One Tree Hill CFS ~ Incident Report August 2019

The spate of vehicle related callouts continued at the start of this month with 3 accidents over the first two weeks, two for car roll-overs. In the first of these we were called for a "car roll-over towards Golden Grove" but on dispatch were turned back by the local MFS who already had the incident under control.



In the second roll-over, a young driver had lost control of his car on the Hannaford
Hump Road and rolled the car onto the strip adjoining the road. The three occupants all
escaped uninjured but unfortunately the same could not be said for the vehicle. Just a hint in relation to this call-out,
there is a whole section in the Driver Companion guide in relation to Qualified Supervising drivers for Learner drivers. If
you are asked to accompany a learner, it is probably best for both of you if you make yourself familiar with this section

We had two other callouts to vehicles, one for a car through a fence on Sampson Flat, which had occurred at least an hour before the call came in and where the driver was sitting in his car waiting for a tow truck, so we were turned back before we got there. The other was for a 5 km diesel spill through Snake Gully in the rain on the 9th of August, this was also being taken care of by other agencies and once again we were turned back.

The major call for the month was for a significant pine tree which had fallen across Cornishmans Hill Road in the storm on the 8th of August narrowly missing the power lines. This blocked the road for several hours while we cleared it with the assistance of the SES and caused disruption for the after-school traffic that regularly uses that road. The main body of the tree remains in place close to the edge of the road, so as with last month, please be aware of the hazard.

... enough said.





Playford Council ~ Local Councillor's Report

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

The statement, "It's been another interesting month!", could be better described as growing frustration in slow progress. However, I've been a strong advocate for discussing strategies on debt management and welcomed the Financial Strategy Day under the leadership of Sam Green our current acting CEO. The day resulted in clear and agreed outcomes that support genuine ambition to provide financial sustainability and service alignment for the Playford community now and into the future. Hopefully we can continue this pathway.

The role of councillor in my opinion, is one where we seek community feedback and represent the peoples voice. When the Adoption Of Code Of Practice For Committee Meetings came before Service Committee (16th July) reflecting a change from eight days' notice for a deputation to 48 hours, I was somewhat surprised when an elected member moved an amendment changing the 48 hours to 5 days. This was carried and ultimately would stop a ratepayer viewing an agenda and presenting a deputation at the appropriate meeting. Fortunately, at the Ordinary Council Meeting (23rd July) we achieved getting the staff recommendation over the line, seven votes to six. This is positive news for ratepayers wishing to provide feedback to the chamber. Ratepayers can now view the agenda of the meetings on a Thursday night then consider if a deputation is appropriate and give email confirmation as late as Sunday 7pm.

One of my top priorities since being elected has been rural roads. The sealing of rural roads historically is financially a sound decision and makes logical sense. However, I am astounded at the cost and investment being made by ratepayers into the sealing of rural roads (approximately \$764,083 per KM). The details can be found in the council agenda for the Ordinary Council Meeting 23rd July 2019, page 188. We the elected members really need to combine and stay focused to drive efficiencies, reduce waste and improve outcomes.

I am pleased to see a new Rural Road Sealing Policy being presented to council. Hopefully this new policy will see improved progress for the rural roads and improve the financial outcomes. The result of the 2019/20 Annual Business Plan and Budget did not see the continuation of funding for the Rural Roads sealing programme. However, we still have the \$900,000 carryover funding for Bassnet Road through the 2018/19 Annual Business Plan. It is my opinion that this funding should be maintained for the original purpose of rural roads and allocated to an alternate rural road. On the 9th July at the strategic Planning Committee meeting, alterations were moved which included the \$900,000 and its allocation to be considered as part of budget review 1.

The Rural Road Sealing policy was returned before the 23rd July Ordinary Council Meeting page 10 of the minutes at 14.6. Councillor Craig moved an amendment, that the allocation be considered for an alternative rural road as part of budget review 1. This was lost and division called. The original motion was then put to the meeting and lost. Hopefully at the next Ordinary Council Meeting, we can achieve a positive result for the Rural Roads and see the intention of the amendment confirmed.

If anyone would like to further discuss the council concerns or other details, please give me a call.





What's Flowering In My Garden?

The brightly coloured Correas have been flowering, so too have the pink Thryptomenes. The golden yellow blossoms of the wattles, brightening up our gardens and roadsides mean that Spring is officially not too far away. The recent rain has been most welcomed.

Hakea orthorrhyncha, a large rounded open shrub, up to 3 metres high and 3 metres wide is in full flower and is an absolutely beautiful sight to see. It bears mid green needle like foliage along it's many branches, allowing full light to strike and show off the brilliant red spider like flowers that cover the full length of its many branches. Viewed when in full bloom, it is a magnificent sight. The New Holland Honeyeaters and Lesser Wattlebirds are enjoying foraging amongst the many flowers. I noticed a Red Wattlebird feeding in this Hakea and these birds disappeared during the Sampson Flat Bushfire and it was very pleasing to see one returned. I hope more return as the Lesser Honeyeater, a rather noisy bird, moved in immediately after the bushfire and has increased in numbers. The pollinated flowers produce very large seed pods in the shape of a bird's beak, each containing 2 seeds. This plant, with a common name of Bird-beak Hakea, grows naturally in the Kalbarri region of Western Australia but is popular as a garden plant, requiring well drained loamy soils. It's not very often seen as a plant to purchase in general garden nurseries but is often available from the Native plant Show, the next being held in October.

Hakea orthorrhyncha, with it's stunning red flowers, is a must have plant that brightens up any Winter garden. Just Beautiful.


