One Tree Hill Progress Association ~ President's Report

Firstly, I would like to acknowledge and thank Bindi Hawkey for her outstanding contribution as the Grapevine editor over the past 4 and a half years. The outstanding quality and presentation is a true credit to her. I would also like to thank Bindi for the amazing job she has done with the ANZAC Day Order of Service over the same period. We wish her all the best in her new role with CFS Region 2 Head Quarters and hope to see her soon.

I would like to take this opportunity to welcome our new Grapevine editor, Kelly Fischer. Kelly brings a lot of skills, talents and lots of energy into the role. Kelly has a lot of new ideas which I can't wait to see come online.

The Kersbrook Road fire siren is moving along and are awaiting quotes and engineering reports. The flower beds have been raised in Chambers so no-one forgets, thanks David. We have been informed that City of Playford have matched the \$1.5M from the State Government for the McGilp Precinct Upgrade. Next stages are a redesign of some areas taking into account earlier resident feedback and then community consultation again.

Cr Kerrison and Member for King, Rhiannon Pearce are still advocating on the town's behalf for a review of Black Top Road and Yorktown Road intersection during wet, foggy and dark conditions. We have had a further accident in the last month at the intersection. Whilst this car was being retrieved that morning a further two cars went through the intersection with a near-miss.

The results of the City of Playford traffic survey from 16-30 MAY 2022 in the township have been analysed. Of note, we have just over 5000 vehicles a day coming through our town from the West side. Of serious concern is the maximum speed that was clocked at the 3 locations. On the West side of town the maximum speed was 159.2 Km/h, the middle of town had a maximum of 139.2 Km/h and the East side had a maximum of 159.5 Km/h. I would like to remind people of the **50** km/h speed limit in the township as speeds like this are dangerous to everyone's health.

I have received several responses from the bus service questionnaire of last month. I will keep the door open for another 4 weeks. One response we had was to let people know that by utilising a bus service would reduce our carbon footprint. The questions posed were:

- · Would you regularly use a bus service?
- · How many times a week would you use this service?
- · What times of the day would you use the service?
- · Where would you like to transfer? (Elizabeth/Salisbury/Munro Para/etc)
- · Would the front of the Institute be a suitable bus stop?
- · Any other comments/suggestions?

Cornishmans Hill Road Works

Cornishmans Hill Road in One Tree Hill will be closed to through traffic for approximately one week from Monday 5 September (weather permitting) in order for road works to be undertaken.

Initially completed in May 2022, Cornishmans Hill Road was resealed using spray seal, a common treatment for rural roads that provides a number of benefits over asphalt in certain situations. Failure of the final surfacing, along with adverse weather events have caused erosion and potholes.

Council acknowledges the frustration that this has caused and is actively taking steps to resolve the situation as soon as possible. The rectification works are being undertaken at no cost to Council.

Rectification of this road will begin from 5 September and is estimated to take approximately one week. Road closures will be in place during this time, with access for local traffic maintained. Local residents will be notified via mail.

As September can still be a cool and wet month, asphalt will be used to repair the road instead of spray seal as seal spray can only be applied under warmer temperatures.

This upgrade is part of the Council's Road Renewal program.

Please note that these works may be impacted by inclement weather and dates may change as a result.



Playford Council ~ Local Councilor's Report

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

I hope this edition of the Grapevine finds everyone well.

Thank you for the community feedback again in the failing of the Cornishmans Hill Road upgrade. I was amazed at the magnitude of potholes and the size when arriving onsite at approximately 9am Monday the 15th August 2022. I immediately raised the road safety conditions to our General Manager City Assets and forwarded photos.

The City of Playford will be providing community updates to the Grapevine, sharing updates on the social media platforms which I will be sharing on my Facebook page.

In Summary, Asphalt will be used to repair the road instead of Spray Seal and works are expected to start from the 5th September 2022 with an estimated completion time of one week.

McGilp Recreation Park update: The initial concept plans were released in the early stages when we were seeking matching external funding from the State Government with the petition. While the plans were well received there were a few residents and community members that had concerns. The City of Playford has considered the feedback that I was able to convey and is modifying the plans to be released for community engagement. Please stay tuned as the indication from the administration is that the engagement process will be ready to proceed within the month.

Blacktop road / Yorktown road intersection: After the correspondence to the Hon. Tom Koutsantonis MP, Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, the City of Playford received a response from Emma Kokar, Executive Director Road & Marine Svcs on the 8th July 2022.

The Road Safety Audit and Road Safety Analysis of the intersection did not highlight the requirement for a major upgrade, including an acceleration lane or installation of street lighting at this stage. While the Department has improved signage and line marking the incidences continue. It is my concern that many of these incidences are not being reported and it may only be a matter of time before a serious accident occurs. Furthermore, the audit did not demonstrate an understanding of the incidents occurring and the contributing weather conditions limiting visibility.

The Department has indicated that they will continue to monitor traffic movements at this intersection and should the need for change become evident, the appropriate action will be taken in the interest of road safety.

Having considered the feedback from residents and the response from the Department I will be moving the following Motion on Notice this month (August 2022).

"The Mayor writes to Tom Koutsantonis MP, the Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, and Rhiannon Pearce MP for King inviting them to meet with Council, the One Tree Hill Progress Association and residents at the Blacktop Road and Yorktown Road intersection to address the short comings of the recent Road Safety Audit and resulting intersection concerns".

One Tree Hill Cemetery – Niche Wall: The new Niche Wall has now been installed and the leases are available from the City of Playford.

I always enjoy a good community market and look forward to seeing you if you're available at One Tree Hill on the first Saturday of every month (excluding) January. If you happen to miss me at the One Tree Hill markets, you can catch me at the Craigmore Community Markets on the last Sunday of every month at the YMCA Building Craigmore between 10am and 2pm.

Thank you for the local support and interest in our community.

Good News! I have nothing which I can report on. This is probably only the second or third time I can say this since I started doing the Police Crime stats for One Tree Hill in 1992!!




- I can say that due to the wet weather vehicle accidents have increased and we ask all road users to take care when driving through the hills and ensure they take weather conditions into account.
- We have also had a couple more Cyber-crime offences where residents have been 'scammed'. What's app
 is the common form of contact used by the scammers and it always starts with a scenario of the phone
 being lost or dropped in water or similar so they (usually posing as son or daughter) are borrowing someone
 else's phone. This is a 100% red flag that it is a scam; if anyone gets this sort of message and they should
 block the number and not reply to it.

One Tree Hill CFS ~ August Report

Incident Report—up to and including 18th August 2022

During this period we had 6 callouts, the most serious being to prepare a helicopter landing site on the Gawler-One Tree Hill Road just south of the Uley Road intersection on the 15th of August to assist with evacuation of a patient following a medical emergency. Finding a suitable landing spot proved tricky with the helicopter eventually landing in a muddy paddock across the road from the incident.

This was the third call in 3 days for the Brigade with the first being on Saturday evening to assist Williamstown CFS with a vehicle fire between One Tree Hill and Williamstown. Nothing was found at the location that was called in, with Williamstown later finding the vehicle (after more information was given) near the Warren Reservoir.



Sunday night saw us called to another car accident on the corner of Hannaford Hump Road and One Tree Hill Road. In this case, the car had penetrated the barrier at the site of a previous accident and parts of the barrier had to be removed to allow access to the car. This is a dangerous corner and can get very slippery after heavy rain, so please take care.

Other incidents for the month included a tree down which was partially blocking Uley Road as well as 2 vehicle accidents. One for a car versus tree at Bibaringa near the Kentish Road intersection and the other for a 2 car MVA (Motor Vehicle Accident) on Humbug Scrub Road early on the morning of the 3rd of August.

The new tanker is proving popular and has just been temporarily replaced for a week while our tanker is being used in an exhibit for the AFAC22 conference. This is Australia's largest annual Emergency Services conference and a testament to the state-of-the-art nature of this appliance.

Spring is coming ... again

It's that time of year already and as you would have seen on the roadside signs, the CFS focus for this month is property preparation. While it is probably the last thing we want to think about when the weather is still cold and damp, it is time to start preparing for the upcoming fire season. The CFS website has a good guide for the things you might need to think about, just search for "home and property" on the home page. One of the things you may not have thought about is whether we have sufficient access to get one of our fire trucks up your driveway in the event of an emergency. We are looking for 4 metres by 4 metres for a typical appliance with access to turn around if you have a long drive.

More congratulations to four members of the Brigade who were presented with Long Service medals at the recent Annual General Meeting. Medals were presented to Paul Bebbington, Roger Brown, Mark Cranwell and the Captain Alex Thompson.







What's Flowering In My Garden?

Rain, rain, rain with more rain to come. The much welcomed rain is filling dams and seeping into the soil, replenishing moisture held in the subsoil. The many Wattle trees have burst open their brilliant golden puff balls to farewell a cold, wet Winter and to announce that Spring is not too far away. Hakea orthorrhyncha, with its stunning display of many large fiery red flowers and the bright pink/purple tiny flowers of Thryptomene baeckeacea are just two of many plants that are in flower at the moment. Many plants are creating brilliant splashes of colour throughout the garden. So enjoyable to see.

Thryptomene calycina, one of my all time favourite flowering natives, is a spectacular sight to see. Tiny deep red flower buds open to small dainty white flowers with a deep red centre that are found at the bases of the tiny, dark green elliptical leaves. This rounded, compact plant will grow approximately 1.5 m high and wide and has

graceful slightly arching branches. Brush past this shrub and it's most pleasant aromatic scent will permeate the air as well as any clothing that has come into contact with it's branches. For many years this plant, with the names common Grampians Thryptomene and/or Heath Myrtle has been cultivated for the flower cut industry throughout the world. Thryptomene calycina comes in two forms; one being white and the



other white with a tinge of dark pink. As the flowers of both varieties age the tiny flowers change to a dark cherry red shade and are retained on the stems for quite a long time. This long flowering plant grows naturally in the Grampians region of Victoria and will grow in moist, well drained loamy soils. It will grow in full sun to part shade and is frost hardy and drought tolerant but may need an extra water during Summer until well established. Pick a bunch of stems and add to other flowers for a lovely arrangement inside; the scent inside the house will be quite refreshing and intoxicating. Prune this shrub after flowering in order to keep it compact if you have not picked a few stems for inside. This absolutely delightful plant is available from good nurseries and you may even find a few at the next Australian Plant Sales at Urrbrae High School on Saturday 29th October 2022.

When Thryptomene calycina is in flower it's just one of my most favourite plants. It is because of it's rounded shape, arching stems, colourful small flowers supported by tiny dark green leaves and long lasting aromatic scent.

Just beautiful.

For cat enthusiasts June of

every year is a big deal, with the ACF (Australian Cat Federation) running a national show for purebred cats. This year's annual was held in Brisbane, QLD and was the 50th anniversary of the feline federation's show, with over 400 cats, of all breeds, coming to compete for the top national accolades.



This annual show draws the best of the best feline competitors from around the country. It's a 4-day event with a panel of twelve judges to examine all of the over 400 entries. Each cat is examined by 6 different judges to then qualify for the grand finale.

Of these twelve esteemed judges, the ACF proudly flew in six international judges to come and judge our Australian cats this year. This show is the height of the feline fancy's annual exhibitions and those who participate have worked all year with their animals to present the best of the best. The investment of entry, transport and lodgement of the AFC national entrants and their cats often exceeds thousands for the chance to participate. This level of showing and investment into the cat fancy isn't for the fainthearted!



After a couple of long days for the cats with 6 judges handling and going over each cat, referring to the unique Breed Standards, each of the Judges then selects their choice for "best in show" for the final, top 36 cats of all breeds out of 400.

Then comes the next level of serious competition with a new panel of judges that has to take those 36 top winning cats and work it down to the final six best cats in the entire show. This process has the cat enthusiasts on the edge of their seats as they determine not only which cat is the best of their breed but the best over all the other breeds on a national level for the title of BEST Kitten, Best Entire & Best Neuter in both Shorthair and Longhair.



It's with great excitement we can congratulate, one of One Tree Hills own local breeders, Adelhills Bengals (www.bengalcatbreeder.com.au) Melinda Radus, on her entire Bengal stud cat DGCH Adelhills Gone Wild aka Gizmo for winning; Supreme Shorthair Entire Cat in Show.






GRATITUDE... WHAT IS THIS?

Unfortunately it is also a very dangerous time as the risk of car strike and dog attacks increase as they have romance on their mind.

The male koala uses a scent gland on his chest to mark trees in their territory to warn other males to keep away and attract females, by rubbing his chest up and down the trunk of the tree. The gland oozes a clear, oily, strong musky smelling liquid.

The breeding season is August to February and the way you can help make this time safer for the koala is to ensure safe passage through your property. If you are lucky to have one in your area, you can enjoy the serenade as he sends his best bellow out to attract a female.
