Dear Residents,

This is the last Grapevine for the year and I would like to wish everyone in One Tree Hill a very Merry Christmas and a safe and prosperous New Year. I would like to thank our band of volunteers at Progress for their tireless efforts during a very challenging year. I would like to personally mention several people for going well beyond to help provide for our community; Pat Jones for maintaining the Hall at such high standards and the huge amount of time taking and cancelling bookings and for fitting people in to the halls busy schedule; Steve Huckstepp for maintaining our books and financials, also his tireless efforts during the year with "all" the policy changes during Covid restrictions, finally for being a great President and confidante over the past couple of years; Heather Fischer, our market manager, for her efforts in managing to keep the market open and thriving during the darkest days of covid management; and finally to Bindi for her prodigious talents editing the Grapevine and keeping everyone informed. Thank you so much for your efforts and have a well earned rest over Christmas.

This last month, I have received a response from Mr Corey Wingard in relation to the Blacktop and Yorktown Road intersection. The email stated that an external review of the intersection will be concluded soon and a report sent to DIT. In the meantime, the sign posts have finally been restored, new line marking has occurred and the give way signs have been enlarged. I thank Mr Wingard for his response and look forward to hearing from his office regarding the review.

On Saturday 13th November I was invited to the General Store by Rhiannon Pearce, Labor candidate for King, for a meeting. At this meeting I was pleasantly shocked to be informed that the State Labor Party have made an election promise of \$1.5 Million dollars towards the McGilp Road Recreation Park upgrade. I would like to take this opportunity to sincerely thank Rhiannon and her team for their support of One Tree Hill. Also at the meeting was Nick Champion and Matt Burnell, Federal Member for Spence, Mr Robert Klose and Cr David Kerrison.

This is a huge step forward for the redevelopment funding. We now also have a pledge for funding from the City of Playford and an application in for a Sports and Recreation Grant which will get us over the line. Many thanks to Cr David Kerrison for his continued support in Chambers.

An update on the fire siren up on Kersbrook Road. I have called a meeting for November 25 to all respondents to the questionnaire so this will happen before we go to press. I have invited State and Federal Members and Councillors to the meeting and am glad to report that we have a strong response to attend the meeting. I was provided an invitation from Federal MP, Nick Champion, to place an expression of interest for the next phase in the Building Better Communities Grant scheme. I have submitted our proposal for the fire siren and will finalise if we pass the EOI stage.

The flower bed saga continues but now have support from the City of Playford to chase up the Department of Infrastructure and Transport regarding their email. Will keep you posted.

Paula Luethen, Member for King, has kindly passed on my email request to Minister David Spiers for an answer as to when the auto-switch generator project will be due for completion. I would like to thank Paula and her team for their continued support of One Tree Hill during 2021 and look forward to working together in 2022. I will keep you posted as to the progress of this.

One Tree Hill CFS ~ October Report



It has been an interesting month, although in terms of callouts it has been very quiet. The hail-storm on the 28th of October will live long in the memory of One Tree Hill residents and if you are still here in 20 years and something similar happens, I hope you say, “yes, but not as bad as ‘21”.

Fortunately, we only had 3 callouts that day, one which came in the midst of the hail-storm here and was for a Strike Team to Angaston to help with flooding that had occurred earlier in the day, and 2 which were for trees down locally. Unfortunately, talking to other people from surrounding areas, it appears that the OTH township was particularly hard hit, with substantial damage throughout the township to cars, skylights, and poly-carb sheeting on sheds and pergolas.

One scary callout and perhaps a precursor for the upcoming fire season was a call to a second alarm grass fire in Penfield on the 9th of November. We had 2 trucks attend, our Bulk Water Carrier (BWC13) and OTH 34, but the thing that makes it scary was that at that stage most of the undergrowth locally was still either green or only partially cured. Over the last couple of years, we have had to attend significant fires in Roseworthy and on the outskirts of Gawler in the weeks prior to Christmas and by the time you read this, we will have passed the sixth anniversary of the Pinery fire which occurred on the 25th of November 2015. It is a grim reminder that major fires can occur early in the South Australian fire season.

The only other callout occurred in the early hours of the morning of the 15th of November with a car hitting a tree after the driver had lost control. Not surprisingly, the vehicle sustained significant damage, but luckily the driver was able to walk away from the incident. As always, please take care on our roads, nobody who works in Emergency Services likes to attend vehicle accidents, especially at one o'clock in the morning.



Have you ever thought of joining CFS?

One Tree Hill CFS is on the lookout for new recruits especially amongst people who live locally and are available to help with day-time callouts. While we have a very dedicated crew in the Brigade, many of them work outside the area during the day and have extended response times, so if you are able to help, please give the Duty Officer a call on 8280 7055 or call by the shed on a Monday night during training. CFS provides all the training you need before you are able to ride an appliance and all we ask of you is your time.

Don't think you are cut out for the front-line? Besides the operational crew who man the appliances, we also have non-firefighting roles available in things such as communications and the Operational Support Unit mentioned last month, so if you think you can help, please give us a call.

Fire Danger Season is Coming

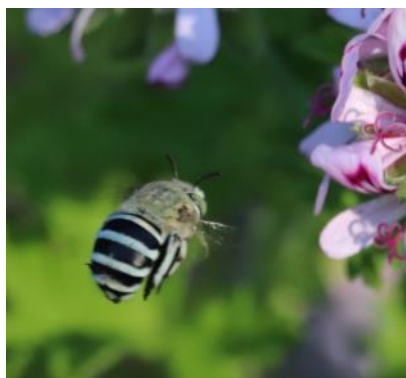

Blue Banded Bees are Busy Buzzing in One Tree Hill



Lauren Start sent some photos (including the cover photo) in to the OTH Grapevine after she first noticed a blue banded bee buzzing around her property on Cornishman's Hill Road. Lauren also shared some information she had found out about this bee, and thought others may be interested to learn a bit more too. The following information is from Australian Geographic (see web site below for more information).

"THIS HAS TO BE one of the prettiest bees in the world. Named for the beautiful turquoise bands that run across its abdomen, the blue-banded bee (*Amegilla cingulate*) sports a lush golden and white fluff, enormous green eyes, and tan-coloured wings that look like crisp layers of cellophane.

Males can be distinguished from females by the number of blue bands they display – males have five while the females have just four. Adult blue-banded bees typically grow to between 10mm and 12mm.

Blue-banded bees are one of a few native Australian bee species that perform a particular type of pollination known as 'buzz pollination'. Also known as sonication, this type of pollination is really useful on crops such as tomatoes, blueberries, cranberries, kiwi fruit, eggplants and chilies, but the well-known and very common western honey bee (*Apis mellifera*), is incapable of performing this process. For this reason, the blue-banded bee is extremely valuable to Australian farmers."

Hydrating and Cooling Koalas during Hot Weather

SUMMER is fast approaching and with this brings hot and thirsty Koalas.

What can be fatal to a Koala, is that of water in the lungs (aspiration pneumonia) which can happen when they are given water to drink from a hose, or a water-bottle as seen in numerous viral videos. Even though people mean well, forcing water into the throat could cause the Koala to inhale and water go directly into the lungs, risking Aspiration Pneumonia.

A safer way to provide drinking water is via a bowl, helmet, or hat, from which the Koala can lap up the water it needs. Or, if using a squirt bottle or open ended bottle, allow gravity to let the water slowly drip out and the koala can lap it up. Placing a slow running water hose in a tree near the Koala, will also allow it to lap the water as desired.

If you are lucky enough to have a Koala visit your garden during hot weather, it may go low into a non-eucalypt tree/bush, or even to the ground to keep cool. You can lightly mist above the head of the Koala to cool the air around it. You can provide a shallow tray of water which it might sit in, or a shallow bowl of water to drink, at the base of the tree. If you have a dog, please keep it contained or inside until the Koala leaves your property.

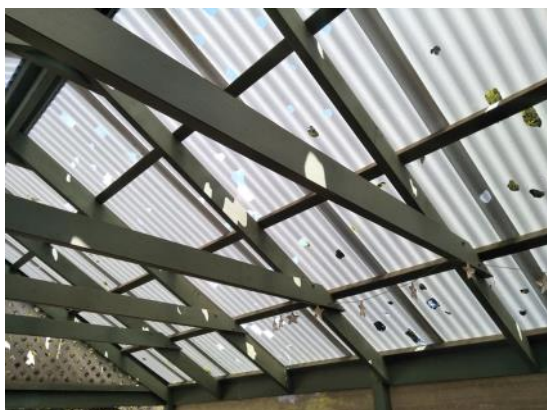

Playford Council ~ Local Councillor's Report

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

I would like to take the opportunity to wish everyone all the best for a safe and happy Christmas.

Since being elected as your Councillor, I've been advocating to see the McGilp Recreation Park redevelopment delivered. The early stages saw the concept plans being delivered and the project raised through the priority list for the City of Playford. The key to see this project being delivered has always been the assistance of external funding.

Thank you to everyone who has assisted me in the process advocating for external funding and those who signed and supported the Petition where I was seeking the Member of King, Ms Paula Luethen MP, to obtain the commitment of the State Government to allocate half of the funds towards the delivery of the entire upgrade of McGilp Recreation Park Redevelopment. While Paula has been supportive of the McGilp Recreation Park upgrade to date she has simply directed the City of Playford to the highly competitive grant funding process.

The City of Playford follows closely the new and available grant funding rounds and has made three applications for grant funding to see the McGilp upgrade delivered.

State Government Grants:

- Community Recreation and Sports Facilities Program 20/21 – unsuccessful
- Community Recreation and Sports Facilities Program 21/22 – submitted August 21 – decision early December 21.

Federal Government Grant:

- Building Better Regions Fund Round 5 – Submitted March 21 – unsuccessful, which would have seen the entire upgrade delivered.

We are hoping to be successful in the 21/22 Community Recreation and Sports Facility Program. If successful many important upgrades will be achieved including an oval extension to accommodate a senior soccer pitch and improved storm water drainage, new unisex and disability access change rooms including a new wastewater system and connecting path network along with a BMX track, delivering 1.676M towards the entire upgrade. (\$826,000 grant funded and \$850,000 by the City of Playford)

On the 13th November 2021, Graham Watson (President OTH Progress Association) and I met with Rhiannon Pearce – Labor for King, Nick Champion MP and Matt Burnell – Labor for Spence. We were pleasantly surprised to receive the announcement of an election promise from Rhiannon Pearce, to deliver \$1.5M towards the entire \$3M upgrade of the McGilp Recreation Park to the City of Playford if she is elected and her party forms Government. I'd like to say a huge thank you to Rhiannon and her team for the commitment to our community.

As Paula Luethen MP for King, has been a strong advocate for the McGilp Recreation Park upgrade, I'll be seeking confirmation as to whether, though a Liberal Government if she is re-elected, Paula Luethen will match or exceed the \$1.5M election promise by a Labor Government for the upgrade of the McGilp Recreation Park.

As your elected member for the City of Playford I will continue to work with our local MP – Paula Luethen and our Labor Candidate for King – Rhiannon Pearce in the interest of our City of Playford residents living in the electorate of King.

City of Playford Service Update



Chilean Needle Grass Roadside Control

In collaboration with Green Adelaide, the first survey and roadside control of Chilean Needle Grass was completed on 4th November, with the final sweep for Chilean Needle Grass expected to start the week of 29th November.

Roadside Slashing

Council completed the first pre-Chilean Needle Grass slash in early October, prior to the first survey. This saw all the hills roadsides slashed before contractors identified and removed any Chilean Needle Grass before it flowered.

Roads affected by Chilean Needle Grass were slashed in between surveys in mid-November.

The next cycle of roadside slashing will align with Chilean Needle Grass sweeping in late November, with non-affected roads being slashed in the week of 29th November, and affected roads slashed shortly after, once the Chilean Needle Grass sweep has been completed.

The reach slasher will be out and about at the same time, following the roadside slashing program.

Verge and Reserve Mowing

As part of Council's verge mowing program, verges and reserves within One Tree Hill are scheduled for mowing in late November, pending confirmation of no Chilean Needle Grass.

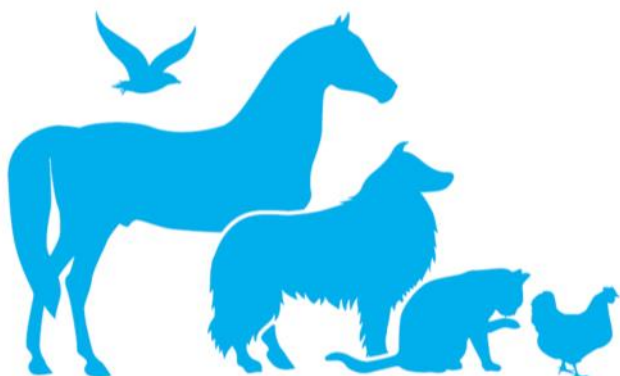
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What is “Mental Health”?

Mental Health! – What is your view when you hear these words? I know that many people can be a little cynical and claim that too many people are pulling the “mental health” card when it comes to wellness and there can be a perception that it is just a trend or an excuse. I thought I would share a little more information about Mental Health and what this means. Taking a look at the Beyond Blue website Mental Health is *“a state of well-being in which every individual realises his or her own potential, can cope with the normal stresses of life, can work productively and fruitfully and is able to make a contribution to his/her/their community”*.



The words “Mental health” are often used as a substitute for mental health conditions – such as depression, anxiety conditions, schizophrenia and others. These are more so “mental health conditions”. I encourage you to think more about Mental Health in terms of “wellness” rather than illness. We can think of it like a spectrum – mental health at one end and mental conditions at other.. High levels of mental health can see increased learning, creativity, more productivity, sociable behaviours, good physical health etc. In contrast mental health conditions can cause distress, impact on day to day functioning etc, these can be associated with poor physical health, premature death and sadly suicide

It’s important to remember that mental health is complex - the fact that someone doesn’t have a diagnosed mental health condition doesn’t necessarily mean they are flourishing, and likewise someone “with one” can feel very well in many aspects of life. Many people know what they need to do to take care of their physical health but how about Mental Health?

What does it mean to you to be mentally healthy??

The answers to this question are very diverse as we are all unique...However, here are a few tips on some things that *can help* maintain your mental health...

- **Boost Your Mental Health** by doing things you enjoy - Just doing things you think are fun can go a long way to your mental health – no judgement!
- **Build a Better Relationship with Technology** – there is a lot of evidence that too much time with our phones is not good for our mental health – but if we learn healthy ways to interact with technology it does not need to be bad for us – there are a lot of “smart” things we can do to use these to our advantage!
- **Be Kind to Yourself** - Yes many people are sooo mean to themselves...while we all have flaws our self acceptance of these is a key driver towards happiness.
- **Practice Gratitude** - The more we do this the happier we are likely to be.
- **Positive Reappraisal** - this is an emotional regulation strategy that we can use to reinterpret a negative situation in more positive (or less negative) ways in order to make us feel better. If we don't use reappraisal (or we're not very skilled at it), this can lead to lower emotional health.
- **Add Some Positive Info To your Brain** - The more information our brains have on a subject, the easier it is to recall anything related to that subject. That means if we have more positive words, info, and memories in our brains, it should be easier to bring to mind the positive stuff.
- **Working Towards Goals** - This can be good for emotional health. Researchers suggest this is because moving towards meaningful goals can provide a greater sense of purpose.
- **Mindfulness** - Mindfulness is the basic human ability to be fully present, aware of where we are and what we're doing, and not overly reactive or overwhelmed by what's going on around us. You may have read earlier articles I have written on mindfulness!

What's Flowering In My Garden?



It's Springtime. The wild oats are 7ft tall this year as a result of excellent Spring rains. Hail damaged plants continue to reveal the extent of the damage caused by that horrendous hail storm. The really strong winds from the southeast last week uprooted trees and shattered some shrubs. That's Mother Nature displaying her fury. Plants will regenerate; it is the perfect time for a judicious prune after flowering and storm damage.

There is colour everywhere. Many grevilleas are in full flower and splashes of red, orange, pink and yellow are enjoyed from many corners of the garden. This Spring, the Bottlebrushes (Callistemons) are putting on a wonderful display of very large brightly coloured brushes with colours ranging from soft white, pink and orange to bold red, crimson and purple. The large brushes are, perhaps, as a result of good but regular Winter and Spring rainfall.

Melaleuca bromelioides is an absolute picture this Spring. This small rounded shrub, approximately 1m x 1m, has fine pine like foliage along its stems. The many terminal clusters of white buds open to reveal bright white flowers scattered all over this bush. These dazzling white flowers emit a strong perfume or, perhaps better described as a strong soapy almost alkaline/perfume. This perfume or scent attracts many, many insects. As the flowers age, they change colour from a crisp white to mid pink and end their flowering time a shade of pinky orange red. It is so enjoyable to observe this plant for about four weeks during its flowering period and to watch the interesting colour transformation. Melaleuca bromelioides grows naturally in the Esperance region of Western Australia and may be available from a specialist nursery. It is spectacular when in flower, just one of many flowering shrubs to enjoy during Spring.

Just beautiful.

The hall has a new surround sound system, TV, microphone facilities, and heating and cooling.

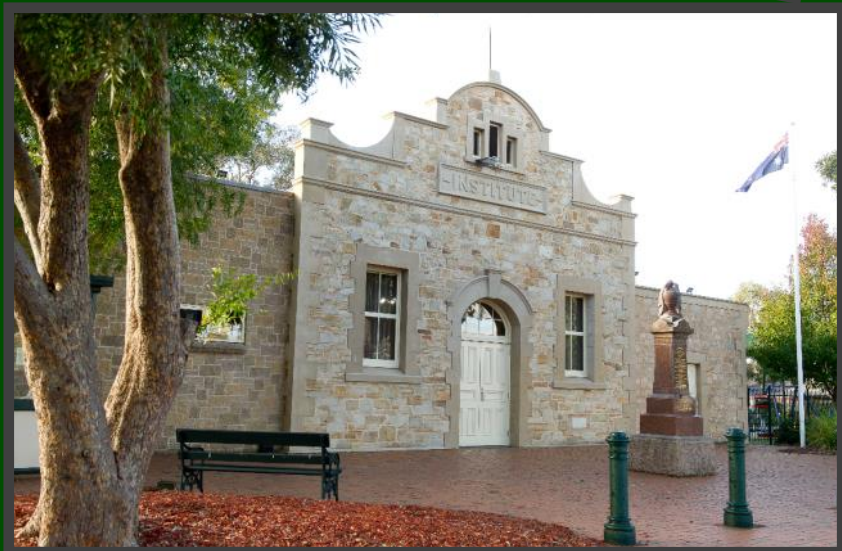

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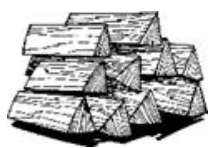

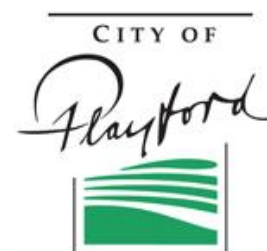
