NEWS AND VIEWS FROM YOUR COUNCILLOR

Dear Residents.

I thought that I would bring you up to date on a number of issues that have happened in the past couple of months. And most of it is good news!

McGILP OVAL

Fences to help prevent balls going out of the playing area should soon be installed on both the east and west sides of the Oval. Materials to help the Cricket Club upgrade the existing practice nets will be supplied by Council.

Council will also remove the old wire fence along the eastern side of the Oval, along McGilp Road and replace it with a permapine post and rail fence.

The automatic watering system is now fully operational, and top dressing of the oval will be done before the cricket season commences.

ONE TREE HILL CEMETERY

An internment wall for placement of loved ones' ashes, paving, a seat and landscaping are proposed for the cemetery.

Doug and Sybil Winsor and I met with Jarred Rush from Council and discussed the wall's location and appropriate landscaping. Native trees and shrubs will be planted around the cemetery boundary to hide the fence and landscaping will also be extended into the water tank block to create a better flow and theme for the whole area. Some plantings to add a dash of colour will also take place. This work will proceed over the next couple of months.

The front fence which is falling down, will be removed as the existing trees act as a boundary. A padlock has been placed on the front gate to try and reduce the possibility of increased vandalism of cemeteries.

Further drainage work, resheeting of the footpaths and other plantings will be investigated for next year's budget.

LOCAL ROADS

Council has allocated about \$270 000 to upgrade and complete the remaining 2.6 km of Craigmore Road and to seal its portion of Potts Road. There are still some funds left in the road construction program and I will try and get some of those funds (approx \$110 000) earmarked for work on Kentish Road.

Viney Drive will be completely resealed, and Tyeka Drive, Bassnett, Johnson, Shillabeer, Payne, Gould Creek, Taylors and Medlow roads will be resheeted this year.

SIGNS

Keep your eye open for new signs which could appear at each end of our town soon.

RECYCLING

Recycling is still being considered for One Tree Hill. I hope to be able to report further on a proposed trial of a system for both the township and the rural area.

RAPID

Council will support the introduction of the RAPID system into our area. At September's meeting, Council approved funding to purchase the numberplates, and will maintain the directory.

GREENING

A number of Greening Committee initiatives have been going on in our district:

Grandview Drive Reserve is taking shape and the local people have been involved with the Greening Committee and Council employees in the planting of trees and shrubs on 'their' reserve.

Bridal Creeper is a big problem on the Scenic Route. In fact it is suffocating the stand of 100+year old Banksias. Two working bees have been held to remove the creeper, however, there is still a lot to be done. Why not join us on **Sunday 10 October between 10am and 12 noon** and help make a big dent on this invasive creeper and help **SAVE THE BANKSIAS.**

The location is the Gawler Scenic route, near the Kersbrook Road, Park Road intersection. You can't miss us because there are red safety cones to highlight the site and red jacketed people working busily in the bushes. Just bring your gloves and a sense of humour.

MEDLOW ROAD LANDFILL

The Planning Commission has approved the project.

The Management Committee is now at the stage of ensuring that the best possible management practices are included in a report which will form the main thrust to control the site's operations a. Four members of that group could be invited to visit the latest landfill site in Queensland (they say that the operation and control of this landfill is the best in Australia) which has been developed and operates on a very similar basis to the proposed Medlow Road site. This will raise any possible problems that should be addressed before a licence is granted.

COMMERCIAL/RETAIL

The first stage of the \$25m Munno Para Shopping Centre has commenced with the laying of the foundations for Hungry Jack's on the corner of Main North Road and the new entrance to the proposed shopping centre site.

MAJOR ROADS

The Uley Road, Main North Road intersection is being upgraded and signalised to accommodate traffic flows through this busy intersection and for easy access/egress to the proposed shopping centre.

Over the next two years, DRT will modify the Blacktop Road, Main North Road junction. It is proposed to close the centre median and make it a left in, left out operation only. Right turn traffic will be relocated to John Rice Avenue, Main North Road junction which will be redesigned into a four way intersection with Blacktop Road traffic redirected along Bungarra Street. Bungarra Street will be upgraded, sound mounding will be installed and a landscaping scheme will be implemented. The total project which will be Federally funded could cost \$2m.
