The council elections have been run and counted. I would like to congratulate Cr David Kerrison and Cr Andrew Craig on their re-election and welcome new councillor Tanya Smiljanic to Ward 3. Also congratulations to Mayor Glenn Docherty on his re-election. I look forward to working with you all over the next four years.

On Saturday 12th November Federal Member for Spence Matt Burnell, State Member Rhiannon Pearce, State Minister for Police, Emergency Services and Correctional Services Joe Szakacs and Cr David Kerrison met with Michael Fischer from Progress and community members at the corner of Black Top and Yorktown Roads. The delegation heard community concerns about the intersection, the continual accidents and also witnessed the behaviours of many drivers on approach to Black Top Road from the West. It is an absolute pleasure to be able to represent my local community and I will continue to dedicate myself to delivering for you and our local communities.

As you would be aware our Ward (Ward 3) had ten candidates for this term and only three vacancies. How did we all fair with our primary (first preference) votes? Please see the table listed. The Quota for Ward 3 this year was 770, which is the number of votes that a candidate needs to be certain of election. I was extremely grateful to receive the required support to reach quota on first preference votes and thank you again to everyone who supported me with your first preference vote.

After preferences were counted Tanya Smiljanic reached Quota and was elected 2 and Andrew Craig was elected 3 with 712. Congratulations to Tanya and Andrew, I look forward to working with you so we can continue to deliver for Ward 3 and the City of Playford.

Well done to all the candidates including Clare Rae who ended up in fourth place with 586 votes after preferences were distributed.

Congratulations to Mayor Docherty on his re-election with 8,789 Votes and well done to Shaun Reardon with a strong result of 7,611 Votes and Jerome Smith with 2459 Votes.

Blacktop Road / Yorktown intersection update – Thank you to Rhiannon Pearce MP for King for your continued advocacy and for organising a community meeting at the Blacktop Road / Yorktown Road intersection with the Minister for police, Emergency Services and Correctional Services, Hon. Joe Szakacs MP.

I am a strong advocate for engaging with the local community to gain in depth knowledge and understanding of matters that can often be overlooked in a report. Thank you to the residents and road users that joined us along with the OTH progress Association to share the local knowledge and safety concerns with the Hon. Joe Szakacs MP, Rhiannon Pearce MP and Matt Burnell MP (Federal Member for Spence).

The Minister indicated that he would consider the feedback and make further investigations.

McGilp Recreation Park Upgrade – The key elements of the engagement plan are underway, including an information flyer, direct mail out to the local catchment around McGilp Recreation Park with an information flyer and details on how to provide feedback. There will also be face to face engagements with neighbouring residents, Sports Clubs and at the One Tree Hill Market in December. CFS REPORT NOVEMBER 2022

Incident Report



Weather related events have been a feature of this month's callouts with 9 of the 15 callouts resulting from the recent wild and woolly weather. Once again, the Brigade was called upon to assist the SES with the trail of devastation left in the Upper Sturt and Coromandel Valley areas on the 12th of November. Crews that attended on this day and again the following day described the scene as like what you see when a tornado hits with trees on houses and cars, and power lines down in several locations.

One Tree Hill did not escape the wild weather over this period with trees down on Blacktop Road at One Tree Hill, Bassnet Road at Humbug Scrub, twice on Williams Road at Gould Creek, and Toolunga Road at Yattalunga over the course of the month. The two trees on Williams Road both brought down power lines and resulted in the road being blocked. The station was also brought up on stand-by on the afternoon of the 9th of November with a significant thunderstorm band moving through the area. Our services were not required until later that night however when residents of the township were startled by the simultaneous flash and clap of thunder from a direct lightning strike within the town around 8:30 PM. This strike set fire to a large palm tree on Jordan Drive with the home owner spraying down the tree until crews arrive to douse the flames.

The Brigade has also attended 3 other callouts for fires all of which have been significant in their own way. The first was to a campfire that was left improperly extinguished on a property on Sheoak Road, this was on the first warm Sunday of the month and the wooded area had potential to spread the fire if it had not been reported. The second was reported as a rubbish fire and turned out to be more like a bonfire. As stated in the past, we are obliged to attend all callouts if reported by neighbours, so please don't be surprised if we turn up.

Finally, as this article was being prepared, we had our first grass fire of the season which some may find surprising given the low level of grass curing seen throughout the area. This fire was started by an angle grinder and the property owner sustained burns to the legs in his attempts to stop the fire spreading. The other 2 calls were for a vehicle fire on Humbug Scrub Road at Humbug Scrub on the 29th of October and for a car driven off the ford a bit further down the same road a week later.

Fire Danger Season Delayed

The Brigade was visited by the Minister for Emergency Services, Joe Szakacs MP, and the new Chief Officer of the CFS, Brett Loughlin as well as other dignitaries on the 31st of October for the release of the Fire Danger Season dates for this year. In releasing the dates, the Chief Officer warned "Don't be fooled into thinking there is no bushfire risk in South Australia this season" and pointed out that in some places there is up to 3 times the normal fuel growth. The date for the Mount Lofty Ranges has been set back by two weeks due to the mild weather and will now commence on the 1st of December. Several other areas have already commenced the Fire Danger Season, so be aware if you are traveling.

Members of the Brigade attended the funeral of local identity Peter Watson during the month at the Hall and provided a Guard of Honour as his hearse passed the Station on the way to the cemetery. Peter was a member of the CFS for more than 25 years and Captain for 10 of those. The members Brigade would like to pass on their condolences to the family and friends.

Finally, this is the last Grapevine for 2022, I know, where did that year go? The members of the One Tree Hill Country Fire Service Brigade would like to wish everybody a merry and safe Christmas and a happy (and firework free) New Year. Please be careful on the roads over the holiday period with the additional threat of floods in many areas adding to the dangers of travelling during this period.

Part two: Joey's transition to eating leaf. As mentioned in the previous edition of the Grapevine, koala Joey's drink milk and nothing else for 6 months while developing in the pouch.

Koala's have only one stomach and have a really big caecum. Therefore referred to as hindgut fermentors. The caecum and the large intestine are filled with microbes and these microbes are not found in leaf.


The Joey needs to digest leaves so where do they get these important microbes from? This is where koala mums come in. They produce these microbes in the form of pap ("Pap bland soft or semi liquid food")

Joey's know when the desire to eat pap begins, and puts its head out of the pouch and begins to nuzzle around mums cloaca. The nuzzling and licking stimulates mum to secrete a pasty liquid from her caecum for the Joey to eat. The reason for this is to kickstart the hindgut in the fermentation process.

The pap is produced while the Joey stimulates her usually for a week or two.

Joey's know when the pap is no longer needed. The Joey is then able to start eating leaves and is now able to easily digest them.

WHAT'S FLOWERING IN MY GARDEN

There has been so much rain recently and with more to come the creeks will be flowing for some time in the future. All plants are appreciative of the late Spring rains with many plants showing signs of new lush growth. The Callistemons, commonly referred to as Bottlebrushes, have put on a brilliant display of brightly coloured brushes. There are white, soft pink and dark pink brushes as well as oranges, reds, dark red and purple/mauve brushes.

Flowering throughout the garden at the moment are many various varieties of *Chamelaucium* which have the common well known name of Waxflowers. *Chamelaucium uncinatum* has been in cultivation for many, many years now and has often been referred to the Geralton Waxflower. Many varieties of Waxflowers have been created with flower colours ranging white, cream, yellow, pink, red and purple. As gardeners, we now have



many varieties to select from at any of our good garden centres. One stunning variety, Purple Pride, is a medium sized rounded open shrub that will grow 3-4m high and 2-3m wide. It bears fine needle like foliage and during late Spring, it's mid pink buds open to a massed display of large purple five petalled flowers.

Many honey bees, native bees, flies and butterflies can be seen buzzing around as they are attracted to the perfume that this plant produces. It is best to plant Waxflowers in well drained sandy loamy soil as these plants grow naturally on sandy soils in Western Australia. Flowering stems can be cut and mixed with other flowers to create a beautiful bunch of flowers. Give this plant a light trim after flowering to stimulate new growth and you will enjoy this long lived plant for many years to come.

Chamelaucium uncinatum Purple Pride is just a beautiful addition to any garden as is any other Waxflower.

Feeling concerned about your child's screen time?

It is important for you to consider why you are concerned about screen time in the family?.. Then try to address what is not going so well in the family. Are you concerned because you are observing poor sleep, limited social interactions or are your child's school results slipping? Consider also what *type* of screen time your kids engage in.. is it Consumption (largely watching) or Creation (designing ideas or writing things etc) or Connection (playing a game with other people)? The latter two are a little more interactive and allowing some skill development.

Here are a few things to consider...

- We can help reduce our kids screen time by noticing what we see in our child's behaviour, by identify any unhelpful behaviours first – for eg. Poor communication, moodiness etc. Try to bring these up with the kids in a gentle supportive way.
- Put rules around bedtime...quality of sleep is critical – to ensure this, kids need at least an hour of downtime before they are to go to sleep. Devices sleep in a different room.
- What else are you doing to connect with your kids? Notice the importance of connection and model it as parents. This can be hard with work and busy lives but we do need to try to be consciously aware. If kids are trying to talk to us what are we doing when they want to talk.. are we available to them?

What do you do if you are meeting any "Tech tantrums" – when you ask them to turn devices off?

- We have to stay calm and recognise that this may have become a habit ...gently offer them other options. Explain ahead of time what is reasonable and what you plan.
- What were we all doing before this habit kicked in? – consider everyone's part in this.
- Don't hinder kids with their imagination – so keep supporting and encouraging this – finding other diverse ways to be imaginative and fun.

- Know how they can engage with other things – what else do you notice that they enjoy or are a little good at - and how can you seek to further build their competence/ interest in these things.
- Remember it is not a bad thing to be bored as a kid. This can encourage resourcefulness. It is not an excuse for them to throw at us when we ask them to turn off their devices! Tell them you are happy for them to come up with any other reasonable ideas on what to do – other than screen time. Important that they experience some boredom as it helps them to find their own solutions and build resilience.

It is useful to appreciate that many kids are getting quite strong positive hits of dopamine from gaming – they may be connecting with others online/in person and finding much excitement in these games. Can you support them with other ways to experience happiness and excitement?

When it comes to how much time is ok, or how much time is safe, a lot of research is telling us that kids should not be getting anywhere near 7 hours per day (Consumption, Creation or Connection total time)! If they are, this could be limiting aspects of their frontal cortex brain development.

Have you tried sitting with them and coming to understand the content of the games and their interest in them? Have you tried setting some healthy boundaries as a start?

The hall has a new surround sound system, TV, microphone facilities, and heating and cooling.


Outside you will find a sheltered playground that leads to picturesque garden areas which are ideal for photos.


