If you live in the City of Playford you are required to obtain a burning permit between the dates of 15 May 2018 and 31 October 2018.

Some areas are exempted from having to obtain an individual burning permit and are instead covered by a General Notice Burning Permit – per information below.

Burning Permits are issued to enforce the Environment Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016 in accordance with clause 6.

This general notice burning permit is issued by the City of Playford and authorises any person within the following areas of the City of Playford (as defined in the City of Playford Development Plan pursuant to the Development Act 1993) that are within Metropolitan Adelaide (as defined in the Development Act 1993):

- a. The Watershed Zone (Mount Lofty Ranges);
- b. The Hills Face Zone;
- c. Primary Production Zone (Mount Lofty Ranges);

to carry out any of the following burning activities in those areas, outside of the 2017/2018 fire danger season (fixed under the Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005) subject to the conditions set out below:

Burning off vegetation for fire prevention or control;

Conditions

- This burning permit cannot authorise a person to carry out a burning activity under (1) on land if the person is not the owner occupier of the land or does not have the consent or authority of the owner or occupier.
- 3. A person carrying out a burning activity under (1) and (2) must:
 - Only burn between the hours of 10am and 5pm, Monday to Saturday. NOTE: Burning on Sundays and Public Holidays is prohibited.
 - Create Piles 3m x 3m x 2m Maximum
 - Notify your neighbours prior to the day of burn.
 - Place materials to be burnt in a position that allows for a four-metre clearance around and over the fire.
 - Ensure all piles to be burnt are not in close proximity to other flammable materials including grass and logs.
 - Burn one pile at a time, to ensure that you retain control of each burn.
 - Have appropriate working fire control equipment on standby.
 - Extinguish the fire immediately if smoke or odour is causing a nuisance on another person's property.
 - Stay within the direct vicinity of the immediate burn site if smoke or smoulder is coming off of the burn.
 - On the completion of the burn, ensure the fire is completely extinguished.

You must not: Burn materials mixed into soil or permapine treated with copper arsenate, household rubbish, plastic or rubber.

- This notice remains in force until 31st October 2018.
- Individual permits will be considered on a case by case basis in November 2018.

Notes

This burning permit does not authorise the burning of a prohibited substance (Clauses (6)(3)(d) and (7) (1) of the Environment Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016. The fact that a person has complied with the conditions of the burning permit does not:

a. relieve the person from liability for any loss, damage or harm caused by a fire lit under the authority of the burning permit;
 or

b. prevent proceedings for enforcement of the general environmental duty under section 25 of the Environment Protection Act 1993, or for any offence under the Act, in relation to the burning activity (clause 6(5) of the Environment Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016). This permit is subject to any ban, prohibition, restriction, or other requirement under the Fire and Emergency services Act 2005, the Native Vegetation Act 1991 or a prescribed act (clause 5(4) Environment Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016). 

One Tree Hill... Councillor's Report

Most Important FIRE PERMITS. Once again Council has issued a general burning permit for bushfire fuel reduction burning OUTSIDE OF THE BUSHFIRE SEASON and outside of Townships only for our area. Please check the CFS the Website cfs.sa.gov.au or phone Council on 85260333 to ensure that the season has not been extended. Please be vigilant and not burn if the surrounding area is still dry and no rain has fallen. Council is exploring a Storm Management Plan (SMP) which includes One Tree Hill, this is not a bad thing however the aim is to mitigate downstream flooding issues and improve water quality. Public consultation will be held with affected and interested landowners, it is worth bearing in mind that upstream land owners should not have to lose out to benefit downstream users unless a trade-off is negotiated. It is interesting that Council has approved new works for Freemont Park which includes a bigger lake, provisions for a restaurant and or function centre, provisions for a kiosk and or food truck. Stages were also explored that included a \$1.65M doggy park relocation of the maintenance shed at \$1.32M a sensory garden at a cost of \$1.9M amoungst other stuff. If you are interested in reading these ideas and documents they can be found on Council's website under agendas minutes and meetings. Oddly enough when I asked the question whether we had our priorities right as people in rural areas would have to battle unsealed roads, dust and unsafe conditions to row a boat or walk a dog etc. I was told that the approved stage was fully funded in the previous versions budget. This did not answer my question but raised in my mind that when things are increased but still fully funded either the first budget had a lot of meat on it or there is going to be a hole in the budget once the new you-butte lake is delivered. Rate Capping was also discussed but it appears that the Libs will not have the numbers in the Upper House (22 seats, 9 Liberals, 8 Labor, 2 Greens, 2 SA best and an independent) 12 votes are needed, it will take a lot of buying to secure rate capping. Anzac Day will have come and gone by the time you read this I hope it is, as always, a very successful commemoration followed by an afternoon of steady soaking rain.

One Tree Hill CFS... Incident Report April 2018

The unseasonal hot weather on the 11th of April turned a reasonably quiet month into a very busy one. An unusual weather system saw a cold front that stalled just off the coast and meant that Adelaide was buffeted by strong Northerly winds for most of the day. We were initially asked to man the station from 10 until 3 o'clock but as the day progressed it became clear that it would be much longer than that. With the Fire Danger Indexes going through the roof a call came in for a fire at the Jeffries Compost depot at Buckland Park. The windrows of ageing compost had spontaneously combusted due to a combination of the natural heat build-up within the piles and the high winds.

Although our initial response to that fire was only the tanker, most of the rest of the Group had units committed to Buckland Park, and so One Tree Hill station became rural fire cover for most of Elizabeth and Munno Para. As a result, we were called to grass fires late in the afternoon in Andrews Farm and MacDonald Park, both of which were bought quickly under control despite the weather at the time. As it became obvious that the Jeffries fire would burn for many days, the Brigade was then called in to provide more crews to relieve those that had been working all afternoon.

Apart from that, during the month we had a Tree down, a vehicle fire and accident, and provided teams for a strike team to the Birdwood fire that was widely reported in the press. We also had one call for a Grass fire heading towards a house on Tyeka Drive which turned out to be the resident having a small comfort fire.

Fire Danger Season Extended

On the 19th of April, the CFS announced that it has decided to extend the Fire Danger season in the Adelaide Hills zone until the 15th of May. Parts of the Adelaide Hills have received 25-100 mm below the average January to April rainfall and the fuel load in most areas remains extremely dry. Leigh Miller from CFS HQ has said that we require about 70mm of rain and milder autumn conditions before the fire risk is reduced. So you need to hold off on your burn-offs for a couple more weeks. The date remains unchanged at the 30th of April for the Adelaide Metropolitan region.

Exotic Grass Invaders, Community Workshop

Exotic species are invading Australia at an alarming rate. Everyone knows about cane toads, rabbits and foxes but few would appreciate the threat we are facing by species such as Buffel Grass, African Fountain Grass, Chilean Needle Grass and Coolatai Grass.

Most of us appreciate the dangers we face by fires but don't know that many of these invasive grasses change the fuel load significantly and thrive after fires. They burn very hot but recover faster than many native grasses and thus in many parts of Australia are scorching out native bushland.

Many of these grass species are difficult to identify and even harder to control and hence we need to work together as a community to contain these invaders and to tackle the escalating threat.

Recipes of the Month... Apple Berry Crumble

Ingredients

- 2 Medium Apples
- 3/4 cup (115g) frozen mixed berries
 - 2 tablespoons lemon juice
 - 2 tablespoons brown sugar
 - 2 tablespoons plain flour
 - 1/4 cup (20g) rolled oats
 - 20g butter
- 1/4 cup (30g) finely chopped roasted hazelnuts

Method

- Preheat oven to 200 degrees Celsius/180 degrees Celsius fan-forced. Grease four 3/4 cup (180ml) ovenproof dishes; place on tray.
- 2. Peel and core apples; chop coarsely. Combine apple, berries, juice, and half the sugar in a medium bowl; divide mixture among dishes.
- 3. Combine remaining sugar, flour and oats in a small bowl. Rub butter into flour mixture; stir in nuts. Divide crumble over fruit mixture, pressing down firmly. Bake, uncovered, about 30 minutes or until browned lightly.

After the recent rain, which gave us 33mls of much needed rain, the Correas have responded. Correa reflexa has been in flower for the last four weeks and, as a ground cover of approximately 40cms height by 1.2m width, the plant is a delight to the eyes with its pink/red tubular flowers on a mid green foliage.

The New holland honeyeaters and the Eastern spinebills constantly check each and every flower for a feed of nectar.

There are many other Correas available to grow in your garden. Various varieties come in many colours; white, cream, pale green, yellow, red, pinks and oranges. From small plants, eg Correa pulchella to a tall Correa glabra, there's always one to grow somewhere in your garden. Easy to grow, easy to maintain, good as a cut flower stem.



Stormwater management plans are being developed for the:

- Smith Creek Catchment,
- Greater Edinburgh Parks and St Kilda Catchment, and
- Adams Creek and Helps Road Drain Catchment.

The map below shows the location of these catchments.

The plans will identify action to:

- Improve stormwater quality,
- Protect and enhance water dependent ecosystems,
- Promote the use of water-sensitive urban design, including stormwater harvesting and reuse, and


Community News ... Mayor at Indoor Bowls
