One Tree Hill Councillor... Councillor's Report

As a result of the China trip the Department of State Development in conjunction with the Streton Centre and the City of Playford are giving businesses an opportunity to have a stall, meet, greet, and talk to a Chinese contingent of business leaders. If you believe you can expand, provide a service or product to China, phone Lilly at Council and get more information you may even be able to book a stall. All this is happening in September and at short notice, a lot of local businesses have already been contacted but some will as always be missed. If you don't ask you don't get and there's nothing to lose and everything to gain, several businesses could team together to have one stall.

In its wisdom Council decided to commence work on a new Open Space Strategy, a survey sheet was compiled which was in the Messenger, online, Facebook and Twitter (it appears media is the new town hall) and at selected Council Community Venues, and, if you were lucky enough find and fill in the survey between 9 August and 1 September you would have been in the running to win a \$50 prize, of course given the timing circumstances it was not possible to include the information in the Grapevine as I was not aware of it until 3 Aug, I guess One Tree Hill and surrounding areas miss out once again.

Council is showcasing its CBD successes being (a) the Sports Precinct: Bowling Centre The biggest shade structure for a bowls centre anywhere in Australia which is being constructed for the new Playford City Bowling Centre. All three synthetic lawns will be undercover making the facility one of the best of its kind nationally. (b) Eyre Sports Park Construction of the new community clubrooms is well underway. Oval irrigation, grass, cricket wicket and practice nets are now completed, as are the landscaping works including paths, trees and seating surrounding the oval. The new Eyre Boulevard connecting to Womma Rd has commenced. Planning for the second oval and senior soccer pitch is also underway. (c) CBD: Prince George Plaza, the Windsor Green Fountain is now erected on site. The installation is soon also to be a Channel 9 feature news story. New concrete continues to pour while set sections are being finished. With the catenary lighting poles in place, the cables are also going up. The Plaza opening featuring a spectacular light show and performance by the ASO is set for Friday 6 October this year. (d) The CBD: Multi-Deck Carpark, a tender process is now open seeking market interest in constructing the planned multi-deck carpark for the Playford CBD. The six-storey carpark, to be located on the corner of Main North Road and Philip Highway, will have capacity for up to 360 cars providing nearby parking for visitors to the Plaza, Shedley Theatre, the planned Ice Arena, Medical Hub and other CBD developments.

Council is auditing additional bins used by ratepayers without having paid for them, an estimated 400 such bins apparently exist and Council / NAWMA are keen to either get them out of service or have those benefiting from them pay. People with such bins will receive a warning followed by a sticker on the bin and if not paid for eventually the bins will be removed, so watch out for those stickers. More on PFAS Investigation in the next edition.

One Tree Hill CFS — Incident Report August 2017

The pattern of being a quiet winter continued throughout August with only a few callouts to vehicle accidents. The "scenic route" (Gawler-One Tree Hill Road) lived up to its name late on a Friday afternoon with drivers having an opportunity to slow down and take in a very picturesque sunset between Medlow and Kentish Roads. Unfortunately, the obstruction, caused by a van which had lost control and ended up on its side in the middle of the road was not so "scenic"



and could have easily ended in tragedy if there had been vehicles coming in the opposite direction at the time. Thanks go to the other drivers on the scene for safely directing traffic while waiting for emergency services to arrive. Remember, if you find yourself in that situation that your safety is the number one priority. In the other significant incident, crews were called out to clean up spilled oil on a dirt section of road at Hannaford Hump after a driver lost control and hit a tree.

What's that sound?

I was reminded recently of that feeling of uncertainty we all had when we first moved into the area and experienced the siren test for the first time. In this case, a youngster who was staying in the area became quite concerned about what it meant and whether they needed to evacuate. In general, apart from the test which occurs most Monday nights at 7:30, the sirens are not used except when there is an impending threat to the township or local area. By now, we should all have our Bushfire Plans in place and with summer coming, maybe it is a good time to discuss with the children what should happen when the siren goes off.

How do you find out what the emergency is? There are many methods including radio (891 ABC Adelaide), the CFS web site and alerts on smart phones. Work out which is the best method for you, remembering that major incidents may come with power outages. A timely reminder for people still using the old CFS FireApp on their smart phones that this has now been replaced by the more comprehensive AlertSA application with details available on the CFS web-site.

As reported in the last issue the AGM was held on the 7th of August and many people have stood up to take on new positions. Congratulations to all those people and many thanks to people who have served in positions over the last two years keeping our Brigade amongst the strongest in the State.





Recipes of the Month ... Father's Day Breakfast

Pancakes with Lemon and Sugar or Jam

An Easy Recipe the Kids will love to help you make

Ingredients:

- 2 eggs
- 1 3/4 cup milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla essence
- 2 cups self-raising flour
- 1/3 cup CSR Caster Sugar
- Butter, for frying, plus extra, to serve
- Lemon, sugar or jam to serve



Method

Whisk eggs, milk and vanilla together in a jug. Sift flour into a large bowl. Stir in caster sugar. Make a well in the centre. Add milk mixture. Whisk until just combined.

Heat a large non-stick frying pan over medium heat. Grease pan with butter. Using 1/4 cup mixture per pancake, cook pancakes for 2 minutes or until bubbles appear on surface. Turn and cook for a further 1-2 minutes or until cooked through. Transfer to a plate. Cover loosely with foil to keep warm. Repeat with remaining mixture, greasing pan with butter between batches.

Serve with lemon and sugar or jam.



Breakfast Sandwich with Fennel Herb Sausage Patties

Ingredients:


- 2 large tomatoes
- 3 large eggs
- 2 tbsp. milk
- Mayonnaise
- 2 tbsp. Butter
- Thick bread, toasted

Fennel herb Sausage Patties

- 300g mince pork (approx.)
- 1 garlic clove, chopped
- 1 tbsp. chopped fresh parsley
- 1 tbsp chopped fresh chives
- ½ tsp fennel seeds, crushed
- Cooking spray

Method:

Fennel Herb Sausage Patties:



Form mixture into patties. Heat a large non-stick frying pan over medium-high heat, lightly grease. Cook patties until gold brown and cooked through (3-4 minutes per side).

Sandwiches:

Cut tomatoes in slices and cook in a non-stick frying pan over medium-high heat. Add eggs and milk into a jug and beat well. Tip mixture into a non-stick frying pan over medium-high heat and mix with spatula while cooking (scrambled eggs). Stir every 10-15 seconds for 3-4 minutes until cooked.

Spread mayonnaise on toast, top with eggs, tomatoes and Pattie.

All in all it was an extremely memorable weekend of celebrations...well and truly worthy of 150 years.






