One Tree Hill Progress Association ~ President's Report

Dear Residents,

Welcome to a New Year. I hope everyone has had a chance to take a break from work and is safe and well.

On December 22nd 2021 I was informed that we had been selected for the Stronger Communities Program Round 7 Grant and could proceed with a formal Grant application. This has been completed and we should hear in late February whether we have been successful. If successful the money will be spent on the maintenance and relocation of the regional fire siren on Kersbrook Road. I would like to thank Federal Member for Spence, Nick Champion and his team for bringing this Grant to our attention.

State Member for King, Paula Luethen has informed me that we were unsuccessful with the Sports and Recreation Grant this time around. Paula has informed me of a Building Better Regions Fund Grant that is available. I have emailed City of Playford Councillor, David Kerrison for consideration of this grant and added the removal of the flower beds in the township, upgrade of Blacktop and Yorktown Road intersection and the McGilp Sports precinct upgrade.

Paula is still advocating on our behalf to the State Ministry of the benefits of the sports precinct upgrade. I would like to thank Paula and her team for the work behind the scenes in trying to get funding for One Tree Hill developments.

December 13th brought Paula Luethen and Mr Vincent Tarzia, Minister for Police, Emergency Services and Correctional Services to the One Tree Hill Institute for a Bushfire Ready Q&A Forum. We had members from One Tree Hill and Tea Tree Gully CFS brigades and CFS Region 2 Head Quarters present to give us insights into their work. It was a very informative night where we were told of what was happening with CFS and how money had been spent in the winter months. Thanks to Paula for organising this for the township and surrounding districts.

The auto-switch generator and switch board was installed at the One Tree Hill water supply tank just before Christmas. I have been informed that it has been tested and is fully functional. This is great news for the township in case of power outages and brings 12 years of harassment and politicking to an end. As stated before in this column, a great many people of One Tree Hill over the years have contributed to this project and I am happy to finally announce its conclusion. Many thanks to Paula Luethen and Mr David Speirs, Environment and Water Minister for their support of this project.

On the 10th of January we had a small grass fire in Sampson Flat which brought back some bad nightmares for some. We had our first glimpse of the new Black Hawk water bomber helicopter in action that Mr Vincent Tarzia had talked about the previous month. Very impressive watching the helicopter fill up in about 30 seconds from a dam and go straight back to the fire field. This will certainly help our CFS Volunteers in the future.

Finally, a reminder that the One Tree Hill Institute is open for business, we have availabilities and would love for you to have your function or event with us.

One Tree Hill CFS ~ January Report

Happy New Year everyone from the members of the One Tree Hill CFS. The Brigade has had a very busy start to the year, following on from a hectic December, with 33 callouts since the last report in November. 10 of these were for Vehicle accidents, 12 for Grass fires, 5 for structure fires, 2 vehicle fires, 3 trees down and 2 for Strike Teams.



Amongst the grass fires the largest in our area was on Harvey Road at Sampson Flat starting shortly after midday on the 10th of January. Coming just a week after the 7th anniversary of the 2015 Sampson Flat bushfire this was certainly a stark reminder. The fire was quickly raised to a 3rd alarm with 29 vehicles dispatched from OTH and surrounding Brigades. 4 water bombers and 3 helicopters also attended dropping 10 loads and doing a great job in controlling the spread of the fire. The fire which had been burning in a southerly direction and threatened properties was officially declared under control at around 4 PM and had burnt around 12 hectares.

This fire was reportedly started by a contractor using an angle grinder prompting a reminder that the Fire and Emergency Services Act requires a 10-metre cleared space around any work involving angle grinders and similar spark emitting tools and you must have equipment capable of extinguishing a fire on hand. Significant fines are in place for offenders under the Act.

The Brigade took delivery of a new Bulk Water Carrier just before Christmas. This new vehicle carries 10,000 litres of water, slightly less than the previous unit but features a Compressed Air Foam System (CAFS) capable of producing the large volumes of foam necessary for blanketing some fires. The new unit has been called into service many times since it's arrival, most significantly to the large hayshed fire in Kapunda on the 4th and 5th of January, and the transformer fire at the Para sub-station which also broke out on night of the 4th of January as crews were returning from Kapunda. The transformer fire which burnt 39,000 litres of oil presented some difficult challenges to firefighters on the scene and was visible from many parts of the northern suburbs leading to some spectacular pictures on the media.



One Tree Hill CFS Cadet Program

After many years hiatus One Tree Hill CFS Brigade has started a cadet program. CFS Cadets is open to all youth between 11 and 18 years of age. Cadet training will be held fortnightly on Tuesday evenings between 6 and 8 pm at the station. Finally, on a tragic note, the Brigade was deeply saddened by the news of the death of fellow fire-fighter Louise Hincks from the Happy Valley Brigade in a fire at Coles near Lucindale

in the Southeast. Members of the One Tree Hill Brigade send their condolences to the friends and family of Louise and especially to the other members of her Brigade.

Playford Council ~ Local Councillor's Report

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

I would like to take this opportunity to wish everyone well for 2022.

This year I will continue work with the One Tree Hill Progress Association and advocate with State and Federal members on behalf of the community. There are a few topics on the agenda being Humbug Scrub Road speed limit, the main street flower beds that the OTH Progress Association has been working on and the Blacktop / Yorktown Road intersection. I am pleased to announce that since the motion at the Ordinary Council meeting in August 2021 our local MP – Paula Luethen has attended the above intersection with the Minister Corey Wingard. I'm appreciative that our local MP and the Minister attended the intersection however I wish to confirm that the intersection along with Blacktop Road and Yorktown Road are under the care and control of the Department (DIT).

McGilp Recreation Park - Update

The City of Playford was notified on the 11th January 2022 that the second application to the Community Recreation and Sports Facilities Program 21/22 was unsuccessful. The State Government noted that the high number of applications received outweighed the available funds and advised that the next round of funding is anticipated to open in the second quarter of 2022.

The Labor candidate for King (Rhiannon Pearce) has committed \$1.5 million towards the McGilp reserve upgrade if Labor is elected at the March 2022 State Election. Thank you to Rhiannon and Labor for the commitment to One Tree Hill and the assistance in the process to date.

At the 23rd November Ordinary Council Meeting I moved (Council resolution 4819)

- 1. That the Mayor and CEO write to Rhiannon to confirm the details of the \$1.5M election promise clarifying the timing of the funds and relevant terms and conditions if a Labor Government is duly elected.
- 2. That the Mayor and CEO write to Paula Luethen MP member for King seeking confirmation as to whether, through a re-elected Liberal Government, will match or exceed the \$1.5M election promise by a Labor Government for the upgrade of the McGilp Recreation Park.

The Council is still awaiting a response from the letter to Rhiannon Pearce, while Paula Luethen MP advised to await the outcome of Council's grant funding application. Given Council has now received notification that its application was unsuccessful we will now write to Paula Luethen MP seeking her commitment to the project in the lead up to the State Election.

The One Tree Hill Cemetery Niche Wall currently only has three niches' available and this concern was thankfully raised by a local resident. I am pleased to say after working through several processes that I have been advised that the approval for a new niche wall has been granted and the order is being placed.

The Annual Business Plan will be coming before us soon for discussion and I will continue to advocate for downwards pressure on rates, debt management and for Council to maintain its focus on driving efficiencies.

There has been positive advancement with our roadside management looking at how we can deliver the services with increases efficiency in line with community expectations. I am hoping that we will see the results in future years. I would like to say thank you to Andy Slager for his dedication and hard work to deliver for the City of Playford and our residents.

I'd also like to say thank you to the local residents for the support and interest in our community.




Let's Write Our Own Headlines!





What's Flowering In My Garden?

It's mid Summer and it's a challenge to keep plants well watered prior to the hot spells that we have, but thankfully we have not endured any prolonged heatwaves. At the time of writing, there is even a forecast of some precipitation in the next week. Let's hope that our gardens will be refreshed soon. Grevillea Robyn Gordon is providing some spectacular red flowering spikes and a few Bottlebrushes are putting on their Summer display. Some Correas are also showing off some flowers and at the same time offering good ground cover.

Banksia lehmanniana is flowering for the first time and how exciting this is. Planted after the Sampson Flat fire, this Banksia is intriguing and enjoyable to observe. It will grow to approximately 3-5 m high and 2-4 m wide requiring well drained loamy soils but may become quite strangly in it's horizontal spread. It bears tough dark green serrated edged leaves and dark chocolate coloured flower spikes. As the flowers quickly grow, green flowers emerge with a touch of pinkish brown on the tips of each individual flower. The mature flowers are of a beautiful greenish soft yellow and end their flowering stage as a dusky grey shade. The aged flower spikes will be seen for quite a few years. Banksia lehmanniana, with the common names of Lehmann's Banksia and Yellow Flower Lantern has no lignotuber and will not resprout after a fire. Stunning new growth of an appealing rusty coppery bronze shade occurs during Summer at the same time that this plant is showing off it's stunning pendulous cylindrical flowers which can be up to 15cms to 20cms long. The flowers, being full of honey, become

a magnet for the many New Holland Honeyeaters and bees that flock to enjoy the nectar that this plant offers. This Banksia grows naturally inside and just outside the Fitzgerald National Park on the southern coast of Western Australia and is one of the easier to grow Banksias from Western Australia. This plant, available from good garden centres will reward your patience with it's stunning leaf colours and huge flowers. Be prepared to water during the drier months of the year to assist in it's establishment.

Banksia lehmanniana, a spectacular addition to any garden.

Just beautiful.

Koala Rescue Information ~ Koalas and Dog Attack

Koalas come on to the ground to move from tree to tree mostly at night and in mating season between September and February they are also very active on the move looking for love. They are excellent climbers and can climb into backyards where dogs may be present.

Dogs are usually curious, aggressive or even fearful when a koala enters their territory. Koalas do have sharp claws and teeth and will try to defend themselves. Many Koalas that encounter dogs sustain bite wounds. Even a minor puncture wound can see the koala needing to be euthanised.

This leads to the question: How can we stop koalas coming into conflict with dogs? As dog owners you can take a few simple steps to minimise any interaction between your dog and the koala .

These steps may include if you live in a koala area:

- keeping your dogs in overnight to allow koalas safe passage through your property,
- fencing off an area in your yard that allows your dog to play with appropriate fencing that koalas cannot climb keeping your dogs under effective control when you are away from your property.
- If possible also include a safe passage out of the yard for the koala if they need to exit quickly.
- Provision of a pole or plank leaning at no greater than a 60 degree angle against a
- fence can allow for escape is one way to provide exit from the yard.

If you have found a koala in your yard and you are not sure if it has been attacked please get help as bite wounds are sometimes not noticeable and as mentioned can still be fatal to the koala. They may have also climbed a tree to get away from the dog or dogs and by doing that you may think because they can climb they must be okay. This is not always the case as koalas can still climb with very significant injuries.



Dog owners sometimes are worried about consequences they will face if their dog has come into contact with a koala. We just ask that you get help for the koala.
