Well, the clouds have broken and the rain has started to fall bringing a smile to a lot of faces.

This month has brought a letter from Paula Luethen MP regarding the City of Playford's unsuccessful grant bid for the redevelopment of the McGilp Road Recreation Park. Whilst this is disheartening there are further grant bids coming up soon and City of Playford will be lodging further applications with Cr David Kerrison's, the OTH Sports Association and our support.

The flower bed parking obstructions has not got much further. An email has been sent requesting an update as we are still waiting to hear from the Minister for Infrastructure and Transport's office about a site visit.

I am also seeking feedback for the CFS Siren on Karwin Road. At the moment the siren is not working and we are seeking any feedback from residents in the area, good or bad, about the viability of the siren into the future. As a resident of One Tree Hill for many years it was always a look up and take notice of the surroundings when the siren blew. Now, I may be old fashioned in my thinking but this is the type of advice I am seeking from you to work on a way forward.

We are looking at starting up a guest speaker night. If you have a topic that you would like to discuss with the community, we can help facilitate this for you. Otherwise, we will look at getting speakers in and providing you with the opportunity to listen and ask questions.

Please don't be a stranger. Progress is here to support our local community and we would love to see and hear from you. Our meetings are held at the One Tree Hill Institute on the second Thursday of the month starting at 7:30pm.

One Tree Hill CFS ~ June Report



The spate of grass fires towards the end of May continued into June with the Brigade attending 3 grass fires within the area since the last report. The worst of these was a 3rd alarm grass fire just east of Craigmore on the 24th of May with a Watch and Act Message (WAM) issued at the height of the fire for Craigmore residents. The fire was initially reported at 5.30 PM and was attended by 13 appliances including units from the MFS and surrounding CFS Brigades. The fire was not declared Complete until 10 PM that night.

Another fire was reported as a previous burn-off that had flared up under windy conditions on the 7th of June in Bibaringa. In this case the fire was brought under control within an hour but reinforces the message from previous articles that if you are burning off, you need to be vigilant, not just on the day of the burn-off but over the ensuing days.

This month has also been marred by 3 road crash rescue callouts, with one resulting in an arrest and another resulting in a fatality. In the first case, a woman was arrested following a call-out for a crash into a tree on the corner of Blacktop and Goulds Roads at 7.50 AM on the 25th of May. She was travelling with 3 young children in the vehicle, and all were taken to the Women's and Children's Hospital. The Major Crash unit later called for anyone with any further information to get in touch through Crimestoppers on 1800 333 000, more details are available on the SA Police website.

Unfortunately, a second crash involving a car and a tree a couple of days later, on the 28th of May, just east of the round-about on Kersbrook Road, resulted in the death of man from Yattalunga and led to the road being closed for several hours. Our condolences go out to the family and friends.



Medal Presentations

Congratulations to 6 of our members who were presented with the National Medal for long and diligent service within the CFS at the end of May. The members were Tom Walsh, Mike Hawkey, Dave Cockburn, David George, Paul Bebbington and Bruce Hobby. The service of these 6 members over their many years of service represents many thousands of hours of dedication and we have been honoured to have them as members of our Brigade.

Lastly, it appears that the weather has finally broken with several very wet days in the middle of June, and although that takes the pressure off with burn-offs it raises other issues, particularly on the roads. As noted in previous years there are several sites around the local area that can become quite hazardous with water and debris left on the road following heavy showers. Add to that the inevitable fog that occurs at this time of year and an increase in wildlife, particularly kangaroos, on or near the roads and that can make the roads in this area particularly treacherous. As always please drive to conditions and stay safe on the roads.

Playford Council ~ Local Councillor's Report

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

Unfortunately, the City of Playford's application to the State Government Office for Recreation and Sport for the grant funding of the McGilp Recreation Park Redevelopment was unsuccessful. This application did not cover the entire upgrade as only certain portions of the upgrade were eligible for funding under the grant. The eligible portions equated to 1.676M and were to be \$826K grant funded and \$850K funded by the City of Playford in the 2021-22 Annual Business Plan.

The positive news is that another round of the Sport and Recreation funding has opened in June 2021. I have discussed the application with the administration and have been advised that the City of Playford will be resubmitting the application for the McGilp Recreation Park. However, the grant will only cover the eligible portions as did previously.

The Petition for the McGilp upgrade seeking the Member for King, Ms Paula Luethen MP, to obtain the commitment of the state Government to allocate at least half of the funds towards the entire upgrade of McGilp recreation Park Redevelopment was noted by Council and forwarded to Ms Paula Luethen MP. The intention of the petition was to seek the extra funding for the portions of the upgrade that the Sports and Recreation grant did not support and to further engage Paula Luethen to advocate for McGilp if the grant was unsuccessful.

Thank you again to everyone who supported the petition.

You may have recently received a letter from our local MP – Paula Luethen highlighting that the City of Playford submitted a number of grant applications for funding of sporting projects across the City of Playford. Paula highlighted that "One of these applications was for a small portion of the overall McGilp Recreation Park Redevelopment Plans". I'd like to highlight that the application was for the eligible portions of the grant and equated to 1.676M of the entire 3M upgrade. If anyone has any further questions, please give me a call.

The City of Playford has also submitted an application for a Federal grant through the Building Better Regions Fund which would deliver the entire upgrade. The notification is expected around the middle of the year and would need extra funding by Council in a budget review process.

Unfortunately, there is no news on the auto switching back-up generator to protect the One Tree Hill Township in a bushfire emergency. I've emailed our local member numerous times, seeking confirmation of the lodgement by Minister David Spiers including an alternative back up plan for funding if the application is unsuccessful and called her office, without receiving follow up communications. I did however manage to speak with Paula at the One Tree Hill markets on Saturday the 5th of June 2021 and I was informed that the response was expected in the next week. The week has now well and truly passed. I am passionate about the need to protect our Township and I will continue advocating until it is delivered.

I am concerned about the effect that the State Revaluation may have on rates for some of our residents in ward 3. While the proposed rate rise for Playford is 1.25% the redistribution of values could see significant rate increases for some residents.

Two Sides to a Story and the Truth is somewhere else!

When it comes to stories or opinions it is a good idea to do your homework before making judgement or firm decisions. Yes there are always two sides to a story and usually the truth is somewhere else.... somewhere in the middle... somewhere to the side.. not always sure where.. but somewhere!

This challenge comes up all the time in my role as a counsellor. It presents not just in couples counselling but also in my mediation work. When I see both parties it is much easier to work through the challenges and opportunities to move forward. What is harder is progressing through relationship concerns when I am only seeing one individual. This can be relationships between couples, family members, workplace colleagues etc. It is much harder when you are hearing about a dynamic but can’t listen to the other perspective. Sometimes the story I am hearing is just a perception and may be exaggerated, biased or even not true.

Let us take a moment to think about History and what our kids learn. I have read that many people say history was written by the winners. The text that our kids read really only scrapes the surface of the story. History can be a brief snapshot of life events that is typically one sided. What really took place when Cook “discovered” Australia? What other historical events or significant calendar markings do you have questions about? There are two sides to every story and some sides are not recorded or not offered.

We all know only too well how the media can also push or play up a story. Sometimes there can be exaggerations that play up the fear factor and drama to raise ratings. The facts say you have a greater chance of getting cancer than being bitten by a shark or mauled by a croc, yet we often see this out of the ordinary story headlined on the news. Mostly, the whole story

doesn't come out until the media is long done with that news story. Sadly, the media often neglects to report back with a follow up or to share with us additional information that may shed different light on the topic.

Everyone can only see and perceive the world through their own experience and through their own lens. To explain what I mean by this a bit further... picture the lens you look at things through and consider that this lens is made up of your experiences in life, every belief, every failure, every lesson. So of course.. what you perceive or experience is based on this lens. Your lens will be different to the lens of others. You may think your perspective is correct and sure it may be per “your lens”. What we need to consider is that other's perspectives are not necessary incorrect, instead they are just forming a view based on a different lens.



We are all in agreement then.

One of the things I am proud of as a person, is that I lost my ability to judge something as right or wrong a long time ago! This is because, if I am to judge, this will be through my lens only.

I have covered some broad territory here....so I will wrap up by returning to relationships. I think we could do a whole lot better in relationships if we;

1. Did not judge the other party as “right” or “wrong” but instead acknowledge that there is a difference here that is different to my own.
2. Considered how important this difference is and whether it truly impacts on us or if it is something we can step back from
3. Considered if we might be willing to let go the need to be “right” if it means we save relationships and can look at constructive ways forward

We will also discuss soil health, weed containment, efficient and effective controls, timing, land management and hygiene.

The Correas and Thryptomenes have finally burst open to provide a very welcome splash of vibrant colour. The Hakeas are now flowering well with early flower balls showing signs of desperately needing a good drink.

Hakea obtusa, flowering now, blooms about four weeks after Hakea Stockdale Sensation, a beautiful cultivar of Hakea laurina. After the Sampson Flat fire of January 2015, a very small plant of Hakea obtusa was planted as part of many plants that were grown and distributed to fire affected properties. It is now approximately 2m high and 1.5 m wide and bears a mass of stunningly beautiful sweetly scented ball shaped flowers.

These flowers, about the size of a golf ball, appear along the old wood, first as a tiny ball of pale lime green which changes to cream then to white. As the flower develops, white changes to pale pink and at the end of the flowering cycle, the flower is quite a dark pink shade.

With many, many flowers on this dense, rounded small shrub, there are many stunningly beautiful flowers to admire at various stages of development. The many leathery blue green leaves are of an elliptical shape and provide shelter for the Blue Wrens but it's the nectar loving birds that are loving having so many flowers on a small bush.

After flowering, small seed pods each with a sharp pointed beak, holding two seeds will develop. The young seed pods containing protein rich seeds will be devoured by the Eastern Rosellas as part of their daily food intake.

Hakea obtusa grows naturally in Esperance and south western region of Western Australia and requires a sunny position and well drained gravelly loamy soils.

Once established, it is drought and frost tolerant. This plant with it's stunningly beautiful white to pink flowers is well worth growing and may be found at good nurseries. Hakea obtusa is an absolute delight to see and enjoy in my garden; it's many flowers are just glorious. Just beautiful.
