around the ears and eyes.
- * Dry the cat in a large towel. You might try the blow dryer on the low setting but don't be surprised if your cat doesn't like it.
- * If the cat has a long coat, you might try to untangle its fur using a wide toothed comb.
- * Check the ears for any foul smells or debris. If you find anything that concerns you, have it checked out by your vet.

COCKY

Bathing in natural water is a very important act for your pet cocky. If your bird is inside most of the time it could be that the artificial conditions are actually drier than what the bird would usually experience in the open.

Regular bathing keeps the feathers clean and reduces the level of body dust (dander) that the bird produces.

You may need to experiment to see what your bird likes best. Some will play along with a shower spray and spread their wings to get the full workout, others may prefer to do their own thing in a shallow bowl by dunking themselves.

REWARD

Try not to be worked up or tense whilst bathing your pet. They can sense your anxiety so try to keep everything upbeat and cheery. Make a game of it all and reward them in some way so they look forward to future baths.

The bathing of pets can be a horrid ordeal that tests the patience of both parties involved, or an opportunity to get in some further training and bonding with your pet. For both of your sakes I hope that you can turn it into the later.


