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
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From Behind the Desk...

One Tree Hill CFS ~ Incident Report April 2020



The One Tree Hill CFS Brigade hopes that this finds all our readers safe from the threat of the Coronavirus and congratulates the community on the responsible way it has responded to the threat. Fortunately, under the circumstances, the last month has been quiet with just 6 callouts all of which turned out to be relatively minor.

Following the last article, the Brigade was split into two teams to ensure that the entire Brigade is not exposed to infection. Each of those teams are doing two week shifts and this has worked well over the last five weeks as we have been able to man trucks for all

incidents. The CFS has also introduced protocols for checking and reporting on whether incident scenes may be contaminated.

The callouts we have had included a call to assist the SA Ambulance Service after a fall from a horse at the Nyroca stud. There were two grass fires, one on each shift. One over Easter was started by a tractor which caught fire in a paddock while cultivating and was dealt with quickly. The other occurred on the 26th of March not far from Nyroca stud and was also only a small burn which was quickly extinguished.

Despite having less vehicles on the road, there have been two vehicle accidents, a two car head-on on Hannaford Hump Road and the other on Uley Road on the 20th of April. These have both occurred on the blue shift and I am on the red shift, so I apologise for being a bit short on details, we will have to rectify our reporting for next month. The other call was for a tree down blocking Hannaford Hump and Burg Roads which was also swiftly dealt with.



Have you cleaned your flue?

With the weather getting colder a lot of us would have already either lit the combustion heater or at least thought about it, but have you also thought about cleaning your flue? Recommendations are that this is done every year to prevent the build-up of potentially flammable deposits on the inside of the flue. Chimney fires are typically responsible for many house fires during the April-May period each year and these can easily spread within the ceiling space once the flue has become overheated.

Talking to Playford Council this week they have indicated that the Fire Danger Season would end on the 30th of April as planned and they were about to have their website updated with new information including permit applications. Indications are that the General burn permit will be reissued this year for certain parts of our area, but you should check the website to check whether that covers your location.

Playford Council ~ Local Councillor's Report

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

The COVID-19 pandemic has seen the City of Playford moving with the times and is now live streaming council meetings to ensure the safety of our community during this time. The virtual experience will now enable you to watch the meetings from the luxury of your own home. All you have to do is subscribe to our YouTube channel to be notified on any upcoming live streams by visiting www.youtube.com/cityofplayford.

The Strategic Planning Committee meeting was the first meeting to be streamed live on Tuesday the 14th April 2020. Unfortunately, there were some technical issues with the audio, which I am assured have been rectified.

It is the important time of the year with the Draft 2020/21 Annual Business Plan and Budget, Long Term Financial Plan and Asset Management Plans for Public Consultation due to be released. The Plans are on the agenda of the Ordinary Council Meeting on the 28th April 2020 and if approved will be released for public consultation from the 5th May to the 2nd June 2020. This will see the consultation period increase from 21 days to 28 days and hopefully allow residents and ratepayers an extra 7 days to consider and respond.

The Annual Business Plan and Budget proposes a rate increase of 0.75%, comprising of 0.39% for external cost pressure (State Government Cost Shifting) and 0.42% for new and enhanced services, offset by savings from operating costs of previous initiatives (0.06%). Inflation to maintain Existing Service Standards funded by the General Index (Rate Increase) is presented as Equivalent Rate Revenue percentage at 0.00%. However, it appears that the General Index which is the weighted average South Australian Wage Price Index and the Consumer Price Index is being funded by operational savings. Of the 157 pages, the key budget data shows operating income of \$110.112M, operating expenses of \$108,068M, with an operating result of \$2.044M and net borrowing balance of \$172.275M. If you have questions or feedback, please give me a call.

Please follow the City of Playford's internet page to keep informed and have your say during this process. As your councillor for Ward 3, I will be using my Facebook page Cr David Kerrison – City of Playford to communicate with residents.

OTH Progress Association ~ President's Annual Report

The 2019-20 year started with a steep learning curve following in the shoes of long-term President Ian Slater, who thankfully and kindly made himself available to guide me during the year. Thank you to the outgoing committee for their commitment and support in keeping the Association effective, viable and functional; some of these members have made significant contributions over many years.

A special thank you to Graham Watson for providing behind-the-scenes counselling and support; I may not have made it through the year as President without his dedication and sound advice. Being dual-hatted as Treasurer was not particularly onerous, although having two votes in key decisions carries extra responsibility and accountability.

A very special thank you is also warranted for the fantastic work done by Heather and John Fischer in running the monthly Country Markets, to Pat Jones in managing and cleaning the Hall and to Bindi Hawkey in compiling and editing the Grapevine. These are our core activities and they would not be possible without these strong leaders and tireless workers. While definitely not trying to discourage their ongoing support (🙏!), I would encourage them all to implement succession planning so that we can continue functioning efficiently and effectively when they step back (or even want to take a long holiday!). To achieve this, we need to increase our membership.

New membership is our lifeblood; we all need to work hard to bring new residents and business owners into the Association, or at least to actively support our work. We need their new ideas for projects or activities, and we need their horsepower to help us continue running our existing programmes.

Following the 2017 Playford Council rating process fallout, I maintain an active interest in ensuring that their rating policies will not adversely impact ratepayers and that their programmes and projects continue to benefit all Playford areas. We are lucky to have the regular counsel of Cr David Kerrison and we should harness his enthusiasm and commitment to ensure One Tree Hill is not a target for disproportionate rating decisions and is also not forgotten when money is allocated in infrastructure projects. We are enjoying a strong working relationship with Playford Council and are confident that we are working towards the common good of our ratepayers and residents.

We are also lucky to have the regular support of the local Member for King, Paula Luethen. Paula is a regular attendee at our meetings and we appreciate her tireless efforts to listen to the community and to consult and update us on government initiatives. Paula and her staff continue to provide valuable behind-the-scenes help with local issues.

The transition to the new website (<http://onetreehill.org.au>) and email addresses will save us a lot of money and it has given us considerably more flexibility. We are still maintaining a watch on the old email addresses, but I am hoping that we can save substantial amounts on our telephone bills by discontinuing them soon.

The Grapevine magazine is going strongly with great support from the community and advertisers. However, we are losing money and we need to convince local businesses and community organisations to consider using the Grapevine as part of their marketing and to increase their reach in our district. The Grapevine is available to read online on our website (well before it appears in letter boxes); it would become profitable if we could move our readership online, with us then only needing to print a small number to be available for gold-coin donation at selected stores in the township.

We continue to work with Council regarding the movement of the town information sign adjacent to Jordan Drive, which obstructs the view of westbound traffic on Black Top Rd. Council staff are supportive of our safety concerns and we hope a solution is imminent. We are also following up concerns about the lack of town water with the loss of power (a common event in One Tree Hill and especially during bushfires) with the Minister of Environment and Water. We understand the State Government have plans for emergency backup generators and we have asked them to make this a high priority project.

It was wonderful to open the Street Library at the front of the Institute on 26Feb20 and it is getting good use. This is a great example of how our community can suggest new ideas to improve the township and how Progress can then make things happen. The concept is subject to a 12-month review by Council and we can also decide if we need to expand the concept.

OTH BUSINESS BOOSTER

Due to COVID-19, many of our local people and businesses may be experiencing financial stress. To help combat this, and encourage local business connections, the OTH Progress Association is offering free advertising space in May, June and July editions, to local businesses, organisations or individuals who would normally qualify to advertise in the OTH Grapevine (see page 2). 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The eastern States and SA both experienced an horrific, unprecedented bushfire summer which took many human lives and the lives of countless animals and birds. It was wonderful to see how individuals, families and communities came together to help relieve the suffering and to help communities re-build. Thank you to all those people that donated their money or time to help others.

We are all struggling with the Covid-19 restrictions and they have effectively shut-down all our hall-related operations, including hall hiring and Country Market. However, there are still many things we can do for the community in the background and we should keep going. It was with very heavy hearts that we had to cancel the 2020 ANZAC Day commemorative Dawn Service, but our commitment to continuing this tradition next year remains strong.

You will recall that I reluctantly accepted the President's role this past year as it was on top of learning the role of Treasurer. It was on condition that I would be allowed to run streamlined meetings to a tight agenda and with a goal that they run less than 1 hour. I have generally met this objective, which I think is vital to ensure we don't discourage new (and old) members, who lead busy lives and don't have time for long or tedious meetings during a work/school week.

Again, a big thank you to the outgoing committee members. Unless someone else steps up, I am happy to renominate for another year as President (and Treasurer). If they have the time to regularly attend meetings, I urge everyone to consider standing as a committee member and am hopeful that we can manage a changeover in May while working within the Covid-19 restrictions. 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
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


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What's Flowering In My Garden?

Autumn is upon us with it's cooler days and cooler nights. Daylight Saving has ended for another season, meaning that my outdoor activities are now ending late afternoon. There has been a small amount of rain but all the plants will be revived and refreshed once we receive a lot more precipitation.

The Correas are just waiting for a good drink but *Correa glabra* Turnbull is flowering and is one of a very few plants in flower at the moment. It's colourful red and green tubular, pendulous flowers are displayed against a background of mid green elliptical shaped leaves. This plant has grown about 1m high with a spread of about 1.5m and provides shelter for Blue Wrens and New Holland Honeyeaters. During the Winter/Spring of 2019, the New Holland Honeyeaters built a nest inside this dense bush and the many flowers provided much needed nectar for the adults to feed their young birds. This Correa is a very worthy plant in any garden as it can fill in as space between other larger plants. Several plants, planted along a pathway to create a hedge, can be easily trimmed to maintain the effect of a hedge whilst still enjoying beautiful the flowers that the plants will produce. You may find this plant at any good nursery but it is often found at various plant sales/outlets, but ,sadly, the Australian Plant Sale , due to be held in May, has been cancelled due to Covid 19 virus restrictions. Plant this Correa in your garden and enjoy it's bright mid green leaves and it's red and green flowers as well as the many birds that will enjoy feeding on it's flowers as well as having such an excellent shelter bush for refuge.

Correa glabra Turnbull, a hardy, drought resistant plant is a lovely addition to any garden.

BURNING PERMIT



If you live in the City of Playford you are required to obtain a burning permit between the dates of 1 May 2020 and 31 October 2020.

Some areas are exempted from having to obtain an individual burning permit and are instead covered by a General Notice Burning Permit – per information below.

Burning Permits are issued to enforce the Environment Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016 in accordance with clause 6.

This general notice burning permit is issued by the City of Playford and authorises any person within the following areas of the City of Playford (as defined in the City of Playford Development Plan pursuant to the Development Act 1993) that are within Metropolitan Adelaide (as defined in the Development Act 1993):

- a. The Watershed Zone (Mount Lofty Ranges);
- b. The Hills Face Zone;
- c. Primary Production Zone (Mount Lofty Ranges);

to carry out any of the following burning activities in those areas, outside of the 2019/2020 fire danger season (fixed under the Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005) subject to the conditions set out below:

1. Burning off vegetation for fire prevention or control;

Conditions

2. This burning permit cannot authorise a person to carry out a burning activity under (1) on land if the person is not the owner occupier of the land or does not have the consent or authority of the owner or occupier.
3. A person carrying out a burning activity under (1) and (2) must:
 - Only burn between the hours of 10am and 5pm, Monday to Saturday. NOTE: Burning on Sundays and Public Holidays is prohibited.
 - Create Piles 3m x 3m x 2m Maximum
 - Notify your neighbours prior to the day of burn.
 - Place materials to be burnt in a position that allows for a four-metre clearance around and over the fire.
 - Ensure all piles to be burnt are not in close proximity to other flammable materials including grass and logs.
 - Burn one pile at a time, to ensure that you retain control of each burn.
 - Have appropriate working fire control equipment on standby.
 - Extinguish the fire immediately if smoke or odour is causing a nuisance on another person's property.
 - Stay within the direct vicinity of the immediate burn site if smoke or smoulder is coming off of the burn.
 - On the completion of the burn, ensure the fire is completely extinguished.

You must not: Burn materials mixed into soil or permapine treated with copper arsenate, household rubbish, plastic or rubber.

4. This notice remains in force until 31 October 2020.
5. Individual permits will be considered on a case by case basis in November 2020.

Notes

This burning permit does not authorise the burning of a prohibited substance (Clauses (6)(3)(d) and (7) (1) of the Environment Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016. The fact that a person has complied with the conditions of the burning permit does not:

- a. relieve the person from liability for any loss, damage or harm caused by a fire lit under the authority of the burning permit; or
- b. prevent proceedings for enforcement of the general environmental duty under section 25 of the Environment Protection Act 1993, or for any offence under the Act, in relation to the burning activity (clause 6(5) of the Environment Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016). This permit is subject to any ban, prohibition, restriction, or other requirement under the Fire and Emergency services Act 2005, the Native Vegetation Act 1991 or a prescribed act (clause 5(4) Environment Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016). The hall has a new surround sound system, TV, microphone facilities, and heating and cooling.


Outside you will find a sheltered playground that leads to picturesque garden areas which are ideal for photos.

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NORTHERN FOOTHILLS LAND CARE GROUP

Elusive Echidna event scratched a monotreme itch!

Over 60 community members enjoyed an informative evening learning about the natural behaviour and ecology of echidnas, and their preferred habitat. Renowned echidna expert, Dr Peggy Rismiller, shared her knowledge of the oldest surviving mammal species in the world stating that the short-beaked echidna is the most widely distributed mammal across Australia but are in low numbers. Echidnas mate from six years of age and will breed every three years after that. They live solitary lives and are quite elusive but can be seen any time of the day, although they usually avoid extreme temperatures. A number of community members shared stories of 'pet' echidnas that travel the same route through their property around the same time of day. You may find evidence of echidna on your property from conical-shaped diggings where they have dug for ants or termites.

Echidna live in most habitat types, disturbed or undisturbed. Pam Payne, from the Barossa Bush Gardens shared her invaluable local knowledge on plant species selection and the environmental conditions you should consider when selecting what to plant. Temperature, frost, rainfall, effects of wind, and soil condition will determine what plants are best suited to your patch.

5 things you can do to make a positive difference in your community




