
From Behind the Desk...

One Tree Hill Progress Association ~ President's Report

Dear Residents,

We continue to be thankful that SA has so far escaped a second wave of Covid-19. Our heartfelt sympathies go out to affected Victorian individuals and families that are doing it tough and we hope that their health authorities can quickly bring things under control. If South Australians keep doing the right thing and heeding the medical advice for social distancing we should get through this safely.

We re-started the Country Market on 1Aug20 and it was very successful, with lovely weather, plenty of customers and a full house inside and lots of outside stalls. The social distancing capacity limitations inside the hall proved not to be a problem with our normal crowd numbers. Heather and John organised entry and exit procedures that flowed well; almost everyone was willing to cooperate by providing contact tracing details. Thanks to all the participants and customers for their support.

The Association met on 13Aug20. We are progressing several issues, including the replacement of the town map, footpath and gutter repairs in front of the hall and discussions with Council re flowerbeds restricting parking and causing traffic visibility problems on Blacktop Road. We received a less-than-satisfactory response from SA Water regarding the lack of water in a general power outage and we will be following this up again through the State Government.

The South Australian Government's Emergency Management (Public Activities No7) (COVID-19) Direction came into effect on 14Aug20 and it further restricts the use of the Hall (whether indoor or outdoor) to a maximum of 100 people when used as a private place. Any public meetings must be seated and attendance records need to be kept.

From 21Aug20, a Covid Marshall is required where prescribed operations are conducted; this includes all ceremonies at the Hall and onsite purchase and consumption of food or beverages (whether occurring in an indoor or outdoor area). Hall users affected by the new requirements will need to appoint a suitably qualified Covid Marshall to oversee the event in accordance with the Direction.

All that said, the Market is not a private event so the social distancing requirements and maximum room numbers will be the same as the last market, but since we have onsite purchase of food, we will be appointing a Covid Marshall. More detailed information on Covid-19 restrictions is available on our website and on the SA Government website https://www.covid-19.sa.gov.au/.

Our next meeting will be held at 7:30pm on Thursday 10Sep20; I hope to see you there.





Playford Council ~ Local Councillor's Report

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

It was fantastic to see return of the One Tree Hill markets in August. I attended the market with Mayoral Candidate Shaun Reardon to meet and listen to the residents. Thank you to everyone who came along to discuss their issues and concerns about the City of Playford.

This month for the September OTH Markets, I've invited our Mayor for the City of Playford - Glenn Docherty to join me to listen and engage with the local community. I am pleased to advise that he has accepted the invitation and will be in attendance between 9:30am to 10:30am.

In November 2019 at the Ordinary Council Meeting I moved the Motion on Notice – Fire Safety and Verge Mowing (Council Resolution 3836). I understand the difficulties with COVID-19, however the engagement process with the community seeking public feedback on our current processes has been a long time coming.

As part of the consultation process there will be an article in the Playford News covering the Verge Application Process, City Operations Current Verge Tractor Slashing Program, Native Vegetation & Bushfire Management and Having Your Say. There will be a targeted direct mail out (via Australia Post) to Ward 1 & 3 residents. The postal mailout is planned to be aligned with the Playford News distribution on the 14th and 15th of September 2020. The verge mowing, maintenance and fire safety has been one of the largest concerns raised to me since becoming an elected member. Please ensure that we all support this process and Have Your Say.

I'm looking forward to the One tree Hill markets in September, hopefully see you there.

so we can't offer all our usual activities and toys but we're making the most of being able to meet again.



What's Flowering In My Garden?



Winter is certainly upon us with some cold blustery days as well as some very welcome showers and, at times, rain. My garden and our roadsides have been brightened by the many golden blossoms from all the flowering Wattles that are now in full bloom. What a brilliant sight to enjoy.

One wattle, Acacia myrtifolia, grows locally in the One Tree Hill area as well as the forested areas of Para Wirra and adjacent bushland areas. This medium sized rounded tree with purple/brown branches and stems will grow approximately 1m to 1.5m high and wide. It bears smooth leathery elongated leaves that display prominent midribs and yellow edges. During Winter this small tree is covered with many small bunches of pale yellow to pinkish red round flower buds that open to reveal many beautiful soft yellow ball shaped flowers. Many insects visit this plant and thus pollinate the flowers. Nearby, another Acacia myrtifolia has dark green branches and stems and displays flower buds that are of an orange pink red shade. The different colours exhibited by these two plants are examples of the diversity of the plant species. Reddish brown wavy seed capsules are produced with the seed being released when the outer seed casings twist open during warm to hot weather in late Spring or early Summer. Many birds eg Parrots and Pigeons will feast on the seed that has been shed and they share the seed with foraging ants. Acacia myrtifolia is not a long live plant and may become a little untidy. It can be grown easily from seed or purchased as a seedling from various Native Plant Nurseries. You may find this Wattle amongst the many plants that will be available from the Native Plant Sale to be held at the Wayville Showgrounds on Saturday 12th and Sunday 13th September.

Acacia myrtifolia is a lovely flowering small tree that is a welcome addition to any garden as it provides a stunning beautifull splash of soft yellow throughout the garden at the end of our Winter.



Mindfulness...

A Mental Health & Wellbeing Article by One Tree Hill Local Natasha Steen

You might have heard the reference to "mindfulness" ... You might have taken little or no notice of this popular concept that seems to be floating around the media! Maybe you have given it a moment of interest but quickly dismissed it as not for you! Or just maybe you are aware of mindfulness and practising this in some way or maybe you are interested and want to know more......



By taking a moment to read this brief article I am hopeful that you might consider that there is a place for some mindfulness for you in some shape or form. It need not be another thing to do or a fancy process - just learning a different way of focusing and thinking.

Mindfulness can be defined as a mental state where we are conscious and aware of the present moment we are in. Most people know of this as a meditation technique, where a

counsellor may support you to bring calm to your mind and be more accepting and aware of your current feelings etc. Practising this technique can also be done through a range of online "apps" that show us how to slow and clear our thinking. If you are interested in this - I particularly like the "Insight Timer" app - this has 100s of free meditation and relaxation sessions that you can listen to and relax with. These sessions range from 2 mins to 2 hours.


Mindfulness...

The true secret to this concept is not just spending a 2 min session once per day or once per week. But learning how to take mindfulness into your day and through your interactions. It is yet another example of a simple thing we can control that can make our ride in life a little more enjoyable!

We live in a busy world where multitasking seems to be a sign of success. We place pressure on ourselves to go faster to supposedly feel we are succeeding. So how can you actively take charge to find the joy in the little moments. How can you take note of the "here and now" and not have your mind racing in a million different directions? Here are a few tips;

- Try practising mindfulness when you are doing routine activities. Think of routine things you do every day like brush your teeth, maybe make your bed (!?) or hang out some washing. Instead of pushing through the task with your brain working frantically. Try taking notice of the simplicity of what you are doing and using these patches in your day to actively slow down. Breathe, feel your feet on the ground and notice the moment.
- Have a go at practising when you first wake up. Yep invest a wee bit of time before you rush by quietly thinking calm, grounding thoughts before your busy day begins. Taking this time to breathe and clear your head can really set the tone for your day.
- Through your day let your mind relax and wander for sure! This is healthy too but do learn to teach yourself to gently and lovingly come back to the moment.
- Pick a prompt that you can use to teach yourself to be more mindful. For you, it might be a cup of tea, time sitting next to your dog, looking at a favourite photograph or a certain item you walk past. Use this prompt to remind yourself to take time for this mindful mode.
- Take notice of the little things around you stop and truly focus on one conversation at a time. We might think we are more efficient by talking on the phone while we drive or playing an online game while we have a family chat but consider the gains of one thing at a time.

By practising mindfulness we can train our brain to be more efficient - it helps us to be less distracted and more focussed. Please reach out if you would like to know more.
