

One Tree Hill CFS ~ Incident Report February 2019

A fire on Medlow Road which started near a shed and spread into the neighbouring paddock was the most significant fire call over the last 4 weeks. We were called to assist the Dalkeith CFS around 2:30 on Saturday the 19th and the fire was quickly controlled, burning less than one hectare. Another major call occurred on the 23rd of January for a Tree Down blocking the intersection of Medlow Road and Gawler/One Tree Hill Road, that was also quickly dealt with.



Considering the extreme weather conditions over that period, particularly on the 24th of January where the Brigade weather station recorded a high of 47 degrees, that is a great result. The station was manned for the whole of the day on the 24th with two shifts on stand-by. It gave some of our newer members a chance to experience what is commonly called "Hurry up and wait" in the CFS. The only call came late in the day for a "Change of Quarters" to Salisbury CFS, this is where one of our trucks is sent to man another station because their units are committed elsewhere. In this case, Salisbury had been called to the widely reported fire in the On The Run service station in Mawson Lakes.

The change of weather brought a lull in the call-outs with two occurring very late in the reporting period. One was for a car on its side on Kersbrook Road in the early hours of Valentine's Day and the other was a call to assist Kersbrook units mopping up a large fire that occurred on Mewett Road just out of Kersbrook the following day.


More summer to come ...

Playford Council ~ Local Councillor's Report

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

The role of councillor has been taking a little extra time than I had planned. I am pleased to say I am feeling positive with the discussions and likely progress moving forward. If the current discussions are an indication for the next four years, we should see many improvements.

The questions that I have been asking have resulted in a clearer picture of the council's position, resulting under the previous chamber's term and CEO's leadership. The community's sentiment is generally positive to see the City of Playford growing and improving but there are significant concerns around responsible spending and debt. I will continue to represent the community for economically sustainable growth.

The difficulty for any growing businesses is the challenge of growing pains. The state governments planning is set to see the City of Playford's population increase significantly. We will need to support infrastructure development and maintain downwards pressure on rates. This will no doubt often be challenging, and I will maintain a strong focus for downwards pressure on rates.

On the 18th December 2018 I moved a motion 3360. That council provide a report on ways it could increase its consultation with residents by issuing notices of upcoming works prior to making financial commitments to the intended works. The intention is to give residents fair opportunity to respond, increasing council's efficiency to reduce waste and spending. The resulting discussion and suggested implementations are encouraging for residents.

As a resident I plan to attend the monthly markets and welcome residents to discuss any concerns with me at this time.

I appreciate community feedback. Please keep me updated with your thoughts and opinions on community topics.






Up-and-coming Young Author in One Tree Hill



One Tree Hill Area Weeds of Concern

This month's weed of concern for the One Tree Hill area is Bathurst burr (Xanthium spinosum).

Bathurst burr (Xanthium spinosum) is a declared weed under the Natural Resources Management Act 2004 (NRM Act). It is an annual summergrowing weed that produces spiny burrs that degrades wool quality and is a pest plant in pastures. Bathurst burr is a native of South America but has now spread to most temperate areas of the world. It has been considered a noxious weed in South Australia since 1862.

The following sections of the NRM Act apply to Bathurst burr in the Adelaide and Mount Lofty Ranges region:

- Cannot transport the plant, or any material or equipment containing that plant, on a public road
- Cannot sell the plant
- Cannot sell any produce / goods carrying the plant
- Landowner must control the plant on their land
- NRM authority may recover costs for control of weeds on roadsides from adjoining landowners

Bathurst burr is an erect, multi-branching herb that grows to 30 to 60 cm high. Plants mainly germinate in late spring and summer following rain. The stems are greenish-yellow and hairy. The base of each leaf stalk is armed with 3-pronged yellow spines, up to 2.5 cm long. The leaves are dark green

and shiny above and pale and downy underneath. Plants flower throughout the year, but mostly in summer and autumn. Most plants die in early winter. Older plants produce burrs in February while late germinating plants produce them when only a few weeks old in late summer and autumn. The burrs are covered with slender yellow hooked spines and contain two seeds. The seeds remain dormant in the soil for at least three years.

Bathurst Burr is highly visible when growing and control in pasture is readily achieved with common selective herbicides or spot spraying with non-selective herbicides.

Slow Cooker Recipe Maple Apple Chicken


Ingredients:

Tree Hollows and Artificial Hollows

Kersbrook Landcare Group hosted a hollow information night and initial workshop on Tuesday 5th February in One Tree Hill. They hope to form a group to work on projects to create artificial hollows targeted to birds and mammals' specific requirements. The information night was attended by many eager members of our community and some from further afield, and the enthusiasm for such a project was well received.

Tree hollows are cavities that are formed in trees often over a long period of time. They play a very important role, providing habitat for birds, bats and possums. Hollows may be present in living or dead trees and it's important to protect these very valuable trees in the landscape even after they have died. The habitat value of trees increases with age. In fact most trees won't produce hollows until they are quite old often more than 100 years.



Hollows can be formed after branches and limbs have fallen off, after fires, or from insect, termite or fungal attack. They come in all shapes and sizes. Small hollows may be suitable for tiny birds such as pardalotes, or insectivorous bats that live in hollow crevices. Larger hollows may become the homes of parrots, kookaburras, owls or possums. Hollows may be used just for roosting or for nesting and rearing young. Some birds and animals are unable to live without hollows and will disappear completely from an area without them. These are called 'hollow dependent species.'

When no hollows are available people can replace them by make nesting boxes of various sizes to encourage animals to stay and breed. Environmentalists are working on other ways of making hollows. One method is cutting branches at angles that encourage dampness and fungal attack to eat out the centre out of the branches creating a cavity. Also carefully opening up and cutting into fallen timber to make unnatural cavities is another method.

Planting new 'recruitment' trees, species that are likely to one day become 'habitat' trees is also vital if we want to preserve our biodiversity.


