NEWS AND VIEWS FROM YOUR COUNCILLOR

Dear Residents,

I would like to inform you of a number of developments that have occurred since I last wrote to you.

They are:

A new fence has been erected at the Institute
An extension to the footpath on the northern side of the Main Street is in place
The irrigation has been installed on McGilp Oval
New Community Sign Boards have been erected
The traffic islands have been planted
Further earthworks have been carried out on Grandview Drive Reserve
The hopper site has been cleaned up.
Road maintenance has been carried out on a number of unsealed roads

Also, the proposed sealing of a 1 km of Craigmores Road is still scheduled for this financial year.

Progress Association asked me to seek Council's help in providing:

Lights, seats and bins at the Institute
Pest control inspection of the Institute
Pruning of overhanging trees along footpaths
Removal of invasive vines smothering native Banksias on the Scenic Route
Water outlets for irrigation of proposed new landscape for Institute
Extra storage space at the Institute, and
Better maintenance of cemeteries.

I also met with Council's new Manager Recreation Services, Gwynn Cleaves and showed him around our District and pointed out areas of interest and concern. Gwynn comes from Hastings, Victoria and commenced on 13 April.

I am looking forward to working with the new Council over the next two years. Even though we have reined in the debt and are managing to keep rates contained, we still have a lot to do. The rapid development taking place and the need for services to be retained and where possible improved, while keeping resources controlled, is a challenge in itself.

The **Hills Face Zone** could become a big issue again. I joined with a number of other concerned members of the community and attended a Conservation Council Meeting on 21 April. The meeting was called to discuss changes to regulations and the possible impact they could have on the **Hills Face Zone**. I will keep you informed of any issues that may need your attention and help.
