One Tree Hill CFS ~ Incident Report May 2020



A reasonably busy month for the two shifts this month with a couple of unusual calls. Red shift ended their second rotation with a tree down on a shed and a callout for rocks on the road in "Snake Gully", a timely reminder that there are several locations in our local area where debris is washed onto the road during stormy weather creating an extra slippery hazard during winter months.

Trees down were the order of the day for blue shift with 3 occurring in the first 3 days of the shift. One was a kerb-side tree in the township which had fallen across Jordan Drive in the early hours of Saturday the 2nd of May. The next two were on

the following Monday and both occurred on the Gawler-One Tree Hill road near Medlow Road early in the afternoon. These were all cleared quickly without causing much disruption to traffic. The only other call for blue shift was to a car versus tree on Medlow Road, this turned out to be closer to Dalkieth CFS station and their crew arrived before us placing a stop on call for the One Tree Hill appliance.

Red shift had a busy start to their 3rd rotation with 2 vehicle accidents within the first couple of hours. The first call was also for a car versus tree near the "new" roundabout, SAPOL were in attendance when our truck arrived, and our assistance was not required. Significantly, this is one of the first calls we have received to this area since the roundabout was constructed.

The second accident occurred a couple of hours later a bit further down Humbug Scrub Road with the driver lucky to escape with minor injuries after rolling their car. Although they managed to climb out of the car without assistance crews in attendance said that this could have been far worse. There was also another minor accident the following Monday involving a car, a tree and a kangaroo once again on Humbug Scrub Road. Finally, there was a call to the Little Para Treatment plant for a fixed alarm. This is a rather large facility hidden down in the valley near the dam and in this case the alarm was accidentally triggered by one of the staff.

Please take care on the roads



With things slowly getting back to the "new" normal, there are a lot more cars on the roads and across the state we have seen a corresponding increase in serious traffic incidents. As you can see from the report above, we have also started to see an increase locally, fortunately without major injuries. The combination of people emerging from "hibernation" and the winter weather hitting us with a vengeance means we all need to take a bit more care on the roads.

As part of the Brigade getting used to the new mode of operating, we have taken to the Internet to maintain connection between the two shifts. The Captain has held 2 meetings online using Microsoft Teams software provided by the CFS and while there were a couple of hiccups to start off that has been a success. Training is an important part of the CFS, and many members have been taking part in online courses over the last couple of months. The good news this week from central office is that we will soon be able to re-commence practical training on a Monday night initially with only small groups from the active shift but hopefully expanding in the not too far distant future.



Playford Council ~ Local Councillor's Report

HAVE YOUR SAY—Annual Business Plan 2020/21

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

Last month the Draft 2020/21 Annual Business Plan and Budget, Long Term Financial Plan and Asset Management Plans for Public Consultation was deferred pending clarification from Minister Stephan Knoll, as per Council Resolution 4001. The City of Playford is now proceeding with the 28-day consultation period commencing from the 19th of May to the 16th June 2020, (Council resolution 4021). A Public hearing will take place as part of the Services Committee meeting on the 16th June, with options for both in-person and virtual submissions being available for the community to provide their feedback.

Please note the opportunity for in person verbal submissions is subject to change, based on any new advice on social distancing and maximum numbers in the chamber.

The City of Playford's Engagement Hub is being used as a one-stop shop for our community to have their say on the draft business plans. It provides convenient access 24/7 and is available over any browser/device. You can access the Engagement Hub at <https://playford.engagementhub.com.au/>

The Annual Business Plan and Budget incorporates a proposed 0.45% rate increase for 2020/21 raising \$370,000 comprising:

- \$313,000 - 0.39% funding State Government Waste Levy cost pressure.
- \$140,000 - 0.12% funding 11 new and enhanced services.
- (\$47,000) – (0.06%) savings from operating costs of previous initiatives.

The last eighteen months have allowed me the opportunity to work with fellow councillors and the administration staff. There has been a large amount of work done to deliver this economical budget in these difficult times and still deliver for the community. I am waiting to hear and consider all feedback before making my final decision on the rates for 2020/21. I look forward to hearing from the residents of Ward 3 and engaging in constructive discussions. Please view the document online and fill in the feedback forms. If you do not have access to the internet, please let me know and I will be happy to organise a hard copy.

As your Councillor it is my plan in the next twelve months to continue the work with fellow Councillors to drive efficiencies and savings. The two main areas that are currently in my focus are the procurement process and the asset renewal. These are two areas where significant savings maybe found and I wish to ensure the City of Playford is delivering strong financial outcomes for the ratepayers.

The relocation of the OTH Township sign near Jordan Drive was completed in early May. Thank you to the OTH Progress Association, residents and the City of Playford.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and restrictions the Public Consultation process for Fire Safety and Verge Mowing has been delayed. I will continue to work with staff to deliver the consultation when restrictions are lifted.

Please follow the City of Playford's internet page to keep informed and have your say during this process. As your councillor for Ward 3, I will be using my Facebook page Cr David Kerrison – City of Playford to communicate with residents.

Fabulous Fungi Findings Around One Tree Hill

After the recent rains and cooler weather, we have entered “fungus season” - you may have noticed them springing up all over the place, and even perhaps on your own lawn. One Tree Hill local Bruce Hobby has been out hunting fungi with his camera in bushland around our district, and he recently sent me a bunch of photos to showcase his findings. There are so many different kinds, and I thought it would be interesting to share them with you.

I found an excellent fungi identification sheet (a downloadable PDF) on the SA Government’s Natural Resources website for the Adelaide & Mt Lofty Ranges region. The link is shown at the end of this article. I challenge you to go ahead and download the identification sheet to see if you can identify these!

The following text is contained in the identification chart, and is important to remember when out hunting fungi.



Fungi play important roles in all ecosystems from our backyards and school grounds to forests, heath and deserts. Many fungi are recyclers, helping break down dead plant and animal material and putting nutrients back into the soil. Many others form essential partnerships with trees and other plants with the fungi collecting nutrients and water from the soil and passing them to roots. In return the plants provide energy-giving sugars. Fungi may be present all year round but are most common in autumn and winter, particularly following rain. It is important that we don't damage fungi otherwise they can't continue their important roles.



We know very little about the edibility or toxicity of native fungi.

There is no safe way you can tell which ones are safe to eat.

DO NOT EAT ANY FUNGUS FROM THE WILD.


If you touch a fungus, always wash your hands afterwards.





What's Flowering In My Garden?

The Autumn rains have come. All the paddocks are a vibrant green. The Kangaroos and new born lambs nearby are really enjoying the lush new pastures. The dam level is beginning to rise. The most welcome rain has washed off the accumulated dust and grit from all the trees and plants and now, the garden and surrounding bushland are encouraging us to take a walk to enjoy the trees, plants and birds.

Quite a few plants have burst into flower, creating patches of vibrant colour as well as nectar for the birds and the bees. *Eucalyptus fasciculosa*, some of the *Thryptomes* and some of the *Correas* are showing off all their bright colours and flower forms. *Hakea petiolaris* has been flowering for quite a few weeks now and is a delight to admire. This beautiful mature rounded plant has grown about 3 metres high and about 2 metres wide. It has large, round, tough, leathery, deeply veined leaves and its many beautiful ball shaped flowers are borne along the old wood as well as from the leaf axils. The protective flower caps drop off to reveal small tightly compacted lime green balls that display a mauve/purple centre as each flower ball begins to open up. As the cream styles grow and stand out from the centre, the centre colour changes from mauve/purple to a soft pink and the colour develops further to a dark pink as the flower matures. A deep red/brown colour signifies the end of the flowering stage of this flower and is often at this stage that tiny seed capsules, fertilised by birds and bees begin to appear.

With many flowers on this large open bush at various stages of development, this plant offers many shades of lime green, cream, pink and red/pink to enjoy for about 6 weeks during late Autumn to early Spring. The Honeyeaters are enjoying the nectar from these beautiful flowers and the many, many bees can be seen and heard foraging. Clusters of mature seed pods are distributed along this plant's many stems providing a safe home for small spiders and insects. This drought tolerant plant grows naturally in the Darling Range area of Western Australia and adapts well to grow in well drained loamy soil without any additional summer water. It is sometimes available from reputable nurseries and is worthwhile having as a feature plant for its rounded shape, interesting leaf shape and colour and its stunning colourful bird attracting flowers. *Hakea petiolaris* is a stunning plant to enjoy all year round.



Hiking the Andersen Trail near Kersbrook

The Anderson Loop trail is a lovely 8.1 km walk in the Mount Crawford Forest Reserve. The trail starts at a car park off the Little Para Road, 3 km south of Kersbrook, towards Chain of Ponds, and just over half a kilometre from the cemetery. It is a multi-use trail for walking, mountain biking and horse riding.

The trail was set up in 2017, and is part of the Mount Lofty Ranges Trails network. It is well marked with black and yellow trail markers, and can be hiked in either direction. Be sure to keep an eye out for the markers, as they may be hard to spot as the trees have grown since they were erected. The trail follows a series of forest tracks through young pine plantations, native forest and hardwood.

When we first walked this trail 3 years ago, the pine forest had been cleared, after having been destroyed in the Sampson Flat Fire, and the area was very open, quite a bleak landscape. Now the pines have been replanted and the young trees 1 to 3 metres high are just beautiful.


SOME HIGHLIGHTS ALONG THE TRAIL

The trail begins with a walk through 2m high Phalaris grass along a creek flat with many new red gum seedlings. Along the way there is evidence of former Chain of Ponds dwellings with very old exotic trees, including some large pines, now ring barked to allow the native forest to flourish. Off the track but visible is Heatherdale Homestead.

There are a few gentle climbs with stunning views from the top. Good views of the Chain of Ponds reservoir and looking east, the Gumeracha weir. A delightful morning tea stop is beside to two old dams, which hold water in late winter.

Anderson Loop Trail is one of our favourite walks in the local area, and just perfect for a half day walk. More information including digital maps can be obtained from Walking SA website.

Caterpillar Conga Line in Para Wirra

Recently I was sent some photos from Bruce Hobby, who came across a strange conga line of caterpillars in Para Wirra. I was intrigued by this, so I decided to do a little bit of googling on this phenomenon, and in doing so I found it pretty interesting information about caterpillar “procession behaviour”, so I thought I would share it with you.

These hairy caterpillars are the larval stage of the bag-shelter moth. They can often be found in late Summer and Autumn, in clumps around their “food tree” which is usually a wattle. Once they need to find more food, or they are ready to pupate (around May), they head off in search of another food tree or a suitable place to bury themselves and form silk cocoons to sit out the winter, before emerging as bag-shelter moths in October.




A willing leader caterpillar takes charge of the expedition, laying a pheromone trail scent, and the same species caterpillars, often in groups of hundreds, form a head to tail procession in a fascinating caterpillar conga line, blindly following their leader. If the leader stops, the caterpillars clump together and wait in a group until another one decides to be the leader. These caterpillars have been known to accidentally form an endless circle when the leaders of two conga lines pick up the trail left by each other, blindly marching for a week head to tail, before finally dying of hunger after a pointless search for food.

The hairs on these caterpillars are known to cause an itchy rash in humans so it's best not to touch them. They can be dangerous if ingested by pregnant mares and other farm animals, causing a bacterial infection in the placenta via the bloodstream. Farm animals instinctively avoid them.

So next time you see a caterpillar conga line, don't touch, but maybe wave as they pass by, and marvel at a unique display of mother nature at work!




