NEWS AND VIEWS FROM YOUR COUNCILLOR

Dear Residents,

Hello and welcome to 1992. I hope it will bring everything you hope for. Firstly, I would like to welcome all new residents to One Tree Hill. I hope you settle in, enjoy and look after your new environment and participate in the community spirit. I know that the many community organisations, including Progress, the Craft Shop and Uleybury School Museum, to name but a few, would welcome your involvement in their activities. Also, a reminder to all residents that the last day for the free hopper service for this fire season will be Saturday, 14 March.

I would also like to inform you that the Mobile Library is to commence operations again. It will be a weekly service, visiting One Tree Hill every Friday between 2.45 and 4.15p.m. The Mobile Library will be bigger and better than before and is capable of carrying more books. So get along and catch up on your reading. It will be located at the back of the Institute.

Council has adopted a strategic plan to help it grow through the 90's. It has set a number of goals with drainage as its main priority over the next three years. I am concerned that road construction could take a back seat and whilst I am willing to compromise, I would appreciate those people having problems with the roads to write to the Major and City Manager, explaining the problems and requesting that road construction maintenance still gets a fair share of your rate dollar.

Preparation of the 1992/93 budget will commence soon and I will be putting forward requests for road construction and maintenance, McGilp Oval improvements, cemetery beautification and drainage and tree planting proposals. This is a wish list but hopefully some of them will get a guernsey and yet, I am still very mindful of keeping our debt in control. As I have mentioned before, Council is working together, and it is hoped to have the \$2.8m deficit put back in the black by July 1996. Council has a proposed 1992/93 Business Plan before it for consideration. We can thank our new City Manager, Joe Collins, and all staff of Council for their input and dedication to reducing the terrible debt that we have been burdened with by previous Councils. However, there is light at the end of the tunnel, and if we can stick to the proposed business plan, with some compromise and if expected forecasts come to fruition, we all should be better off in the long term.

Another piece of good news is the Greening Committee is considering a possible irrigation system for McGilp Oval.

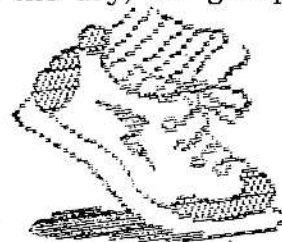
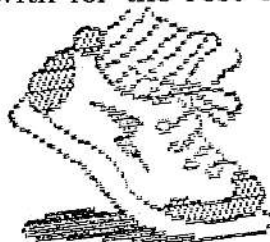
Traffic Speed

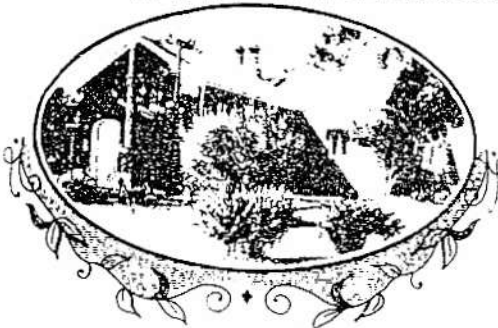
