One Tree Hill Progress Association ~ President's Report

Dear Residents,

At the time of writing we are still waiting on a formal response from the Minister for Environment and Water regarding our concerns with the lack of town water during power outages. It was great to see so many of the City of Playford Councillors from other Wards attend our 6Feb21 Country Market (in trying weather conditions!). We really appreciate the interest shown by the councillors in the One Tree Hill community and especially their support for our concerns for backup power for our water pumping station.

No progress on the review of the township flowerbeds and the impact on parking. After 3 months, the City of Playford have directed our request to the Department of Infrastructure and Transport and we are awaiting contact from them. Rest assured that the traffic and safety aspects of the flowerbeds are being considered and weighed against the amount of available parking in the township. However, it is exceedingly difficult to find accessible parking during busy periods and this often unduly affects local businesses through the loss of their customer parking spaces.

We have been advised that there are no immediate sources of funding for the McGilp Recreation Park upgrade proposals. The City of Playford will hopefully look favourably on adding the project to their Strategic Plan for future funding allocation, but other sources of funding from either the State or Federal Government will likely be required. The One Tree Hill Sports Association is still the lead-agency for this project, and we will help them to foster community support to lobby the various levels of Government to secure funding.

The Progress Association will be holding a modified ANZAC Day commemorative service on 25Apr21. The intention is to hold a normal commemorative service under a Covid-19 Management Plan, with no food, drinks or displays and the only access inside the Hall will be the toilets. More information in next month's Grapevine.

Our Bibaringa, Uleybury and Yattalunga residents have been moved from the King State Government electorate to the Schubert electorate. The Progress Association will now be interacting with two State parliament Members when considering local issues that have government input.

Our next meeting will be held at 7:30pm on Thursday 11Mar21; it would be lovely to see some new faces there! Our AGM is planned for 13May21 - we really need more people to get involved in our activities to support the local community.

One Tree Hill CFS ~ February Report

Milder weather and some heavy rain resulted in this month being much quieter for the crew at One Tree Hill CFS. However, the extremely hot and windy conditions on Sunday the 24th meant the reporting month started with the team on stand-by. Fortunately, things were relatively quiet out our way but not so down south where several allegedly



deliberately lit fires culminated in the Cherry Gardens fire. A crew from OTH was dispatched on strike team on the Sunday night and worked through the night to contain the blaze. A second crew backed them up the following day and were assisted late in the day by heavy rain which in turn made the fireground too slippery for the appliances.

Many appliances from surrounding brigades were dispatched a couple of days later to a grass fire in the Barossa Goldfields area on Allendale Road. Although the fire was in a potentially dangerous area, it had been called in from multiple surrounding properties and the quick response and assistance of the bombers meant that the fire was quickly brought under control and the burn was restricted to a small area.

The Brigade has also been called to 4 Vehicle accidents during the month, one involving a stobie pole and another involving a tree. Just a reminder that after we get rain following long spells of warm to hot weather the roads can become extremely slippery so take care. Another hazard we face in the wet and windy conditions is falling trees and branches and a local resident was reportedly very lucky when a tree fell on Cornishmans Hill Road narrowly missing their car. Although we were dispatched to this incident the road had been cleared by locals before we arrived, this callout was not in vain however as the crew were diverted to a second tree down partially blocking Yorketown Road.



Not quite there...

Although we have had some cooler weather recently, the hot spell in the middle of February reminds us that we are not quite through fire season yet and that we must remain vigilant. The Fire Danger season officially ends on the 30th of April in the Mount Lofty Ranges area and as of the date of writing, that is still nearly ten weeks away. If you have any questions about what is permitted during Fire Danger season, please refer to the CFS web-site.

Playford Council ~ Local Councillor's Report

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

Who wants to see the McGilp Recreation Park Redevelopment? It is needed however it is not in Council's medium-term priorities for funding.

The positive news is that the City of Playford have concept plans for the redevelopment as a shovel ready design which includes the creation of two soccer pitches – one senior and one junior, upgrade of the carpark, change rooms, improvements to the stormwater and wastewater management systems. It also includes an indicative area for a BMX track in the design.

The cost of the upgrade is approximately \$3M and to progress with this redevelopment in the short term, Council will need to receive significant funding from the State or Federal Government. While our local MP has been a fantastic supporter for the redevelopment, I'd like to see funding on the table to see the redevelopment delivered in the short term.

Why would I be seeking the assistance of the State Government? The Redevelopment will significantly benefit the One Tree Hill Primary School who is using the oval facilities without shared use contributions from the Department of Education. The use of the McGilp Recreation Reserve facilities and lack of funding from the Department of Education has been continuing since the 1970's. The upgraded design of the carpark will improve traffic flow for the school especially around school drop-off and pick-up times.



I will be making a Petition available to raise support and obtain the commitment of the State Government to allocate at least half of the funds for the delivery of the entire upgrade of McGilp Recreation Park. I'd appreciate your support in signing the Petition and hopefully together we can see the upgrade delivered.

If you wish to discuss the plans please give me a call or alternatively come and visit me at the local community engagement sessions:

- One Tree Hill Markets on Saturday the 6th of March between 9am & 11:30am
- McGilp Recreation Park on Wednesday the 10th of March between 6pm & 7pm
- One Tree Hill General Store on Sunday the 21st of March between 10am & 1pm

The One Tree Hill Cemetery has been raised by a local resident and I have confirmed that there are no new leases funding to be available for burial plots and there is only one lease left available for the cremation niche / memorial wall. I've asked if the City of Playford is able to undertake a review of the case for the construction of a new niche / memorial wall at the OTH cemetery. It is anticipated that this may require funding for the construction of a new wall through the budget process. I'll keep you updated as this progresses.





Do you have a smart watch or a fitness band!? I am amazed how many people do... Apparently one of the most gifted items over recent years!

These devices offer many beaut features. Features that take a focus on keeping us active or enable us to receive reminders or even wave our wrist over the EFTPOS machine! The one feature I question is the one that reminds you to BREATHE or RELAX!!!!

We live in a worrying world where people need to be reminded to take a moment to relax, notice the small things and take a few deep breaths.

OTH Vets Say ~ Fight Against Fleas!

We are right in the midst of flea season, fleas love the warm weather. It is thought that fleas are only around in the summer, but that is not the case they are around all year, just more prevalent in the warmer months. They can become a burden to our cats and dogs and cause lots of health issues for them, as well as biting us humans.






An adult female flea can lay around 40 eggs per day on your pet. The eggs will then fall off in the environment. The eggs can take 2 days to 2 weeks to hatch into larvae, depending on the temperature. The larvae then take 5-20 days to become pupae, which is protected in a cocoon. The cocoon can protect the pupae for weeks or sometimes even years. When a potential host is present the pupae will emerge from its cocoon and start feeding on that host, and then the cycle continues.

Fleas can be very bad news for your pets, not only do they bite and cause irritations to your pets skin, they can cause flea allergy dermatitis, hair loss and in more severe cases severe anaemia.


When it comes to fleas, prevention is always better than cure. There are lots of products that you can purchase to keep your pets and family flea free. It's best to avoid flea collars and flea powders as they only kill fleas for a short period of time, and generally do not kill the eggs. It is best to use good quality spot on treatments and chews. These products are

best purchased at your local veterinary clinic to ensure you get the correct treatment that you require.



If you do find fleas on your pet, it is almost certain that you will have fleas in your house environment, and it is then necessary to treat your house and all the other pets. Washing blankets and bedding on a high temperature, using flea bombs and sprays in the house, being careful not to use products which could harm your pets and of course a good quality regular flea prevention, to keep them away.



What's Flowering In My Garden?

There has been a very good day or so of rain with the rain gauge capturing 36mls during the rain event. The rain was not welcomed during the first market for the year, but the trees and shrubs have all been washed of built up dust and all are now refreshed. There's a few warm days forecast but we are coming to the end of Summer.

Callistemon Injune has been flowering and providing a splash of soft pink to cream flowers for some time now during Summer. With several plants in the garden, they have not all flowered at the same time, thus providing a staggered flowering season. This plant, which is a variety of Callistemon sieberi can be grown as a single stem small tree or as a multi stemmed rounded compact bush reaching up to 2m high. It has typical bottle brush leaves, perhaps 3-4mm wide and 20-25mm long. The soft grey green shade provided a perfect backdrop to the small almost delicate rosy pink bottle brush flowers that appear along thinnish grey stemmed branchlets. The colour of the flowers fade after a few days to a creamy off white shade. The insects, bees and New Holland Honeyeaters are all attracted to these lovely sprays of flowers.

This is a very hardy Callistemon that does not require any additional Summer watering but, if it does receive a drink during Summer, it will quickly produce a mass of flowers. The drooping nature of the flower spikes adds an interesting feature to this plant. It is sometimes found in good nurseries and through specialist native plant nurseries.

Callistemon Injure is such a lovely plant to have in any garden. I must plant a few more.

Just beautiful.



Works on the One Tree Hill Road Upgrade (between Hannaford Hump and Shillabeer Roads) have commenced from 1 February and are expected to be completed in June.

This \$2.2m project is being jointly undertaken by Playford and TTG Councils as part of the Roads to Recovery Program. Traffic Management will be in place during the works, so plan for delays, and take care while travelling through the area.
