The One Tree Hill Progress Association will be hosting its annual ANZAC Day Dawn Service on Tuesday 25th April.



Announcement from the One Tree Hill Progress Association

Baking ANZAC biscuits is a lovely way to involve children in activities around Anzac Day. There are many books available to help encourage gentle, age-appropriate discussion about the sensitive topic of war. One of our family favourite stories is ANZAC Biscuits by Phil Cummings and Owen Swan, a beautifully told story capturing the tradition of ANZAC Biscuits. It is a lovely way to share the history of the ANZAC biscuit while yours are baking in the oven, you could even bake an additional batch for the ANZAC Dawn Service.

Several recipe variations exist for the traditional ANZAC Biscuit and many people have their own favourites. If you don't have a recipe or are yet to find the right one, you might want to try the one below that has been provided by the Department of Veteran Affairs.







Ingredients

- · 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 2 tablespoons golden syrup
- 1 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda (dissolved in 2 tablespoons boiling water)
- 1 cup rolled oats
- 1 cup desiccated coconut
- 3/4 cup brown sugar
- 3/4 cup plain flour

Directions

- 1. Heat oven to 160°C.
- 2. Melt butter (or margarine) and syrup
- 3. Add dissolved bicarbonate of soda and water.
- 4. Mix dry ingredients in a bowl, add the liquid mixture and stir.
- 5. Place small balls of the mixture (about 1 teaspoon) onto a greased tray.
- 6. Bake for 20 minutes or until lightly brown.
- 7. Lift biscuits onto a cake cooling rack and wait for them to cool.

PLAYFORD COUNCIL - LOCAL COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

I hope this edition of the grapevine finds everyone well.

Over the last four years it has been a pleasure and an honour to represent the residents and communities of Ward 3. There has been significant time invested to deliver debt management strategies, improved business plans and downwards pressure on rates, which has placed the City of Playford in a substantially stronger financial position.

The disappointing delivery of the initial Elizabeth CBD plans has resulted in a fresh approach (version 2) for the Elizabeth CBD and will now include the delivery of a Sports Entertainment Venue on the corner of Main North Road and Philip Highway that is privately funded and not underwritten by the ratepayer. The initial plans around 2018 would have placed the ratepayers at significant financial risk. The Sports Entertainment Venue is to include an indoor ice sports arena, elite rock-climbing facility, two indoor sports courts and gymnasium, supported by a restaurant and other hospitality tenancies and will be delivered by one of Australia's leading developers Pelligra.

Pelligra will privately fund and build two developments in the Elizabeth CBD. Council is excited to have a developer with the credibility of Pelligra to share in our vision to reshape the CBD into a thriving retail, business and entertainment precinct. The second development to be delivered is a commercial office and innovation hub of up to eight storeys, that will offer space for entrepreneurial start-ups, high growth companies and accelerator programs, as well as offer a hospitality venue, foyer and landscaped forecourt.

The Covid environment also delivered challenges to many residents, businesses and the City of Playford. In the challenging environment we felt the need to still deliver for the community and keep rate increases to a bare minimum. Delivering a responsible Annual Business Plan (ABP) with a minimal increase of 0.45%, was an excellent outcome.

While we have delivered debt management strategies and some of the lowest rate increases for the City of Playford over the last four years, the current inflationary environment is set to see a significant rate increase in the Annual Business Plan this year. The inflationary effects are significantly impacting some sectors more than others with construction and roads being my major concern. These inflationary effects not only affect the delivery of new services they also impact our depreciation schedules and replacement costs of existing assets.

It's important that we deliver a budget that is financially responsible and that we do not borrow to keep rates artificially low. The Annual Business Plan and budget will be presented to Council on the 18th April 2023 for consideration for consultation. It is expected that the consultation period will be 28 days and will be late April to late May, with dates to be confirmed.

I always enjoy a good community market and look forward to seeing you at One Tree Hill on the first Saturday of every month (excluding January) and at Craigmore the last Sunday of every month. Thank you for your support and interest in our community.

CFS REPORT - APRIL 2023

Incident Report



First off a big thanks to Ian Fordham for stepping in at the last minute with his great report last month. I liked Ian's format, maybe it is time for a change. Jumping right into it, we have had 16 pager call-outs, 6 of these occurring on the 24th of February with many stations around the state including One Tree Hill called up on to Active Stand-by as the temperature soared into the 40s for the 2nd day in a row.

February

- 19 Tree Down blocking One Tree Hill Road in the section known as "Snake Gully"
- 21 Tree Down a bit further up One Tree Hill Road
 - Grass Fire caused by fallen powerlines in Fairview Park Initially called for our Bulk Water Carrier (BW10) but was placed on stop shortly before arriving
- 24 Tree Down half blocking One Tree Hill Road (again)
 - Grass Fire Ward Belt, call for BW10 support
 - Grass Fire Elizabeth Park, call for BW10 support but stopped on the way
 - Grass Fire (2nd Alarm) Two Wells, once again BW10 was called to support along with multiple vehicles from surrounding Brigades. With 2 drops from the bombers, this fire took nearly 2 hours before it was declared contained.
 - Tree Down, this time on Black Top road in peak hour resulting in a long bank up of cars
 - Grass Fire Two Wells, having barely cleared the previous incident, BW10 was again called out to Two Wells around 6.30 PM. Two Wells actually had 8 fires in their area on this day.
- CAFS Support Port Augusta, request for operators trained in CAFS (Compressed Air Foam System) to help with the tyre fire burning just outside Port Augusta widely reported in the press
 - Vehicle Accident Uley Road Uleybury car vs tree ... a regular call out site
- 27 Clean Up Black Top Road, after a ute had dropped a large amount of hay on the road creating hazardous conditions.

March

- Strike Team Marion Bay, organised on Saturday off-pager a strike team was organised to assist with an ongoing fire in Marion Bay with 2 appliances leaving the station around 5:30 AM and returning around 7:30 PM Sunday
 - Road Crash Rescue Black Top Road, with most of our vehicles already committed, we were called to assist Salisbury MFS. A car had rolled on its side in damp conditions and hit a tree with the occupant trapped in the vehicle. It was later reported in the press that the occupant had received serious injuries, we wish them well in their recovery.
- Vehicle Fire Humbug/Scrub Road, reported just after midnight, there have been several vehicle fires in OTH and surrounding areas recently, please be aware
 - Vehicle Fire Blacktop Road, crews had not even finished with the previous fire when this one was called in. Many of you would have seen the remnants on your daily commute.
- 15 Vehicle Fire Humbug/Scrub Road, motorcycle accident

CFS Shield

Once again, thanks go to One Tree Hill and Tea Tree Gully City Soccer Clubs for their support of the OTH and TTG CFS Brigades through the 4th Annual CFS Shield Day held this year at Tilley Reserve in TTG on the 5th of March. More than \$6000 was raised on the day for the two CFS brigades, and many thanks go to the organisers and players who participated as well as all of the sponsors and businesses, far too many to name here, who contributed on the day.

Another reminder the Fire Danger Season does not end until the 30th of April for the Adelaide Metropolitan and Mount Lofty Ranges Districts. For those of you venturing away over Easter, please be aware that some other Fire Ban Districts around the state have slightly different end dates. Speaking of Easter, this month's accidents are a grim reminder of the dangers of driving on country roads, please stay safe on our roads and have a great Easter.

Speed cameras have recently been deployed within the One Tree Hill area as part of SAPOL's policing of country roads. Vehicles have been detected at speeds in excess of 165 km/h in some locations. A large amount of accidents continue to occur within the One Tree Hill area. There has been significant media coverage in relation to the high road toll particularly on country roads. Please ensure you are not distracted whilst driving and drive according to the road and weather conditions.

WHAT'S FLOWERING IN MY GARDEN

At this time of the year, there are only a few plants in flower. We have all observed and enjoyed the stunning brilliant orange red flowers of Corymbia ficifolia (common name Red Flowering Gum) and my Eucalyptus erythronema is still opening its clusters of beautiful gold tipped pinkish red flowers. What a picture it has been. I will just have to plant some more of this garden friendly Eucalypt.

Some Correas are flowering and the buds on the Hakea Stockdale Sensation are plumping up and will burst open very soon.

Grevillea Goldfever is flowering and is an delight to enjoy. A hybrid between Grevillea juniperina and Grevillea rhyolitica, this rounded but sprawling ground cover can spread about 1.5m wide and grow about 30cm to 40cm high. It is a dense rounded plant that can offer shelter for small birds and it can be planted as a border plant or grown in between other taller shrubs. It bears small

elliptical mid green leaves along it's branches and it's beautiful flower spikes appear at the end of it's many small branches. The attractive soft golden yellow and red flowers are slightly pendulous and are about 2cm to 3cm. This plant flowers throughout the year, attracting many Blue Banded Bees, Honey Bees, Butterflies and the many Honeyeater Birds that visit to enjoy the pollen and nectar that this lovely Grevillea produces. This is a very usefull plant for most gardens. It is a stunning Grevillea that is drought tolerant, hardy, low maintenance, thrives in well drained soils and is small enough to be grown in a pot.

Grevillea Goldfever is available from most nurseries and once established will provide much enjoyment for many months of the year.

Koalas are usually found in tree tops, they can be spotted on the ground when they are moving from one tree to another.

Koalas do look a bit funny on the ground - their arms stride out long and fast, their back legs seem to step higher than needed. Koalas have very powerful arms and upper body for climbing, and it shows when they are walking on the ground.

If you happen to see one walking on the ground, don't frighten them or interfere with their progress. Stand back at least 10 meters, and watch quietly. If they are on the road and a vehicle is approaching, you are best to stay well away and safely flag down the oncoming vehicle. A healthy, uninjured koala will usually move relatively quickly off the road.

FRIENDS OF PARA WIRRA

Autumn in Para Wirra

Late summer and autumn might seem to be a dull time in Para Wirra Conservation Park. Late spring flowers are long gone, the Christmas Bush which had cheerful sprays of

white flowers through January this year has gone to seed. Some of the Eucalypts have been flowering, sustaining insects and birds but at first glance there is nothing to brighten up the ground.

If you look carefully though, you may be treated to splashes of colour and interest among the dry grasses and shrubs.

The 'False Orchid' Lobelia gibbosa, has been valiantly flowering its head off through the heat, its leaves shrivelled up and all its resources pulled into a swollen reddish stem topped by brilliant violet-blue flowers,

In open grassy areas, seemingly triggered by the odd late summer storm, splashes of bright pink and sometimes red or white Garland Lilies (Calostemma purpurea) have burst into flower like their taller cousins the feral Easter Lilies which have invaded bushland from home gardens. No leaves, they come later, just bright pink flowers thrusting out of the ground. You can see these in many parts of Para Wirra and also surviving on some roadsides around One Tree Hill.

As autumn sets in and the leaf litter gets damp, the next wildflower to enjoy is the Parsons Bands orchid, Eriochilus cuculatus. These are more cryptic but in some years you can find large patches of these in sheltered places with their 2 white petals catching the breeze like tiny flags.

These are a few examples of our unique native flora that light up a bushland walk at that time of year when the bright colours of spring seem far away.

Para Wirra with its diverse trail network is a great place to find these plants but you can also find them among hundreds of different and special native plants on reserves and roadsides across our patch from Anstey Hill to Kaiser Stuhl and Cromer reserves.

If you want to learn more, come out with Friends of Para Wirra or get a copy of the native plant guide "Focus on Flora". This is a fantastic resource describing and illustrating 280 native plants, see



The hall has a new surround sound system, TV, microphone facilities, and heating and cooling.


Outside you will find a sheltered playground that leads to picturesque garden areas which are ideal for photos.
