Volunteers are needed to help clean up Blacktop Road starting at the junction of One Tree Hill Road and Blacktop Road and working our way up possibly as far as Yorktown Road. Meet at 9.30am. Following the clean up there will be a sausage sizzle at the Institute. Please join in and help.

Application has been made to Council for the building of a Spiritual Christian Russian Molokans Church in our area. This is a very family oriented group who are looking for a quiet spiritual place to worship. Some of the Russians who are involved with our Market are members of this group apparently.

The One Tree Hill Playgroup received a major grant of \$2,900 to construct toy storage cupboards at the Institute. Now applications need to be in by November 18th for the 1st round for the Minor Community Assistance grants for up to \$300. VANDALISM RESEARCH

Elizabeth/Munno Para Together Against Crime (EMPTAC) in conjunction with the Council of Munno Para have provided a research grant for the establishment of a vandalism register and an investigation and report into the incidence of vandalism in the Munno Para area. The aim of the register is not only to reduce the level of vandalism in the area but also to develop a strong sense of pride in the community. The objects of the project are as follows:

- To establish a vandalism register
- To encourage rapid repair of vandalised sites
- To collate data and produce a map of vandalism in Munno Para
- Improve the quality of life and public image of Munno Para
- Promote broad community participation in Project Team activities
- Promote and support constructive community initiatives in dealing with vandalism.

Jo Buchanan (ph: 369 1480) and Matthew Sanderson (ph: 254 0123) can tell you more about the project and would welcome your assistance. They want reports of any vandalism in our area. This includes graffiti which will be referred for quick repair.

ACTIVITIES OF ONE TREE HILL CFS BRIGADE

During September and October we have been very busy with a variety of activities. We have attended a few call-outs to grass fires, already. Even though it isn't summer yet, the grass is very dry, so please be careful. **TRAINING:** We have run a Level 1 course (basic training) for One Tree Hill and Salisbury brigade members. We are currently following up with a Level 2 course for One Tree Hill members. These courses involve theory and practical sessions on different fire fighting techniques, pumps, water, ladders, safety, etc. **AWARD NIGHT:** On October 15th, the Brigade held an Award Presentation Night with members receiving service awards and supporters receiving certificates of appreciation. This was attended by Alan Ferris, Chief Executive Officer of SA CFS, Mayor Gapper, Councillor Lindsell and members from other Para Group brigades. **RAPID:** We have also started the last stage of the RAPID system which is putting up the plates, placing the key tags on phone cords and collecting the donations. If you don't have your plate yet, a CFS member will be visiting you sometime during November. We hope to have the system up and running by the start of the fire season (December 1st). **HOPPER:** The brigade has been monitoring the hopper on the first Saturday of the month with a positive response from residents. Residents have been pleased they are able to dump their rubbish at any time during the day unlike before when the bin was full by 9am! **POLICE BAND CONCERT:** The SA Police Band will be having a concert at the One Tree Institute on Wednesday, November 16th. Everyone is welcome to attend - please invite your friends. Tickets are \$7 and available from the deli, your Rural Watch Zone Leader or myself (I am at the CFS shed on Monday and Friday nights from 7.30pm.)

VETERINARY NOTES FOR NOVEMBER

There are two major problems at this time of year for our pets and farm animals. These are GRASS SEEDS and SNAKES. With the coming of the dry weather and the grasses start to die off dogs pick up grass seeds easily and will need to be checked daily between their toes, eyes, ears, all orifices including vulva and prepuce. Some breeds will need to be clipped. Cats don't have quite so many problems but will need to be checked daily too. Seek veterinary advice if you are unable to remove the grass seed. Prompt action is needed before the seed becomes imbedded particularly in ears. One sign of a grass seed in the ear is shaking of the head and a sideways hang of the head, maybe a drooping ear. Sometimes the shaking will stop after a time as the seed gets lodged in a more comfortable spot. The seed can then cause major problems.

Sheep get seeds in their mouth, eye ducts, eyes, cattle in their mouths and eyes, horses can get seeds around their teeth. Seeds in the mouth cause excessive salivation. Seeds in the eyes cause them to water and half close. In all cases remove seeds and then treat. Pink eye powder is good for eyes. There are also creams and sprays. Horses mouths can be flushed with a hose.

One way to avoid the problem is to plant the pastures with less damaging grasses. barley grass is particularly bad.

Snakes can also be a problem. Keep the area around your house mowed and tidy up tree prunings. Burn if possible. Watch your step especially around water and be noisy!

If your pet gets bitten they will show signs of paralysis and panting. They may become dehydrated. Take them straight to the vet for antivenom injections to boost immunity and fluid therapy. Treatment can be very successful.

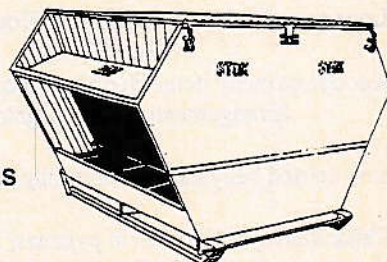


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GARDENERS' CORNER

Wondering what to do or where to go on the weekends?
Why not visit some of our specialist nurseries in the area.

Firstly, visit **KURRINGAL FUCHSIAS**, situated 1.6km down Medlow Road from the Gawler Scenic Road. Syd and Margaret Topperwien have established a fuchsia nursery with approximately 180 different varieties. Over the past two years they have been building shade houses and adding to their collection of fuchsias, striking cuttings and potting on. The nursery was opened to the public on October 16th and will be open on Sundays from 10am to 5pm, and when daylight saving is in effect, they will be open from 5pm to 7.30pm on weeknights.

Just down the road from there is **DAYLILY AND COTTAGE PERENNIAL NURSERY**, situated on Craigmores Road, specialising in cottage plants and daylilies. This is a charming nursery set in a garden setting. It is open on Friday, Saturday and Sunday from 10am to 5pm. Pam and Gerry Janssen have been running their small nursery for 5 years.

Answers to your problems:

Q. My tomatoes look a bit sick and the bottom leaves have brown patches on them. What should I do?

A. Cut off the mottled leaves and dust for powdery mildew. Give the tomatoes a light feed. Blood & bone is good but there are quicker acting fertilisers obtainable from your garden centre. Dilute them to half the recommended dose.

BABY BIRD SEASON

At this time of the year many little birds are taking their first flight out of their nests and they are often a bit weak at first. Many of these birds do not need rescuing but are quietly waiting for their parents to come and feed them. If the baby is uninjured and fully feathered, help it up onto a low branch and watch quietly to see if the parents return. An alternative is to line a ice cream container with tissues and nail it as high as possible up the tree trunk. Put the bird in and again watch for the parent bird. Baby birds are usually better off with their parents. If you have to rescue the bird seek advice from the Bird Care and Conservation Society, there are several numbers in the phone book.
