



One Tree Hill Progress Association ~ President's Report

Dear Residents,

The Progress Association last met on 13Feb20 and it was great to see some new faces at the meeting. We know that people are busy so meetings are kept short (last one 45 mins); you will be made to feel welcome if you would like to come along and see our community work.

- There is some concern about the increased truck activity in the township and we are following this up through Playford Council with Councillor David Kerrison's help.
- The 2020 ANZAC Day planning has commenced; we will run a Dawn Service at 6am in front of the One Tree Hill Institute. If you would like to help in any way with the running of this significant community event, please contact me.
- Following my comments last month about the flower beds in the main, we received just one letter from a One Tree Hill resident. We are considering a request to Playford Council to review the number of flower beds, with a view to maybe moving some that are creating safety issues. If you have concerns about the flower beds, please let me know.
- We have recently received a permit from Playford Council to install a Street Library in front of the Institute. We have ordered a small two-shelf unit and will get it installed as soon as it arrives.
- Regarding the eastern town sign, following a meeting with Council on 11Feb20, we requested the sign be moved
 directly across the road so as to improve road visibility for people exiting Jordan Drive. Council are coordinating with
 DPTI as Blacktop Rd is a State responsibility.
- Following a response from the Minister of Environment and Water concerns about the lack of town water with the loss of power, we will be making further enquiries with the State government about the supply of emergency backup generators.

Our next meeting is at 7:30pm on Thursday 12h March in the Institute at One Tree Hill. I hope to see you there. Kind Regards,

One Tree Hill CFS ~ Incident Report February 2020



After a very busy start to the year, we finally got some much-needed rain, and everything thankfully went quiet. SA firefighters were able to get on top of the fires on Kangaroo Island and finally on Valentine's Day the good news from New South Wales that all fires in that state were classed as contained.

Locally, the change of weather wasn't quite so welcome for a motorist and bike rider who came to grief within an hour of each other following the rain on the 1st of

February. The first incident occurred at around 9.45 in the morning at the intersection of Blacktop and Yorktown Roads where a driver missed the corner in foggy and slippery conditions and ploughed through the large traffic sign on the opposite side of the road. Everyone who has been past that area would have seen the mess that made of the sign. This was followed at 10.40 by a young female rider who discovered how slippery white lines can be on a motor bike at the corner of Blacktop and One Tree Hill Roads.

19th of February and another young driver lost control of their vehicle on Humbug Scrub Road behind Para Wirra Conservation Park. In this case, the air bags deployed which is not much fun for anyone who has experienced it, but according to the crew on the scene the young man was far more worried about how his mother was going to react. Fortunately, all of these drivers escaped without serious injury, but it once again demonstrates how important it is to drive to conditions especially at the end of summer when rods become quite greasy.



Public Relations Events

With many fund raising efforts going on around the state, the Brigade has attended a number of events over the last few weeks, these included a fund raiser at the Cross Keys BMX club, the Australia Day event at Fremont Park, an event for disadvantaged youth in Elizabeth and also Adelaide's Biggest Car Wash on the 16th of February.

As mentioned in the last issue, the Brigade took delivery of a new 11,000 litre Bulk Water Carrier at the start of the summer and it already has been put to great use. For the technical minded, the truck weighs in around 24,000 kg, is nearly twice as

powerful as our two 34 tankers and features an Automatic Manual gear box. (Like a manual but the clutch is computer controlled.) Our photo shows the new truck enjoying a "shower" at Adelaide's Biggest Car Wash.







What's Flowering In My Garden?

As our hot summer officially draws closer to an end, a few Autumn flowering plants are beginning to show some colour. The mauve pink flowers of Thryptomene baeckeacea and the red and green flowers of Correa schlechtendalii are a welcome sight after 30 mils of recent rain.

Callistemon subulatus Brogo Overflow and a few other Callistemons are flowering, much to my surprise. Given the hot Summer that we have endured and the little rain that we have received, Mother Nature decided that it was time for some Summer flowering Callistemons to put on a brilliant, very welcomed splash of colour of bright red and mid pink bottle-brush spikes. Callistemon subulatus Brogo Overflow is flowering and it's stunning dark red, almost crimson red small brushes are covering this small very hardy, drought resistant shrub. The flowers are providing a much needed source of food for the New Holland Honeyeater birds and I have spotted a few Blue Banded Bees hovering above the small brushes of flowers.

This compact arching shrub, with small, quite narrow mid green leaves along it's stems, has grown approximately 1m high and about 1.3m wide during the past 10 years and responds well with new growth after being trimmed back. Brogo Overflow is a plant that can be used for mass plantings or used as a low hedge along pathways or driveways. My plant flowered late Spring last year and I have been amazed that is flowering again just three months after it's Spring flowering. It is a perfect "fill in" plant to grow in between larger plants. You may find this plant in good garden shops but as I want more of this lovely plant in my garden I think I had better take some cuttings and hope that they strike for me. Brogo Overflow is is great plant to have in any sized garden.

One Tree Hill Scout Group News

If you have been walking behind the scout hall lately in the reserve, you may have noticed the appearance of a concrete retaining wall. So what is this all about? The scout group here in One Tree Hill is flourishing, and as we increase in numbers, so does our need for equipment to run our activities. OTH Scout Group owns a large enclosed group trailer, a BBQ trailer and a kayak/canoe trailer, and also has a full inventory of camping and activity gear to keep the youth busy and well equipped for all types of activities throughout the year.

Currently, most equipment is upstairs on a mezzanine level, and leaders and older youth members need to carry gear up and down stairs when packing or unpacking the trailer. 2 trailers are enclosed in a bay downstairs, and the BBQ trailer sits in the main hall. As you can imagine, this is not ideal.

Recently, OTH Scout Group has been fortunate to obtain grants from Scouts SA and the Federal Government, totalling approx \$30000, which has enabled the group to forge ahead to build a new equipment "Q-store" shed, which will provide better access to our equipment, and will also house the trailers and free up space in the main hall. This project has been years in the planning and approval process, and finally now it is coming to fruition thanks to some very dedicated volunteers, which is very exciting for the group. The



retaining wall has been built by our volunteer leaders and committee members.

On another note, over the Christmas break there was an attempted break in at the scout hall via an external roller door, but as the hall is alarmed with security, nothing was taken and the thieves were scared off. The damage was fixed and the door secured more firmly.

Lately, the area around the fire pit has had some rubbish dumped there by members of the public, which is hazardous in summer. Also, some of the pioneering poles and chairs which are stored outside the hall around the back, have been moved (most likely by kids) and left strewn all around the reserve or at the back of adjacent properties. If you are around the Scout Hall, please ensure the area is respected, and report any suspicious activity to the police, including 4WDers and campers. Only OTH leaders and committee members (when required) have permission to drive around the back of the hall for access, and everybody else should be parking at the oval car park. As it is council land, we are not able to fence off our area. We thank and appreciate the members of the community who have looked out for any unusual access or movements around the scout hall. As a Scout Group, we value our presence in the OTH community.
