## PLAYFORD COUNCIL - LOCAL COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

This month as I sit to reflect on the relevant matters for the community in the Grapevine, I wish to share the sad news of my father's passing and say thank you for the kind words of support from family, friends and the community.

I remember as a child my father attending and being involved in the OTH Progress Association and local community matters. In recent years his health inhibited his attendance to meetings however he was always keen to maintain his membership and he closely monitored the Grapevine.

In 2017, he stood beside me in the community campaign to overturn the massive rate hikes. He was a community minded man and despite his illness still turned up with a crowbar and shovel to assist in the installation of the new OTH & Environs sign in September 2020.

Thank you dad for the many memories, love, support and a lifetime of guidance. I pray and trust that you are now in a better

place.









Thank you to Rhiannon Pearce MP for King for continuing to work with me on local matters.

1. We have received an update on the roundabout at Kersbrook Road, Humbug Scrub.

The Department inspected the round about and actioned the removal of gum tree saplings and tree trimming works. The Department further advised that the standard treatments for roundabouts and medians is to maintain a gravel surface. Weeds are sprayed and vegetation trimmed as necessary to maintain road safety.

The community may wish to landscape the roundabout and medians to improve amenity through their local council. The Department will support landscaping proposals where the solution does not negatively impact on road safety and council commits to ongoing landscaping maintenance.

I'd love to see the roundabout landscaped as an entry statement to our town however it will take time and funding. What are your thoughts? Please give me a call or see me at the markets to discuss further.

2. I appreciate Rhiannon's efforts in working with me and advocating for the Blacktop Road / Yorktown Road intersection.

Thank you to the Hon. Joe Szakacs MP, Minister for Police, Emergency Service and Correctional Services who personally heard the resident's concerns and how we can best address road safety at the intersection. Subsequently the Department (DIT) will install a 'STOP' sign on the approach to Blacktop Road from Yorktown Road.

We understand that DIT is investigating the possibility of attaching lighting to enhance the visibility of the 'STOP' signs. The Minister advised this investigation is anticipated to be completed in April 2023.

Furthermore, the Minister has advised the installation of street-lighting at the intersection has been included on a prioriti-

sation list for future funding.

I always enjoy a good community market and look forward to seeing you at One Tree Hill on the first Saturday of every month (excluding January) and at Craigmore the last Sunday of every month. Thank you for your support and interest in our community.

## **CFS REPORT - MARCH 2023**

Since the last report, One Tree Hill CFS has responded to 13 callouts.

#### JANUARY:

**17th** - Tree down Shillabeer road, a member of the public removed the tree before we reached the site.

**17th** - 2 of our members went on a strike team to Burra on Dalkeith's CFS truck, to assist in "mop-up" of a large grass fire.

**26th** - Suspected backyard burn in township, crews unable to locate.

**31st** – Tree down Sampson flat.

#### **FEBRUARY**:

3rd - Car into tree.

**3rd** – Our Bulk Water Carrier responded to a reported structure fire at Hermitage. Fortunately, the fire turned out to be a chimney fire which was extinguished quite quicky, which was fortunate as our Bulk Water Carrier suffered a minor breakdown on the way to the job, and the next closest Bulk Water Carrier (Kersbrook) had to be responded in place of ours. The truck was repaired promptly the next day and back online.


4th – Vehicle accident – Willison Road, occupant left scene.

4th - Assist resident.

**6th** – Motorbike into car. The motorcyclist was very lucky to not suffer serious injuries. The motorbike overtook a local resident who was turning right on Kersbrook Road, and hit the front of the car. As you may have seen in the media, the road toll this year has started very badly with the number of deaths quite high given we are only 6 weeks in. Fortunately, this accident didn't add to that toll. A timely reminder to slow down, and simply drive or ride sensibly.

**9th** – Our Bulk Water carrier was responded to the Dry Creek wetlands to assist other MFS and CFS crews with a fire, however upon arrival it was decided we were no longer required and returned home. This happens more often than you think, however it is always better to request additional resources early on, instead of leaving it too late.

13th – Our brigade was responded to a large fire on the other side of Williamstown, there were numerous other brigades responded. A grass fire burnt a few hectares in very steep terrain. Aerial support from the new Blackhawk helicopters as well as the traditional fixed-wing aircraft was instrumental in knocking down this fire early, ensuring the area burnt was kept to a minimum. CFS also had great support from a number of local residents with farm firefighting units. Due to the large number of large trees burnt, the local brigades ran patrols on this fireground for a number of days after the main fire had been extinguished.



**17th** – Our Bulk Water Carrier was requested to respond to Port Lincoln. There was a large scrub

fire the day before and it had spread into the local dump. As our Bulk Water Carrier has a specialist capability (CAFS — Compress Air Foam System), it was responded to assist in the dump fire along with a similar truck from Crystal Brook. At the time of writing, 2 of our members (M.Hawkey and H. Davis) are on a 4-day deployment. 1 day travel, 2 days work, and 1 day return. We hope our contribution to the Port Lincoln community will help reduce the smoke around the area.

In general news, our cadets have returned to fortnightly training now that school has commenced. Our cadets train Tuesday 6-8PM. Currently there is a waiting list to attend cadets, however if your kids are interested, please contact the Duty Officer. Our brigade also visited the Joey Scout group (Ages 5-7) this month at the Oval (see Joey Scout article), to show them over the truck and let them squirt the fire hose, and the Cub Scouts (Ages 8-10) are visiting us soon at the station.

Training is ongoing with our members, Monday night is our normal training night, however other courses occur on weekends, with many of our members, along with neighbouring brigades recently completing First Aid and CPR courses at One Tree Hill station run by St.John.

With more hot and windy weather on the way, please remain vigilant and use the CFS website to find ways to stay informed. One way is to install the ÄlertSA app on your phone and configure a watch area so you can receive alerts for local incidents, however there is no substitute for a battery powered radio to keep you informed of active incidents, in case of loss of power or mobile phone service.

## WHAT'S FLOWERING IN MY GARDEN

It's February and we have had a few warm to hot days but, thankfully, we have not endured prolonged heatwave conditions.

Despite the lack of rain, some plants that were showing signs of needing a drink received some water and responded well. Thanks to the good rains that we received during Winter and Spring last year, most plants are looking good with plenty of lush Summer growth. At this time of the season, there are not many flowers to be seen. A few Correas have started flowering, much to the delight of the New Holland Honeyeaters. Babingtonia virgata still has quite a few beautiful tiny white flowers which are visited by a myriad of bees and other insects.

It is at this time of the year that the Croweas begin their flowering season. Croweas are available from all good nurseries and come in many varieties that range from small to medium in height and colour variations from white, pale pink through to dark pink. Crowea exalata Rhapsody is a delightful variety to include in any garden. It is a small rounded evergreen shrub with very dark green narrow leaves and it has many dark pink star shaped flowers that appear along the stems. This very hardy plant will grow in full sun to part shade to about 75cms high and 75cms wide. The stunning bright pink flowers attract many nectar feeding insects, various butterflies and native bees. This very pretty low maintenance plant can be planted as a feature plant in a small garden but can also be planted as a fill in plant between larger plants. Flowering stems can be cut and shown off in a vase with other flowers.

If you see this plant in your favourite nursery, buy one or two or three, plant them out watch them grow and enjoy their flowers during late summer through to late Autumn.

Crowea exalata Rhapsody is such a welcome addition to any garden.
