

Likewise, following increased Government restrictions about gatherings, it is with heavy hearts that we must also cancel the 2020 ANZAC Day Dawn Service at One Tree Hill. We encourage everyone to find a way to commemorate the Dawn Service while observing the health restrictions. Lest we forget.


The Association met on 12Mar20 and it was a pleasure to welcome the local Member for King, Paula Luethen. Paula updated the meeting on some recent government initiatives and offered to help with some of our local issues. In particular, Paula will facilitate our discussion with the Minister of Environment and Water regarding our water supply concerns during power outages. We also welcomed Cr David Kerrison, who is continuing to help the association with some local planning issues of concern by providing a valuable liaison with Playford Council.

The Street Library was installed at the front of the Institute on 26Feb20 and is already getting plenty of attention. The permit from Playford Council is to run the Street Library on a trial basis for 12 months. Council are progressing the movement of the eastern town sign directly across the road in order to improve road visibility for people exiting Jordan Drive. Given the positive response from Council to our request, I am quietly confident that this will go ahead.

Our next meeting is scheduled for 7Apr20 (note the different day for April only) in the Institute at One Tree Hill. All visitors and prospective new members will be made to feel welcome. Please check our website for any changes to planned meetings or activities.

#### One Tree Hill CFS ~ Incident Report March 2020



Wow, what a crazy month it has been, who would have thought our world could change so much in that short a period, more about our (CFS) plans for CoVID-19 later.

The month started with a large scrub fire in the triangle bounded by Crosshill, Blacktop and One Tree Hill Roads on the 22nd of February. The fire was raised to Level 3 due to the proximity to the township and the breeze at the time which was threatening to blow the fire towards Blacktop Road and saw 15 units responding from Elizabeth MFS and all surrounding CFS Brigades. Although the fire was contained quickly mop up was made difficult by the

scrubby area and sandy terrain. One unit from Para Reserve stayed in attendance overnight in case of flare ups and the fire was checked again Sunday morning to ensure it was fully extinguished.

There were 3 fires involving vehicles, one in Craigmore which was dealt with by the MFS, one on Yorketown Road which spread to grass and burnt around 250 square metres and the other on Uley Road about 11:30 on the 19th of March. We also had a report of a rubbish fire within the township which prompts me to remind residents that burning rubbish within the township is not permitted at any time regardless of whether it is fire danger season, check the Playford Council website on Fire Safety if you have any questions.

We also had two vehicle accidents, one involving a car and a motorbike with the rider being transported to hospital and the other involving a car into trees on Medlow Road. Seems like there is not a month goes past without at least one tree down, and this month was no exception. In a lot of cases these can be cleared quickly but this month we had a large tree which had blocked Bassnet Road. After clearing this tree crews noticed that another tree had become unstable and this tree was also cleared eliminating the need for a second call.



#### Fire Danger Season

At this stage Fire Danger Season is set to end on the 30th of April and we have not had any indication yet whether it is likely to be extended. Please check the CFS website for information regarding your local area. Once the season ends, permits may be required depending on which Council you are covered under, so please check with your Council before burning. The Playford web site does not appear to have been updated since last year, implying that the One Tree Hill area will be once again covered by a General Permit but that will need to be confirmed, more next month.

Finally, the world seems to have turned upside down in recent weeks and by the time you read this the situation may well have changed again. With news earlier this month that a southern districts Brigade had attended an incident where there was a confirmed case of CoVID-19, we have had to put in place measures to ensure that we are able to continue providing the service to the community. We have disinfected the entire station and will continue to do that on a regular basis. We are attempting to ensure we do not contract or spread the virus by wearing face masks for all incidents and sanitising at every opportunity. We have also introduced protocols to ensure that the Brigade members cannot all be accidentally infected at the same time. We hope all members of the community remain safe and well during the upcoming months.



#### Playford Council ~ Local Councillor's Report

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

The Coronavirus 'COVID-19' has certainly been a major focus with the updates changing regularly. To find out how we are responding to COVID-19, visit the City of Playford's web page for regular updates.

At the Ordinary Council Meeting on the 25th February 2020, I asked two questions without notice regarding the BUSHFIRE FUND (8.1) and for an UPDATE ON DEVELOPMENT AT 1017 BLaCKTOP ROAD, ONE TREE HILL (8.2). Mr Green took the questions on notice with a response to be provided as a 'Question on Notice' in the March Ordinary Council Meeting (24/03/2020).

Many residents over the years have been unaware that Goulds Creek Road is a Right of Way over private land. The following Council Resolution 3931 was carried on the 25th February 2020 and will hopefully deliver improved services to the residents.

Council endorse acceptance of Goulds Creek Road (Right of Way) as a Public Road subject to:

- 1. The landowners vesting the required land to Council at no cost to Council, except for legal and transfer costs.
- 2. Council allocating the required funds through the Annual Business Plan process to upgrade the road to a standard required for an unsealed Public Road, and for legal transfer costs.



#### What's Flowering In My Garden?

It's typical March weather. It's dry, it's dusty. There's no rain on the horizon. How pleasing has it been to know that there has been rain over the Murray Darling catchment area, resulting in a much needed flow in the Darling River. All plants in my garden need a good wash and a good soaking rain.

There are some plants in flower, offering much needed food and nectar to various birds and insects. Eucalyptus fasciculosa is in flower. Grevillea Peaches and Cream is still providing a constant display of it's beautiful cream, soft green and peach coloured large brushes. A Bottlebrush, with pendulous branches, has small pale cream/pink terminal flowers.

Despite the lack of water (no water in the dam), some of my roses have flowered after receiving a watering about 6 weeks ago. I was able to pick a lovely bunch of roses and have enjoyed the delightful perfume that each flower has. Roses are a high maintenance plant requiring regular watering, fertilising and pruning. One variety that I really enjoy is Softee. It grows into a dense rounded thornless bush that produces many miniature flowers along it's stems. It's soft yellow buds open up to reveal an off white fully opened rose but it is this variety's winter flowers of a rose pink/golden yellow that I really enjoy. It offers a tea scent perfume and is a lovely rose to mix with other favourites such as Papa Meilland, Mr Lincoln, Just Joey and Ekstase. My most favourite rose is the old China rose known as Cecil Brunner. I don't need to trim my roses at the moment as the Kangaroos are doing that job for me.

Softee is just beautiful, as are all roses.


#### ANZAC Day 2020 ~ Dawn Service Cancelled





#### **One Tree Hill Scout Group News**


In early March. One Tree Hill Cubs took part in a fauna rescue activity, where they learned sewing skills to make possum pouches in different sizes using sewing machines, and they built possum boxes using tools. The items made will directly benefit a possum carer we know from Kudla.

This task could only be achieved with extra support from parents (and some grandparents too!), so that the sewing and woodwork could be done safely and the cubs could get the maximum benefit from the experience.



The possum pouches needed to have a cotton fabric for the liner, and the outer pouches were sewn with polar fleece. The cubs pinned the pattern piece onto fabric pieces which were precut by Raksha, then they cut it out with fabric scissors, sewed all seams and trimmed their threads. Some of the seams were really tricky for them because the bottom of the pouch meant sewing around a curve, but they did a fantastic job.

The possum boxes were cut into a kit form by Akela, who pre-drilled holes and labelled so the boxes would be put together the right way. Once assembled with the tools, the cubs also got to paint their boxes for a first coat.
