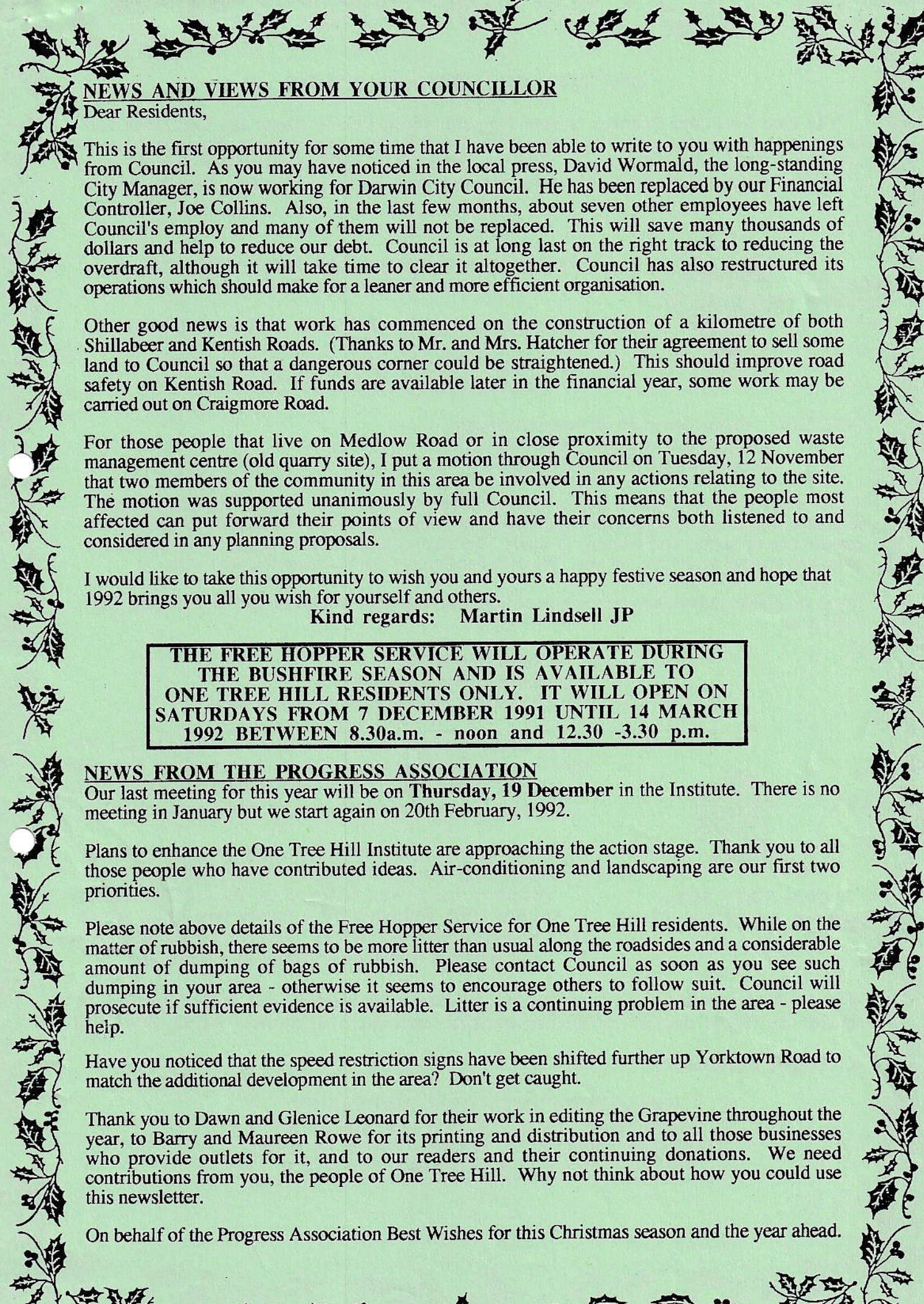

NEWS AND VIEWS FROM YOUR COUNCILLOR

Dear Residents,

This is the first opportunity for some time that I have been able to write to you with happenings from Council. As you may have noticed in the local press, David Wormald, the long-standing City Manager, is now working for Darwin City Council. He has been replaced by our Financial Controller, Joe Collins. Also, in the last few months, about seven other employees have left Council's employ and many of them will not be replaced. This will save many thousands of dollars and help to reduce our debt. Council is at long last on the right track to reducing the overdraft, although it will take time to clear it altogether. Council has also restructured its operations which should make for a leaner and more efficient organisation.

Other good news is that work has commenced on the construction of a kilometre of both Shillabeer and Kentish Roads. (Thanks to Mr. and Mrs. Hatcher for their agreement to sell some land to Council so that a dangerous corner could be straightened.) This should improve road safety on Kentish Road. If funds are available later in the financial year, some work may be carried out on Craigmores Road.

For those people that live on Medlow Road or in close proximity to the proposed waste management centre (old quarry site), I put a motion through Council on Tuesday, 12 November that two members of the community in this area be involved in any actions relating to the site. The motion was supported unanimously by full Council. This means that the people most affected can put forward their points of view and have their concerns both listened to and considered in any planning proposals.

I would like to take this opportunity to wish you and yours a happy festive season and hope that 1992 brings you all you wish for yourself and others.
