### Permanent Generator for One Tree Hill, Protecting our Community:

One Tree Hill residents told me they have been lobbying for a permanent back-up generator for the One Tree Hill water supply for over a decade.



My thanks to the One Tree Hill community, including One Tree Hill Progress Association, for bringing this important matter to my attention during my door knocking and listening posts so we could work towards a solution.

I am excited to report that SA Water have advised they will now connect a permanent generator to the One Tree Hill water pump station by the end of the year.

This will importantly allow the back-up generator to automatically come into operation in event of a power outage.

In January 2021, I convened a meeting to identify a solution with key stakeholders including the Office of the Minister Environment and Water, Office of the Minister for Emergency Services, SA Water, CFS, One Tree Hill Progress Association and the City of Playford.

I thank each of the attendees for their contribution and collaboration which has resulted in a very positive outcome.



This last month has brought a welcome letter from the Member for King Paula Luethen regarding the successful grant bid for the purchase and installation of an auto-switch generator for the town water supply. The works are being done by SA Water and are due to be completed by December.

What does this mean? It now allows for water pressure to be maintained during power outages but more importantly, during the bushfire season, allows for the choice to defend or flee the oncoming fire. Whilst not advocating families put themselves in harm's way, we do now have a choice. As always, have a bushfire survival plan prepared and ready to be enacted. Thank you for listening and for your actions are very much appreciated!

I am still seeking feedback for the CFS Siren on Karwin Road. At the moment the siren is not working and we are seeking any feedback from residents in the area, good or bad, about the viability of the siren into the future. No responses have been received as yet.

Our Treasurer, Steve Huckstepp and Hall Manager, Pat Jones have had a busy 3 weeks with 3 new COVID Management Plans. Thank you both for the long nights of reading and application writing to the State Government.

I am meeting with a member from the office of Mr Nick Champion MP in late July to discuss future Federal Government Grants and hopefully get a plan on how best to proceed.

Progress is here to support our local community and we would love to see and hear from you. Our meetings are held at the One Tree Hill Institute on the second Thursday of the month starting at 7:30pm.

### One Tree Hill CFS ~ July Report

The wild and woolly weather which started in the middle of the month has led to a plethora of callouts for trees down during July, including 6 within one 13-hour period. The long list is as follows:



### July 15

- 7:13 PM Medlow Road, Uleybury
- 9:44 PM Precolumb Road, One Tree Hill
- 10:24 PM Blacktop Road, One Tree Hill

### July 16

- 3:39 AM Humbug Scrub Road, Humbug Scrub •
- 4:58 AM Yorketown Road, One Tree Hill
- 10:27 AM Sheoak Road, Humbug Scrub

July 20

- 7:35 AM McGilp Road, One Tree Hill (Tree on powerlines)
- 7:49 AM Rose Court, One Tree Hill

#### July 24

- 1:44 PM One Tree Hill Road, Gould Creek
- 5:00 PM Bassnett Road, Humbug Scrub

There were five vehicle related callouts, two in the new section of One Tree Hill Road near Melville Road. One of these involved a car which hit a tree and then ricocheted into a second tree causing significant damage, the other was for a fluid clean-up from a motor bike which had come unstuck after hitting the edge of the new bitumen. Although it is an improvement over the old road, this is still a very new section of road and is not yet finished, so please take care when driving in this area.

In addition, there was a callout for roll-over on Humbug Scrub Road near Para Wirra, one for a 2 car MVA (Motor Vehicle Accident) on the corner of Crosshill and One Tree Hill Roads, and one to assist a driver get their car off the road after it had broken down on the Kersbrook Road.

Finally, in a change of pace, we were called to assist the MFS for a house fire in Hillbank but received a Stop on Call for the incident prior to arriving.





A big thank you from all the members of the Brigade to the members of the community who give us donations, many of them anonymously. These generous donations are used by the Brigade to purchase extra equipment which supplements the equipment provided by the CFS. Examples of major items we have purchased in the past include a TIC (Thermal Imaging Camera), which enables us to find hot-spots at bushfires which are not otherwise visible, and the extensions to the fire-shed which provides a dedicated facility for recommissioning our Breathing Apparatus (BA). We have also been able to re-furbish our kitchen which is the envy of many visiting Brigades.

As this article is being written the State once again finds itself in the middle of another COVID lock-down. We wish all residents of the One Tree Hill area the best of health during this difficult period and rest assured the Brigade has put in place measures to enable us to respond to all callouts during the period.

### Playford Council ~ Local Councillor's Report

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

It is fantastic news for the One Tree Hill Township residents to hear that the long awaited on-site auto switching backup generator will now be funded by SA Water and installed towards the end of the year. Excellent work by the One Tree Hill Progress Association and everyone involved across our local community. This is a testament that strong advocacy can deliver for our local community!

Thank you to our local MP – Paula Luethen for her advocacy in this process. I have also followed up with Paula and her office expressing the importance of the auto switching generator being delivered by the start of the fire season. If SA Water can prioritise the delivery, it would be appreciated. Paula's office has indicated that they will be following up with SA Water.

On Thursday the 15th of July it was a pleasure to attend the King Grant Information Workshop (pictured right) with the Hon. Corey Wingard, Minister for Recreation, Sport and Racing with fellow elected members Mayor Docherty and Councillor Gossink. It is excellent to hear the City of Playford receiving positive feedback on its grant applications. The City of Playford will be relodging its application to the State Government Office for Recreation and Sport in the new round of funding for the McGilp Recreation Park.

In discussions with Paula Luethen we've learnt of a new grant with a pool of funding that's about to be released. If the City of Playford were fortunate enough to be successful on both grants for McGilp, it may be possible that McGilp could be delivered uniformly. This leads me to the Petition seeking Paula Luethen MP to obtain the commitment of the State Government to allocate at least half of the funds towards the entire upgrade of McGilp Recreation Park. It would appear that Paula is unable to seek the commitment of the State Government and will continue to offer support in the competitive grant application process.

I have met with our General Manager of City Assets along with one of our engineers and the project manager from the City of Playford onsite. At a recent community engagement in Hillbank held by Paula Luethen, I did raise the need to have a community engagement to bring the residents from both Councils together. Paula indicated that she is happy to take the lead on the engagement.

As your elected member for the City of Playford you may see me out and about with our local MP – Paula Luethen and the Labor Candidate for King – Rhiannon Pearce. It is my intention to work apolitically in the interest of our City of Playford residents that are in King.

As I come to the end of this month's Councillor's report the SA lockdowns have commenced. Wishing everyone well in these difficult times.

### August 2021 Editorial is submitted by Rhiannon Pearce (Labor Candidate for King)

I know how important locals think it is to be part of a safe and prepared community.

People in One Tree Hill told me as much recently when the Federal Member for Spence, Nick Champion MP and I met with Cr. David Kerrison (pictured right, with permission), and representatives from the One Tree Hill Progress Association.

We got the clear message that they wanted to see some improvement in fire safety by sourcing a back-up generator to prevent loss of water supply to the township in the event of a power failure.

Nick and I were determined to lend a hand and I'm thrilled to say that by working together, the One Tree Hill township has won!

SA Water has agreed to provide a permanent generator – making the town safer going into the next fire season.

We also promised to help locals in Hillbank do more to raise the issue of anti-social behaviour in the suburb. It seems that a few of the hot spots occur on roads that lead up and into One Tree Hill.

After my Crime Forum in Hillbank, I worked closely again with Councillors from the City of Playford to action the requests of the local community, and now portable CCTVs will be installed to stop illegal dumping, hoon driving and graffiti in the area.

### Are You Feeling It?

### A Mental Health & Wellbeing Article by One Tree Hill Local Natasha Steen

Some people drink it, some smoke it, some will gamble it, others will hide it, some people argue it...or others just "FEEL IT" ....!! What am I talking about? ...I am talking about the emotions that come out of our life experiences.

I will give you a few examples to explain what I am on about!! Someone has experienced trauma....they shut down, become quieter, more reserved and may turn more to smoking (for example) and don't ever properly feel it, and seek help around the impact. Another example is where a person may be afraid of grieving...a close friend dies and they push it aside saying "I will be alright"... When clearly they are not... They think they don't need to attend to their feelings as they not sure what they would do if they did.... So they just soldier on, but find themselves worsening their gambling habits.





Other people can be really aggressive and this may be because they are not owning their feelings and allowing themselves to feel them and instead taking this out on others. Related to this - I recall a person who had deep feelings of "poor self esteem" that they were denying. So instead of taking some ownership around this, they continue with angry outbursts etc to deflect away from feelings that have never been dealt with.

The research shows us that denying feelings, ignoring and putting them aside, can make these emotions more intense.

### What are some of the typical reasons that people hide/mask feelings?

- To avoid showing 'weakness'. Showing emotion can put you in a vulnerable place, and it's pretty normal to want to avoid exposing vulnerabilities to others.
- To avoid getting hurt. People often hide emotions to protect their relationships or avoid conflict
- Lack of confidence. If you grew up receiving the message that your opinions and feelings don't matter, you'll likely learn to hide your feelings from an early age.

### By not allowing yourself to feel and express emotions the following can happen;

- Negative impact on your communication you are not as clear and honest with people around you.
- Conflict with people you care about
- The negative feelings can become even more intense
- Build up of stress in the body. Unaddressed stress tends to linger in the body, where it can contribute to diabetes, sleep issues, high blood pressure or even heart problems.

The first thing I do when I meet people who start to share personal things that are causing them some angst is to commend them. I encourage people to give themselves a pat on the back for reaching out to talk to a counsellor. These people have taken the first step ...they have reached out and are "feeling it"! *Are you feeling it?*

### What's Flowering In My Garden?


Winter has arrived with cold days and nights and some very welcomed rain. Some local dams are full and overflowing but the sub soil in places is still powdery dry, requiring more steady ,soaking rains. With more rain forecast, let's hope that we receive some useful precipitation.

The Hakeas have almost finished their stunning Winter display and some Eucalypts are still flowering, providing nectar for many birds and bees. The Correas, also known as Native Fuschias, are in full flower at the moment providing many displays of brightly coloured flowers in many shades of white, cream, red, orange and pink.

One Correa that caught my eye recently is Correa glabra variety turnbulli "Barossa Gold". This highly ornamental plant has grown into a low mounded shrub approximately 1.5 metres high and wide. It bears many small elliptical shaped leaves that are of a lime green to mid green shade with the addition of gold overtones when grown in full sun. If "Barossa Gold" is planted in full or part shade it's leaves will be quite a darker shade with less golden shading. This stunning shrub bears lovely dusky red pendulous bell shaped flowers that are visited by many bees and nectar seeking birds , for example New Holland Honeyeaters. "Barossa Gold" is a low maintenance Correa that grows in well drained moist soils, but may need a little extra water of Summer, and is a great plant for small spots in any garden. Once established, it is frost and drought tolerant. Give this stunning Correa a good prune after flowering to prevent it from becoming too straggly. The new growth will provide a mass of brightly coloured foliage followed by beautiful red flowers and you may find that the New Holland Honeyeaters and the Blue Wrens will nest and rear their young in a mature Correa bush. This beautiful Correa is available at good nurseries.

Correa glabra, a stunningly beautiful shrub that brightens up a Winter garden.

Just beautiful.

### One Tree Hill Cubs Para Wirra Bushcraft Camp

On a rainy weekend in late June, 21 One Tree Hill cubs, leaders and some parent helpers camped out at the Helipad campsite in Para Wirra for their Bushcraft camp for 2 nights. For many of the cubs, this was their first tent camp! The purpose of the camp was to teach the cubs our core scouting skills of bushcraft, bushwalking and camping, but most importantly to have heaps of fun with cub friends!





For many of the cubs, the highlight of the camp was the shelter building activity (see pictures on the opposite page), where pairs or groups of cubs were given a small tarp and a piece of rope each, and they had to work together to come up with a shelter using anything else they could find in nature - without damaging the environment. All of the shelters were very different, and it was great to see what they came up with!

Cubs learned about some basic survival navigation skills how to use the Southern Cross to find South at night,

and how to use an analog clock

(drawn on the ground with a stick) and the Sun to find North during the day. Our friend Steve Taylor (retired Para Wirra ranger and Friends of Para Wirra volunteer) came to visit to teach the cubs about indigenous use of native plants and animals at Para Wirra to provide food, clothing and medicine. We had a walk around the campsite to discover some examples. Along with all of those skills, the cubs went on a 5km hike in the rain down to the Lake and back, and they also learned how to strike a match safely, how to build their own small fires, and they even got to cook their own hot dog lunches on their fires before the rain came and put a dampener on that activity! Lots of great scouting fun to be had!
