One Tree Hill Progress Association ~ President's Report

Dear Residents,

The Minister for Environment and Water has responded regarding our concerns with the lack of town water during power outages. The message regarding the increased fire-related risk to property from not having a permanent backup generator at the OTH Water Pumping Station has been acknowledged and understood. The Minister advises that a permanent generator solution is eligible for funding under the Australian Government's Disaster Risk Reduction Program and that he will be supporting an application from his department.

Still no progress on the review of the township flowerbeds and the impact on parking. We have written to the City of Playford again to find out who (in the Department of Infrastructure and Transport) they redirected our request to. It is now over 6 months since our original request was made to Playford.

Given the concerns raised by the SA Department of Health with ANZAC Day COVID-Safe management plans being prepared by RSLs and other event organisers, the Progress Association has been forced to re-think our ANZAC Day commemorative service plans for 25Apr21. The event will now be held inside the Hall under the auspices of our existing COVID-Safe Plan and attendance will be limited to 130 people on a pre-registration basis. Please see the separate Grapevine notice regarding attendance requirements. If anything changes after the GV goes to print, we will put a notice on our webpage.

Our next meeting will be held at 7:30pm on Thursday 8Apr21, with our AGM planned for Thursday 13May21 at 7:30pm. You are always welcome to attend our Progress Association meetings as an observer to see how we are providing community support services.

One Tree Hill CFS ~ March Report



The Incident Report for the last month is exceptionally short with only 2 fire calls, both out of the area. The first at Bolivar just behind the Caltex service station between Port Wakefield Road and the new expressway, and the second not far away in Burton between Waterloo Corner and Diment Roads. In both cases, the 11,000 litre Bulk Water Carrier stationed at One Tree Hill was called to provide water for the trucks on the fireground.

Highlight of the month for the Brigade was the second annual CFS Soccer Shield played between One Tree Hill and Tea Tree Gully Soccer Clubs. This year's event, on the 27th of February, was organised by the OTH club and was held, in perfect weather, at the Munno Para ground home of the OTH seniors. The day included amusements for the kids, a raffle, BBQ and bar, and CFS demonstrations. Feature of the day were the soccer games between the two clubs running from 12 o'clock until 6:30 with games between Under 7s, Under 12s, Colts, Reserves, and the Senior team. At the end of the day, Tea Tree Gully won the Shield by one goal on goal aggregate.

The CFS Brigades were well represented on the day with units on display from both Brigades and many of the kids (some not so young) were able to get their hands wet have a squirt on the hoses. High point for the CFS was the penalty shoot out between the two Brigades with One Tree Hill victorious 3-0. Both Brigades wish to thank the two clubs involved and especially those involved in organising the event. We would also like to thank the businesses that donated to the raffle, and for making the day a great success with a final tally of \$5700 being donated to the two CFS brigades.

Changes to Regulations



Several amendments were introduced to the Fire and Emergency Service Regulations, taking effect from the 1st of March, to help reduce the risk of bushfires in the state. The amendments provide greater definition on the types of equipment and the conditions under which they can be used during the fire danger season. The use of hot tools, such as oxy cutters and angle grinders, which have been the cause of many fires over the years, are particularly affected. The most significant change is that the cleared area required to operate these tools has been increased from 4 metres to 10 metres. There has also been an increase in the initial expiation notice fees (fines), from \$315 to \$473, applicable to people found not adhering to the regulations. Additional information can be found under "media releases" on the CFS website.

The Brigade has an interesting training night for members in the coming week with the State Operations Brigade coming out to conduct an exercise with their Satellite and Communications trailers. This gives us not only the opportunity to become familiar with this state-of-the-art equipment but also to work with the Operations Brigade.

With Easter already upon us, the members of the OTH CFS would like to wish everyone a happy, healthy, and safe Easter. Unfortunately, this is also the time of year when we get the first breaks in the weather, resulting in more hazardous road conditions. After a year when a lot of people have been unable to get away, please be extra careful on the roads in the upcoming weeks.

Playford Council ~ Local Councillor's Report

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

Thank you to all the residents who visited me at the OTH Markets. It was another fantastic day.

The McGilp Recreation Park upgrade and the Petition to obtain the commitment of the State Government to allocate at least half of the funds towards the delivery of the entire upgrade was this month's focus. The City of Playford has been sourcing funding through the competitive grant funding initiatives, however these grant applications (if successful) will only see portion of the concept upgrade delivered. I'd like to see our local MP – Paula Luethen, seek the commitment of the State Government to deliver at least 50 percent of the funds to deliver the entire upgrade. This will then deliver the carpark upgrade, which is needed to ensure improved traffic flows, especially around school pick up and drop off times.

The community support has been strong. The only concerns raised so far is around the BMX track and the impact it may have on the local residents. The suggestions have been to improve the area with trees and walking trails in place of the BMX track. I have discussed these concerns with the City of Playford and raised the need for community engagement in the detailed plan and design phase.

The efforts for the onsite backup generator to ensure the town's water supply continues. The drive started well over ten years ago by long term locals, Peter Watson, Pat Jones, Margaret Watson, Lance Walters and Albert Baggs, (as pictured Messenger news Paper around 2011).

In follow up from the meeting at Paula Luethen's office on the 14th January 2021 with representatives from Minister David Spiers Office, Minister Vincent Tarzia's Office, the CFS, SA water, One Tree Hill Progress Association and myself as local Councillor now have a response from David Spiers (Minister for Environment and Water).



Minister David Spiers advises that the permanent generator solution is eligible for funding under the Australian Government's Disaster Risk Reduction Program and that he will be supporting an application to be made to this funding program. The minister further advised as of the 12th February 2021, work was under way to prepare the application.

Thank you to David Spiers, and everyone involved over many years. I certainly hope the funding application is successful. I will be continuing conversations with Paula Luethen MP encouraging a backup plan to secure the \$50,000 if the application were to be unsuccessful.

The Humbug Scrub Fire Siren is progressing slowly to date due to several factors. The siren is not a council matter however I will continue to work with the One Tree Hill Progress Association for a resolution. Thank you to all concerned who have contacted and communicated with me on the importance of the siren to the community.

It was a pleasure to meet Ashton Hurn – Liberal candidate for Schubert, (2022 state election) at the One Tree Hill Progress Association on the 11th March 2021. The changes in the electoral boundaries will see residents in Humbug Scrub, Bibaringa, Yattalunga, Sampsons Flat and Uleybury now in the Schubert electorate.

The time of year has arrived and discussions on the rates for next year have begun. Hopefully the last two years of advocating for improved business plans and downwards pressure on rate increases will deliver for the residents and ratepayers. Please have your say when the ABP for 2021/22 is released for consultation.

Communication and Your Inner Voice

My topic for this month relates to my passion for communication! Yes this is near and dear to my heart. Something I will never tire of supporting people with! Something I probably should stop nagging my family about! I believe that improving how we communicate with ourselves and others is the key to being the best version of ourselves!

As a Counsellor and Coach I hear many personal stories.... listening to various life stories can be pretty sad at times. Amongst these, there is often a confronting theme of people who have such poor "self talk". I feel very concerned when I listen to how some people describe their inner voice or self critic. If these people talked to their friends like they talk to themselves I don't think they would have these friends for long. How can such self talk be tolerated? How exhausting must this be? What a barrier to getting on with a more positive experience in day to day life!

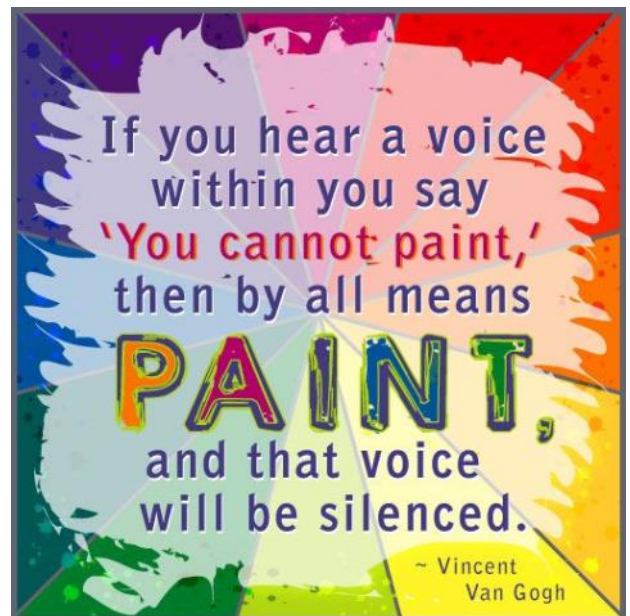
The reality is that many people have lived through challenging upbringings, traumatic experiences or environments with little nurturing. Sometimes we grow up in environments that are on the whole just fine but we didn't learn how to own our own praise and make sense of emotions. When people have had these experiences it is not surprising they have such poor self talk. Often a big focus of my counselling support becomes empowering people to recognise the damage of poor self talk, when is this "voice" coming into their head, why is this voice there and how on earth do they manage it!?

Most of us have these inner critics and various things we say to ourselves. This is perfectly normal. There is plenty of good in having a voice of reason and ways to use self talk to determine what we decide to do and say in life! In saying this – we are wise to take notice if our self talk is bringing us down or making our ride in life harder than it needs to be. Poor self talk can manifest itself in a variety of ways. These include poor self esteem, poor social skills, narcissistic behaviours, relationship challenges, bad habits, anxiety and depression.

The good news is that we can learn more about our self talk and how to improve it. The results can be startling! The trick is to know the voice, maybe give it a name and start talking back to it with positive affirmations etc! I am seeing clients gain more time in their day, learn more about their strengths in life, smile more, apply for different jobs and improve their relationships.

My passion for communication centres on the belief that if you can improve how you talk to *yourself* AND how you talk to *others* ... You can truly find the best version of yourself.

OTH Vets Say ~ *Vaccination is Vital!*



When it comes to protecting our furry family members, keeping up to date with vaccinations is a must. There are number of contagious diseases that can be transmitted from pet to pet, either by close contact with faeces, urine etc or airborne transmission through respiratory means. Some viruses can live in the soil for years still infecting pets as they sniff around the area. These diseases can be fatal if contracted, so vaccination is the way to go to ensure your pets are safe.

When cats and dogs are first born, they carry some immunity from their mother, depending on whether she was adequately vaccinated or not.

Dogs require their first vaccinations at 6 weeks of age as their natural immunity starts to wear off, after the first injection, the immunity starts to wear off again at around 9 weeks of age, so we then vaccinate again, and then again at 12 weeks of age by this time they have built up enough immunity against the viruses. After a year they just require a yearly booster.

Cats require their first vaccinations at 8 weeks of age and then again at 10 weeks and 12 weeks. Then yearly after that.

Vaccination protocols differ from vaccine to vaccine, for full information about them, contact your nearest veterinary clinic.

For dogs the diseases that we vaccinate against are Distemper, Hepatitis, Parvovirus, Bordetella Bronchiseptica and Parainfluenza. The vaccination for these diseases is commonly known as the C5 vaccination.

For cats the diseases are Feline Panleukopaenia, Feline Rhinotracheitis Virus, Feline Calicivirus and Feline Immunodeficiency Virus. The vaccination for these is commonly known as the F3 vaccination and the FIV Vaccination.

All the mentioned diseases are highly contagious and some are more common than others, but all are still around in Australia. Vaccinations are relatively inexpensive compared to the veterinary treatment, if your pet was contract any of the diseases. It is also better to prevent than cure.

OTH Local ANZAC History ~ The Shillabeer Family

The Shillabeer family are well known in the One Tree Hill area, arriving early in the colony's history. Andrew William Shillabeer and two of his eight children, Samuel Stewart and Albert Arthur, enlisted in WWI.

Sadly, both Andrew and his son Albert died in battle during WWI. They were among 24 young men from One Tree Hill, Virginia, Smithfield and Penfield who died in action during the Great War. A member of the 48th Australian Battalion, Albert Shillabeer died during the battle of Bullecourt, France, in 1917 at the age of 22. Unfortunately Andrew also died in action, however nothing is known of how he died. What is known is that he was brave and willing to fight for his country, as were his two sons.

Samuel Shillabeer received a gunshot wound to his right buttock while fighting in his first war in France. He sailed to England where he recovered in Horton War Hospital, London. After his recovery he returned to France to resume fighting.

Once the war ended he returned to Australia as a hero. He married the love of his life May Ena Wackett and lived in Norwood until he passed away on the 19 of June 1962, aged 63.

One plant that is currently providing a most welcome splash of colour is *Callistemon citrinus* Pink Champagne. A must have plant in any garden! Upright medium sized vibrant rosy pink bottlebrush type flowers are produced during Spring and Autumn on sturdy stems. These flowers fade to a soft pink and complete their flowering cycle with a delicate creamy off white shade. With the many bees that pollinate the flowers, the beautiful crimson red male Eastern Rosellas come and feed on the young seed capsules. The lady Eastern Rosellas have a distinctive plumage in shades of bluish grey green. The aromatic leaves of this plant are lance shaped up to 3cms long and approximately 7mm wide and are of a lovely soft grey green shade which is just perfect for showing off the colourful flowers. All leaves are held firmly along the stems. This drought hardy *Callistemon* grows in a wide range of soils either in full sun or part shade. *Callistemon citrinus* Pink Champagne can be planted as a stunning feature plant in a garden bed or planted as a windbreak or screen. It responds quickly to regular pruning in order to shape the plant. For me, I like how it responds to water. If watered during early Summer soon after the Spring flowering period it will respond with a Summer flush of delightful flowers. This past Summer, with 36mils of rain a few weeks ago, my plants are flowering again very soon after their Summer flush. I am impressed with plants ability to flower so quickly after receiving a drink of water. This plant is available from various native plant nurseries and is sometimes found at good garden centres.

Seek this plant if you have space in your garden; you will enjoy the many flowers that it can produce throughout the year as well as the many birds that visit this plant. *Callistemon citrinus* Pink Champagne is one of the best bottlebrushes available for any garden.

Just beautiful.
