

One Tree Hill CFS — Incident Report November 2018

November has been a month tinged with tragedy following a domestic accident. In what can only be described as a tragic accident, a resident was pinned against the wall of a shed by a rainwater tank when the stand supporting the tank collapsed. It is believed that the victim, who unfortunately died at the scene, was attempting to stabilise the stand at the time of the accident. The members of the CFS would like to express their condolences to the family and friends.



In an odd start to the month we were called to an incident involving a cat that decided to have a litter of kittens in a roller door with the homeowner unable to remove them. Although not something we are trained for, some innovation and a broom brought the call to a satisfactory outcome. Back to the more routine calls and as the Fire Danger Season approached, we had three calls involving people doing burn-offs. Two were small but with potential, one where the owner was taking advantage of the Adelaide Hills Council open permit and was surprised by the rate of spread of the fire and called the CFS to help extinguish it and the other in the Playford area where the owner was unaware that he needed a permit.

In the third and more serious case, a landowner in Golden Grove started a burn-off and then left the property. The fire went out of control burning more than a hectare and resulted in a Level 3 alarm. It is understood that the owner is facing charges because of his negligence.

Fire Danger Season has started

By now everyone should realise that the Fire Danger Season for the Adelaide Hills and Metropolitan area started on the 17th of November. Check the CFS web-site if you are unsure what you can do, there is a handy guide that makes thing clear. Monday the 12th was our first Total Fire ban day for this season and as reported in the press, the police have already charged several people with offences relating to violating the ban including one person for using a chain saw, so be warned.



The topic of fences and gates is one that occasionally causes some angst in the community. While we always attempt to use gates and minimise damage where possible, in the heat of the moment (pardon the pun) that is not always an option. With several landowners in the area now investing in electric gates you might need to either leave the gates open or ensure that we have an alternative method of entry onto your property in case of emergency.

Fire Danger Ratings

Fire Danger Ratings indicate the degree of difficulty of stopping a fire under the predicted weather conditions.

The Bureau of Meteorology, in partnership with CFS, determines the Fire Danger Ratings based on a combination of predicted weather conditions and current observations.

The official Fire Danger Rating for the following day is issued after 4:30pm by the CFS, and includes preliminary forecasts for the next four days.

The ratings do not predict how likely bushfires are to occur, but rather how a fire would behave if one started.

The higher the Fire Danger Rating, the more dangerous the fire conditions are in that district.

Fire Danger Ratings should be used to determine your Bushfire Survival Plan response for the following days.

Fire Danger Ratings forecast two to four days out should be used as a guide only and may change.





Melling Snowmen Recipe

MAKES 24 SNOWMEN

Ingredients

- 2 1/2 cups (375g) Plain Flour
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 175g butter, softened
- 3/4 cup (165g) caster sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 Egg
- 1 cup (160g) icing sugar mixture
- 1 1/2 tablespoons milk
- Snake Iollies, to decorate
- 24 white marshmallows
- Dark chocolate writing icing, to decorate
- 2 x 120g pkts M&M's Minis



Method

- Sift the flour, baking powder and salt into a bowl. Use an electric mixer to beat the butter and caster sugar in a bowl for 5 mins or until pale and creamy. Beat in the vanilla and egg. Stir in the flour mixture.
- 2. Turn out the dough onto a lightly floured surface. Knead for 1 min or until smooth. Divide dough into 2 portions and shape each portion into a disc. Wrap in plastic wrap and place in the fridge for 30 mins to chill.
- 3. Preheat oven to 180C. Line 2 baking trays with baking paper.
- 4. Roll out 1 pastry disc between 2 sheets of baking paper to 5mm thickness. Use a 7cm round pastry cutter to cut 12 discs from dough, re-rolling trimmings if necessary. Place discs 3cm apart on the lined trays. Bake for 12-15 mins or until lightly golden. Set aside to cool. Repeat with remaining dough to make 24 biscuits.
- 5. Sift the icing sugar into a bowl. Add enough milk to make a thick spreadable consistency. Spoon icing over the cooled biscuits and spread towards the edges to form the melted body.
- 6. Use kitchen scissors to cut 24 small triangles from an orange snake lolly to form the noses. Gently dip the bases of the noses in icing. Attach to the sides of the marshmallows. Use the writing icing to pipe eyes and mouths onto the marshmallows. Press marshmallow heads onto iced biscuits. Use kitchen scissors to cut heads from snake lollies. Cut down the length of snakes to make two long thin pieces. Wrap around marshmallow heads to form scarves.
- 7. Place red and green M&M's Minis down the centre of the biscuits to form buttons. Use the writing icing to pipe arms on each biscuit. Store in an airtight container for up to a week.



What's flowering in my garden today?

There are colourful flowering plants everywhere. The Callistemons, with the common name of Bottlebrushes, are in full flower. There are white, pink, apricot, orange, mauve, purple and many shades of red. One of my favourites is the green flowering Callistemon pinifolius with it's soft lime green bottlebrush flowers and very fine pine like leaves. The Melaleucas are showing off their flowers in m any shades of cream, pink, mauve, purple and red.

The Native Frangipani, Hymenosporum flavum, has been an absolute delight for the past 6 weeks. Often seen as a street tree in the suburbs, it's mass of creamy white flowers open over a few weeks against dark green glossy leaves and



gradually age to a bright golden yellow. On warm balmy nights, the back yard is filled strong and most deightful sweet perfume. The birds and the bees enjoy this tree which will produce interesting large green seed pods, which turn brown, encasing many papery coppery brown seeds. a newly planted tree will need to be watered over Summer and autumn until established, which may be up to 3 years. Once established it will become a favourite tree, up to 5 meters high and 3 metres wide and, if you are like me, you will eagerly await it's flowering time just to really enjoy it's magnificent perfume. A great sub tropical tree.

Community News... One Tree Hill Area Weeds of Concern

<u>Silverleaf Nightshade</u> originates from central or southern America and was first reported in Australia in the early 1900s. It is now established in the One Tree Hill postal district.

Silverleaf Nightshade (SLN) is a summer active perennial closely related to horticultural crops such as tomatoes and eggplants, making biological control problematic. SLN is a declared noxious weed in South Australia and other states. It is one one of the worst weeds in South Australia as it is readily spread by seed and root segments and once established, is very difficult to control. It reduces crop yields and is poisonous to stock.

The typical silverleaf nightshade is a deep-rooted, erect, summer-growing perennial herb, measuring up to 80 cm high, but more commonly 35-40 cm

high. Stems are erect, branched, covered with fine hairs giving a silver-white appearance. Lower stems are usually armed with sharp spines. Leaves are 6-15 cm long and 2-3 cm wide. Leaves often have sharp spines, and are 2-4 mm long on the underside of veins. Leaf margins are undulated and often scalloped. Flowers begin in November and continue throughout summer. They are purple to violet-coloured, occasionally white, up to 3.5 cm in diameter, have 5 fused petals and prominent yellow anthers. Silverleaf nightshade bears up to 60 tomato-like berries per stem, each containing 20-100 seeds.

The extensive root system of silverleaf nightshade, up to several metres in width and depth, poses a large problem for control. Roots can penetrate to depths of at least two metres. Farmers have even reported roots as deep as five metres. Each plant is usually

part of a colony with inter-connecting root systems which helps give silverleaf nightshade its tremendous competitive ability and persistence. It is important to note that new plants can regenerate from root segments as small as 1 cm. Research shows that root segments if kept moist can remain viable in soil for up to 15 months.

Seedlings emerge at any time from late spring until autumn, depending on rainfall. Emergence occurs more in disturbed soils than on crusted compacted or undisturbed soil. Under favourable conditions up to 80% of fresh seed can germinate. Germination is greatest at depths between 1-3 cm, with optimum soil temperature above 15°C (at 3 cm).

Silverleaf nightshade infestations can not be successfully eradicated with a single herbicide application. Aerial growth can be controlled in-season, however regrowth can occur later in the same season or in the next season from the same rootbank. Diligence in maintaining a herbicide program over several years is required to run down an established infestation due to the extremely persistent seeds and roots in soil.

A successful management program should include a range of tactics, aimed to control the seedbank and/or the rootbank. The good news is that field trial results confirm that a 'dual action' spray program, implemented over successive years can reduce the impact of this difficult weed. The dual action program involves spraying silverleaf nightshade at the early flowering stage, both in spring or autumn, to prevent seed set. A follow-up spray in autumn controls re-shoots and helps run down the root reserves.

A variety of chemicals can be used, including Glyphosate. Please see *Weed control handbook for declared plants in South Australia* for advice on chemical control, available on-line from:

Community News... Centenary of Armistice

To mark the 100th Anniversary of the signing for Peace in Europe a small group of people gathered at the One Tree Hill Institute.

The Australian Flag on the flagpole at the One Tree Hill Institute was lowered to half mast.

A wreath with pieces of French Lavender that grows naturally in France, and pieces of Rosemary that grows on the cliffs at Gallipoli, was laid at the base of our monument (see photo on the front cover of this issue). Incorporated into the wreath, were five hand crocheted black centred red poppies, one for each One Tree Hill man who left our township to fight for King and Country during World War 1 from 1914 to 1918, and who did not come back home. Their names are engraved on our monument as well as those men who died during World War 2.



A minutes silence to remember lives lost and to reflect on the horror of wartime conflict was observed. The Australian Flag, raised to the top of the flagpole, majestically fluttered softly.

No words were spoken.

No bugler played The Last Post.

This quiet ceremony at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month was attended by six adults and two young children.

The men and women who left our country and made the ultimate sacrifice were not forgotten on Armistice Day.

Now, in 2018, Armistice Day is known as Remembrance Day.


