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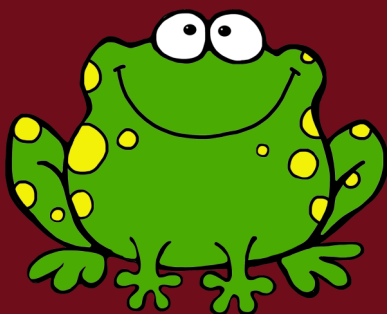

Dear Residents,

Feedback on our new website (<http://onetreehill.org.au>) has been positive; if you haven't already had a look, please do so. We are still looking for photos of town activities/events to improve our online presence.

Country Market Policy. The Market Manager is often placed in a difficult position when trying to balance the stallholder mix at our Country Market. Progress have agreed that the market terms and conditions should be transparent to stallholders, visitors and other interested parties. Accordingly, we are working on a Market Policy that we will aim to introduce in early 2020. If you have an interest in our policy direction, please feel free to submit your ideas via the email below.

Street Library Update. At our 10th October meeting, we decided to go for something a little bigger than what we have been considering and to also look for an off-street location. Accordingly, we will ask Council for approval to put a bookshelf in the alcove of the second (western) entrance of the Institute; this is still visible from the street but is out of the weather. This new site will allow us to host a lot more books.

The petition to move the town information sign was discussed by Council at its 24Sep19 meeting. The Council simply Noted the petition, accepting their staff's recommendation that there was no issue. Cr Kerrison subsequently moved "that Council assess and provide a report on alternate placement locations of the One Tree Hill Township sign (near Jordan Drive on the eastern entry to the township) and associated costs." The motion was lost 8-7, probably because of the perceived high cost of undertaking public consultation. Subsequent informal meetings have agreed to take the issue back to Council again.

Our next meeting is at 7:30pm on Thursday 14th November in the Institute at One Tree Hill. Meetings only take about an hour; it would be great to see some new faces there.

One Tree Hill CFS ~ Incident Report October 2019

A quiet month as we would expect in October, with three callouts to out of control or unattended burn-offs. One of these was particularly unusual, with the initial call being for a burn-off "getting away from the person on scene". On arrival, the officer in charge reported two small fires, but on closer inspection realised that the two fires he could see were connected and the total burn out area was close to 2 hectares. The fire was burning in the accumulated debris under tall green grass and was not visible over most of the fire ground. That was unusual but the other thing that was strange was that the fire had burnt primarily down-hill, showing that it had been burning for a long time. Both are indicators that the fire had been unattended and/or not properly extinguished which are both conditions of all burning permits. In instances such as this we are required to notify the relevant Council and it is fortunate that the weather had not been warmer or windier on this particular day.



Speaking of burning permits, with the end of October coming, it is advised that if you intend burning, you should check with your council to ensure you are still covered in your area. General Notice permits have expiry dates which generally precede the start of Fire Danger Season and people have been caught out in the past. Fire Danger Season has not yet been declared for the Mount Lofty Ranges but has been brought forward to 1 November in several other areas of the state, keep an eye on the CFS web-site for more information, it will definitely happen before the next Grapevine.

It is pleasing that up until this point of the month, we have had no vehicle incidents locally (touch wood) with our other calls for the month including a call to Nyroca stud to assist the SA Ambulance with a lift for a fallen rider, and an early morning call to man the radio room to co-ordinate units at a large truck fire on the Northern Expressway. We have also had two requests for members available to go on deployment to New South Wales. Well done to the members who willingly put their hands up and volunteered at short notice to assist our interstate colleagues who have been fighting the devastating fires over there.

Playford Council ~ Local Councillor's Report

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

In follow up from last month, I wish to say thank you to the residents that contacted me and provided feedback in relation to the Blackspot Funding Deeds and plans for the Uley / Gawler-One Tree Hill Road intersection. I personally support the feedback received and have discussed the concerns with the City of Playford.

The One Tree Hill Town Sign near Jordan Drive has raised a number of complaints since its installation. Last month the One Tree Hill Progress Association submitted a petition for a review into the location and positioning of the sign. In support of residents I moved a motion without notice,

That Council assess and provide a report on alternate placement locations of the One Tree Hill Township sign (near Jordan Drive on the eastern entry to the township) and associated costs. The report to be brought back to the elected members for community consultation, within the next four weeks.

The motion was lost 7 votes to 8 votes with a division being called. I will amend the motion and place the motion again this month on notice.

The adoption of a new Rural Road Sealing Policy will hopefully see improved outcomes for the rural roads and the City of Playford as a whole. I will continue to question the costs being presented on rural roads and the expenditure. In my opinion we need a balance between meeting recommended standards and costs involved. Many of our rural roads sealed over the years have not been constructed to today's standards, however service residents and the community adequately and at a significantly lower cost.

The other questions that have been raised again on behalf of ward 3 are in relation to the Silverleaf Nightshade Management Plan, tractor slashing program prior to fire danger season and the suggested plan changes to Medlow Road, Uleybury. If anyone is interested please give me a call or refer to the Ordinary Council Meeting Agenda, Tuesday 22nd October 2019.

The Budget Update Report for September 2019 see a combined \$0.5M favourable result with a surplus position of 2.1M compared with a budgeted year to date surplus of \$1.6M. The details of the Budget Update Report 2019 and First Budget Review 2019/2020 can also be found in the agenda of the Ordinary Council Meeting, Tuesday 22nd October 2019.

If anyone would like to further discuss the council concerns or other details, please give me a call.

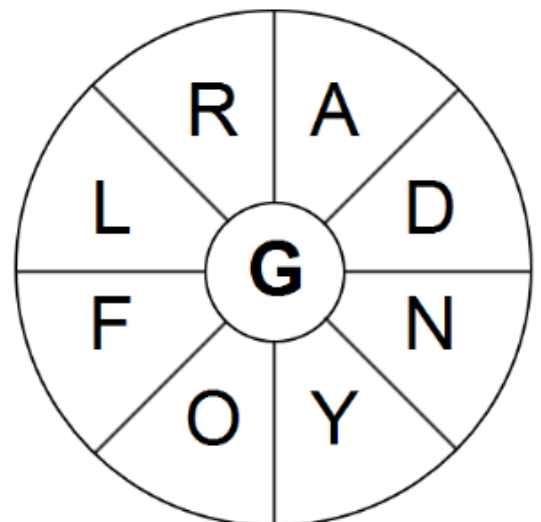

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What's Flowering In My Garden?

Many plants are flowering at the moment and all are contributing to a wonderful kaleidoscope of brilliant vibrant colours. The first flowers of the strongly perfumed Native frangipani (*Hymenosporum flavum*) have just opened this week as have the large beautiful orange red spider like blooms of *Grevillea Superb*. Many of the rounded flower buds of the Waxflowers (*Chamaleucium* species) have burst open to reveal many pastel shades of white, pink and mauve as well as the darker shades of crimson and purple. All the birds are enjoying the Spring feast as there is plenty of food to feed the young birds that have hatched.

Kunzea baxteri nana Mandy's Surprise has been an outstanding flowering plant this spring with it's all over coverage of brilliant bright red bottlebrush type flowers. A small compact bush approximately 1mx1m, it is quite dense and it's leaves are small and elliptical with the flower spikes emerging from near the end of its many small branches. The gold tips on the end of the flowers enhance the overall stunning effect of this mid green leaved plant. When it has finished flowering it's many crimson red and green seed capsules are revealed and are almost as beautiful as when it is in flower. This plant grows in well drained soils, is frost tolerant and best of all, is drought tolerant once established as my plant did not receive any extra water during the past Autumn and Summer. If you are looking for a small plant that gives shelter for small birds and gives you brilliant colour for a month or so, seek this plant from good garden shops but be prepared for the Eastern Rosellas to visit and munch away on the many fresh seed capsules.

Kunzea baxteri nana Mandy's Surprise is a fantastic plant and makes a welcome addition to any small or large garden.

Did you see the large flock of the endangered Yellow Tail Black Cockatoos flying through recently? Oh, what a magnificent memorable sight it was.

Just beautiful.

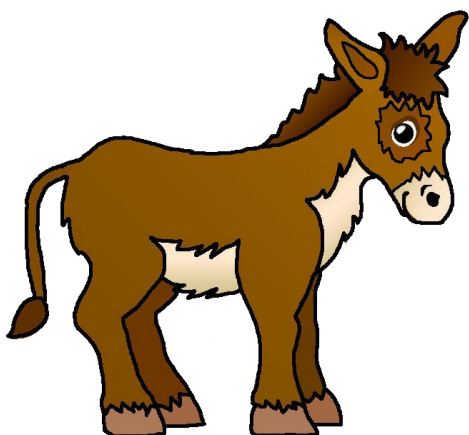
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One Tree Hill's Own Internet Superstar!



Most of you will not know that in our little township, we have our very own internet superstar. He has 4 legs, a cute hairstyle, a short and stocky build, and a lovable personality... He goes by the name of "Paddington", the miniature donkey! You may have seen a photo of Paddington in the October Grapevine just after he was born.

Paddington is a micro miniature Mediterranean donkey. His Mum is 29 inches tall, and Dad 30 inches. Paddington was the foal of the season to be born at Knotty Ash Miniature Horse & Donkey Stud, run by One Tree Hill locals Gillian & Keith Emmerson.

Gillian & Keith first moved to One Tree Hill in 1983, although they didn't start breeding miniature horses until 2001, when they fell head over heels with the tiny and well-mannered horses. Over the years since then, they have successfully bred and shown many miniature foals.

In 2010, Gillian & Keith purchased their first Miniature Mediterranean Donkeys—a Jack from Queensland, and Jennies from Tasmania and Victoria.

So what's so special about Paddington? This little fella became an internet sensation almost overnight, when a 2 minute home video of Gillian playing and cuddling with 2 day old Paddington was shared all over the world, getting at first hundreds, thousands, and within a week, millions of views! Paddington went viral!

We are pretty sure Paddington does not even know what all the fuss is about, but it's quite obvious that millions of people across the globe have a soft spot for miniature donkeys, just like the Emmersons do.

The video clip was picked up by "Viralhog", and if you do a quick Google search you'll find it - entitled "Baby Donkey Craves Cuddles", and promoted via Viralhog all over social media. Millions of viewers, thousands of shares, reactions and comments, worldwide—all in love with Paddington, and with nothing but praise for Gillian's gentle nature with him.

This was the 4th time the event has been run by us over 6 years, and it was again a success.

One Tree Hill ~ Weed Of Concern



Single plant

Gazanias (Gazania spp) are a low-growing perennial herb from South Africa. They have become a popular groundcover used in both commercial and home garden planting in Australia. This group of invasive plants has spread into coastal dunes, agricultural areas and along roadsides. Gazania is widely distributed in the Adelaide and Mount Lofty Ranges Natural Resources Management (NRM) region.

Gazanias are a tough, low-growing perennial herb that grow to an average height of 30 cm. They grow in clumps and can also form dense carpets covering large areas.

Flower heads are brightly coloured and commonly have yellow or orange petals with dark or black bases (sometimes with a white dot). Other colours may include cream, pink, red or maroon. Gazanias flower all year round but predominantly in spring and summer. Flower heads can be 6 to 12 cm across, and the stalk height can reach up to 30 cm. Flowers close under low light and at night.

Leaves can be 4 to 10 cm long, slender with a pointed end and an indented central mid rib. Young leaves can be lobed. Leaves can vary from dark green and glossy to silver/grey and hairy. The underside of the leaves are distinctly white/silver.

Gazania is a declared plant under the Natural Resources Management Act 2004 (NRM Act). The following sections of the NRM Act apply to gazania in the Adelaide and Mount Lofty Ranges region:

- 175 (1) Prohibiting entry to area
- 175 (2) Prohibiting movement on public roads
- 177 (1) Prohibiting sale of the plant
- 177 (2) Prohibiting sale of contaminated goods
- 182 (2) Landowners to control the plant on their properties
- 185 Recovery of control costs on adjoining road reserves

The Act also prohibits the movement or transport of the plant on a public road by itself or as a contaminant, its entry to South Australia, or sale by itself or as a contaminant. NRM authorities in the Adelaide and Mount Lofty Ranges and South East regions may require land owners to control gazania plants growing on their land. NRM authorities in these regions are required to control plants on road reserves and may recover costs from the adjoining land owners.

The following sterile cultivars, all subject to Plant Breeders Rights in Australia, are exempt from the declaration:

- GT20 (marketed as Double Gold TM)
- Sugaja (marketed as Sunset Jane TM)
- Sugamo (marketed as Montezuma TM)

Landholders and urban residents are encouraged to remove gazania from their properties and in some cases authorities may require that it be controlled. In the Adelaide and Mount Lofty Ranges region, locations adjacent to native vegetation are prioritised for control.

For effective control, the entire plant, including its root system, should be dug out. Minimal disturbance techniques should be employed. Plants should be removed and correctly disposed of to ensure flowers do not go to seed or the roots re-establish. In situations where the plant cannot be removed flowers heads should be taken off before setting seed. This will prevent the further spread of seed. A minimal level of control is to mow or brush cut the flowers before they develop and set seed.

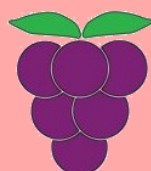
