PLAYFORD COUNCIL - LOCAL COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

I would like to wish everyone well for a fantastic 2024.

McGilp Recreation Park upgrade

The McGilp Recreation Park upgrade is moving along. The detailed design process began in September 2023, with the appointment of the design consultant. The detailed design phase is over halfway through with the completion expected in February 2024. Once detailed design is complete Council will go to tender for the construction contractor. The City of Playford anticipate the tendering and appointment will take place from February to May 2024 with the aim to begin construction in June 2024.

One Tree Hill Cemetery Meeting - Monday 12th February 2024 at 4pm.

The general presentation of the One Tree Hill Cemetery has been raised several times by residents over the last twelve months. The trees that were once along the roadside were removed due to the impact upon the heritage wall. I would also like to see a plan for the cemetery to lift the presentation and ambience of the area.

I would appreciate residents meeting me along with Andy Slager the Senior Manager – City Operations to bring positive feedback and ideas forward for consideration.

Karwin Road, Humbug Scrub

The re-sheeting of Karwin Road has been scheduled to occur from Monday the 11th March 2024, subject to favourable weather conditions. Work will include swale drain maintenance where required and the placement of additional quarry rubble that has been historically used. The performance of this product is currently being monitored for dust and its compressive strength. If the performance of the product is thought to be acceptable it may be used on Karwin Road.

Acknowledgement of Country

On the 28th November 2023 I moved Council Resolution 5660 and the elected body voted to change the Acknowledgement of Country. What did we do?

- We maintained the Acknowledgement of Country and increased the exposure by placing the acknowledgement on the City of Playford's website. The website connects and reaches a far wider audience.
- We maintained the Acknowledgement of Country at Civic Events as determined by the administration on an event-by-event basis.
- We have added a separate acknowledgement to be inclusive of all Australians that have contributed to building and defending our nation.
- We removed the reading out of the acknowledgement at each meeting, that is simply read out to the same small group of people over and over.

PLAYFORD COUNCIL - LOCAL COUNCILLOR'S REPORT CONT'D

The results of the referendum 'Voice to Parliament' spoke loud and clear however it was the many conversations within the community that stood out to me. People were not against the First Nations people, they saw the 'Voice' as divisive, and they wanted unity not division. The Acknowledgement of Country to many residents is seen as a hollow gesture devalued by its overuse.

I am a strong advocate that Elected Members should be voting independently of political bias and should NOT be employed in a political office.

The motion was simple and inclusive and there should not have been significant argument against the motion in my opinion. If it was supported and not argued against, the motion would have passed quickly and minimal time would have been spent.

It was interesting to see the Councillors that are Labor Party employees against this motion. It seemed that there was a party line to protect. Were these Councillors representing the residents of Playford or are we paying them to support a political agenda? One was claiming misinformation and another making false claims saying that I said,

- 1. The reading out of the acknowledgement was inefficient. I did NOT say this.
- 2. That I was busy sand bagging my country, as I like to say. I NEVER referred to sand bagging my country.
- 3. Interestingly, Cr Rebecca Vandepeear was quick to label this motion as a 'Culture War'. It was NOT for me.
- 4. That I was wasting time bringing the motion to the chamber especially when residents were sand bagging their homes. While we had a rain event and some localised flooding within Ward 1, I am unaware of residents needing to sandbag their homes. We did not have the convergence of flooding events of the North and South Para which impacts the Gawler River where we see the significant impacts of flooding in Angle vale and Viriginia. Most of the time taken in the debate was the argument against the motion.

It is disappointing to see a Parliamentary style debate with misinformation and sensationalism coming to the City of Playford. If this continues it is my intention to put a spotlight on this type of behaviour.

I always appreciate connecting with the community and listening to your ideas and feedback. Please give me a call or visit me at the One Tree Hill Markets the first Saturday of every month.

FEBRUARY 2024 CFS REPORT - JANUARY 2024

Incident Report

First up, the members of the One Tree Hill Brigade would like to wish everyone a happy and safe New Year. There has been a total of 30 call-outs since our last report that have kept us busy over the Christmas break. There are far too many to list in detail, but in summary, there have been 11 grass, tree, or rubbish fires, 9 trees down, 3 structure fires, 2 vehicle accidents and 1 vehicle fire, Strike teams to Mount Pleasant and Pewsey Vale, a call to assist resident and finally a Hazmat (Hazardous Material) call. More detailed information and some spectacular photos are available on our Facebook page.

Of the grass fires, 4 were outside out of the area, and 4 were caused by a lightning storm that passed through the township on the 28th of December. Fortunately, these latter fires were all minor due to the rain that fell with the lightning, although one of the tree fires had to be "baby-sat" overnight. The long spell of rainy weather during the middle of December gave us a bit of a break from the predicted long hot summer, but things are starting to heat up again as this article is being written.

The 3 structure fires were all out of area with the most significant being the house fire in Williamstown that was widely reported in the press, where the home was fully destroyed with losses estimated at \$1.3M. Another of these was in a glass house complex at Virginia where bombers were called in to assist, dropping water in areas that crews were having trouble accessing and restricting the spread of the blaze.

On the 15th of January, crews were called to the OTH station for a Hazardous Material (Hazmat) call, unfortunately the object in question, an electrical line fuse containing toxic material, was left in front of the station and in accordance with Hazmat protocols, this meant that the station had to be isolated because it was within the exclusion zone and we were unable to access the appliances. Hazmat Operators from other Brigades were able to assess the substance and work with authorities for its removal. SA CFS headquarters issued a statement urging the community to report any hazardous materials to 000 and not to move any unknown substances.

Vale Vince Cozzitorto

It was with deep sadness that the CFS announced the passing of former Captain Vince Cozzitorto on the 17th of December after losing a long and courageous battle with emphysema. Vince is a Life Member of the One Tree Hill Brigade, serving for 46 years, notably as Captain from 1991-1999 and OTH CFS President from 1999-2007. The Brigade passes on their sincerest condolences to Vince's wife Linda, another long serving member of the Brigade, and to his family and friends.

Members of the Brigade, the Region and CFS Headquarters honoured Vince with a Guard of Honour at his funeral on the 3rd of January. The attendance at the funeral, over 450 people, showed the high regard with which Vince was held both within the CFS and within the broader OTH community. Personally, Vince was Captain when I joined and was a great leader and mentor, always professional and always ready with words of encouragement and a cheeky grin. The siren was given 3 extra blasts on the 8th of January to recognise Vince's passing, he will be truly missed.

<u>General</u>

Finally on a brighter note, a huge thanks to all the people who turned out for our inaugural Santa Lolly run on the 20th of December. Given the success it may have to become an annual event. I couldn't say it better than our Facebook post ... "The warm reception, friendly waves, and well wishes were an awesome demonstration of OTH community spirit. However, the best parts of tonight were the smiles on the faces of the children, the screams of delight at seeing Santa on OTH 34P, and the mad scramble for all the lollies coming off the appliances."

THE MAGIC OF THERAPY DOGS Lisa Kettler

"Can I pat your dog?", people ask when Tilly is wearing her Therapy Dogs Australia bandana. And my answer is almost always "Yes! She would love that!" And instantly, Tilly, and by extension, myself, have made a new connection with someone. The ice has been broken, and the awkwardness that often surrounds talking to a complete stranger or casual acquaintance, has gone.

Within moments, a comfortable conversation has begun, based on getting to know more about Tilly, but so often moving within a sentence or two, to connection building between the humans. Small snippets of personality, story telling, opinions, experiences and more are being shared, like: "Oh, my dog would be jumping all over us! He's a kelpie and he's crazy, but we love him". I have learned more, and more comfortably and authentically, about other humans in some of the five minute conversations initiated by connection with Tilly, than in much longer meetings or social events.

Better still, people leave the interaction with a smile on their face, and often tell me if

I see them again, that they experienced a lift in their mood or felt an improved capacity to deal with the difficult things in their day, as a result of the interaction with Tilly.

In a training or workplace setting, the effect is magnified, as people visibly relax and start talking not only to me, but to each other about Tilly. Once the connection has been established, it is so much easier to talk about other things. Tilly herself does not demand conversation back from whoever she is interacting with, and makes her own choices about who to approach and for how long, so even the most reserved and quiet people in the room can feel a sense of engagement and connection.

Therapy dogs have a very specific role, that is different to the role of a service or assistance dog. While an assistance dog is trained to help a single person with things like tasks of daily living, medical alert, community access, regulatory support or emotional support, a therapy dog is trained to work with their handler (in this case, me) to provide a service to others. Therapy dogs may be found working with their handlers, most commonly in health, community or education settings, bringing connection, comfort, and joy one paw, tail wag or soulful look at a time.



In our case, Tilly and I work together part time at Flow Psychology, and on other days, we are available to provide Workplace Paws wellbeing visits for teams working in offices, health, service and education settings. We both love this role, and I value providing a service which has benefits backed by a growing research evidence base.

My favourite response to hear when someone meets Tilly, is "She's amazing. How did she know how much I needed that today?". I love it because I am just the conduit: it's Tilly who brings the magic! To learn more about therapy dogs, feel free to email me at lisak@embracepsych.com.au

WHAT'S FLOWERING IN MY GARDEN Heather Fischer, Humbug Scrub

It's January and it's Summertime in Humbug Scrub and the surrounding areas. The weather has been quite mild with only a few hot days. At the time of writing the weather forecast for the next few days is for a hot spell which means giving some plants a good drink prior to the expected dry heat. There's no Summer holiday for any gardener.

With the most welcomed rain in November and December many Callistemons (Bottlebrushes) have put on their Summer show of stunning brightly coloured flowers. All the Honeyeaters are enjoying the nectar that the Bottlebrushes are providing. Many Grevilleas are in flower and these also provide nectar for the many birds that live in this garden. Grevillea Honey Gem responded well to the November and December rains putting on a lot of new bronze coloured growth and some most beautiful flowering stems. This Grevillea is a hybrid between Grevillea banksii and Grevillea pteridifolia and will grow up to 4m high and spread 3 m wide. It has deeply divided dark green leaves and enjoys being planted in a position of full sun to part shade on well drained soils. It produces glorious long lasting, very large golden orange yellow flower spikes. Many Honeyeaters have visited the many magnificent flowers that this Grevillea has produced. Although it is drought and frost tolerant, this stunning Grevillea does receive regular Summer and Autumn water. After flowering, this Grevillea can be pruned to encourage new growth. This beautiful Grevillea can be planted in an area with other large flowered Grevilleas e.g. Grevillea Coconut Ice to create a large display of brightly coloured Grevilleas.

You will find Grevillea Honey Gem at all good nurseries and once established you will enjoy the most magnificent brushes of golden yellow flowers that this Grevillea can produce throughout the year.

KOALA RESCUE NEWS Bronwyn Wilton



KOALA POUCH

Unlike kangaroo pouches, which open towards the top, koala pouches are located towards the bottom of their bodies and open outward. The baby koala, or Joey, won't fall out of the pouch because the mother koala uses a strong sphincter muscle to keep the pouch closed. The shape does not change as the koala Joey grows older.

It's really the growth of the pouch young that changes the apparent position of the pouch opening. The koala pouch opens vertically i.e towards the front of the mum, as they are sitting up in the tree.

Koala pouches are in fact vertical, that is they open as a long slit longitudinally.

It is very muscular and can shut tightly. The angle and shape of the pouch allows the Joey to stick his/her head out and feed on pap. It also allows a big Joey to stick his/her head in the pouch and have a feed. It is a very clever design.

<u>REMEMBER:</u> Do not pick up a sick koala, it can still inflict serious injuries with its teeth and claws. If you see an injured, sick or orphaned koala please ring our free 24/7 hotline on 0474 737 283


