

NEWS AND VIEWS FROM YOUR COUNCILLOR

Dear Residents,

Remember, the last day for putting rubbish in the hopper this season will be Saturday 13 March (Federal Election Day - don't forget to vote). The hopper service is available between 8.30 am and 3.30 pm.

Further to our recycling efforts to date, in April, Munno Para Council, in conjunction with NADB will commence a fortnightly recycling program in the urban areas. For us, in the One Tree Hill area, it will mean that, apart from our weekly rubbish collection, there will be various locations around the district each fortnight where we can place recyclables such as paper, cardboard, metal, plastics and glass. So, remember to separate these items from your main stream rubbish and help us to help you keep the recycle program going. However, I would still encourage you to keep your bottles for the CFS who will always put them to good use. The Mayor, Jo Gapper will announce the introduction of the service at the end of March and I will keep you informed of developments and arrange for publicity on details of the recycle times and location points around One Tree Hill (one will be at the hopper site).

The installation of the streetscape to reduce speed through the main street has commenced. This came about because of the concern shown by Progress Association and many people who have requested that the Council address the problem of vehicles speeding through the town, and in turn, also provide a means of beautifying the main street. In addition to this, the islands will provide protected parking bays, and be landscaped with appropriate trees and shrubs that will help beautify the street in keeping with a village atmosphere. Extra street lighting will also be installed and the original design of the islands has been reduced to accommodate a bikelane on both sides of the street through the township. The Council will also place notice boards in appropriate locations at each end of our town so that community groups can promote different meetings and events.

Council's City Engineer has investigated the replacement of the fence at the Institute and it is anticipated that this will be installed soon.

Council, through the City Manager, has advised that 1 km of Craigmore Road will be constructed and sealed this financial year. I would also like at least \$800 000 to be included in the 1993/94 budget for road construction and sealing operations. Council has agreed that the completion of both Craigmore Road and Kentish Road should be considered in its next road construction programme.

A supplementary report on the original Medlow Road waste management site Environment Impact Statement was released and has been discussed by the local management committee set up to oversee operations should the project proceed. It is anticipated that the NADB will put a planning proposal before Council later this year.

Construction of the first of two flood control parks has comenced. These are an integral part of the City's Drainage Strategy and are paid for under the Federal Government's 'Better Cities Fund'. The construction will assist in preventing the flooding of Smithfield West, Andrews Farm and parts of Salisbury. At the end of February Council signed the contract with Stockport Pty Ltd to construct the \$2m+Fradd Road Flow Control Park which will include the landscaping for a proposed nine hole public golf course. The tender for the construction of Stebonheath Flood Control Park will also be let soon.
