

PLAYFORD COUNCIL - LOCAL COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

I hope this edition of the Grapevine finds everyone well as we launch into the new financial year.

2024/2025 Rate Rebates: Primary Producers in the spotlight?

I voted against the Rate rebates being held in a confidential setting at the Strategic & Services Committee Meeting on the 14th May 2024 and at the Ordinary Council meeting on the 28th May 2024. If there are sectors of our community or individual organisations receiving rate rebates, as this affects all ratepayers, I believe the matter should be open and transparent. The rate rebates that are discretionary rebates, if they are long standing rebates to be removed, I believe the City of Playford should be open and transparent to the community in doing so.

It was a surprise as the City of Playford had discussed the Rate rebate policy in detail through many information sessions in the past, prior to changes being presented for decision. The proposed changes to remove the 10% Discretionary Rebate for Category 7 (primary production) where a notional value was applied by the Valuer General or had a fixed charge removed due to being a contiguous or single farming enterprise was unannounced until the agenda was received for the Strategic and Services Committee Meeting on the 14th May 2024.

In response to the above, Cr Rentoulis Moved and I seconded the motion that became Council Resolution 5875 on the 28th May 2024, at the Ordinary Council Meeting, which didn't segregate Primary Producers. Furthermore, Cr Rentoulis Moved and I seconded to release as much of the report as possible from In-Confidence so the rural communities can clearly understand the intentions of the City of Playford. A copy of the report and the resolution can be found on the City of Playford's internet page.

If you are a Primary Producer or receiving a Residential Rural Rebate in Playford, I'd like to hear from you and receive your feedback. This feedback will enable me to represent our community in coming Information Sessions and discussions.

McGilp Recreation Park update: The City of Playford Procurement Staff are in the closing stages of working through the final contract terms and conditions to award the contract. The City of Playford is commencing Stakeholder engagement to inform of the implementation and work collaboratively through the implementation issues in this early stage of delivery.

Community Meeting: Deer and Vermin Control

One Tree Hill General Store

13th July 2024 @ 10am

The agenda is to bring interested community members together to discuss ideas on how we can work collaboratively together to control the feral deer and reduce other pests that are damaging gardens, native vegetation and are collision risks to motorists. The discussion with the Hills and Fleurieu Landscape Board have been promising to date. The Landscape Officer was aware of the data entered into the Feral Scan App indicating the importance of the community recording activity and sightings. We are planning to have local and professional people in attendance who offer Vermin Control Services for residents to meet.

CFS INCIDENT REPORT JULY 2024

Feels like I am re-writing last month's article with out-of-control burn-offs featuring right up until the end of May. In fact, the number of burn-off calls across the state led the CFS to take the unusual step on the 28th of May of requesting people to refrain from burning off on the 28th and 29th of May as the high temperatures and north winds ahead of the forecast cool change combined to create summer-like fire conditions.

The first of these was on the 17th of May on the Gawler-One Tree Hill Road at Bibaringa fortunately this was only a small burn and was quickly brought under control. The Bulk Water Carrier (BWC) was called to Stanton Road Virginia around 1:30 pm on the 23rd of May to assist local crews with water, this incident was considerably bigger than the one the week before and took 8 appliances more than two and a half hours to control. While the BWC was still committed at Virginia, we received another call for one of our trucks to assist Barossa Valley crews at the Barossa Goldfields around 3:30 pm. The original call for this fire was for a grass fire but was upgraded to a structure fire shortly after when flames from the former burn-off threatened a shed containing cars. Only one other fire in the area during the reporting period and that was for a report of smoke at a property behind the Recreation Park on the morning of the 11th of June.

The déjà vu continued this month with Humbug Scrub Road the scene of two separate vehicle accidents, the first on the 20th of May with a car hitting a tree behind the Conservation Park and the second on the 25th with another car vs tree on the road up to the Park. Rounding out the vehicle accidents for the month was another car vs tree this time on Blacktop Road on the 3rd of June.



Winter is here ...

While the nights have been very cold for a while now, we have finally received some decent rainfalls and was amazing how quickly the green started showing through on the paddocks. Now that the immediate threat has finally past it's never too early to start thinking about the next fire season and what preparations need to be made. One of the things that you can think about doing now is trimming back the trees around the access roads onto and around your properties. The recommendation is for access roads to be between 4 and 5 metres wide with sufficient clearance for a truck to pass under any trees, again around 4 metres. Access in and out of properties and the space for trucks to turn around on tracks is a major consideration in the way we approach any fire situation.

A bit of advance notice that the One Tree Hill CFS will be hosting an Open Day, timed to coincide with the Market on the 7th of September between 9:00 am and 3:00 pm. Come and visit and inspect our equipment and the facilities at the fire shed, and a good time to ask any questions you may have. Put a note in your Calendar and we'll see you in September.

BIRDS IN MY BACKYARD

Heather mentioned the Eastern Spinebill in her "What's flowering in my garden?" last issue so I thought I should tell you a little about that bird.

The Eastern Spinebill (*Acanthorhynchus tenuirostris*) is a specialist honey eater, taking nectar from the flower, often while hovering similar to a hummingbird. The bill is long, slender and bent downward. This shape of the bill allows it to feed on bell shaped flowers. It also feeds on insects and spiders. The wing is about 54 to 74 mm long while the bill is 20 to 30 mm.

(Wing length is measured from carpal joint (front bulge) of the wing to the tip, not the wingspan which is across spread wings and includes width of body.)

It inhabits most of the east coast, from
Adelaide to Brisbane, with a few isolated
pockets further north.

Relatively common, it tends to stay at home, not migrate. Exceptions are those who leave the high, cold, country for warmer climes in winter and some prefer sunny Queensland, moving there for the winter.

The male has a black crown, which is missing in the female and juveniles. A black crescent down each side of the chest is clearly visible in all adults but absent from juveniles.

The bill is unmistakable. The Western Spinebill, found only in the South West corner of WA, is similar in bill and colours although smaller in all respects.





WHAT'S FLOWERING IN MY GARDEN

It's Winter and whilst I think that there are not many plants in flower a leisurely walk around the garden has revealed just how many plants are flowering. Many East Coast Banksias are in flower providing a splash of bright golden yellow flowering spikes all held against beautiful bright lime green foliage. Hakea invaginata with it's smallish cream to pink puff ball shaped flowers is providing much enjoyable nectar for the many birds that forage throughout the garden. Many Eucalyptus citriodora trees with the common name of Lemon Scented Gums have produced copious number of flowering buds and the Rainbow Lorikeets are having a wonderful time foraging high up in these trees. We have received some much needed rainfall finally but with more forecast very soon (at the time of writing) any drop of moisture from above will be gratefully received.

Many Correas have been slow to open their flowers this season but their buds have been plumped up by the recent rain and all will be a delight to enjoy soon. Correa pulchella Pixie Caps is quite a lovely plant to have in any garden as well as a good sized pot. This small evergreen

Correa will grow approximately 1m x 1m and bears many beautiful crisp white bell shaped flowers all held against dark green foliage. It is a very hardy and low maintenance plant that can be pruned to keep it in a more compact shape. Being a small rounded shaped plant, many birds enjoy the safe refuge space that this delightful Correa offers. It is not just the foliage which is attractive, it's the white bell shaped flowers with their bright yellow tipped stamens that attract the many small nectar loving birds which visit regularly. On warmer days, many insects can be seen visiting the flowers. Correa pulchella Pixie Caps grows well in sandy loamy soils in full sun to part shade either as a feature plant in a rockery /cottage garden bed or in a large pot. Correa pulchella Pixie Caps is one of the many stunning Correas available from all good nurseries and when in flower is just an absolute delight to admire and enjoy. Grow one or two or more and enjoy its dark green foliage and crisp white flowers.

Just beautiful.



MENTAL HEALTH

I have just finished reading a book – "The Courage to be Disliked" by Ichiro Kishimi and Fumitake Koga.

The book was written by a Japanese philosopher (with a passion for Psychology) in collaboration with a young academic. It is written in a conversational manner where he chats with a young person about how we live life. It is a little heavy, but I loved the simple approach to life that is advocated.

The key message was that people who live their life with happiness and confidence, do so because they;

- Have a strong sense of Self Acceptance
- Have Confidence in Others around them and view as their comrades
- Know their Contribution and Value to Others

I am finding that much of my counselling work is centered on coaching people in one, two or all of these areas. I thought you may find it interesting to hear a little more about what is meant by each of these points – allowing you to consider how you are travelling in these spaces.

Self Acceptance – people who are happier and more confident are pretty comfortable and accepting that they are who they are! These people may be aware of their challenges, traumas etc but they also know their strengths and accept themselves as a whole. These are people who are more content with who they are and not spending a lot of time comparing or expecting that life will be better when they are different!

Confidence in Others – this means that you might be a person who generally gets up each day with a feeling that people around you are "on your side"... people are your comrades not your enemies! This is about accepting others around you "are what they are" and that they have responsibility to communicate, look after themselves etc too and you don't need to step in and do their life tasks for them! Mmmmm.. this can be a tricky dynamic for a lot of people. It can also be the source of a lot of interpersonal conflict.

Contribution and Value to Others – people who are happier and more confident do know what value they offer to other people in their life, however they don't need constant pats on the back for this! Knowing that you offer something meaningful to society or others around you can be a real asset to your wellbeing. This contribution does not need to be fancy, but we are creatures that do crave interpersonal connection and worth. Knowing in your heart, the small contributions you make to a couple of other people, will set you up for greater happiness and confidence.

Pretty simple really... but I find that often 1, 2 or 3 of these areas can be the challenge when people are seeking to live their best live and be the best version of themselves. Take some time to think about your own happiness and confidence and maybe look at these 3 key areas – what can you focus more on and what is depleting your energy. Remember – when we spend too much time thinking about what we "can not" control – or trying to do "other people's tasks in life" we can feel dissatisfied, sad and overwhelmed.

The overall message from this book was clear...

"Happiness is a journey – not a destination". We can live with more intention if we do not think of life in a linear fashion, but, instead like a daily dance with the small things. Yes we can have goals etc...but if we are living life only to be happy "when we get to a destination - meet certain financial goals, go on a dream holiday" etc.. – then what happens if we don't get there!!? Did we miss our opportunity for happiness? Why not try setting up your journey as a dance – like a dot to dot of dancing with the small things on a daily basis... this way if something is to change tomorrow.. you did your dance with happiness yesterday!

KOALAS BUILT-IN RAINCOAT


Due to their thick and oily fur koalas are able to get rid of rain water rather quickly. They have two layers of fur, the outer being water resistant, which helps their skin to hardly ever get wet. Which is essential, as a koala's low body energy isn't really sufficient to resist the cold.






