One Tree Hill Progress... Rate-Payers Sub-Committee Report

Election of New Committee

Thank you to the dedicated locals who attended the last meeting for the formation of the new Ratepayer Subcommittee. There remain many concerns for the residents of Ward 3 and we plan to keep a keen eye on the developments of the City of Playford.

The article in the Northern Weekly 27th June by Tim Jackson former CEO clearly expressed our concerns. In his article he raised concerns about the debt level and that it, "should be of grave concern to ratepayer and residents", highlighting project debt to peak in 2019/2020 at \$178 million.

Tim Jackson also expressed shared concerns on the sale of assets and the lack of detail thereof. He further stated, "this is unacceptable from a transparency perspective as they are community assets." He went on to raise other concerns and observed that if the City of Playford's plan falls short, the debt levels may reach \$250 million.

The City of Playford's spending plan is nothing short of audacious and they are committing future ratepayers to massive interest payments to service their debt. Our councillors have been falling short in asking the hard questions for accountability when in session. They should be promoting greater levels of transparency to their ratepayers and community.

The Ratepayer Subcommittee will continue to ask the hard questions of Council and seek higher levels of transparency. We welcome community support and feedback; please feel free to give me a call.

One Tree Hill... Councillor's Report

Regrettably, I have missed two Council meetings in the month of June as I was spending time hospitalised in the new RAH. I am pleased to say that thanks to the expertise and service received from the surgeons and staff at the RAH and RDN, I am now up and at it and raring to go. As such I am now signalling my intention to renominate as a Ward Three Councillor for re-election at the upcoming Council Elections in November, however beyond this article I will not be using this column or the Grapevine to further my prospects other than by paid advertisement. I am still always available for a chat at the OTH Country Market.

Council continues with its day to day business as usual, as the caretaker period fast approaches due to the upcoming Council Elections. Dog Registrations are now managed by the Dog and Cat Management Board (DACO at the web site dogsandcatsonline.com.au), however if you are unsure as to what needs to be done please contact Council direct. As of July 1 you can now have two hard waste collections per financial year, or you can choose to exchange your collections for dump vouchers and take your rubbish to NAWMA's public waste transfer station.

Council news:

- Savings deliver new services for SA's NEXT Great City—Over the past financial year, Playford has worked hard to reduce operating costs and provide the right mix of services to benefit our region and cater for our rapidly growing population. Some of these new services in the 2018/19 Annual Business Plan include a redevelopment of Virginia's main street, a new Grenville Hub, and infrastructure to deliver even more cheap, recycled water to green Playford. Council will invest \$73.36 million in its Capital Works Program and \$105.75 million on existing business and usual services, including 19 km of footpaths, 4 km of kerbing and 40 km of sealed roads.
- New Grenville Hub Concepts—Throughout the year, the Grenville Consultation Group has been involved in providing input to the concept design for the new Grenville Hub. Architects City Collective have used this input to develop an innovative design concept.
- <u>Playford welcomes increased police numbers based in Northern CBD</u>—About 500 police officers will be based at the Elizabeth
 Police Complex in Playford's Northern CBD as SA Police transitions from Local Service Areas to four Police Districts in Adelaide's
 north, south, east and west. The move will further strengthen Playford's CBD as a focal point for services in the north. The
 Northern Police District will be home to a larger, more flexible working group assisted by new and enhanced central crime
 assessment, investigation and intelligence support, improving frontline services and public safety.</u>

One Tree Hill CFS — Incident Report July 2018



Several unusual incidents this month, but the only significant call-out was one to assist Kersbrook CFS and other agencies in a building collapse. Our truck was turned back just as we arrived and actual details are a bit sparse as the incident has not been reported in the press.

There were two incidents where we were called to single car vehicle accidents, but in both instances the occupants had left the scene. One involved a car over the edge of the One Tree Hill road near Melville Road around 5 a.m. on the 29th of June, the other involved a car and a caravan into a tree on Bassnett Road around midnight on the 12th of July. In this case, after investigating the scene and finding no-one around, the incident was left in the hands of the SA Police.

Two trees down, one completely blocking Cornishmans Hill Road, and a minor two car vehicle accident made up the complement of the calls up to the 18th of July. We all hope the quiet spell will continue however it only takes one mistake to cause a major incident.

House Fires from house fires

Other brigades and the MFS have been busy with a spate of house fires caused either directly or indirectly by combustion heaters. I was reminded the other night by a spark flying out of my heater and into a foolishly placed cat bed not to be complacent and it led me to thinking what I would have done if it had been more serious. Luckily cat and bed are both ok, but it shows how quickly your pleasant log fire can turn into a problem.

Another issue is disposal of embers; a house in the suburbs became involved in fire recently caused by a wheelie bin that had been set alight by embers that appeared dead. Plastic and embers are a bad mix, and for \$15 a steel bucket is a much safer option.

Hard to believe that we are more than half-way through the year and it's time once again to start thinking about the upcoming fire season. How are your preparations going? Apparently, it was Benjamin Franklin who said "an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure".

Members are reminded that as always, the AGM will be held on the first Monday in August. Although this is a non-voting year attendance at the meeting is compulsory.







Recipes of the Month... Classic Shepherd's Pie

Ingredients:

- 3 brown onions, finely sliced
- 3 cloves crushed garlic
- 100 ml red wine
- 500 g lamb mince
- 100 g swiss brown mushroom
- 100 g green peas (optional)
- 250 ml beef stock
- 50 g corn flour
- 60 g butter
- 100 ml extra virgin olive oil
- 10 sprigs thyme, picked
- 1 bunch curly parsley, chopped
- mashed potato
- 1 sprig rosemary



Preparation: 25 minutes | Cooking: 2 Hours | Serves: 4

Method:

- 1. Put the butter and half the oil in a pan then sweat the onion and garlic on a very low heat for approximately 1 hour. You are trying to caramelise the onion which will give a great depth of flavour and sweetness to the
- 2. In a separate pan, fry the lamb mince in batches until golden. Use a hot pan so the mince doesn't stew. Once it's golden, tip it into the onion pot.
- Turn the heat up and add the mushrooms. Cook until they take some colour then add the red wine. Reduce by half then add the stock. Cook for about 30 minutes.
- Add enough water to the corn flour to make a slurry then slowly pour into the lamb. Stir quickly with a wooden spoon or whisk. Continue until the sauce has thickened to 'pie' consistency.
- Add the rosemary and thyme then cook on low for a further 10 minutes. Check the seasoning then remove the rosemary. Fold through the parsley and peas.
- Spoon the beef mixture into a shallow baking dish. Spoon the mash over the beef, spread it out, and rough the mash up a little with a fork. Cook uncovered at 220°C for about 20-25 minutes or until thoroughly hot.

<u>Tips:</u> Don't forget to serve with a glass of red!

What's flowering in my garden today?

Banksia catoglypta is flowering. The large flower ball, with a diameter of approximately 5 cms, contains many, many individual flowers of a lovely soft yellow gold but with a bright coppery orange tip. Each flower ball appears on stems close base of the plant. A few years ago, this interesting plant from Western Australia, was known as Dryandra catoglypta but is now known as Banksia Catoglypta after Dryandras were moved into the Banksia genus.

This plant has lovely soft blue green grey stiff leaves that are deeply serrated and when seen on an overcast Winter's day, this plant's soft colours are a delight to see. The New Holland Honeyeaters forage for nectar in the flowers and their bright yellow, black and white plumage is a brilliant contrast to the soft colours of the flowers and leaves. It's a very hardy, easily maintained small plant, worthy of growing to enjoy it's stunning flowers and foliage.

Para Wirra Conservation Park News...

Did you know that Para Wirra has recently changed from a Recreation Park to a Conservation Park? And did you know that you can now camp there? Here's some info about camping spots, taken from their website. www.environment.sa.gov.au



Wirra campground

Situated at the eastern end of the park, amongst the pink gums, grass trees and hop bush this campground has 19 campsites, including six that are suitable for small campervans (RV's) and camper trailers, toilets, a basic camp kitchen, gas barbecues and fire pits in each camp site for use outside the fire ban season. All of the campsites are wheelchair accessible, they are on flat ground with a compacted gravel surface. The toilet facilities are wheelchair accessible, with a 900mm door width and a fixed handrail alongside the toilet.

Group bookings

Camping is available for larger group bookings at the Helipad Site within the Gawler View Visitor Precinct — see Visitor Precinct map for location. This area is suitable for schools, scout groups, community and recreational organisations or large family groups. A large open grass area it's suitable for tent camping and can accommodate up to 60 people. With a shelter shed nearby and toilets about 100m walk from this site. Toilet facilities at Helipad campsite are not wheel-chair accessible. A small fire pit is located on site, which is available for use outside the fire danger. The Helipad site can be booked online but if your organisation requires an invoice please complete the school booking form under the book & pay tab for Para Wirra or contact the District Office on 8115 4600.

Book online

Book online to reserve your campsite up to 12 months in advance.

Book and pay in person

If you are unable to book and pay online you can do so, in person, at booking agents across the state. Our local booking agent is the One Tree Hill Fodder Store.



Important Information:

- Vehicle access to the Wirra Campground during daylight hours is through the main park entrance, these gates shut
 at sunset and open at sunrise. For access into the park after hours when a booking is made you will be given a
 combination lock code for the Eastern Entrance along Humbug Scrub Road. This entrance is locked to general park
 visitors.
- Collection of firewood within National Parks is prohibited. In order to use the fire pits at Wirra Campground you
 will need to bring your own wood. A number of the local shops may have fire wood for purchase try the One Tree
 Hill Fodder Store, Kersbrook General Store and Cockatoo Valley Store.
- Water at the campground and park is all non-potable, so campers are advised to bring along their own drinking water.
- Campers need to take all their rubbish out with them as there are no bins provided within the park.
- If you have a large group please call the Natural Resources Centre Gawler on 8115 4600 or you can send an email to DEWPWOnlineBookings@sa.gov.au.
- Community and recreation organisations, school groups and scouts can arrange special 'camp-over' activities at one of the open spaces by appointment with a ranger (conditions apply).

Northern Foothills Land Care Group

Winter weeds and Artichoke control

During another really entertaining evening, the Northern Foothills Land Care Group hosted "Pests Cost Us All" with tips on weed ID and how to develop an integrated weed management strategy for sustainable and effective weed management.

Key messages were to define the problem, identify your weeds and their locations, determine a strategy that involves what to tackle and when, and involve your neighbours. Weed control is a community challenge as weeds happily spread under boundary fences with kangaroos, birds and the wind having little respect for the valiant efforts of individual landholders. The only sustainable approach to save time and money is to unite with your neighbours to eliminate unwanted plants from an area.





If you don't know your neighbour well, then a common goal might just be the bridge you need for good neighbourly relations. So don your welly boots, brave the cold and walk around your land with your note pad in hand. Common weeds to look for at this time of year are Artichokes, Cape Tulip and St John's Wort. Integrated weed management is a bit of a mouthful, but just means looking at a variety of control options: preventing spread by spraying, crop rotation, mechanical removal, and even biological controls like camel grazing! Camels are being used on the notorious prickly pear cactus in Queensland, as their mouths are adapted to eat whole pieces of the prickly plant. So if you're on steep land where weed control access is difficult it may

be that you don't have a prickly problem but a camel deficiency! When you run out of weeds, lend them on to your neighbours. Food for thought!

Being passionate about protecting the environment and sharing information about what individuals and communities can do to help has led to our group receiving a commendation award for public education. We were recognized for achieving outstanding results educating, engaging and inspiring the northern foothills rural communities to practice sustainable land care and conservation. Our events have been presented in partnership with similar groups with specialist knowledge and have resulted in meaningful, interesting and professional events that have created an extensive support network of community members and professionals.



The group was one of 8 other local volunteer groups to receive formal recognition by Northern Volunteering SA Inc. Lisa, Monica, Robyn and Elaine attended an afternoon tea where they were honored and humbled to receive the award. Well done to all the passionate group members!

Community News... One Tree Hill Area Weeds of Concern



One-leaf Cape Tulip (Moraea flaccida)

One-leaf Cape tulip is a declared weed under the *Natural Resources Management Act 2004* throughout the whole of the State of South Australia. It is highly toxic to all types of grazing animals and if not controlled spreads rapidly through pastures, roadsides and native vegetation. Under Section 182(2) of the Act, land holders in the Adelaide and Mount Lofty Ranges region have a legal responsibility to control plants and keep their properties free of Cape tulips. Under

Section 185, NRM authorities may recover costs for the control of infestations on road reserves from the adjoining land owners. The common name Cape tulip is applied to both One-leaf Cape tulip (the most common in our area) and Two-leaf Cape tulip.

One-leaf Cape tulip (Moraea flaccida) is a perennial herb which grows from a corm than sprouts annual leaves and flowers to 60cm high. Each plant has only one leaf which is flat 1-2cm wide and up to 100cm long. Flowers are 3-5cm in diameter with six petals, varying in colour from salmon pink to orange or yellow. The fruit is a three valve capsule up to 5cm long which starts green and turns brown when mature. Corms are 1-2cm in diameter but covered in a brown fibrous tunic.

Corms stay dormant in the soil and germinate after autumn rains and the plant grows quickly through winter and soon after produce their distinctive flowers, but many corms stay dormant in the soil for 5 to 10 years. It is important to note that a high percentage of corms will germinate into active growth after fire. Control following a fire event can be quite effective.

The control of Cape tulip must be carried out from July to September, and as with most weed control it is important to eradicate the small patches first and prevent spread by seed or corms.

Cape tulips can be controlled using a foliar spray using a selective herbicide. Smaller infestations are controlled by wiping on herbicide using a sponge or weed tongs. Hand control can be carried out by carefully grubbing with a knife or trowel, making sure the entire root system and corms are removed and then burnt.




We have had a lot of success on our property (and our neighbours) using a weed wand and hand removal, particularly along water courses.




