

Quite a busy month of activity with planning and organising the annual ANZAC day dawn service well under way. Residents of One Tree Hill who have memorabilia from WW1 or WW2 and would like to loan items for display on ANZAC Day are asked to deliver those items on that Tuesday so we have some time to set up and display them in an orderly fashion.

We have received positive reaction from the Playford Council regarding some pavers which were lifting, outside the hall on the pathway leading up the hill, due to tree root activity. A work schedule order has been actioned and we hope to see the problem rectified over the next week or so, thanks to the Council for a quick response.

Firstly, I did like to thank and acknowledge Cr Andrew Craig for attending our meeting this month. He has been happy to attend and assist the ratepayers committee and is seeking answers from council to a range of questions.

The new Ice Skating Rink has been given the green light and reportedly is being funded by private investment together with an interest free loan of ten million dollars. The question we have asked, is there any rate payers money being invested in this project or at risk? We are informed that there is not.

The new Hotel will essentially be developed in the same process being funded by private development. Once again the question we have asked, is there any rate payers money at risk or invested in the project? We are informed that there is not.

The new car park will be a council investment and owned by council. We are unsure on the details to the Medical centre and are seeking further information.

## One Tree Hill... Councilor's Report

Playford Arena gets the green light. A State Government loan of \$10 million has given the green light to Playford's long awaited ice arena. The proposed \$40 million international standard multi-purpose sports and entertainment facility is set to host significant sporting events and concerts including ice hockey world championships, figure skating championships, and national and international rock-climbing championships. The arena will also be a major concert venue, attracting major national and international entertainment and music acts. Council had strong opposition by other bids to have the Ice Arena built elsewhere. Other benefits to the City include the sale of land at market price Council will be paid Commercial rates for the development moving forward. Hundreds of construction jobs will be created and once completed in approximately 2 years, around 70 full and part time jobs will have been created and it will instill confidence in the City of Playford as a second Central Business District (CBD). Gimme shelter – Playford Bowling Centre shade structure progresses. The Playford Bowling Centre will be the largest undercover bowls facility in the Southern Hemisphere. This is now well advanced with its shade structure in place and now commencing the next stage of applying the covering material. The stateof-the-art bowling surface substructure is also on schedule for the March completion target. Members of the newly formed Playford Bowling Club are excited about moving into the new facility which builds on the reputation of the growing Playford Sports Precinct. Playford CBD Hotel A developer is currently in an exclusivity contract period to design and construct a 10-12 storey, 260 room, 4.5 star hotel for the Northern CBD. It will feature a rooftop bar, minimum of two in-house ground level restaurants, a gym with swimming pool and function facilities. The hotel will provide high standard accommodation for people visiting the Playford area to attend business conferences, sporting events and other activities. Hotel patrons will enjoy the atmosphere of the new plaza, nearby Fremont Park green spaces, access to surrounding retail, and other services. The hotel will be a no poker machine venue. Prince George Plaza retail tenancies New retail café and restaurant tenancies for Prince George Plaza are in the process of design. These businesses will provide convenient indoor al fresco café and dining options for people visiting the CBD for events, shopping or cultural activities in the Plaza and Shedley Theatre. Construction is due to commence in mid-2018 with the retailers open for business in early 2019. Carclew Road, a major road in the City of Playford's farming community, is receiving a \$2.3 million upgrade as part of Council's Rural Road Sealing program. Carclew Road at Penfield Gardens was earmarked for sealing in the City of Playford's 2017/18 Annual Business Plan. Located just north of Angle Vale Road, the lengthy thoroughfare is utilised by local agricultural and horticultural businesses. The upgrade aligns with Council's aims of stimulating local economic activity and is timely with Marrone Fresh now expanding its business operations in the area.

## One Tree Hill CFS — Incident Report Feb 2018

Well, half way through February and the One Tree Hill area remains fire free this summer, touch wood. A summer without a fire would be a great achievement but it is not over yet and the recent fire at Emu Flat near Clare reminds us that we are only one careless incident away from disaster. In that case, it was a ride-on lawn mower that created a fire that continued to be a problem for more than a week. Crews from One Tree Hill attended that fire on four separate strike teams and were part of a team that successfully defended a house on the first day.

We have had a couple of busy Saturdays. The first was the day after Australia Day where we were initially called to a tree down on the Hannaford Hump Road. That was followed a short time later with a smoke sighting not far away on Range Road which turned out to be a major fire. High temperatures helped the fire race up a hill from the pump shed where it started and threatened several houses. A quick response from the aerial bombers, including the Helitack (Elvis), helped the ground crews bring the fire under control however mopping up took most of the day due to the steep terrain.

The second was on Saturday the 10th where we were called to assist a helicopter landing for the tragic accident at the corner of Jordan Drive and Blacktop Road. Despite a quick response from a local paramedic, a motorcycle rider from Mount Pleasant died at the scene. This was followed by a second motorcycle accident near the corner of Harvey and One Tree Hill roads 17 minutes later. The rider in this instance sustained several broken bones and severe injuries and was eventually transported to hospital in the helicopter called for the first incident.


Our thoughts go out to the family of the riders involved and also to the driver of the 4 wheel drive who was also injured in the incident. The fatal accident was witnessed by several people and its proximity to the township meant that there were more people at the scene than we would normally see. These types of incidents can be very stressful and while the CFS has measures in place to help members deal with the stress involved, the question arose about what is available for others. The answer is that the Road Trauma Support team are available to assist. This is a free service which provides counselling and support to anyone who feels they are not coping well as a result of a road accident.

As you will all know by now, March the 17th this year is not only St. Patrick's Day, but also the state election. We will have our barbeque set up at the polling booth with plenty of information available. So come in, say G'day and maybe buy a sausage or ask a question, we will be happy to help.



# Recipes of the Month... Sausage Rolls



#### **Ingredients**

- ♦ 250gms sausage meat
- ♦ 250gms pork mince
- ♦ 1 small onion finely diced
- ▶ 1/4 cup parsley finely chopped
  - ♦ 1 cup cold mashed potato
    - ♦ 1 egg beaten
- ♦ 4 tablespoons tomato sauce
- good dash of Worcestershire sauce
  - salt and pepper to taste
  - puff pastry sheets cut in half
    - extra egg beaten

#### Method

- 1. Mix all ingredients together. roll into sausage shape and place on pastry sheet.
- 2. Brush long edge of pastry sheets with extra egg.
- 3. Roll up pastry, place on baking tray.
- 4. Make a cut into upward facing pastry to show preferred serving size.
- 5. Brush tops with extra beaten egg.
- 6. Bake in hot oven 20-25 minutes until pastry golden brown.
- 7. Serve with home made tomato sauce!! Enjoy.

# History... Humbug Scrub Wildlife Sanctuary 1970-1994

I cover two decades here as there is so little information.

Neville married and moved to Victoria where he worked on a farm. With older brothers Phillip and Robin also married and moved out, the sanctuary was in the hands of an aging Ray, his wife Gwen, who was ill, and disabled son, John.

Neville's move generated some fun. He hired a trailer and with all their possessions packed in, struck out for Gippsland, in eastern Victoria. His baby daughter was only a few weeks old. The trailer was overloaded and unbalanced but by driving slowly and carefully he managed to arrive safely. Along the way he picked up a police escort who must have decided he was reasonably safe as they left after awhile. These days, of course, he would have been pulled over for an unsafe load. At about 35miles per hour (equivalent to about 60kph) it would have been a very long trip, about 14 hours.

This was the era that many of the local people remember. Ray opened the sanctuary on weekends or whenever he as around at 20 cents per person but otherwise continued to scrape a living from the land.

More and more people took advantage of Ray's concern for animals by leaving their pets with him. He was happy to give them a home but finances must have been severely strained to feed them. One such bird was Fred, a Little Corella, who had arrived in 1956. Fred is still living at the sanctuary and is quite a character. Neville tells me I am not allowed to sing to Fred as he remembers some rather lewd songs, not suitable for youngsters' ears. We do not know how old Fred it but Corellas have been known to live to 80 years old.

In 1976, Mrs Bellchambers died, with John passing in 1989.

Ray soldiered on, filling his promise to his father: that he would manage and preserve the sanctuary all his days.

On Australia Day 1992 his work was recognised. Raynor F. F. Bellchambers was presented with the Medal of the Order of Australia (O.A.M.)

Ray died in 1993 or 1994 and his son Phil took over the role of manager.





#### The Advertiser 12th September 1906

#### ALMOST DROWNED—SAVED BY THE STUMP OF A TREE

#### NINE HOURS IN THE WATER

#### Gawler, September 11.

Mr. J. S. Harvey, son of Mr. J. S. Harvey, of One Tree Hill, met with an accident on Sunday evening near Williamstown. He had been to his brother's residence at New Mecklenberg, and on the return journey noticed a strong stream was running at Alice Crossing, South Para River. He however, decided to cross it with his horse. Unfortunately, the girth of the saddle broke when the animal was in the middle of the stream, and Mr. Harvey, being unable to swim, was washed down the river. He managed to catch hold of a stump of a tree, about 400 yards lower down the river's course, and thus was able to keep himself partly out of the water. His cries for help were heard by Mr. Bain, who, however, was unable to render immediate assistance, as the tree to which Mr. Harvey was holding was about 70ft from the bank. The Gawler police were acquainted with the news at 10 o'clock on Sunday night and Mounted Constable Webb and Foot Constable Mitchell drove out, arriving at Williamstown a little after midnight. They then had to walk four miles to the river. When they reached the scene at 2 o'clock in the morning, there were 15 people there, and a large fire had been lighted. Owing to the strong stream of water it was impossible to help the unfortunate man out of his perilous position for some time. Eventually, the police managed to reach Mr. Harvey by tying a piece of string to a stone and hurling the missile. To the string was attached a rope, and Mr. Harvey, after getting possession of the rope, was able to fasten it around himself. In this way he managed to reach the bank. He was in a state of collapse when rescued. He was taken to Mr. Bain's residence, where he remained for the rest of the night. Mr. Harvey was holding onto a tree for nine hours.
