



Dear Residents,

The OTH Progress Association was very saddened to hear of the passing of long-term resident Lance Walter. In addition to his many years of service and dedication to the CFS, Lance was a life member of Progress, through which he worked tirelessly to serve the community over many decades. In his earlier days, Lance was a member of the OTH cricket team, and he was well known for bowling medium paced "spinners" with good effect! We would also like to acknowledge the many years that his wife Hazel supported the Association as the Hall cleaner and coordinator. We send our deep condolences to his family and we have given a donation to the OTH CFS in his memory.

The SA Government Emergency Management Direction on 18Nov20 resulted in a complete closure of the Institute and a cancellation of our 5Dec20 Country Market. The planned Twilight Market will be replaced by a special Christmas Market on Saturday 19th December. Please check our website and Facebook pages for the latest information, including the impact on our upcoming markets.

I am very appreciative that Bruce Whittington has stepped up to help us as Secretary until the next AGM in Apr/May next year. Bruce and I share an Air Force background and he is a very capable and organised person.

Thank you to the people that completed the Grapevine survey over the past couple of months; the main messages we received back are:

- ⇒ 66% say range and quality is Excellent and 80% say design and layout is Excellent
- ⇒ 60% visit our website at least once per month, 80% are engaged by the content and 100% say it connects them to the community
- ⇒ Readers want more local information about people, places, historical info, hobby farms, and environmental articles.

The Grapevine compiler has taken your feedback on board. We look forward to the community continuing to support her by submitting news and information to share with others through your community magazine. The online survey is still active on our webpage.

We recently met with the City of Playford regarding a review of the township garden beds on Blacktop Road and they are reviewing the planning issues that lead to their installation. With the excellent publicity through a Channel 7 news story and a Bunyip article we are still actively trying to increase community awareness about the lack of town water during a power outage. Local MP Paula Luethen is following the matter up for us through the relevant Minister's departments.

Progress last met on 12Nov20 and we heard representations from the OTH Sports Association and associated members (Cricket/Tennis/Soccer) about the exciting McGilp Road Sports and Education Precinct plans. These plans propose newly designed clubrooms and upgrades to the oval and parking areas (see separate article). Progress has committed to supporting the development application and, if funding is secured, will ensure that the community is given opportunity to have their say about the plans.

Our next meeting will be held at 7:30pm on Thursday 10Dec20; I remain ever hopeful that we will see some new faces at the Institute. The Progress Association committee wishes you and your family a very Merry Christmas and Happiness and Prosperity for 2021.

One Tree Hill CFS ~ November Report

Where do I start? It was a massive month, and this is a massive report, my apologies. First off, it has been a tumultuous year and it seems too early but the members of the OTH CFS would like to wish readers a very safe, incredibly happy Christmas and New Year period. As I write, we are back in lock-down, but it has already been announced that restrictions will be lifted. This has not affected operations except for non-emergency incident related activities such as training.

November has been hectic to say the least and there is not space to go into detail about all the incidents that have occurred this month. Here is a summary since my last report:

- 20/10 Gould Creek: Assist resident, cat stuck in a wall
- 27/10 Yattalunga: Rubbish or waste fire, no-one monitoring
- 28/10 Sampson Flat: Vehicle roll-over on Hannaford Hump/ One Tree Hill Roads
- 02/11 Hillbank: Car fire in paddock
- 02/11 Williamstown: 4th alarm house fire, call for BA (Breathing Apparatus) operators
- 02/11 Waterloo Corner: shed on fire ... very smelly fire in containers!!
- 03/11 Burton: 3rd alarm grass fire started from an unattended burn-off
- 04/11 Blakeview: Hay bales on fire on Bentley Road
- 05/11 One Tree Hill: Grass fire burning near vehicles, upgraded to Vehicle fire
- 05/11 One Tree Hill: Car versus tree, fortunately no serious injuries
- 05/11 Sampsons Flat: Motor bike versus guard rail, rider transported to hospital
- 07/11 Yattalunga: Car run off the road by a kangaroo in Para Wirra, no serious injuries
- 09/11 One Tree Hill: Grass fire started by slasher
- 10/11 Mallala: Para tanker called to a large grass fire
- 10/11 Lower Light: Grass fire started by lightning;

- 12/11 Blakeview: Called in as a grass fire but turned out to be a haystack fire
- 12/11 Blakeview: Strike Team: changeover crews for haystack fire
- 12/11 Blakeview: Haystack reignition, by this time, the haystack had been thoroughly wet down, demolished and spread over several hundred square metres but still reignited
- 14/11 Blakeview: Grass fire in suburban park, threatening houses
- 14/11 Bibaringa: Car in ditch
- 15/11 One Tree Hill: Bush alight, quickly extinguished
- 15/11 Waikerie: Cascading strike team to assist with large grass fire caused by lightning
- 16/11 Sampson Flat: Tree down across Kersbrook Road
- 17/11 Humbug Scrub: Clean-up car versus tree on Humbug Scrub/Kersbrook roads
- 18/11 Blakeview: 2nd alarm grass fire in paddock near Main North Road
- 19/11 Yumali: Cascading strike team to large crop fire caused by electricity wire down
- 19/11 Yumali: 2nd strike team
- 20/11 Kapunda: Assist SAAS with patient lift
- 20/11 Yumali: Call for strike teams to assist with mop-up

As you can see, exceptionally busy and a credit to all the members who have responded, and a big well done to the new members. We all hope things will quiet down!! Some things to take away:

- even though the grass is not completely cured right now, it will still burn given the right conditions, (I think I mentioned that last month!)
- anyone who witnessed the amazing lightning show on the 10th of November should be in awe of the power of nature. The amazing thing was that we did not have a fire locally, and
- Take care on the roads, trees inevitably win!!



Some people have asked about the use of the town sirens. Most people will know that the siren is tested every Monday night at 7:30 – at this time we are just making sure it works if we need it.

In case of emergency threatening the township or local area, particularly nearby grass fires, the siren will sound for a short period and then turn off, and possibly sounded again at regular intervals while the threat remains.

If you hear the siren at any other time other than 7:3-pm on a Monday night, you should use it as a prompt to seek further information, whether by walking outside and looking around, contacting neighbours, listening to the radio, calling the Bushfire Information Hotline (1800 362 361) or by checking the Alerts app, CFS website or social media feeds. Do not rely on one source of information (including not relying on the siren to sound), there are many, and be ready to enact your bushfire plan.

Finally, Fire Danger Season dates have been gazetted as 1st of December to 30th of April, this does not mean you can burn-off until the start of December, the Playford Council General Permit expired on 31st of October, the Adelaide Hills Council may have different conditions. Please check with your local council, it is up to you to ensure you are covered.



Playford Council ~ Local Councillor's Report

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

What a year it has been living with the concerns and restrictions of COVID-19. While we have been fortunate in SA, I am hoping that the swift and decisive action by our State Government will see the current cluster outbreak dissolved and the lifting of restrictions in the lead up to Christmas.

I would like to take the opportunity to wish everyone all the best for a safe and happy Christmas.

The need for a back up power supply ensuring water delivery for One Tree Hill Township residents has not been satisfied by SA Water. While this is a State Government issue, it is one that has been raised by locals for over ten years. As a local resident of the area and one of your council representatives, I will continue to work along with the OTH Progress Association advocating to see the delivery of an independent on site auto switching back up power supply. Thank you to Paula Luethen, who met with me to further discuss the topic on the 13th of November 2020.

On the 14th December 2020, I am pleased to announce that we will have the opportunity to meet with the Member for Spence, Nick Champion and the new Labor Candidate for King, Rhiannon Pearce, to further discuss the One Tree Hill water supply concerns. Obviously, COVID-19 restrictions pending.

The month of November has also seen me advocating on behalf of the community with Paula Luethen to receive the maximum amount of funding possible from the State government for the planned McGilp Recreation upgrade. The funding is an imperative step to see the plan upgrade delivered now to meet the community's needs. I would also like to see further funding from the Department of Education towards the upgrade, as the school uses and has used the council facilities (McGilp Oval) for as long as I can remember without shared use agreements. I believe that it is fair that the Department of Education make a significant contribution.

It is hard to fathom where the year has gone and this is despite some fairly long quiet days at home! Really, compared to our Victorian counterparts, we have had a small taste of lockdown. Amongst it all we have had the schmozzle of the US election – what a divided Nation.

Yet through all of this I am taking a big deep breath. I am wanting to take "tumultuous 2020" and selfishly gain from it! Ever the optimist I am going to reflect on what I have learnt from this time. Yep - I apologise as this month I am taking the space with an opinion piece!

My immediate family are not so bad to spend time with - but we sure need our own space and to respect whatever rocks our individual socks! Yes, we have many shared interests, but we do need a bit of space to do our own things. 


OTH Vets Say ~ Watch Out For Grass Seeds!



It's the time of year, when the weather gets hotter, the grass turns brown and grass seeds turn into dangerous objects.

Grass Seeds get stuck in the strangest places and can cause real damage to our pets, eyes, ears, nose, skin and many other places.



It is important to check our pets daily for these hidden dangers, check between toes, in and around ears and in fur. Just one grass seed can burrow its way into an ear canal and if left can cause infections and damage to ear drums. They can pierce the skin in between toes and burrow their way up legs under the skin, causing inflammation, pain, irritation and swelling. Seeds can be sniffed up noses, causing sneezing, head shaking and infections.

If your pets shows signs of skin swelling, head shaking, rubbing ears, sneezing, discharge, biting and hair loss get them to your local vet clinic. Sometimes grass seeds are easy to detect and removed by your veterinarian and other times they need sedations, Anaesthetic and surgical removal.

Please check your pets everyday, especially if you have a lot of grass seeds in your area. Contact your local vet clinic if you have any concerns.

It was a fantastic night and all who participated had an amazing time. We look forward to doing it all again next year!







One Tree Hill Loses A Local Legend Vale Lance Walter (1923 - 2020)



What's Flowering In My Garden?

Summer is almost upon us but Spring, with the mild weather and rain, has been most enjoyable and bearable. The weeds that were cut a few weeks ago have burst into regrowth but they will be cut again to reduce the fire risk.

Calothamnus quadrifidis is flowering and is a delight to observe and enjoy. With the common name of One Sided Bottlebrush or Common Net bush, this plant grows throughout a large area of southwestern Western Australia in gravelly granite and loamy free draining soils. This small open bush grows about 1.5m high and may grow to 3m wide without pruning and has narrow needle like soft green, almost lime green, rounded leaves.

Lovely soft yellow flowers are held in clusters along the older stems and emerge from soft lime green buds. Some of the clusters cascade downwards which means that the New Holland Honeyeaters appear to hang gymnastically upside down in order to insert their long beaks into the flowers to collect the nectar. As the flowers age the colour changes from soft yellow to a subtle pinkish tan shade. In any garden this plant can be grown as an individual specimen plant or planted with other plants to create a hedge or windbreak. Once established this very hardy bush does not need any additional Summer watering.

A good prune after flowering will result in a well shaped bush that will be enjoyed for many years. A brilliant red flowering form, which has just finished flowering, has been visited by many Honeyeaters during the past six weeks. This bush is not found very often in general garden nurseries but can be found at specialist native nurseries. Calothamnus quadrifidis is just a delight to have in the garden.

Just beautiful.

One Tree Hill Tennis Club has had an exciting start to the 2020/2021 season. This season we have three junior teams playing competition tennis on Saturday mornings.

For the first time ever we have two 'orange ball' teams. The Orange ball competition is a great start for up and coming players, with a few changes to help smooth the way into learning how to play tennis. It is played on a slightly smaller court, the winner is the first to 4 games using tennis scoring, and once you reach deuce, the next point wins.









Parents are asked to be on the court helping the children learn to score and give encouragement. Each child plays two doubles and a singles. We have a boys and a girls team in this competition.







We also have a 'green ball' team which is the next step up from 'orange ball'. The full court is used with tennis scoring, and at this level the children score for themselves with parents watching from outside the court. This team is playing in the boys competition due to our small numbers in this skill range, but the team comprises of two boys and two girls.



The players train once a week, but we also have a few children who come out each week to train only, and occasionally fill-in when needed.




