
The RAAF from Edinburgh, who undertook the duties of Catafalque Party and assisted during the service, were extremely professional, and always add a great deal to the event.

#### One Tree Hill CFS ~ Incident Report April 2019

Another quiet month with six calls callouts and two active stand-by events. Most of the callouts were relatively minor but, in the week leading up to Easter the Brigade has been heavily involved in the Boconoc Park fire just outside of Clare. This fire started from an out of control burn off on the 16<sup>th</sup> of April and despite heavily grazed paddocks was able to spread quickly in strong winds burning towards Clare and heavy woodland. The Brigade was brought up on stand-by early in the afternoon as a cautionary measure because of heavy commitment to the fire from northern area brigades. We were then



called to join a Para Group strike team late in the afternoon, with crews arriving around 7 o'clock and working until after midnight. A follow-up crew on Wednesday morning were not required, but a second team did turn out on Thursday morning working until late into the afternoon.

The other active standby was called on the 5<sup>th</sup> of April when warm and windy conditions significantly increased the fire danger. The brigade was called to a car accident in the morning to help extricate a vehicle from a chain wire fence but was stood down before attending. Not long after returning we were called to a partially built shed in Gould Creek that was threatening to blow away in the strong winds. Crews used power tools to deconstruct the shed and return it to "flat packs" which were able to be secured.

As I write this, Easter has started badly with a car vs tree on the Humbug Scrub road near Para Wirra, fortunately there were no injuries. Other incidents included a large tree down on Paines Road on the 25<sup>th</sup> of March which took several hours to clear.





For those who haven't heard, CFS HQ have extended fire danger season until the middle of May, although unprecedented it may be extended still further if the weather does not break before then. With two major fires and Total Fire Bans at the end of April it is understandable that HQ remain concerned with the potential threat.







#### What's Flowering In My Garden?

#### Eucalyptus fasciculosa

There's not much flowering in my garden at the moment. There are a few Correas in flower but many are just waiting for a good drink in order to open up their gorgeous flowers. Oh when, when will we receive some rain?


Eucalyptus fasciculosa has burst into flower and is a delight to admire with it's terminal bunches of small white flowers. These flowers are providing much needed food for the New Holland Honeyeaters and the bees are making most of the opportunity to collect pollen and nectar. It can grow up to 20 metres tall but those nearby to me are about 6 metres tall. This tree can have a tall straight trunk or be one that has a few twisted gnarly trunks, each showing off the predominate white/cream bark splashed with shades of brown/tan rough bark. Some trees display very persistent dark bark towards the base of the trees.

The adult leaves are a mid green colour and the kangaroos are a bit partial to eating the new growth. Our local koala has spent many hours resting in the forks of some of the trees along my road and has been observed enjoying the luscious new tips of the leaves of these trees. In the past, trunks of this tree, with it's hard and durable timber were often used as fencing posts.

You may have this tree on on your property but ,if not, there are many in flower along our roadsides. Enjoy the many bunches of the sweetly scented terminal flowers that this Eucalypt has produced this Autumn.



#### One Tree Hill Area Weeds of Concern

#### This month's weed of concern for the One Tree Hill area is Horehound (Marrubium vulgare).

Horehound (Marrubium vulgare) is a declared weed under the Natural Resources Management Act 2004 (NRM Act). The movement or transport of the plant on a public road, by itself or as a contaminant, or the sale by itself or as a contaminant

is prohibited. Horehound is native to temperate Eurasia, Europe, the Middle East and the Mediterranean region including North Africa. It was first recorded as naturalised in Australia by the 1840s.

Horehound is an erect or spreading bushy, aromatic perennial herb, growing to 80 cm high under favourable conditions. It is similar in shape and form to lavender. Horehound thrives on poor soil and in waste places. It invades poor pastures where there is little competition and is unpalatable for livestock. Because of its ability to invade disturbed vegetation, it is also a recognised environmental weed.

Horehound is adapted to a Mediterranean climate similar to conditions across the southern half of SA where annual rainfall exceeds 200 mm. It grows on neutral to alkaline soils, is resistant to levels of frost found in SA and can survive summer droughts.





Dense white flower clusters in the leaf forks

Horehound has velvety, near-circular green-grey leaves in opposite pairs. They are deeply veined and wrinkled with toothed edges and are covered with white, cottony hairs, especially on the lower leaf surface.

The stems are square and covered with white, cottony hairs. The white tubular flowers (6-12 mm long) are borne in dense clusters in the forks of the upper leaves. Flowers are two-lipped, the upper 'lip' being divided into two lobes and the lower 'lip' being divided into three lobes.

The fruit contains four 'seeds' enclosed in the old flower 'calyx', which has ten backwards-curved teeth or spines. These 'seeds', 1- 2.5 mm long, are brown or black in colour, egg-shaped or pear-shaped, and have a slightly rough surface texture. Horehound seed is dispersed by animals, stock or car tyres. The dry, hooked, fruit or burr attaches readily to wool, fur or clothing. Water can disperse seed and seed may be carried in mud on vehicles. Horses are also known to pass seeds in a viable condition after ingestion.

Control options include cultivation, grazing, and chemical control. Small infestations can be controlled by grubbing plants or spot-spraying. Bag and dispose of seed on site responsibly. Dense infestations need to be controlled by a combination of methods in conjunction with good pasture management and revegetation for best long-term control. Don't allow horehound to flower and set seed before treatment. Aim to maintain or reduce horehound densities to manageable levels. For advice on chemical control techniques contact the Gawler Natural Resources Centre.

## If you live in the City of Playford you are required to obtain a burning permit between the dates of 13 May 2019 and 31 October 2019.

Some areas are exempted from having to obtain an individual burning permit and are instead covered by a General Notice Burning Permit – per information below.

Burning Permits are issued to enforce the Environment Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016 in accordance with clause 6.

This general notice burning permit is issued by the City of Playford and authorises any person within the following areas of the City of Playford (as defined in the City of Playford Development Plan pursuant to the Development Act 1993) that are within Metropolitan Adelaide (as defined in the Development Act 1993):

- a. The Watershed Zone (Mount Lofty Ranges);
- b. The Hills Face Zone;
- c. Primary Production Zone (Mount Lofty Ranges);

to carry out any of the following burning activities in those areas, outside of the 2017/2018 fire danger season (fixed under the Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005) subject to the conditions set out below:

1. Burning off vegetation for fire prevention or control;

#### **Conditions**

- 2. This burning permit cannot authorise a person to carry out a burning activity under (1) on land if the person is not the owner occupier of the land or does not have the consent or authority of the owner or occupier.
- 3. A person carrying out a burning activity under (1) and (2) must:
  - Only burn between the hours of 10am and 5pm, Monday to Saturday. *NOTE: Burning on Sundays and Public Holidays is prohibited.*
  - · Create Piles 3m x 3m x 2m Maximum
  - · Notify your neighbours prior to the day of burn.
  - · Place materials to be burnt in a position that allows for a four-metre clearance around and over the fire.
  - Ensure all piles to be burnt are not in close proximity to other flammable materials including grass and logs.
  - Burn one pile at a time, to ensure that you retain control of each burn.
  - · Have appropriate working fire control equipment on standby.
  - · Extinguish the fire immediately if smoke or odour is causing a nuisance on another person's property.
  - Stay within the direct vicinity of the immediate burn site if smoke or smoulder is coming off of the burn.
  - On the completion of the burn, ensure the fire is completely extinguished.

You must not: Burn materials mixed into soil or permapine treated with copper arsenate, household rubbish, plastic or rubber.

- 4. This notice remains in force until 31 October 2019.
- 5. Individual permits will be considered on a case by case basis in November 2019.

#### **Notes**

This burning permit does not authorise the burning of a prohibited substance (Clauses (6)(3)(d) and (7) (1) of the Environment Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016. The fact that a person has complied with the conditions of the burning permit does not:

a. relieve the person from liability for any loss, damage or harm caused by a fire lit under the authority of the burning permit; or

b. prevent proceedings for enforcement of the general environmental duty under section 25 of the Environment Protection Act 1993, or for any offence under the Act, in relation to the burning activity (clause 6(5) of the Environment Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016). This permit is subject to any ban, prohibition, restriction, or other requirement under the Fire and Emergency services Act 2005, the Native Vegetation Act 1991 or a prescribed act (clause 5(4) Environment Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016). 

#### Oh Deer, who has been eating my Paddocks?

Europeans who settled arid and semi-arid Australia in the late 1800s brought with them livestock grazing and land management practices that have proven in retrospect not to suit our semi-arid condition. Desertification in Australia has happened and continues to happen because of the use of landscapes without an appreciation and understanding of the relationship between vegetation and soils and the effects of physical and environmental pressures imposed on them.



Grazing pressures from both kept stock and uncontrolled feral and native animals, all contribute to the widespread issues we have all experienced this year. If you feel like you are drowning in dust and you have noticed that your

paddocks tend not to recover like they used to, then join us in an information evening to learn about some simple grazing control practices that can help stem land degradation. Listen to land and grazing management experts offer a grassroots approach to the use of effective techniques for rehabilitating landscapes.
