One Tree Hill CFS — Incident Report March 2018

Another month and another serious car accident, in this case a head on collision on the Gawler-One Tree Hill Road which saw the road closed for several hours around mid-day on the 25th of February. Fortunately, there were no fatalities in this incident, however several people were transported to hospital with serious injuries. They say, "bad things come in threes" and with three major accidents in three weeks, our fingers are crossed that there are no more for a long while. Please take care on our roads, particularly with Easter and the school holidays on the way, and with the winter rains not far off, please drive to the conditions.

On the fire front, despite a couple of minor rubbish related incidents, we remain fire free in the One Tree Hill area for this summer. Dry conditions persist throughout the state and although there have been no major fire incidents during the month, the recent catastrophic fires in Victoria and New South Wales remind us that we can't afford to become complacent just yet.

Burning Off?

As the weather turns cooler, we are regularly asked questions relating to burning off. The situation is clear up until the end of Fire Danger season on the 30th of April with no burning off permitted. After that date, the issuing of permits is the responsibility of your local council, so our best advice is to contact them if you have any questions. At this stage, we have had no indication from Playford Council whether they intend to reinstate the blanket exemption for rural properties that they introduced last year but stay tuned and we will let you know as soon as we get word.

It was great to see so many familiar faces at the school polling booth on election day and thank you for all your kind words and donations. Polling booth barbeques are a great Aussie tradition and days like that are a good reminder of what a fantastic community we have around One Tree Hill.

Councillor's Report

Hotel Playford: Two hundred and thirty jobs will be created as a result of the new hotel development project set to go ahead in Playford's CBD. The Council-preferred concept is for a seven storey hotel to be built on Playford Boulevard on the southern side of the plaza. The announcement of the preferred hotel location opens the door for planning to commence for the design and construction of a new Grenville Community Hub at the top end of the Plaza on the prime site originally proposed for the hotel. New location announced for Grenville Centre is a result of the proposal to build the Hotel Playford on the south side of the Plaza. An opportunity now exists to build the new Grenville Centre at the top of Windsor Green next to the Civic Centre on Lot 1 with adjacent land between Lot 1 and Main North Road providing an area that is suitable for use as the Grenville community garden. The two-storey new Grenville Centre will have approximately 40% more floor area than the existing facility. The new location will provide easy access to the Civic Centre, Library facilities and other amenities. Jo Gapper Park Upgrade Continual improvement of facilities and community amenities is an ongoing part of Council's business. At Jo Gapper Park, new toilet facilities are being installed to improve the park for visitors. Services to the site will be completed and a pre-fabricated kit building will be delivered to site in early April. Local builders will be used to erect the building which has an expected completion date in May 2018. Keeping progress on track to building SA's Next Great City, The City of Playford is rolling out an ambitious program of projects across its Northern CBD, Sports and Health Precincts and other activities. Behind the scenes, Council has implemented a rigorous Project Management Framework designed to set clear milestones, implement best practice, establish clear roles and responsibilities, monitor performance, and to schedule and manage all project activities from concept to completion. This approach is ho

One Tree Hill Progress... Rate-Payers Sub-Committee Report

Councillors Invited to attend

It's been an interesting month of observation with council. The Prince George Plaza we believed to be a \$ 5.5 million project, is not. The final forecast cost is \$ 11.18 million and a cost to ratepayers \$ 8.476 million after federal grant funding.

We are all for growth and development and wish to see our community grow and prosper but is the council spending wisely on our behalf? Are we receiving value for money as the ratepayer? As for the new tennis centre, I'm yet to see these facilities being used in my travels, which cost in the range of \$8.9 million. Value for money?

All of this huge spending by councils on our behalf leads me to ask, what do we receive in our ward as ratepayer's? While the council does collect our rubbish weekly and supports with the local community facilities, are we falling short in comparison? The council in my opinion is not maintaining our roads adequately which does at times compromise all of our safety. The road sides are often a concern and the local community lacks services such as transport facilities.

At the last council meeting it was revealed that council approves, in principle, for an increase to the hard waste service standard to allow up to two services per year for residential premises, via access to home/or voucher as per current service provision, and a change to a year round at call service. The final decision on implementation and cost impacts to be determined within council deliberation on the 2018/19 NAWMA service agreement.

As we are now leading up to the council elections later in the year, I had invited our local councillors to attend our next meeting. We wished to give them the opportunity to share their vision for the next term, should they be elected by the community again. The meeting was to be held at the One Tree Hill Institute on the 12th April 2018 at 9pm following the OTH progress meeting.

The time has now been rescheduled due to Cr Federico declining the invitation. He has requested and is prepared to attend the earlier progress meeting at 7:30pm, as he believes this meeting is representative of the greater community rather than a select few who then pass on their interpretation to the rest of the committee.

I am disappointed by this response as the ratepayer's committee was formed to represent the community and its concerns. The largest has been the rates issue which still remains a concern although rate capping may help address the rate rises.

We as the Ratepayer's subcommittee are here to listen to the ratepayer's concerns and we are seeking accountability and transparency from council.

The councillors are now invited to attend and address the progress meeting from 7:30pm on the 12th April 2018 at the One Tree Hill Institute. The community is welcome to attend as visitors on the evening.







Recipes of the Month... Chickpea Veggie Burger



Ingredients

- 1 can chickpeas
- 1/2 a red onion, finely diced
 - 1 small zucchini, grated
- 3 tbsp. finely chopped cilantro
 - 3 tbsp. red wine vinegar
 - 1 tbsp. sriracha sauce
- 2 tbsp. natural peanut butter
 - 1 tsp. cumin
 - 1 tsp. garlic powder
 - 2 tsp. black pepper
 - 1/2 tsp. sea salt
 - 1 cup of quick oats
 - 2 tbsp. olive oil

Method

- 1. After draining and rinsing chickpeas, place them in a bowl and mash with a fork.
- 2. Add all the other ingredients to the bowl.
- 3. Use your hands to mix very well.
- 4. Form into 6-8 patties.
- 5. Cook on BBQ at around 200 degrees Celsius for approximately 10 minutes each side.
- 6. You can also fry these in a pan with oil for 3-5 minutes each side

What's flowering in my garden?

Many insects are attracted to this small bush including the native blue banded bee. Its leaves are a lovely mid green, almost a lime green. Just perfect to show its gorgeous five petalled flowers. Let the seed pods mature and enjoy the starry shaped seed capsules after the seeds have been dispersed in late spring. It is a lovely garden plant, about 80cms. high by 1 metre wide.

History... **Humbug Scrub Wildlife Sanctuary**More Tales of Ray Bellchamber's Life

Since publishing the article asking for further information I have heard several stories about him.

Ray had some help to manage the sanctuary. One gentleman came to me and said he remembers helping to fence Duck Lake (the lake below the cottage).

Another lady told me of her experience. She attended a "chop picnic" (we would call it a barbecue as they grilled some chops and shared salads) at an oval in Humbug Scrub. As this was 1953, it was not in Para Wirra (Para Wirra was not declared until 1962) so there is some doubt as to the exact location. I will let the lady tell the story.

"Mr Bellchambers came to meet us and take us down the road to the gate. (My sister) was closest to the fence, in an area where there were some emus. She was carrying a large doll, which had a black wig and one of the emus put its head over the fence and tried to take the wig.

There was a desperate scream "That big bird is trying to eat my dolly's hair".

Mr Bellchambers rescued the doll, comforted my sister and walked with her at the head of the group to the oval. Several black ducks walked with us and he picked up one of them and put it on his hat, where it settled happily."

Many people have mentioned The Hat, asking if it was a military hat. I don't know. I suspect it was simply a Gentleman's hat.

We know that Duck Lake has a spring in the bottom, one reason it lasts so well in summer. I also learnt that the approving public servant was a Mr Beaver. I would dearly love to rename the Lake Beaver Lake.

Mary Harris was a supporter of the sanctuary. When she died, she left a sum of money to the sanctuary. Ray chose to sink and fit out a bore, which is reliable even in dry conditions. This has eased the reliance on the lakes for water.

Co-incidentally I also received a letter and photos from Phil Bellchambers including many taken by Tom of the animals he saw in the early years: dama wallabies, southern stone curlew, native cat (quoll), yellow-footed phascogale, and southern brown bandicoot. There is so much that has been lost in the last 110 years.


