



Happy New Year everyone and all the best for 2019.



#### One Tree Hill CFS — Incident Report January 2019

A belated Happy New Year to everyone. We have had a busy period since the last issue and have responded to 18 incidents since the last report as well as manning the station several times for stand-by on Total Fire Ban days and the Tour Down Under this week. Summarising the incidents, we have had calls for 8 grass fires, 4 vehicle accidents, 5 trees down and one case of escaping gas. Obviously too many to cover individually.



A fatality as a result of a car accident occurred on the 6th of December with the driver thrown out after rolling the car on a reasonably straight stretch of Blacktop road about 1 km from the sub- station. Witnesses described the car being driven erratically and at speed shortly before the incident. In a 2nd serious incident, a local man escaped serious injury after rolling his car on Cornishmans Hill Road. A reminder that our responsibility at these accidents is fire cover for the vehicle and ensuring public safety through traffic control. We are not responsible for the contents of vehicles although we do try to ensure that they are either with the vehicle when it is taken away or removed for safe-keeping.



While we had the "traditional" fire started by idiots with fireworks on New Year's Eve, the most significant blaze occured the day before between Airport and Shillabeer Roads at Sampson Flat. Coming just 3 days short of the 4th anniversary of the Sampson Flat fire, the fire only burned about one hectare of bushland and was quickly brought under control. The slow rate of spread was attributed to favourable weather conditions as well as reduced fuel load in the "scar" of the 2015 fire.

#### Bushfires Start When We Stop Paying Attention—Operation NOMAD

Shortly before Christmas Police started an anti-bushfire campaign in the Adelaide Hills. In addition to their increased presence as a result of Operation NOMAD, they have also delivered posters and information packs to local residents. The theme of the campaign is aimed at increasing awareness of suspicious behaviour and encouraging people to ring 131444 if they have any information related to incidents. It's pleasing to see that people have heeded the message and, in at least one instance, a member of the public was able to extinguish a small road-side fire before it was able to spread as well as providing Police with information concerning a suspicious vehicle. If you find yourself in this situation, please remember you should never put yourself in danger but the more information you can provide to Police the better.




## One Tree Hill Rural Watch— Crime Report







### What's flowering in my garden today?

It's January and it's HOT. At the time of writing 38 degrees seems so much more bearable than the 46 degrees that registered in the thermometer a few days ago. All plants are doing their best to cope with this relentess heat. No doubt some won't survive.

I know it is January because **Corymbia ficifolia** is blooming. In the past, this large tree was known as Eucalyptus ficifolia and is commonly referred to as the Red Flowering Gum. My tree, singed and heat affected during the Sampson Flat Bushfire four summers ago now, produces large masses beautiful, brilliant red clusters of flowers that can almost cover the entire tree. Standing underneath the canopy, all that you can hear is the constant buzz of many, many busy bees busily collecting pollen.

There are a few mature trees in full flower at the moment, in a paddock on the side of the hill on the northern side of Blacktop Road at the T junction with One Tree Hill Road. If travelling past these trees, take a look at them and enjoy the magnificent display that they create annually.

This species is indigenous to the far southwest area of Western Australia in the Walpole and Mt Frankland area and has been planted extensively throughout many areas of eastern and southern Australia where there is adequate rainfall. Grafted trees are available for growing in large garden areas from most garden centres. If you have space for a large tree with a rounded canopy consider planting Corymbia ficifolia. Once established and producing flowers, you will enjoy the stunning brilliant red flowers that this well known and loved tree offers.

#### **One Tree Hill CFS Station Facilities Development**

The One Tree Hill CFS recently completed the design, construction and fitting out of a BA (Breathing Apparatus) cleaning room on the eastern side of our station. THIS WAS ENTIRELY PAID FOR BY MONETARY DONATIONS FROM THE COMMUNITY.

BA is used by specially trained CFS volunteers when attending structure fires and car fires. Up until this room was completed crews would have to clean the BA equipment, (which can take about 45 minutes), after they returned from the job either outside or in the truck bay, both of which had no permanent cleaning facilities.

Often these jobs would occur late at night or very early in the morning and often in winter. We are now able to step off the truck and walk straight into the new BA room where everything is permanently set up and ready to go, saving time and a lot of discomfort.



We sincerely thank everyone who has donated money to our brigade, or left empty soft drink and beer bottles and cans behind the station for us. By doing so you have helped us construct this very important asset for our brigade.



#### One Tree Hill Area Weeds of Concern

**St. John's wort (Hypericum perforatum)** is regarded as a significant environmental weed in Victoria and as an environmental weed in South Australia, the ACT, New South Wales and Western Australia. It is a serious perennial weed of pastures, water catchments, forest and national parks in the high rainfall areas of southern Australia. It was brought to Australia in 1875 as a

garden plant, and is used in herbal medicine.

St. John's wort is an upright and long-lived (perennial) herbaceous plant usually growing 30-70 cm tall, but can reach up to

1.2 meters in height. It usually produces several stems each year from a woody rootstock. These stems are somewhat woody near the base and have paired branches in their upper halves. The plant has stout main roots up to 1000mm deep and creeping rhizomes just below the surface that produce buds and new shoots each year. Its relatively small leaves are oppositely arranged, stalkless, hairless and light green in colour. Leaves have translucent oil glands which look like perforations in the blade when held up to the sun. Its bright yellow flowers (1-3 cm across) often have small black dots along the edges of their petals. It has reddish-brown striped sticky three-celled seed capsules (5-10mm long) which split open when mature. A plant can produce up to 33 000 seeds per year, and the seeds can remain viable for 12 years.

St John's wort is toxic to horses, sheep, cattle and goats. Horses are most sensitive, and goats least sensitive. Animals with coloured skin are less sensitive to toxicity than those with white skin. It causes photo-sensitisation in animals leading to low productivity and sometimes death. It also causes contact dermatitis in people. The green and dry plants and hay can be toxic. The toxic substance is a fluorescent red pigment called hypericin, and is concentrated in the oil glands in the leaves and flowers. The narrow-leaf strain (leaves 7 - 9 mm wide) contains more toxin than the broad-leaf strain (10 - 12 mm wide). Poisoning with St John's wort is more common in spring and summer because production of the toxin, hypericin, is strongly associated with development of the plant flower stems.

We have found that hand-weeding, either by pulling plants out by hand or digging plants out using a hoe or shovel, is not an effective method of controlling St John's wort. St John's wort can reproduce from buds produced on its roots; therefore, new plants will grow unless the entire root structure is removed.

Spot-spraying is an appropriate control strategy to use on isolated St John's wort infestations. Spot-spraying is best carried out when the St John's wort is in flower (November to January), because at this time it is easily seen and most sensitive to herbicides. There are two indigenous native species of Hypericum (small St John's wort H gramineum and matted St John's wort H japonicum) which may co-occur with St John's wort and with which it could be confused. Both indigenous species may be distinguished by the absence of black gland dots on the petals and leaves, the presence of 4 longitudinal ridges on the stem (young stems of St John's Wort are 2-ridged) and by the stamens not being fused into bundles.
