PLAYFORD COUNCIL - LOCAL COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents, I hope this edition of the Grapevine finds everyone well.

Blacktop Road / Yorktown intersection - Following up from last month's Grapevine, the Mayor has written (as per Council Resolution) to Tom Koutsantonis MP, the Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, and Rhiannon Pearce MP for King inviting them to meet with Council, the One Tree Hill Progress Association and residents at the Blacktop Road and Yorktown Road intersection to address the short comings of the recent Road Safety Audit and resulting intersection concerns. We are hopeful of a positive response.

McGill Recreation Park Upgrade - Council will be undertaking a 28 day community engagement process across October and November 2022. The engagement process will provide an opportunity for the community to provide feedback on the project.

Cornishmans Hill Road - While it has been excellent to see the increased rainfall this winter, it has added to the disastrous delivery of Cornishmans Hill road. The works again being delayed from the proposed 5th September until a suitable window is available to avoid the heavy rainfalls. I am hoping that the Asphalt reseal will be complete before this edition of the Grapevine is distributed.

The City of Playford's aim to meet the Austroads Guides is impacting the delivery of our Rural Road Renewal program. The increase in the carriage width is problematic in the hills and is often resulting in larger shoulder drop offs and water management issues. I have raised these concerns and completed roadside inspections with our CEO and the General Manager City Assets and will continue to seek resolve.

Intersection of Hannaford Hump Road and One Tree Hill Road: - Thank you to the residents that have raised the accident damage to the guard railing on the intersection Hannaford Hump Road and OTH Road (start of Snake Gully). The guard railing is the responsibility of the TTG Council. The City of Playford has made contact and can confirm that the TTG Council has raised a request for a quote.

Potts Road and Gawler OTH Road Intersection: - Thank you to the residents who raised the safety concerns with the signage. The existing T-junction sign has been reinstated appropriately with a supplementary sign (250m ahead). The assessment supported our concerns that the existing hazard marker sign may not be seen by some motorists in a combination of circumstances. The Council is proposing to upgrade the existing hazard marker sign with a larger sign of 3.2m (W) x 0.8m(H), with proposed works scheduled for October/November 2022.

Olive Control Field Day - The wild olive control is often time consuming and difficult especially in hilly terrain. Local residents have contacted me to gain information on the effective control methods, which has resulted in conversations with Green Adelaide and a planned field day on the 22nd October between 10am to 12noon. If you are interested in effective Olive Control methods, please keep an eye out for information from Green Adelaide.

Blacktop Road Flower Beds - The City of Playford will be preparing a consultation letter for residents that maybe affected by any changes to the existing flower bed removal works along Blacktop Road, One Tree Hill. The letters are planned to be sent in September / October 2022. Please provide your feedback to the City of Playford and raise any concerns with me.

I always enjoy a good community market and look forward to seeing you if you're available at One Tree Hill on the first Saturday of every month (excluding) January. If you happen to miss me at the One Tree Hill markets, you can catch me at the Craigmores Community Markets on the last Sunday of every month at the YMCA Building Craigmores between 10am and 2pm. Thank you for the local support and interest in our community.

CFS REPORT SEPTEMBER 2022

Incident Report



With only 2 incidents over the last 4 weeks to the 13th of September, this has been one of the quietest months on record for the One Tree Hill Brigade. The first on the 20th of August was for a tree down on Gulf View Drive which took less than half an hour to clear and the second was a 3 car pile up at the intersection of Blacktop and One Tree Hill Roads on a sunny Sunday afternoon on the 28th. Fortunately, there were no serious injuries and the appliances called were able to return to the shed within 25 minutes.

New Fire Danger Rating System

From September the 1st a new fire danger rating system, known as the AFDRS, has been introduced nationally by AFAC, the National Council for Fire and Emergency Services, to help introduce consistency between the states and reduce confusion. While the new system looks like the old one it has been developed scientifically and reduces the number of categories to four, these are Moderate, High, Extreme and Catastrophic and these focus on the likely behaviour if a fire should start and how you should respond.

Moderate means most fires can be controlled, and you should plan and prepare. **High** means fires can be dangerous, and you should be ready to act. **Extreme** means fires will spread quickly and will be extremely dangerous, you should act immediately to protect your life and property. **Catastrophic** means that if a fire takes hold, lives are likely to be lost, and for your own survival you should leave bushfire risk areas. Under the new system, our Fire Weather District remains the same, that is the Mount Lofty Ranges. More information available on both the CFS and AFAC websites if you are interested.

The One Tree Hill Brigade started our preparations in earnest for the upcoming fire season this week completing the first stage of our burn-over drills. This is an annual process and prepares us in case we are caught in a situation where we cannot escape an active fire front. This is also a good time for everyone in the community to review and update their fire plans and ensure they are prepared

One way you could use the new AFDRS is to build it into your own bushfire survival plan as a trigger and have different levels of action based on what the Rating is for a particular day. What, you don't have a plan? Making correct choices when you are threatened by the smoke, noise and confusion of a fire can be very difficult and having a written plan could help save your life and the lives of people around you. Making a plan isn't that hard and because each plan will be slightly different there are many resources available to help you. From the "5 minute bushfire plan" to more in depth advice, the CFS website is a good place to start.

Dear Editor,

I recently attended a meeting of the One Tree Hill Progress Association, which reminded me of the first Progress Association meeting I attended in One Tree Hill back in May 2017. This was as a result of having chaired a community meeting in Angle Vale concerning the councils plan to change it's rating policy. The proposed policy change would have resulted in some massive rate increases across the community. Examples include, increases of 27.6% if your home was valued between \$400,00 and \$500,000 and if you had a primary production property valued over \$300,000 you would have faced a increase of between 21% and 221%. Increases like this are totally unaffordable for many.

It was only because of these established community groups that David Kerrison and myself where able to lead a campaign which brought the community together making a stand against those unjust rate increases in the small amount of time available. This resulted in a win for the community, but this is not a reason to be complacent. Being part of one of the fastest growing areas in Australia there are always new challenges around the corner so it's important for members of the community to take an interest in local issues. Don't let silence be your voice.

While the recent meeting I attended had much smaller numbers it's great to see the Progress Association continuing to be active across the community.



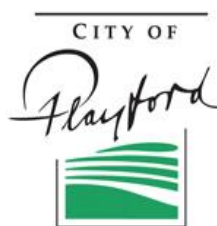

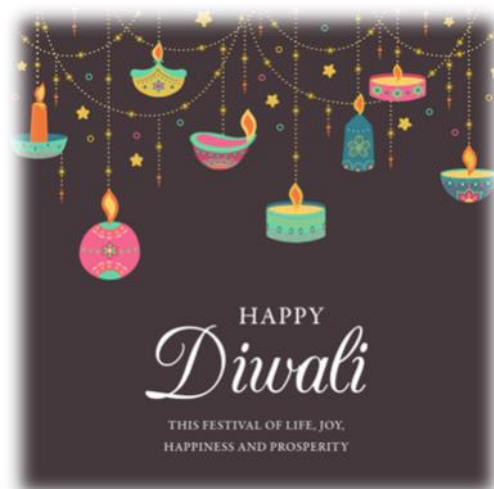

What's Flowering In My Garden?

Spring has arrived but there's not much warm weather yet and with more rain forecast, we could enjoy a rather damp early Spring. With most dams full, many creeks are trickling well.

The Blue Wrens are building nests and the New Holland Honeyeaters have come together as a family to welcome the arrival of some youngsters.

Many shrubs are flowering creating many glorious splashes of bright colour throughout the garden. There's the large cylindrical spikes of both the red *Hakea buccellata* and the pink *Hakea franseria*. *Philotheca myoporoides*, a huge rounded mass of stunning cherry red and white flowers is attracting so many honey bees. The local *Hakea rostrata*, with its magnificent honey scented perfume is another magnet for the bees.

Many *Grevillea*s flowers have opened up and one spectacular *Grevillea* is *Grevillea Jelly Baby*. This stunning hybrid, a cross between *Grevillea lanigera* and *Grevillea lavandulacea* is a great small rounded hardy plant for any small or large garden. It bears bright mid pink spider like flowers over soft mid green/grey elliptical foliage and flowers from mid Winter to late Spring. This compact rounded plant provides a brilliant splash of colour and attracts many bees and foraging New Holland Honeyeaters. It is perfect as a border plant, as a focal point in a rockery or as a potted plant on a patio. *Grevillea Jelly Baby* grows well in full sun or part shade in free draining acidic soils but may need a little extra water during late Summer. It is available from most nurseries. If you have a few rabbits (or lots) it would be advisable to protect this most attractive plant with a tallish surround of wire mesh.

Grevillea Jelly Baby is one of my favourite plants. It is small rounded, compact and offers many brightly coloured mid pink spider like flowers over a long flowering time. Just beautiful.

2022 Whack a Weed Day

An impressive team of 51 turned out on 3rd September to tackle wild olives and boneseed around an old clearing in the heart of Para Wirra. The weather was perfect for the task ahead.

One Tree Hill Joeys, Cubs, Scouts, Venturers, 6 Leaders, a couple of community members and the Friends of Para Wirra banded together for a brisk 2km hike out from the Lake to a lesser known part of the park, for a couple of hours of solid weed control, followed by a sausage sizzle.

The younger group of Joeys and Cubs focussed their efforts to help protect the Endangered Peppermint Box Woodland from boneseed invasion. The older group of Scouts and Venturers learned to treat wild olives by drilling and applying herbicide, guided by Friends of Para Wirra.

This part of the park didn't have a great display of Spring wildflowers for us as it is still regenerating from stock grazing days, but we had good views across the valley to Lizard Rock. A relaxing break at the Lake was appreciated by all, after a hard morning's work in the bush.

This community service event was a great opportunity for the Friends of Para Wirra to see the One Tree Hill scouts in action across all ages working naturally together in effective teams. It was noted that the scouts displayed teamwork and leadership skills which are not normally seen in other groups of young people. For their efforts, the scouts across all age groups will use this community service towards an Environment badge, and each member clocked up 4km on their bushwalking log total.

This was a challenging and new task for both volunteer groups to work on together and get to know each other. The Friends of Para Wirra volunteers were amazed at the energy and enthusiasm of the youth, while the youth were guided by the knowledge and expertise of the Friends of Para Wirra.

RU OK?

A Mental Health & Wellbeing Article by One Tree Hill Local Natasha Steen

On Thursday 8th September Australia observed RUOK day. Do you know what this day is all about? The concept is simple... reach out to someone near you and check in if they are ok. "RU OK" was founded in 2009 – it is an Australian non – profit suicide prevention organisation. It revolves around the slogan "RU OK" and advocates for people to have conversations with others. Many workplaces and schools are starting to recognise this day and offer education around the concept.

Once per year this organisation sets aside a natural day of action to remind Australians that every day is the day to ask, 'Are you ok?' and to try to start some warm conversation if we spot any signs that someone is struggling with life.

Some of the signs we can look out for that may indicate someone is not ok:

- Major health issues
- Relationship challenges
- Describing being overwhelmed
- Acting differently
- Experiencing grief
- Changes at work
- Not engaging socially
- Agitated
- Just not themselves
- Moody
- Less interested in their physical appearance or hygiene

If we notice these signs it can be awkward to know what to do. Here are a few basic tips...

1. Ask RUOK? For example:

- "How are you going – What has been happening for you lately?"
- "You seem less chatty than normal – How are you going?"

If they don't want to chat, try to share your concern and leave them with something like "Please call me if you ever want to chat?" OR "Is there someone else you would rather talk to?"

2. Listen with an open mind

- Don't judge
- Don't feel you have to have all the answers
- Repeat back what you hear to show you understand

3. Encourage Action

- Ask what they would like from you
- Be positive and encourage the role of professionals – seeing a Doctor/Counsellor/Psychologist – or check out my resource list below...

4. Check in

- Once someone has opened up a little to you - pop a reminder in your calendar for a gentle follow up.

If you think someone is in immediate risk of suicide, please call 000 and ask for an ambulance.

Remember you don't have to be an expert to make a difference. Just by keeping the conversation going and showing someone you care can be just what they need to access appropriate help and avoid any crisis.




