

Dear One Tree Hill Residents,

A quiet month where grants were submitted and acquitted and allowing our State and Federal Members a bit of time to settle into their new roles.

We have been informed that Cornishmans Hill Road, Alexander Avenue and Potts Road are scheduled for resurfacing in August.

We have had correspondence from CFS Region 2 Headquarters regarding the Kersbrook Road fire siren and we will start to engage the noted business with the removal and reposition of the fire siren.

City of Playford have received a response from the Chief Executive of the Department for Environment and Water regarding Bathurst Burr in the district. It seems that though this is one of 150 declared pest plants it is best controlled by education and awareness-raising of landowners. The local landscape board, Green Adelaide, are focused on new and emerging weeds such as Buffel grass, African love grass, Chilean needle grass and Coolatai grass. The past month has seen damage to the hall which has needed urgent repair from the City of Playford maintenance team which we thank sincerely. With the cost of electricity, hirers forgetting to turn off air-conditioning and appliances, damage to doors and tables we are now in the process of reviewing the cost of hiring the hall.

We have updated the web page with a lot of past Grapevines that were kindly provided to us by Meredith and David Parker and from the Local History section of the Playford Library. As a thank you to the Library Steve Huckstepp presented the Manager with a DVD of all the Grapevines we had on file to increase their collection. Thank you to everyone for helping to expand the knowledge base of One Tree Hill history.

Progress meets on the second Thursday of the month at the One Tree Hill Institute from 7:30pm.

One Tree Hill CFS ~ May Report



A couple of wild and woolly weekends over the last month have seen the Brigade take the unusual step of having standby crews allocated to cover the expected extreme weather. On the first of these weekends, the wild weather finally struck on Monday morning, the 30th of May, resulting in a large pine tree falling across Black Top Road into the path of an oncoming vehicle. The crew had just cleared this job when it was called up to stand-by at the station and was eventually deployed to assist the Salisbury SES after what was described as a “mini tornado” left a path of destruction through parts of Salisbury and Elizabeth South. The crew ended up helping at the Calvary Central Districts Hospital where part of the roof had been dislodged resulting in areas of the hospital being evacuated due to flooding.

This wind and wet weather have really taken their toll on trees in the area with other trees falling across Blacktop Road at Gould Creek on the 4th of June and one on Toolunga Road at Yattalunga on the 25th of May. We were also called to a vehicle fire on Uley Road on this day, with the vehicle on LP Gas which caused some concern before finally being extinguished.

The only other call for the month was for the 10,000 litre tanker from One Tree Hill to assist crews from Virginia, Salisbury and Elizabeth MFS with a refrigerated container fire at Penfield. This fire started around 7:30 PM on the 11th of June and crews were eventually released around 10:30.

Big Changes



Many of you would have seen the big changes at the station with the building being rendered and repainted in the striking new red and grey colours. The roof has also received a long overdue coat of paint. This is part of a government program to refurbish fire stations around the state and introduce a “standard” colour scheme to make them more distinctive. I think you will all agree that it is a vast improvement over the old cream brick and green colours. The building is not the only thing to change with the Brigade taking delivery of a new 34 appliance. This vehicle carries 3,000 litres of water and replaces our old 24 unit which has been with the Brigade for more than 10 years.

The members of the Brigade would like to pass on a big “thank you” to all the members of the community who generously give us donations, many on an annual basis. While most of our standard day to day expenses are met by the state government these donations enable us to equip the station above and beyond what is supplied as well as provide equipment on the trucks which is beyond the standard kit.

The Federal Government is about to recognise 31 members of the Brigade who will be receiving a National Emergency Medal for efforts during the 2019/20 fire season which included deployments to the massive fires in Queensland and New South Wales as well as the Cudlee Creek fire here. Congratulations to all who will be receiving medals in a presentation on the 25th of June.

With most of us using our combustion heaters for several weeks now, it is timely to remind people to take care when disposing of those ashes. The ashes you take out of your heaters are not always as cold as they seem to be and can smoulder for hours or days before eventually going out and the act of moving the ashes can introduce air which may encourage them to reignite. In the past, people have made the mistake of using plastic containers to store ashes before disposing of them or even dumping them in wheelie bins resulting in unexpected fires that can spread to nearby buildings. Metal buckets are available at hardware stores and are a much more practical solution.

over the last couple of months we have had a number of OTH residents (more elderly) who have been victims of scams and lost substantial amount of money. I don't report on these as they are personal however the info sheet below (from the SAPOL web site) offers some very good advice as to how to protect yourselves from a scam. In particular, it highlights that you don't send money to anyone unless you know exactly who it is.

SCAMS

A scam is a dishonest act where someone may trick you into parting with your money.

Scammers can be very convincing and invent seemingly legitimate reasons to make you part with your money.

Scammers will contact a person through emails, phone calls, text messages or letters.

To reduce your chances of becoming a victim of a scam, please consider the following crime prevention tips:

- Always know who you are communicating with and where your information is going. If you are uncertain, confirm the contact is legitimate through methods other than what they have provided.
- Never give your personal details, passwords, credit card or online account details to a person you cannot identify in an official capacity.
- Legitimate companies, particularly financial institutions will not send emails requesting you to log on to a link – log on independently if you need to access that site.
- Ignore emails and text messages which advise you have won a competition that you did not enter.
- Do not send money to receive lottery winnings or to claim a prize.
- Never give an unsolicited person remote access to your computer. You may compromise the security of your device and your personal information.
- Ensure your computer is protected with regularly updated anti-virus and anti-spyware software.

Playford Council ~ Local Councillor's Report

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

The recent rains have highlighted several water and flooding concerns across the City of Playford. As one of your Councillors for Ward 3, I have taken the time to inspect and discuss these concerns along with arranging a meeting and site tour within Ward 3 with the CEO Sam Green and the General Manager City Assets Simon Blom. One area that needs addressing is what seems to be a disconnection between the engineer's desktop and the field application.

Cornishmans Hill Road – One Tree Hill

The condition of the seal has deteriorated to a point where it has been acknowledged that large portions, if not the entire seal, will need to be removed and reinstated. I will be advocating that the entire seal needs to be replaced to have confidence in the integrity and longevity of the road and to protect the capital investment of the ratepayer and funds received via the grant process.

This renewal project included the removal and reconstruction of the road pavement, installation of stormwater infrastructure and the resealing of a 1.1km segment of the road as part of the Asset Renewal Program. The administration advises the contracted price is to be retained however I can advise is that the projected budget was in the order of \$800,000 to \$900,000 and was part funded by the City of Playford and by a Special Local Roads Program Grant.

As part of the contractual arrangement with the contractor, the City of Playford advises that there is an agreed scope and quality on which the works will be paid. Until the agreed scope and quality is achieved, including all rework required, the contractor will not be paid. The contractor will be inspecting the road three times a week and undertaking any temporary repairs until the weather is warmer and suitable for permanent rectification. The monitoring, implementation of temporary repairs and the resealing of the road will come at no cost to the Council.

Medlow Road – Uleybury

The City Operation and Asset Delivery teams are working together to assess the shoulder, swale and stormwater maintenance requirements of this road on the low side of the Balefill to better manage the reoccurring erosion caused by the velocity of water. I will continue to advocate for a permanent and cost-effective solution.

Blacktop Road – One Tree Hill

The footpath on Blacktop Road is still on hold pending a response regarding the Native Vegetation. The first section near Jordan Drive is a designated Significant Environmental Benefit (SEB) offset site. Our environment team are currently assessing whether we can build through this section, what protections and other requirements there may be for the trees. ie. if works can be done utilising machinery or need to be completed by hand. The works will not be completed before 30th June as previously projected and remain dependant on Native Vegetation time frames.

If you have concerns regarding the other current road works including Riggs Road and Alexander Ave, please give me a call as I will be following up with the administration. Thank you to the Kentish Road resident who raised the water and safety concerns and to Andy Slager Senior Manager City Operations for meeting us onsite to address these concerns.

Unfortunately, the response regarding Bathurst Burr from Greening Adelaide was disappointing and I'll provide further updates in due course.

Thank you for the local support and interest in our community.

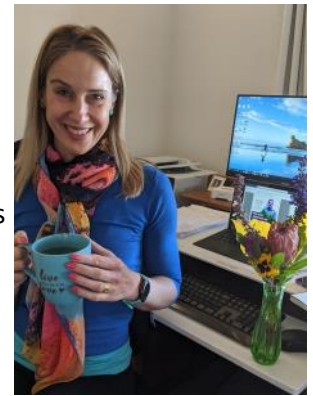






Let's Talk About Boys!

When I look at the culture that surrounds many of our boys - I am concerned that there may be a bit of a crisis going on! It seems some of the masculine ideals our boys continue to be presented with are creating longer term issues and a big strain on our mental health system. Research shows that overall girls are gaining better educational outcomes and improving with overall health and yet the stats on mental health issues for men are concerning.

Some of the young men I am meeting are really struggling with emotional stuff as they question how they "should be" while reflecting on how they have grown up. When young men are told to "man up", "you will be right", "be the bigger boy", "move on from feeling like this" – this can start to build uncertainty when it comes to managing emotions and feelings. Some of this may sound "dated", extending from previous generations, but this culture is impacting on many of our boys today. It is concerning when the environment that our boys hang out in, is often defined by the lowest form of acceptable behaviour in a group! Because the others are doing it... it is ok!

I am not advocating that we toss out recognition that many boys thrive on being active, busy and loud... but I would like it if we could take more notice of boys still needing emotional connection, and that physical and emotional development occur at different stages to girls. Often with boys we may see "anger" - it is common amongst our teenage boys to see random angry reactions to parents. Anger is just the visible emotion. Usually, with anger, there is more that sits behind it. Often these are reactions that are begging to be explored. Underneath, our boys may have fears, unanswered questions, difficulty communicating, times of sadness or feelings of not being a typical loud sporty boy.

My proposal is that in our own little communities - families etc, we start to give more recognition to the feelings of our boys. Boys need to be able to name these, check in on these and make sense of options to move ahead, despite feelings of doubt, fear, loneliness, comparison etc.

When I hear a 9 year old boy tell me he is sad, doesn't know why, thinks he doesn't fit in the world and worries he is not "loud, good in big groups or sporty", I am concerned! What is wrong with this?

Next time your boy is heading off with his mates to a party, how about you ask him to be the best behaved boy in the room!? - not to feel he can't join in but to consider lifting his standards and doing what he thinks might be a safe and healthy path for him. Tell him it is ok to be him! Sometimes boys are just needing someone to kick it off and their friends may follow! As Dumbledore said in the first Harry Potter movie... "It takes a great deal of bravery to stand up to your enemies, but a great deal more to stand up to your friends". A few final takeaways for parents are:

- Spend time in conversation with your sons – just make time – cars can be great places for conversations with boys. If we don't break the silence the internet will be sure to fill the gap!
- Teach them that they and their feelings do matter – lead by example – share stories and show some of your own vulnerabilities.
- Teach them to say "no" and to hear "no" - boundaries are important!

Koalas and Mites

Most mammals have mites that live on their fur, which are highly specific to their particular hosts, sliding up and down the hair to access their food, which mostly seems to be oils and other fatty materials on the hair follicle.



The Koalas constant grooming usually keeps the mite population in check, but large populations may sometimes build up if Koalas live in very close contact with one another, and the mites transferring to the other Koala/s.

Outbreaks are associated with itching more than usual in the inner thighs, groin, arms and back. They may lose little tufts of fur may occur while scratching, but they don't have much in the way of bald spots, bleeding, inflammation, redness, odour or the characteristic white raised lesions of SARCOPTIC MANGE.

There is no need to have any treatment done to oneself, as the Mites will not survive on humans as we have no fur.

What's Flowering In My Garden?



Hakea invaginata has long narrow rounded pale green leaves and can be trimmed or pruned to maintain it's rounded shaped in order to not become too straggly. The brownish bronze shade of it's new growth contrasts well against the pale green needle like foliage and appears after flowering or pruning. This Hakea, available from most garden nurseries has no lignotuber and if destroyed by fire will only regenerate from seed. It is a lovely small shrub to have in the garden. Hakea invaginata; another stunning Hakea to admire and enjoy.

Just beautiful.

Rain, rain and more rain. The recent rainfall has been most welcomed with some small dams overflowing and hopefully the larger dams will fill with further rain expected during Winter and Spring. Some Banksias with their magnificent flowering spikes are an absolute delight to enjoy. Most Correas are in full flower creating mounds of brightly coloured bell shaped flowers with colours ranging from pale pink to glowing orange and brilliant dark red. The blooming Banksias and Correas are attracting many nectar foraging birds and it is most enjoyable to watch a resident family of Eastern Spinebills enjoy the flowering garden plants.

It's this time of the year that the Hakeas are putting on their stunning display of bird attracting flowers. Hakea Stockdale Sensation has been just beautiful for about 8 weeks now and there's still some more flower buds to open up.

Hakea invaginata has many flower buds that have burst open, shedding their silvery green protective covering to reveal tiny balls of deep pink/purple flowers. As they open up further, the colour changes to a cream/off white shade and will change again to a dark pink shade as the flower ages. This colour transformation results in seeing a medium sized rounded shrub showing off masses of flowers at different stages of development. This Hakea which grows naturally over a large area of southern Western Australia will grow up to 1.5m to 2m high and wide in well drained soils. Once established, it is very drought tolerant.

Fred Riley's Book Available Now at the Post Office

Many of you will already have read about the late Fred Riley's book "Strong To Serve" by Joseph Mack, which was released earlier this year. Sadly, with Fred's declining health and then passing in April, the family did not get to hold the official book launch they had planned.

As such, the stock has been held since then, and the family is keen for these to be made available to One Tree Hill residents at a reduced price. Wain Walker has kindly offered a space to stock these on a shelf at the Post Office. They are available for only \$25, and will need to be paid by cash.

This is one of the last books we'll see that included extensive, recent interviews with the subject. The author spent countless hours with the great Fred Riley (who, as of May 2022 when this review was written, has only just passed away) who was able to share his extensive memories and support them with primary sources like his logbook. Records left by his contemporaries were also consulted to cross-reference the accounts and also add context and detail. The narrative is finely crafted and Fred continues to live among the pages, such is the effort the author made to understand the man, to get inside his head as it were. The author's strong aviation background certainly helped here, but it's his empathy that made the strongest contribution. The book is also the first time, or at the very least the first time in a long time, that No 130 Squadron has been written about in detail. This is the almost 260-page paperback that punches well above its weight.

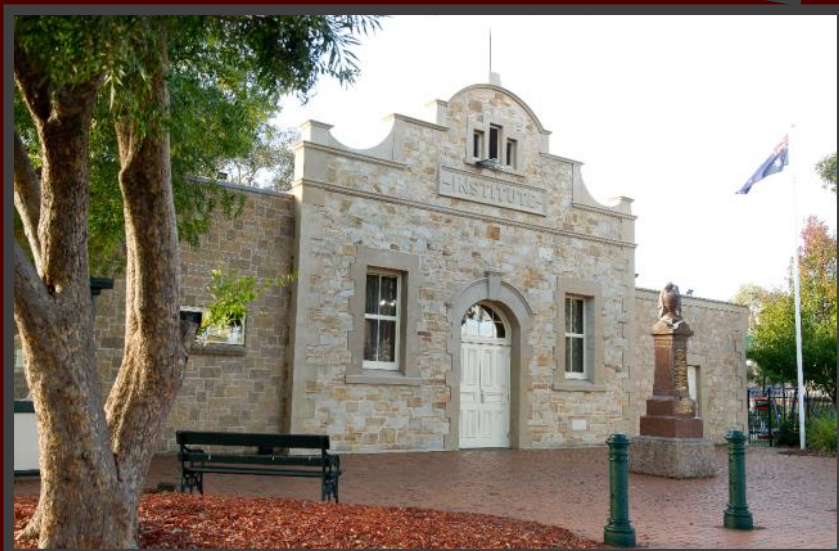

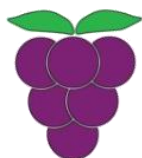

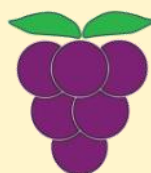
