Local Member of Parliament Retiring

Lea Stevens grew up in the southern suburbs of Adelaide. She attended South Road Primary School and Marion High School. She was Head Prefect in her last year. Her tertiary studies were at the University of Adelaide where she was awarded a Bachelor of Science and later a Diploma of Education.

In the early 70's, she taught in several private schools whilst having her two children, Dan and Tim. In 1976, Lea and husband Mike, moved to the One Tree Hill area on to a 10 acre block. The boys attended the playgroup organized by the many young mothers in the area at the time and then OTH Primary School. Lea was involved with the School Council and Progress Association and community activities during the 80's.

She worked at several schools in the public education system most notably at the Para West Adult Campus and Fremont-Elizabeth High School where she was Principal.

In 1994, she was elected to the then seat of Elizabeth in the SA Parliament. This seat later became Little Para and took in the southern parts of the One Tree Hill area around Gould Creek and the Little Para dam. She was the Minister of Health from 2002 to the end of 2005.

Lea is looking forward to her retirement from politics and to getting involved in the many areas of interest to her, including early childhood development and China.

Alas, the curious alpacas discovered a well-established oleander bush.


The oleander seemingly known to all the other indigenous animals as a poisonous shrub had never caused any problems before. Unfortunately the alpacas adopted from another environment were not aware of any danger and greedily partook of their newfound treat.

Very sadly they perished.

Pictured below is the shrub Nerium Oleander, the plant is widely grown in gardens and community parks throughout Australia, although of late it has been discouraged because of the toxic leaves. If digested in large quantities it can prove to be fatal.

Make sure that you don't have any of the plants within reach of curious alpacas or other animals.





OTH CFS REPORT FEBRUARY 2010

ARE YOU LIABLE TO BE FINED OR PROSECUTED?

Remember that during the fire danger season:

It is illegal to operate any internal combustion engine (including motorbikes, quad bikes tractors, other stationary engines) within 4 meters of flammable material unless a shovel or rake plus a portable water sprayer are on hand and the exhaust system complies with the regulations (which includes among other items that no heated exhaust components may come into contact with flammable material).

> On Total fire Ban days operating the equipment listed above outside is prohibited unless a schedule 10 permit is obtained.

On Total Fire Ban days, comfort and other cooking fires (including non-gas Weber type barbeques) are prohibited from being used in the open air, even if they comply with all of the mandatory regulation requirements regarding comfort and other fires that generally prohibit/restrict the lighting of fires year round).

Some History part 11: The Kirks of Kirklands: Part Two

The second generation of Kirks in One Tree Hill began with Robert, the eldest son of Alexander Kirk and his wife Clementina Smart. Robert spent his early years in One Tree Hill and in 1877 married Cecilia Wilson McEwin, daughter of Robert McEwin of Golden Grove. They had 6 children.

For a time Robert and his family resided in the northern towns, Narridy, Crystal Brook and Warnertown, where his uncles, Robert and Charles Smart, owned property. Later, Robert and family, returned to the local district where 3 of their daughters married sons of the Roberts, Bowey and Hutchens thus connecting these early families. Sadly their only son Robert Alexander died at the age of nineteen.

Of the remaining Kirk children seven were daughters, all of whom married local men. Two married brothers named Wilson, both of whom were blacksmiths. The remaining daughters married into the Shillabeer, Jones, Davies, Jose and Burdon families respectively. Some of their children also married into local families such as Walter and Millar.

The seventh and ninth Kirk children of Alexander and Clementina were boys. John was born in 1861 and died in 1890 without having married. Alexander Charles was born in 1867 almost 21 years after his older brother Robert.

Alexander Charles was described as "the best haystack maker in the district". In those days hay was cut, parcelled into sheaves, stooked and then carted in from the paddocks to be stacked. The resulting haystacks, if well made, looked attractive and were very durable.

In 1891 Alexander Charles married Bessie Melinda Gaylard the daughter of Percival Gaylard and Jane Emma Gould, youngest daughter of Joseph Gould, an early settler of Gould Creek. Percival Gaylard, described as "an English gentleman farmer," served as Chairman of the Tea Tree Gully Council from 1867-1874. His two storey, nine roomed, stone residence of "Burrow Hill", stood on the hillside on the western side of the OTH road south of Gould Creek, where a more recent house now stands.

Alexander Charles and Bessie Kirk had one child, a son Allan Vernon, who inherited "Kirklands". Allan married Mary Lillian (Mollie) Martin a relative of the neighbouring Richardson family and they had two sons and a daughter. These sons Raymond John Bertram and Vernon Alexander both married daughters of local families and their sons now all live in the district on property that was originally part of "Kirklands".

Like his father, Allan enjoyed sport as well as a game of cards. He and wife Mollie played for the local tennis team. However, the occupation for which Allan was best known was his remarkable water divining skill. Many of the older local residents availed themselves of his expertise and attribute their successful underground water supplies to his ability.


Allan also operated the local milk run with his younger son Vernon in which they collected milk from local farmers and delivered it to the Farmers Union depot at Mile End. Farming identities around the district still remember that daily milking chore.

Vernon Alexander Kirk aged 91, the present owner of "Kirklands" had a reputation in his younger days as an excellent rifle shot. He was also the number 1 player for the local tennis team for many years, carrying on a family tradition.

Few families in South Australia can claim their property as one of the original land titles still held by the descendants of the original owners. The existing generation of Kirks are well able to justify this unique claim.

TIPS ON HORSE CARE

We hope to be able to bring you regular tips on care for your horses by a local identity, Julie Buttery.

These Tips are very appropriate to start with, what to do to help your horse in HOT WEATHER:

On extreme fire danger days do not leave rugs, fly masks or veils on your horse. If the horse gets caught in a fire, the rugs etc. will melt onto the horse and cause major burns. Nearly all rugs contain some synthetic material, even "cotton" ones. Oiling the hooves is an important job as this hot weather dries the hoof out, allowing it to chip. Oil in the evening so it can be absorbed overnight. Shod hooves need more oiling as the iron shoe absorbs heat from the ground. Use an oily (liquid) dressing, not a grease-based one in hot weather. You want to moisturise, not protect from the wet.

Shape One Tree Hill's Future with Blueprint



City of Playford has created Blueprint to confirm and refine community views on the future of One Tree Hill, Angle Vale and Virginia. This understanding will help Playford develop separate master plans for each town which will guide change and development in each township.

Blueprint is a series of interactive workshops that will be delivered with professional planning partner Hassell.

Playford's townships give Playford a unique and valued urban and rural character. The diversity in its people, industry and lifestyle provides a culture that is hard to find elsewhere. The need to carry out Blueprint in each of the townships was emphasised by City of Playford Acting Mayor Councillor Glenn Docherty:

"One Tree Hill's community needs and wants are unique. Blueprint is designed so that One Tree Hill can maintain the things that make it a special and distinctive place now and in to the future".

"I urge all those interested in the future of One Tree Hill to take part in Blueprint. It provides the opportunity to have real input to the long term planning that will shape the future development of the town" Cr Docherty said.

Blueprint is a two stage process. In stage one City of Playford and Hassell will work with the One Tree Hill community to generate ideas around the future of the township. These ideas will guide the concept design. In stage two the concept will be brought back to the One Tree Hill community for presentation and interaction to help refine it.


THE CHRISTMAS MORNING SERVICE was something special, when people were able to celebrate and remember the Birth of Jesus.



HANDY HINTS AROUND THE HOME

To re-use an old paint roller tray or to keep a new one clean, simply place the tray into a plastic bag or small garbage bin liner. Pour in the paint and the bag will sink into the shape of the tray. When you've finished, take off the bag and dispose of it, leaving your tray ready to use next time without cleaning.

Music is very much a passion with him but so too is computer technology. He skillfully combines these two when he is busy in the family room which he has set up as a recording studio. (Mum and Dad usually find an excuse to be elsewhere at these times!) He has recorded and produced a number of tracks for friends and others all of which have been well received. He is hoping to become a professional sound engineer and performer but is also considering web design as a career.

With the current Cricket Season in full bowl the Grapevine was delighted to find this article about the very early days of Cricket in OTH. We think the reference is to Sampson's Flat.

Taken from The Express Publication 30th September 1898, page 3f.

The return match between the Munno Para East and the Universal Cricket Club was played on the practice ground of the former club near One Tree Hill. The Universalists started from the Kent Town Hotel in an omnibus and four vehicles. The Brunswick Band enlivening the early morning with it's superior sounds.

Breaking from the North Road at the Little Para, the whole party might have supposed they were about to scale the Alps, so precipitous is the track up the spur to the Bay of Biscay ground beyond.

Once safely upon the hills by pleasant detours, enjoying beautiful views of deep glens with magnificent prospects of broad plains and the off ocean, the party made their way to the spot where the match was to be contested.

On the rising ground near the foot of the slope were pitched tents for the Clubs and their scorers,

for the band and an additional one for the ladies considerable numbers of whom were mingled with the spectators, who amounted to from 150 to 300 persons. These with the well-placed field, the tents and the band, filling the valley by turns with melting or moving music which found response in the surrounding hills,


