

One Tree Hill CFS ~ Incident Report September 2019

Several more vehicle accidents this month including the unusual situation of having two calls within seven minutes of each other. This occurred on Saturday the 14th of September with the initial call to respond to Somerset Grove in Craigmore covering a call in the Dalkieth Brigade area because Dalkieth were already fully committed at another job. The first responding truck passed the second accident on the way to this incident and after a quick assessment continued to the first call. This is in accordance with CFS procedure which dictates that unless there is clearly a higher priority for the second call, we deal with incidents in the order they were received.



We had another call to a single car MVA (Motor Vehicle Accident) at around 6:30 a.m. on the 28th of August which turned out to be 2 cars which had been involved in a near head-on accident on the Gawler-One Tree Hill Road with one of the cars ending up in the paddock alongside the road. This was the most serious accident we have had in a while and involved removing the roof from one of the vehicles so that the patient could be extracted before being taken to hospital by ambulance.

Two calls were for rubbish or waste fires and in both cases the fires were extinguished because they did not meet the burning guidelines issued by the Council. It is a good idea if you are having a burn off to check and ensure that you are meeting the requirements, including size, availability of water and having someone in attendance. If you plan on using the "comfort fire" excuse, please also check the CFS website for what constitutes a comfort fire.

Two more calls this month, one to assist the MFS with water at a 2 story town house fire in Blakeview which was widely reported in the media. The other was a call to assist the SA Ambulance with a lift in a paddock. These happen occasionally where a person has fallen and hurt themselves and need to be physically carried from a paddock to the ambulance because of lack of access.



Bushfire Survival Plan Workshop



Playford Council ~ Local Councillor's Report

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

The City of Playford has announced the appointment of Sam Green as its new Chief Executive Officer.

The exhaustive recruitment process saw a strong and impressive calibre of candidates from across Australia. Throughout the process, Sam established himself as a strong candidate and his excellent knowledge and deep understanding of our community was evident.

I have a strong working relationship with Mr Green and have every confidence in his leadership to deliver the goods for the City of Playford. The minutes of the confidential special meetings are now available on the City of Playford internet page. While I supported the appointment of Mr Green as one of your representatives for ward 3, I was a strong advocate to take a conservative approach on the term of the initial appointment. Majority of the chamber did not support my approach and Mr Green has been appointed for five years. Anyone who wishes to have a closer look can refer to the minutes of the special meetings Monday 9th September and Wednesday 11th September 2019.

At the Ordinary Council Meeting 27th August 2019, item 14.6 council resolution was carried for the City of Playford to execute Blackspot Funding Deeds with the Commissioner of Highways which included the intersection of Uley Road/ Gawler-One Tree Hill Road, Yattalunga. The project description list includes, install lighting, signs, pavement widening, left turn construction, raised pavement maker and skid resistance treatment.

If anyone would like to further discuss the council concerns or other details, please give me a call.

As the change of season is upon us, I wish everyone well with their fire preparations. The Question of when the Fire Danger Season will start has been raised and will it be early this year? This will depend on climatic conditions and how the season develops. It is expected by approximately early to late November CFS will be in a position to provide advice to the community (and Council) regarding the start of the Fire Danger Season.







ARE YOU BUSHFIRE READY?

Prepare your home or workplace now.

You must...

- · Clear 20 metres around your house
- Clear five metres around other buildings and structures on your property
- Cut long grass on your property (occupied and vacant land allotments)
- · Prune tree limbs and branches which overhang your home
- · Create fire breaks.

You should...

- · Remove 'dead' branches, 'dead' undergrowth and leaf litter from your property
- Remove bark, heavy mulch, wood piles and other flammable materials close to your home and shed
- Regularly clean your gutters
- Create access to an alternative water supply (at least 5,000 litres) such as a swimming pool or water tank.

You can...

Clear vegetation further than 20 metres from your house for fire prevention WITH A
 PERMIT FROM THE CFS. Native vegetation is protected by law, under the Native
 Vegetation Act, and permission is required to clear it on your property.

Please be reminded that any mowing or alterations on roadsides requires permission to be obtained from Council in accordance with the Local Government Act 1999. The City of Playford will conduct flammable undergrowth inspections prior to the 2019/2020 fire danger season to ensure landowners comply with the Fire and Emergency Services Act.






A timely reminder to think Chilean Needle Grass control

Good results for roadsides

Natural Resources Adelaide and Mt Lofty Ranges officers have been working closely together with the City of Playford council over the past 8 years to manage Chilean Needle Grass (CNG) on the roadsides. In the 2018 survey great results were seen with significantly less plants found. 75% of all known roadside sites had no CNG with the remaining sites having only a low number of plants.



The ongoing success has been a big win for the environment and community. An added benefit is an increase of native grasses due to a modified mowing program which favours native grass seed set.



Identification

Chilean Needle Grass is a tussock grass identified by its redpurple, drooping seed heads and needle-like seeds. These predominantly appear late October through to December. Take care to identify the grass correctly as it can be confused with others that have similar seeds and a drooping form. Barley grass, great brome grass and native spear grass are the most common plants this weed gets confused with. More information can be found at weeds.ala.org.au/WoNS/Chileanneedlegrass

One Tree Hill ~ Weed Of Concern

Boneseed (Chrysanthemoides monilifera ssp. Monilifera) is a Weed of National Significance and a declared plant under the Natural Resources Management Act 2004 (NRM Act). The movement or transport of the plant on a public road, by itself or as a contaminant, or the sale by itself or as a contaminant is prohibited. It is regarded as one of the worst weeds in Australia because of its invasiveness, potential for spread, and economic and environmental impacts. Boneseed has become an aggressive invader of native bushland in Australia. Although it does not affect agriculture, it is considered a weed because of its ability to establish in areas of native vegetation ranging from mallee scrub to eucalypt dominated forests and, in particular, the coastal fringe.



Boneseed is a bushy, woody, erect, perennial shrub to 3 m high, and lives for 10 $\,$

to 20 years. The stems are much-branched, green or often purplish-green when young, and become woody with age. The leaves which are 20-80 mm long, dull, green, elliptic and leathery, are alternately arranged and have edges which are coarsely toothed. The bright yellow daisy flower heads with brownish centres are 10-40 mm in diameter each with 5 or 6

radiating petals. The fruits are globular, 6-8 mm in diameter, with a thin outer fleshy purple-green layer which turns black and flakes off revealing a white bony fruit containing a single egg shaped seed which persists on the bush for several months. Each fruit holds one seed which is bone coloured and very hard, hence its common name "Boneseed". A single plant can produce 50,000 seeds a year of which about 60 percent are viable. Seeds can remain dormant in the soil more than 10 years.

Boneseed is native to South Africa, and was introduced to Sydney, Melbourne and Adelaide as an ornamental in the 1850's and was first recorded in the wild in 1852 in Sydney and 1892 in Adelaide. It is very common in parts of the Mt Lofty Ranges, with occasional infestations throughout the State.

Boneseed grows rapidly during winter and a few plants may flower in the first year, particularly on burnt areas where there is little competition. However, plants are usually at least 18 months and sometimes three years old before flowering. Flowers are formed in late winter and spring (Aug – Oct), and the fruit shed seeds in summer (Oct - Jan). Seeds germinate at any time of the year but mostly in autumn and is now an aggressive weed of roadsides and disturbed woodland. It flowers mostly in late winter and spring.

A range of effective control measures are available including hand pulling, herbicide treatment, physical removal, fire and biological control. Natural regeneration or oversowing with native plants is an important part of the rehabilitation process. Because of the large and persistent seedbanks in the soil, follow-up treatment is required for many years.

Small infestations can be removed by hand-pulling quite easily because it has a shallow root system. Several herbicides are registered to control boneseed by spray or cut-stump application. The cut-stump application method reduces the risk to nearby nontarget plants but is time-consuming, especially when dealing with large numbers of small boneseed plants. Burning will trigger mass germination of



boneseed and may also improve access for herbicide application. Spraying small seedlings in the first few months after germination is generally ineffective because they are quickly replaced by new ones. It is better to spray at the end of seedling emergence but, even then, follow-up control will be needed in subsequent years after further germination has taken place.

In inaccessible locations, or where there is a risk of damage to sensitive native vegetation, conventional control methods may be difficult or impossible to implement. In such cases biocontrol may be the only feasible management option, although alone it will not eradicate the weed. The likely effect is to reduce the growth and rate of spread of the weed, allowing more time for control by other means. The boneseed leaf buckle mite has been released at selected sites in the Adelaide and Mt Lofty Ranges. However survival of the mites appears to be an issue, and community groups are being encouraged to start nurseries to grow their own boneseed leaf buckle mites for transference onto field plants.
