#### PLAYFORD COUNCIL - LOCAL COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

Thank you to the residents that took the time to review and provided feedback on the Annual Business Plans. I do appreciate the feedback and support.

In summary there were over 12,000 engagements through various media articles and 1,700 engagements by either downloading or engaging with our media. We received 48 feedback responses with nearly two thirds (65%) indicating that they had read the plans in detail, while less than one third (29%) had only read the parts of interest to them and 6% had not read the plans and documents.

The overall support of the plans was 33%, with 13% neither agreeing nor disagreeing and 54% unsupportive of the plans. The main themes in community feedback related to opposing the rate rise and a perceived misalignment of rate increases not being reflected by an increase of maintenance in the local area.

These themes were underpinned by comments highlighting concerns on the increasing cost of living to struggling families along with a desire to see change in their immediate suburb with better maintenance of footpaths and roads. Traffic congestion and road condition was commonly mentioned in a general sense, and comments were also made about the frustrations with Curtis Road and the need for this to be a focus in the plans.

On a local front, discussion with One Tree Hill residents continue to highlight,

- The concerns with our roadside management and maintenance.
- The need to lift the presentation of our main street.
- The presentation, water management and security of the OTH Cemetery.
- The safety concerns of the Yorktown Road and Blacktop Road intersection.
- The traffic safety concerns on Burnett Drive due to school time drop off and pick-ups. (The City of Playford is currently collecting traffic data in response to concerns raised for further consideration).
- The desire to reassess the speed limits of Kersbrook Road and Uley Road.

I would like to see a main street upgrade delivered to improve the presentation of our local township and improve the functionality with new footpaths providing the connectivity that community members have been requesting. I'd be interested to hear your feedback.

I will continue to be at the One Tree Hill Market on the first Saturday of every month (excluding January) to engage and discuss local matters.

#### **CFS REPORT - JULY 2023**

#### **Incident Report**

Ten call-outs this month with one sadly ending in tragedy with the death of a 22 year old girl killed on Uley Road around 10 PM on the 25<sup>th</sup> of May when she lost control of the car she was driving colliding with a tree. Members of the One Tree Hill CFS send their condolences to the family and friends. This incident happened in the stretch of Uley Road near the Miles Road intersection which has been the scene of many incidents in recent years



and was the second accident in a week in this area. In the first incident a car lost control and went through a fence on the 20<sup>th</sup> of May.

The previous day also saw the brigade involved in another serious incident with the bulk water carrier called to assist the several MFS and CFS appliances from other Brigades at a house fire in Evanston. Initially called in as a tree on fire, the resulting fire completely gutted the house and sheds on the property, injuring both occupants of the property. Crews had difficulty accessing the house because of items hoarded around the surrounding yard.

There were another two car accidents for the month within 12 hours of each other on the same stretch of road, one at 8:30 at night on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of June, the other at 8:15 the following morning. Both accidents occurred on Humbug Scrub Road, along the back of Para Wirra Recreation Park, with the second one being a rollover, and resulted in the Rescue helicopter being dispatched to the scene.

Two trees down this month, one on Backtop Road near Tyeka Road and the other on Gulfview Drive. In both incidents the trees had fallen on power lines creating difficulties for crews in attendance. In an unusual callout, crews were called to assist a resident at around 5:30 PM on the 31st of May with escaped sheep creating a traffic hazard on Yorktown Road.

In what seems to have been a month of 2s, there were also two vehicle fires, this time on the 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> of June, one on Uley Road and the other just around the corner on the Gawler One Tree Hill Road near Tenafeate Creek wines. The first of these was called in as a car smoking from underneath the bonnet but on arrival, crews were confronted by a tradie vehicle well involved in fire causing major disruption to peak hour traffic.

#### **Emergency Kits**

Hard to think with all the rain and cold weather around that we are only a few short months away from another fire season. Although it is a great time to be sitting around our heaters, there are still things we can do to prepare for the upcoming fire season. Things like preparing or updating your Bushfire plan and, as recently advertised on the CFS signs around town, preparing an Emergency Kit. What do you put in your Emergency Kit? Basically, anything that you might need if you needed to leave your house at short notice. While there are some obvious things, the CFS web site has a comprehensive list of things you might consider, just Google "CFS Emergency Kit".

Another sad month for the CFS this time with the passing of Rex Hall AFSM. In a 60-year career with the CFS and EFS Rex was a member of the One Tree Hill Brigade for 15 of those during the 60s and 70s. After leaving One Tree Hill Rex went on to establish the SA Volunteer Fire Fighters Museum in Naracoorte and authored several books about CFS/EFS history. The state CFS web site paid honours to Rex, saying "Rex was a brave man who dedicated his life to protecting our community. He will be remembered for his courage, selflessness and preserving the CFS legacy. May he rest in peace." Condolences to the family and friends.

# Pumpkin soup

Easy | 0:15 Prep | 0:30 Cook | 6 Servings



#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 750g jap pumpkin diced
- 250g potatoes diced
- 2 onions diced medium
- 3 chicken stock cubes crumbled
- 3 ½ cups water
- 250ml thickened cream
- 1 pinch salt and pepper \*to taste

#### **EQUIPMENT NEEDED**

- Saucepan
- Blender

#### **METHOD**

- 1. Place all ingredients, except the cream, into a large saucepan.
- 2. Simmer until vegetables are tender.
- 3. Remove from heat.
- 4. Blend with a stick blender until smooth.
- Add cream and stir through (do not boil after adding cream).

#### WHAT'S FLOWERING IN MY GARDEN

#### **Heather Fischer, Humbug Scrub**

It's cold and damp. Winter has set in with cold days and nights and some sunshine in between cold fronts that breeze through delivering very welcomed showers of rain. Dams need to be replenished as well as the subsoil.

The flowering Hakeas continue to provide nectar for the many Honeyeaters that reside in the garden. Winter flowering Correas with their bright orange red flowers are creating a bright splash of colour throughout the garden beds. The brightly coloured Eastern Crimson Rosellas are devouring the immature seed capsules on some Bottlebrushes as well as enjoying the sprays of seed buds on the River Red Gums.

Hypocalymma xanthopetalum is in full flower mode at the moment and is an absolutely stunning plant to see and enjoy. Although it flowers throughout the year, it is at it's flowering best during Winter. It is a low growing rounded plant with many narrow arching stems. The stems bear narrow mid green elliptical shaped leaves with the brilliant golden yellow small dainty flowers appearing from the leaf axils. When flowering is complete, the withered petals and stamens drop off to reveal a bright green seed capsules to which the Rosellas are attracted. This lovely plant which grows naturally in the south western area of Western Australia has the common name of Golden Myrtle and will grow on a variety of well drained acidic soils in full sun to part shade. A similar plant Hypocalymma cordifolium has yellow flowers and

is occasionally available to purchase from good garden centres. Hypocalymma xanthpetalum is sometimes available at the Adelaide native plant sale. It is such a wonderfull plant in any garden or large pot as it's many brilliant golden yellow flowers brighten up our Winter days.

#### BIRDS IN MY BACKYARD Julie Buttery, Humbug Scrub

I started to write about the next little bird that became a frequent visitor heard laughing outside. "OK" I thought "if you insist". So this article is about the Laughing Kookaburra, sometimes called the Laughing Jackass.

Many of us will remember the song "Kookaburra sits in the old gum tree, Merry merry king of the bush is he" & some may also remember the other version about sitting on the electric wire "Jumping up and down..."

The Laughing Kookaburra is such a staple of our bush. They have been called "the bushman's alarm clock" for their propensity to laugh at daybreak.

I remember babysitting my almost 2 year old grandson. He had been shown the drawing of a kookaburra in my lounge & I had tried to mimic the laugh. This morning in memory, he was up before daylight. All of a sudden his eyes went huge and he stood transfixed. Outside, the kookaburras had begun their dawn chorus. When they finished he said "Hoo Haha bird" & pointed to the picture. The light had truly dawned for him & he began to realise that the sounds we made were in mimic of birds and animals. Whenever I phoned my son (living in Canberra) we had to wait while the 'Kookas' had their chorus as he missed them so much.

For years, kookaburras have settled in an ancient River Red Gum near our house & given their dawn & dusk chorus. They have nested in another tree, about 50 metres away. At different times of the year, they call from further away & we only notice them if we are outside at the time. We have watched them take mice and lizards & even small snakes. The snakes get a thorough bashing on a branch or dropped repeatedly from a branch before being eaten.

Young Kookaburras need to learn to laugh. Their early attempts are - laughable. At each attempt, an adult will re-

peat the phrase, exactly like a linguistic teacher, & the youngster will try again. Eventually the whole family is singing the same song – a territorial song.

There is something about the Laughing Kookaburra call: it seems to force a smile on every human face. Especially when they choose to call just as you have made a fool of yourself.

The Laughing Kookaburra (Dacelo novaeguineae) is a member of the Kingfisher family. There are 13 species of Australian

Kingfisher but only 4 fish frequently in water. Our Laughing Kookaburra has blue on its upper wing coverts but usually only a light colour. Its cousin, the Blue-winged kookaburra, has much brighter blue wing coverts. The breeding male has a bright



blue patch on his rump but the females and lesser males have paler or no blue on the rump. Juveniles also have a black bill which fades in adulthood to cream on the under mandible.

Laughing kookaburras live in a family group of about 7 birds with all helping to rear the youngsters.

Their wing span is about 187 to 233 mm and weight around 200 to 450 grams.

Their natural range is the entire eastern side of the continent, from the tip of Qld to Victoria and extending into southern SA (Pt Augusta and south). However, they have been introduced to Kangaroo Island, Flinders Island, Tasmania and SW Western Australia. In WA they are considered a pest. Their foraging habits have driven some of the local birds close to extinction, in particular by taking newly hatched birds from the nest. The WA birds have not had tuition in laughing and their call is definitely different, somehow a bit "off note".

Kookaburras perch on a branch and wait quietly for prey to move below them. They may be quite hard to spot in the shadows.



Kookaburras are another bird that people like to feed – and do them harm by doing so. Mince is not suitable. Some chopped raw meat is occasionally acceptable but, like all our wild fauna, they are best served by us providing natural habitat for them, not supplement feeding them. We will get it wrong. If you really can't help yourself, buy frozen mice and leave for them.



#### KOALA RESCUE NEWS Bronwyn Wilton

Koalas can climb up trees in two ways:

They can bound, which is a leaping forward motion with their arms and legs pushing off similar to a frog. Or they climb quadrupedally, using one foot at a time, similar to how they walk when on the ground.

When koalas are on the ground and close to the tree they have picked to climb, they tend to bound quickly to reach safety. They can move incredibly quickly this way.

Koalas find jumping from branch to branch quiet easy and can leap up to two meters. They will often jump from tree to tree in heavily treed areas. Jumping is a much safer option than coming to ground to swap trees, as they can avoid most predators this way.





<u>REMEMBER:</u> Do not pick up a sick koala, it can still inflict serious injuries with its teeth and claws. If you see an injured, sick or orphaned koala please ring our free 24/7 hotline on 0474 737 283

#### ONE TREE HILL CUBS BUSHCRAFT CAMP

In early June, One Tree Hill cubs (Kumanti Pack) held a Bushcraft camp at Blackham Environmental and Conservation Centre near Para Wirra. The 15 cubs who attended with their leaders and cook helpers were lucky to score great weather considering that it is winter! We even ended up in short sleeves on one of the days. Cubs slept in tents on site, and for 8 of the cubs it was their very first tent camp!

Cubs experienced a range of bushcraft skills with an underlying theme of survival and self-sufficiency. This included finding North using the sun and the time, finding South using the stars by identifying the Southern Cross, compasses, building a shelter using a tarp and rope, collecting water from nature and how to make water safe, the fire triangle, collecting suitable firewood and building and lighting their own fires in a pyramid to cook a snack, cooking dessert on a bigger fire with coals, using a flint and steel, and day and night hiking a total of 6km. Angle Vale cubs were camped nearby on the same weekend, and we even did a video call "sing-off" with them around the campfire at night for something fun and different!

Overall the camp was a great success, and to top it off we invested 2 brand new cubs, Jaxon and Lachy, who made their scout promise and were welcomed into Kumanti Pack. Luckily, we managed to get the tents down before the rain came, so we went home with everything dry!

#### NORTHERN FOOTHILLS LAND CARE GROUP

#### Birds and Biodiversity in the Adelaide Mt Lofty Ranges.



NFLCG Birds and Biodiversity Information Evening.

Last month a large group of keen environmentalists was treated to a discussion about the state of our Biodiversity as seen through the eyes of retired ecologist and ornithologist Dr David Paton. The rate of extinction and decline of bird species in the Adelaide Mount Lofty Ranges over the last 150 years and particularly over the last 30 years, has been very high and is an excellent indicator that despite the Governments Biodiversity conservation targets, the situation continues to accelerate towards a place we don't want to go.

Despite what appears to be a greater Government awareness, and ongoing recovery efforts, many species are currently considered threatened. We heard how we needed to take action on a number of fronts to reduce the impacts of climate change, invasive species, grazing pressure and the impact of land use pressure on biodiversity. The message was quite clear, the environmental wrecking ball was rolling and our efforts today would need to be considerable and sustained in order to slow the decline. Although the message was particularly confronting, there was hope as we heard about the work of BioR's revegetation successes on Kangaroo Island and in the lower Murray.

Northern Foothills Land Care Group would like to thank all those who braved the cold to attend and we look forward to seeing you at our next information evening.

Post script: BioR is a grassroots charity that reconstructs habitats to support native wildlife that is doing amazing work.






