One Tree Hill Progress — Rate-Payers Sub-Committee Report

Election Time for Sub Committee

The concerns in relation to future rate issues remain. While we have a proposed 3% rise for the 2018/2019 year, it is the 2019/2020 year that remains the concern. It is my belief that the council will revisit the large rate increase after the council election.

This is why I am seeking further community support. As a community we need to foster positive communications with council and seek to ensure we are represented fairly. Hopefully these communications will achieve greater levels of transparency, accountability, encourage council to drive efficiencies and look at spending in a different light. I believe spending needs to be considered in the terms of "return to the rate payer" both financially and in socio economic terms.

It is great to see the Grand Plans of the next great city unfolding but what long term effect will these plans have on the rate payer? realestate.com.au compared council rates between councils recently and the City of Playford based on a home value of \$450,000 was already the highest at \$1,990. The same value home in Burnside was \$986.

Recently advertised by the City of Playford was the approval and commencement of the Freemont Park upgrade. It is my understanding that the upgrade is a \$23.51 million dollar upgrade of which only \$4.6 million is funded so far. How will this spending affect the City of Playford ratio of debt and how much more will our rates cost?

I am requesting all concerned One Tree Hill ward ratepayers to please attend our next meeting, which will commence following the One Tree Hill Progress meeting around 8:45pm on the 14th June 2018. The main agenda item is the election of the committee and chairperson for the year ahead.

One Tree Hill... Councillor's Report

Bushfire fuel reduction burning is now allowed within the parameters as laid out in last months Grapevine "Council information paper". The Storm Management Plan is out for public consultation and by the time this edition hits the streets the rates public submissions would have been heard and Council will move to set the rates for the coming financial year. Residents and motorists will be noticing the changing skyline of Playford's CBD. Steel works and pre-cast panels are going into place on the carpark project at the corner of Main North Road and Philip Highway. In the coming months, construction will commence on Playford's new hotel, a plaza restaurant and café, and the new Grenville Hub. With the Playford Arena, Fremont Park Stage 2 and the CBD Medical Hub also not far off. Brabham 'track weapon' to be built at Edinburgh Parks 70 high-tech supercars, valued at \$1.8 million each, will be built at ZF Lemforder, Edinburgh Parks. The BT62 V8 will be a midengined 5.4 litre vehicle has been described as a 'track weapon' and is another example of industries that are creating jobs of the future in Adelaide's north. A smart parking pilot project in the Health Precinct is targeting car parking congestion. With parking around the Lyell McEwin Hospital often in high demand, data from recently installed parking sensors is being used by University of Adelaide researchers to analyse parking usage in the area. The pilot will be the first smart city project undertaken under a recently signed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Council and the university. The project is about finding new ways to use technology to make day to day activities of our community easier to manage. A proposed upgrade to Virginia Main Street forms part of the 2018/19 City of Playford Draft Annual Business Plan. The upgrade will include wider footpaths, new trees and street furniture, pedestrian crossings, public Wi-Fi and extensive improvements to stormwater management. The delivery of this project is expected to deliver benefits to local business and tourism opportunities. From July 1st 2018 visit Dogs and Cats on line to register your dog in the meantime phone Council to update your details or find out more about the new way to register your pets and the new regulations in relation to dog and cat management.

One Tree Hill CFS... Incident Report May 2018

Multiple car accidents during May are a concern for the Brigade with the weather only set to get worse. The worst of these was on Precolumb Road on the 7th of May with a report of an entrapment when a car hit a tree. This prompted turnouts from the MFS in Elizabeth and Salisbury along with the Salisbury CFS. This was followed by a car into the guard rail at Hannaford Hump Road on the 10th and then a car roll-over on the same road the following day. With the weather getting wetter and the fog starting to roll in in the mornings it is important that we all drive to the conditions. I should also mention the horrendous condition of the road outside the power station which has now been posted with Traffic Hazard signs.

In addition to the traffic accidents, the severe change in weather bought with it numerous trees down. The first on the Gawler One Tree Hill Road was a tree blocking half of the roadway and was later reported as multiple trees down. We also had another alarm for the school as well as a fuel spill on Friday the 18th near the corner of Blacktop and One Tree Hill Roads.

Earlier in the year, the National Parks department invited members of the One Tree Hill CFS to try out the new camping facilities at the Para Wirra Conservation Park in the first weekend in May. The weather the week before did not look too promising but fortunately cleared and a hardy band of CFS members were on hand to test the facilities. Needless to say, a good time was had by all. The CFS would like to thank the National Parks for their kind offer.

Fire Danger season has now finished but landowners are reminded that there are still some restrictions on burning. You are advised to contact your local Council to ensure that you are meeting all requirements before starting that blaze.



Recipes of the Month... Impossible Savoury Slice



Ingredients

- 1 and 1/2 cups of plain sifted flour
 - 1 tbsp. macadamia oil
 - 8 eggs beaten
 - 4 cups of skim milk
 - 1 large onion diced
- 6 slices 97% fat free bacon rasher finely chopped
 - 2 large tomatoes diced
 - 1 zucchini dried
 - 1 small red capsicum diced
- 2 cups of low fat cheddar cheese grated
 - 2 tsp. fresh basil
 - 1 tbs. dry mustard

Method

- Preheat oven to 180C
- 2. Grease a deep rectangular 20cm x 30cm pan and line with baking paper, overlapping edges on two opposite sides for easy removal when slice is cold.
- 3. In a large bowl add flour, fold in oil, eggs, and milk. Beat well with electric beaters.
- 4. Add remaining ingredients and stir well.
- 5. Pour into prepared pan leaving a 1-2cm gap from the top.
- 6. Bake for approximately 1 and 1/4 hours, or until golden brown on top and cooked in the middle.
- 7. Cool in pan before gently removing. Eat hot or refrigerate.





Community News... One Tree Hill Scout Group

On ANZAC Day, many of the joeys, cubs and scouts turned out in uniform to attend the One Tree Hill Dawn Service, while the venturers and some of the leaders cooked the gunfire breakfast for the hungry crowds. When Term 2 started, cubs followed up with a night to learn about the ANZACS and the meaning behind ANZAC Day and the things we associate with it. With an influx of new members in the cub pack, Term 2 is all about getting back to basics, so the cubs had a night about the Jungle Book, which is the symbolic framework that cubs was based on when it was created by Baden Powell in way back in 1916.

A Grey Wolf Award was awarded to Kailtin, who has just made the transition from the cub pack up to the scout troop. The Grey Wolf Award is the highest award which can be attained by cub scouts. Cody in joeys was awarded his Promise Challenge, which is the highest award for joey scouts. The scout leaders have been very busy getting their scouts skilled up and ready for AJ2016 – which is the next Australian Jamboree, to be held at Tailem Bend, attended by several thousand scouts from all across the country and from overseas. Approx 16 scouts from One Tree Hill will attend the Jamboree, which is held every 3 years.

To support the youth members, of course we need trained leaders. Leaders in scouting undergo extensive training over several years to reach completion of their advanced training (Gilwell wood beads). Just recently one of our scout leaders, Chad, completed his advanced training, which is a huge achievement. Leaders who volunteer their time already put in many, many hours of work into running their sections, and training is on top of all of that. Well done Chad.

Many of the youth involved in One Tree Hill Scout Group are currently involved in a scout gang show called Comedy Capers Gang Show. Performing arts is another branch of scouting where youth of all ages can gain confidence in performing on stage using scouting as their supporting framework. If you ever get the chance to see one, go along, they are a great family show.
