

Time For Change Is Near!

Prior the 2017 Rate Review Policy last year most people paid very little attention to the operations of the City Of Playford. The way in which the council considered us the residents of ward 3, was very concerning and led to the formation of the Rate Payers Subcommittee. Over the last 12 months the Rate Payers subcommittee have been keeping a very close eye on the City of Playford and the concerns have only increased from 2017.

It is my opinion that the council under the direction of the CEO Mal Hemmerling will revisit the rates again after the elections later in the year.

The continued secrecy with council is a significant concern. The council should in my opinion, have a greater level of transparency for the rate payers and address the community for feedback with its plans on development. While many of the developments are great to see, at what cost to rate payer do they come? We are already paying some of the highest rates in the state, how much more will they rise over the next ten years? If you are not worried, please review the borrowings and debt levels of council and the future development plans and spending.

Have our councillors let us down of recent times? Is it time for new and fresh representation for the rate payers of our ward? I believe it's time for the community to have their say! As a result I will be stepping down from my role as chairperson of the subcommittee and nominating for our ward in the upcoming election.

I am happy to say that I will be joined by two other locals, who are like minded and wish to add a fresh approach and see greater representation for the rate payers of our community.


One Tree Hill... Councillor's Report

Bushfire fuel reduction burning is now allowed within certain parameters. One is NO BURNING ON SUNDAY or PUBLIC HOLIDAYS. It appears that some people feel that those rules don't apply to them. To get Council to issue a General Permit and extend the burning hours required a lot of hard negotiating mostly by one Rural Councillor. Last year people burnt within the guidelines and getting a General Permit this year was an easier negotiation. I am concerned that if people continue to flaunt the rules we may lose the General Permit moving forward meaning having to apply for a permit in future. Please adhere to the rules so as all the community can benefit from the permit. We upper rural suburbs are the only ones to have the General Permit the plains rural suburbs have to apply to burn. Council held its public consultation hearing in relation to the Draft City Plan and Rates. Only a handful of people made verbal representation and 26 in total made written representations. Facebook got a fair whack with shares, likes and comments. Council in conjunction with the Stretton Centre, Hortex, SA Fresh and associated Horticulture organisations are looking to form a business alliance group to help promote and expand the Northern Regions horticultural enterprises focused around Virginia and surrounding areas. Council and the Stretton Centre are keen to form an alliance / business group for our district's wine and food production producers to help expand and network markets and opportunities for economic growth. If you are interested and feel that you would like to attend a meeting possibley at the OTH Institute please e-mail me at crifederico@playford.sa.gov.au with your contact details and if there is enough interest I will arrange a meeting. If numbers do not warrant a meeting I will, with your permission, forward your details to the team and someone will be able to contact you and discuss your needs and may be able to offer help and opportunities. Councils Draft Open Space Strategy and Guidelines will be out for public consul

One Tree Hill CFS — Incident Report June 2018



An otherwise quiet month turned to tragedy with the vehicle accident on the Gawler-One Tree Hill Road early on Sunday the 24th of June. A driver was killed after losing control of his vehicle and colliding with a tree just North of the new round-about. This resulted in the road between the round-about and Uley Road being closed for several hours while SA Police Major Crash investigated the scene. Our thoughts go out to the family and friends of the deceased. While it is uncertain what caused this crash our message as always is please take care on our roads.

Apart from this accident there was one other minor vehicle accident and three car fires during the month. Many people would have seen the results of the most significant of these vehicle fires which occurred in the early hours of the 22nd of June near the corner of Hannaford Hump Road and One Tree Hill Road and resulted in a ute being totally burnt out. The only other incident for the month was a tree down near the power station on Blacktop Road.

We would once again like to thank everyone who has contributed to making our station one of the best in the state.








What's flowering in my garden today

Winter has arrived with a cold and wet few days resulting in much welcomed 60 mils recorded in the rain gauge.

Hakea "Burrendong Beauty" is flowering and it's glorious brilliant cherry red/pink flowers really do standout in a winter's landscape. Hakea "Burrendong Beauty", believed to be a hybrid between Hakea myrtoides and Hakea petiolaris, was found as a seedling at the Burrendong Arboretum


in New South Wales. Planted in full sun or part shade, it can grow to approximately 80 cms high but about 1.5m in width. The beauty of this plant is in the intense colours of the round golf ball sized flowers that bloom on the length of all it's mainly horizontal branches. It is propagated from cuttings and is available from many retail garden shops. At flowering time, which can be about 4 weeks duration, the New Holland Honeyeaters, Eastern Spinebills and Lesser Honeyeaters all visit this plant for nectar. Even the Blue Wrens find tasty morsels along it's sometimes straggly stems. Once established this Hakea may need to be pruned to keep it in an acceptable shape and size. When in flower Hakea "Burrendong Beauty" is an a sight to behold. An absolute beauty.



Community News ... Letter to the Editor

Dear Editor,

Many Playford Council Ward 3 ratepayers and residents were deeply distressed by the way in which we were treated in the 2017 rating review process. We have significant concerns about the secrecy surrounding Council business, the growing cost of our already expensive rates and the increasing amount of debt with which Playford is burdening future ratepayers. The purpose of this initial letter is to let your readers know that David Kerrison, Bob Ryder and Steve Huckstepp (members of the One Tree Hill Progress Association and long term local residents) have decided to try and do something about the many Council issues. We will be nominating for the upcoming Playford Council elections for the expanded Ward 3.

None of us have political ambitions, but someone needs to step up to the plate to try and better represent our ratepayers and residents. As like-minded business people, we share the same concerns about Council and therefore see value in working together as a team to ensure the needs and interests of the hills and foothills residents are given sufficient voice in Council. In particular we want to ensure that Council spending is in line with what the ratepayers can afford and rein-in Council borrowing to ensure future debt is manageable. With the 2018 expansion of our Ward taking in Hillbank and most of Craigmore we also see a need to ensure Council services and spending in our Ward meets our growing service and infrastructure needs.

We have agreed on 5 key messages:

- Apply downwards pressure on council rates.
- Ensure robust Business Plans for all major projects.
- Focus on accountability and service delivery efficiency.
- Ensure Council Services and spending in our Ward meets our growing service and infrastructure needs.
- Develop a plan to pay off debt.

You will hear more from us in coming months and we especially want to hear from the local community about what they want from Council. We intend to establish a presence at the Market beginning in July and will be setting up a Facebook page to facilitate contact.


