You may have noticed we have made some changes to our Facebook accounts, the One Tree Hill Grapevine Facebook page is now One Tree Hill Progress Association this is now the official social media communication platform for the One Tree Hill Progress Association. The primary purpose is to enable the Progress Association to more effectively share information about its activities, meetings and community initiatives. We still encourage residents to connect through the One Tree Hill Community Facebook Page to stay connected local conversations and community happenings.

Residents from Precolumb Road attended out April Progress meeting to discuss safety concerns along the road. Many OTH residents use Precolumb Road for recreation activities (walking, running, riding) and want to feel safe to do so with their families. Some of the concerns raised are lack of space for pedestrians to move aside safely from a car, blind spots due to the nature of the road and current speed of 80km. A proposal has been put forth for a safety assessment on Precolumb Road. Please take a moment to complete the survey below.

Residents also raised concern for a proposed liquor licence for Craft Garage Brewing Co. located on Blen-

PLAYFORD COUNCIL - LOCAL COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Dear Ratepayers and Residents,

I hope this message finds you well and that the ANZAC rains have arrived and brought much-needed relief.

ANNUAL BUSINESS PLAN (ABP) & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

As I write this month's Grapevine report, I'm reviewing the agenda for the upcoming City of Playford Council Meeting on Tuesday, 22 April 2025. Item 15.1 includes the Draft 2025/26 Annual Business Plan and Budget (ABP), Long Term Financial Plan, and Strategic Asset Management Plan, which are expected to go to public consultation from Wednesday, 30 April to Tuesday, 27 May 2025. This will also include the Draft Rate Rebate Policy and Procedure for 2025/26.

I'll be at the One Tree Hill Market on 3 May to discuss the ABP and hear your thoughts. Please ensure formal feedback is submitted through the City of Playford's official channels.

The draft ABP proposes a 4.54% increase in rate revenue for 2025/26 to support new community projects, address inflationary cost pressures, and ensure long-term financial sustainability.

McGilp Recreation Park Update

Upgrades at McGilp Park are ahead of schedule. As a result, the renewal of the playground and the new pump track will now begin before the 2025/26 financial year, with completion forecast for August 2025.

OTH CEMETERY DRAINAGE WORK

City Operations have inspected the stormwater system via CCTV. Most of the infrastructure is in good condition, though one section was damaged by trenching and another blocked. Repairs are planned, with a new stormwater design to follow 2025/26. Once resolved, a heritage mason will be engaged to repair the wall, likely impacted by drainage issues. Landscaping plans will follow after all works are complete.

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY - PRECOLUMB ROAD

At the recent OTH Progress Meeting, concerns were raised about speed and pedestrian safety on Precolumb Road. The Progress Association is expected to seek community feedback before presenting a request to Council.

SPEED LIMIT ON BLACKTOP ROAD

I understand the OTH Progress Association has contacted Rhiannon Pearce MP to request her support in resolving the departmental decision that saw the entire 100km/h zone reduced to 80km/h on Blacktop Road. I'll be attend the next OTH Progress Meeting to hear discussions and updates.

ILLEGAL DUMPING AND ROADSIDE LITTER MANAGEMENT

Over the last few months I have been continuing discussions with the administration to address our roadside rubbish management. I'd like to see a lift in the presentation of our semi-rural community.




KOALA RESCUE NEWS - Bronwyn Wilton



HINDGUT FERMENTERS

- Microbes and fermentation are in the Koala's hindgut the caecum and proximal colon which breakdown the eucalyptus leaf contents
- Metabolic rate is half of that of a typical mammal
- Conserves water by passing relatively dry faecal pellets and therefore storing water in the caecum
- Eucalyptus leaf have a high protein content, low proportion of fibre, lignin and low in Carbohydrates
- Foods high in carbs (grass, fruit, grains) can cause bloat and abdominal pressure due to gases from the fermentation remaining immobile in the caecum
- Digest retention can last up to 100 200 hours due to extraordinary length of their caecum – 200 cm long and 10 cm diameter

CFS INCIDENT REPORT APRIL 2025





OTH CFS Brigade has experienced an eventful period, attending 11 incidents, including 5 grass fires, 2 vehicle accidents, 2 structure fires, one heavy rescue, and one tree down. The Brigade volunteers continued to display their devotion to duty, with several state and interstate deployments.

Grass fires occurred on the 15th (x3), and 19th (x2) of March. Grass fires occurred at Two Wells Rd, Buchfelde, High St, Gawler, Curtis Rd Munno Para, Torrens Vally Rd, Birdwood, and South Para Reservoir, Williamstown. Three of these grass fires were significant, with the station responding all trucks. What made these days particularly challenging were the extreme weather conditions on Total Fire ban (TFB) days. Para base was stood up on the TFB days, with members on active standby in preparation for the extreme conditions, considerably reducing response times.

Of the two structure fires, a substantial amount of damage occurred on 23rd of March on Kentish Rd, Uleybury. When crews arrived at the property, they discovered several vehicles, including a forklift well alight. Breathing apparatus fire-fighters got to work quickly, however the vehicles and

surrounding equipment were unable to be salvaged and were destroyed by the intense fire fuelled by vehicle fuels and drums of waste oil.





Two motor vehicle accidents (MVA) occurred on the 11th of April. The MVAs occurred on Blacktop Rd, One Tree Hill and Humbug Scrub Rd Yattalunga. Fortunately, there were no serious injuries at either of these accidents.

The brigade responded to a heavy rescue at the construction site at McGilp oval on the 17th of March. Crew members assisted MFS and SA ambulance personnel with a complicated extrication of a seriously injured worker.

A tree down incident was reported on the 15th of March near the corner of Uley and Chapman roads, Uleybury, crews made short work of the situation with minimal disturbance to traffic flow.

Brigade activities.

Work continues on the station entrance; we look forward to its completion and official opening ceremony. The newly installed standpipe has significantly improved volunteer safety when filling the trucks. The station recently received an upgrade to its security system, further improving security of and streamlining entry and exit to the station. March 22nd the 6th annual CFS Shield Soccer match between OTH and Tea Tree Gully Soccer clubs was held. All proceeds raised on the day were generously donated evenly to OTH and TTG CFS brigades. April 6th saw OTH 34 parked outside Adelaide Oval for the Emergency Services AFL game. The OTH crew along with CFS mascot Smokey, formed a guard of honour as the Adelaide Crows entered the stadium. The Brigade is looking for volunteer firefighters to bolster our membership. If this sounds like you, please contact the Duty member on 8280 7055 for more details. WHAT'S FLOWERING IN MY GARDEN

Heather Fischer, Humbug Scrub

What's flowering in my garden? Not much. It's that time of the year but after some much needed rain soon, Hakea Stockdale Sensation will burst into flower and show off many large puffballs of cream, pale pink and crimson. The buds are struggling to burst open but will as soon as we receive rain. My goodness, we are all witnessing the dramatic effect of the drought. I have never seen it so dry. The drought is the result of the lack of rain during the past 18 months or more. The lack of rain has resulted in such dry subsoil and topsoil and we can all see how much our local trees are now so stressed and dying. I do hope that that some will recover as we are not used to seeing a brown canopy of trees in our landscape. The ants have been very busy collecting seed that has been shed from many plants that have died and I 'm hoping that we may find new seedlings of trees and shrubs after the rains that will come.

The Autumn flowering Nerines have sent up their brightly coloured flowers and what a delight they are.

These extremely hardy bulbs range in colour from white to pale pink to mid pink with various shades of reds. Nerines are sometimes called the Guernsey Lily and are native to South Africa. The flowers appear as a cluster at the end of slender stems that can be up to 45cms high. These lily type flowers pop up before the leaves and can be left undisturbed for quite some time before needing to be divided. Nerine bulbs can be planted in pots using well draining potting mix that does not contain too much compost. Plant the bulbs so that the top of the bulb is just showing but if planted too deep the bulb may rot. Nerine bulbs come in packs and are available from nurseries and also, can be purchased from specialist bulb nurseries. These brightly coloured flowers are just so beautiful at the moment. I must plant more of these charming Autumn flowering bulbs.

BIRDS IN MY BACKYARD

Dromaius novaehollandiae. Well, that's a mouthful. Do you recognise the species? It's the common ol' emu. Dromaius comes from the Greek for runner, and the novaehollandiae indicates New Holland, you know, Australia. So that mouthful means Aussie runner. And of course we know it can run: "Run the pants off a kangaroo" even.

The emu is the only living member of its genus. The Cassowary and Ostrich are not related. It has a couple of other unique characteristics.

It cannot step backwards (it rotates quickly though). It is on our coat of arms, supposedly because it won't go backwards.

Its feathers are in pairs, with a single shaft per pair. If you find a "double feather" it is from an emu.

And it is the only bird to have won a war! Seriously, it is known as the Emu War. Back in 1932 wheat farmers in Western Australia wanted the numbers of emus reduced. The military were called in, using Lewis machine guns – and gave up. Although 986 emus were confirmed killed, they kept plundering the wheat crops. After all, approximately 20,000 moved in as part of their annual migration pattern. It is thought about another 2500 emus died of wounds.

A tall bird, about 1.5 to 1.9 metres tall, it weighs around 25 to 45 kg. When feathers are fresh (new) the neck is covered in dark feathers. As these age and fall out, the skin of the neck is revealed to be blue.

Pairs are monogamous, until the female lays a clutch. Then she wanders off and leaves the male to incubate the eggs and rear the young. She will often find another mate and lay another clutch. So any time you see striped youngsters and an adult, you may be certain it is the father who is caring for the chicks. The chicks are striped until about 3 months old, when they begin to get the adult plumage.



The feathers absorb the dirt the bird lays in. Hence it appears to have different colours depending on location. Locally, they tend to be grey but in the Red Centre, their plumage appears reddish brown.

Emus have vestigial wings. You can often see them hanging down from their sides. These wings seem to be used sometimes as aerofoils to assist in sharp turns when running, but that is my personal observation only. Their tail feathers are quite long and give the distinctive bounce to the walk.

Emus were hunted to extinction in Tasmania. Otherwise, they are very common throughout Australia except the Pilbara area of NW Western Australia.

Emus are mostly herbivores but also eat grubs, insects etc if they get the chance. And they eat anything: except Pumpkin and citrus fruits. While volunteering at Humbug Scrub Wildlife Sanctuary we tried to feed them pumpkin. They will grab a piece then actively spit it out!

Their long toes can be used as weapons but they are basically a placid bird if left alone. Mostly quiet, they have a deep drumming call which carries for some distance. If you are cornered by an emu, put a hand up well above your head (give yourself the appearance of a long neck) and sound a deep "boom boom" call. They will usually back off. I think it is the warning of the dominant female.







For dry vegetation burning

If you live in the City of Playford you are required to obtain a burning permit between the dates of 15 May 2025 and 31 October 2025.

Some areas are exempted from having to obtain an individual burning permit and are instead covered by a General Notice Burning Permit – per information below.

Burning Permits are issued to enforce the *Environment Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016* in accordance with clause 6.

This general notice burning permit is issued by the City of Playford and authorises any person within the following areas of the City of Playford (as defined in the City of Playford Development Plan pursuant to the Development Act 1993) that are within Metropolitan Adelaide (as defined in the Development Act 1993):

- a. The Watershed Zone (Mount Lofty Ranges);
- b. The Hills Face Zone;
- c. Primary Production Zone (Mount Lofty Ranges); to carry out any of the following burning activities in those areas, outside of the 2025/2026 fire danger season (fixed under the Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005) subject to the conditions set out below:

Conditions:

- 1. Burning off vegetation for fire prevention or control:
- This burning permit cannot authorise a person to carry out a burning activity under (1) on land if the person is not the owner occupier of the land or does not have the consent or authority of the owner or occupier.
- A person carrying out a burning activity under (1) and (2) must:
 - Only burn between the hours of 10am and 5pm, Monday to Saturday. NOTE: Burning on Sundays and Public Holidays is prohibited.
 - Create Piles 3m x 3m x 2m Maximum
 - · Notify your neighbours prior to the day of burn.
 - · Place materials to be burnt in a position that allows for a four-metre clearance around and over the fire.
 - Ensure all piles to be burnt are not in close proximity to other flammable materials including grass and logs.
 - · Burn one pile at a time, to ensure that you retain control of each burn.
 - Have appropriate working fire control equipment on standby.
 - Extinguish the fire immediately if smoke or odour is causing a nuisance on another person's property.
 - · Stay within the direct vicinity of the immediate burn site if smoke or smoulder is coming off of the burn.
 - On the completion of the burn, ensure the fire is completely extinguished.

You must not:

Burn materials mixed into soil or permapine treated with copper arsenate, household rubbish, plastic or rubber.

- 4. This notice remains in force until 31 October 2025.
- 5. Individual permits will be considered on a case by case basis in November 2025.

Notes

This burning permit does not authorise the burning of a prohibited substance (Clauses (6)(3)(d) and (7) (1) of the Environment Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016. The fact that a person has complied with the conditions of the burning permit does not:

- relieve the person from liability for any loss, damage or harm caused by a fire lit under the authority of the burning permit; or
- b. prevent proceedings for enforcement of the general environmental duty under section 25 of the Environment Protection Act 1993, or for any offence under the Act, in relation to the burning activity (clause 6(5) of the Environment Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016). This permit is subject to any ban, prohibition, restriction, or other requirement under the Fire and Emergency services Act 2005, the Native Vegetation Act 1991 or a prescribed act (clause 5(4) Environment Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016).
