

PLAYFORD COUNCIL - LOCAL COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

I hope this edition of the Grapevine finds everyone well and that the tanks are continuing to fill on the limited rainfall.

Political Influence in Local Government – Does it concern you? - Local Government is the closest tier of government to the community. Our decisions as Councillors must reflect the voice and needs of residents, not the interests of political parties. It is my firm belief that the community elects us to be **independent representatives**—not party-line voters.

I raise a serious and growing concern: I have overheard and witnessed conversations that suggest political influence at times is being exerted over decision-making within our Council. This includes elected members or party-affiliated employees being pressured to vote in line with political positions—potentially at odds with the community's expectations.

This is a risk as it compromises the democratic process by prioritising political agendas over the ratepayers, it creates a conflict of interest when party loyalty overrides public interest, and it further erodes transparency and public trust in council decision making.

I believe that all elected members and relevant staff should declare any political affiliations. The residents and ratepayers deserve full transparency to make informed voting decisions in future elections.

Furthermore, I highlight increasing **State Government influence** on council operations. Councils are being directed in matters of structure, policies, procedures, and document templates—reducing the autonomy of locally elected members. Additionally, **cost-shifting from state to local government** is placing more financial pressure on councils, effectively transferring costs from state taxes to **your council rates**.

This creeping centralisation diminishes our ability to act as the **independent voice of the community**, and I will continue to advocate for stronger local decision-making and less external interference.

Heavy Vehicle Traffic – Medlow Road and Craigmore Road -Thank you to residents who have contacted me with concerns about increased heavy vehicle activity on Medlow Road and Craigmore Road.

Upon enquiry, the City of Playford administration confirmed that there is one registered heavy vehicle permit for Medlow Road, issued from 26 February 2025 to 4 February 2028. The permit allows for up to 80 heavy vehicle movements during that period for earthmoving equipment.

However, it is important to clarify that General Access Vehicles do not require permits under current regulations. These include rigid trucks towing a trailer (up to 19m in total length), prime movers towing a semi-trailer (up to 19m), and approved combinations up to 20m in length.

The City of Playford is now considering installing traffic classifiers to accurately capture and quantify heavy vehicle movements on both Medlow Road and Craigmore Road along with meeting with the National Heavy Vehicle Regulator and SAPOL to discuss monitoring, enforcement and compliance strategies for this corridor. WHAT'S FLOWERING IN MY GARDEN - Heather Fischer, Humbug Scrub

There are not many plants in flower at this time of the year. After all, it is Winter. *Hakea Burrendong Beauty* usually flowers late March to early April but this year the many small flower buds are still struggling to open due to the drought of the past two years. Perhaps after a few more showers of rain these buds that clothe the narrow stems will burst open to create a wonderful mass display of cherry red rounded puff balls.

Hakea Stockdale Sensation was very slow to flower also but after some rain it is now finally showing off its most attractive cream and cherry red flowers. *Eucalyptus sideroxylon* is flowering and is providing nectar for the many birds that are foraging in the tree tops. Flower colour of this tall dark deeply furrowed trunked *Eucalypt* is very varied and ranges from cream to pale pink to a dark pinkish red.

Westringia fructosa Naringa is a most attractive *Westringia* hybrid that is covered in the most delightful mauve flowers is flowering at the moment. There are many extremely hardy *Westringia* plants available from all good nurseries and there are so many to select from.

Westringia fructosa Naringa will grow to 1m high and 60cm wide if pruned regularly to shape and it is an ideal variety to use if you wish to make a decorative hedge by

planting about 1m apart. Planted in a garden bed as a feature plant it will grow up to 2.2m tall and 1.5m wide. This very hardy fast growing variety is drought tolerant and will grow in well drained sandy to loamy soils as well as well drained clay soils.

Naringa has purplish brown stems that support dark green elongated leaves with a pointed end. Many four petalled mauve flowers grow all over the bush and are a magnet for the forever foraging New Holland Honeyeaters and Eastern Spinebills.

Many *Westringias*, because of their rounded shape are a safe have for small birds and many small birds will make their nests inside densely growing *Westringias*.

I think *Westringia fructosa Naringa* will be a perfect garden bush for the Blue Wrens to hide in and to nest in. I will just have to watch and see.

Westringia fructosa Naringa is an absolute beauty for its size, shape, colourful flowers and hardiness. Find one or more and enjoy throughout the year.

BIRDS IN MY BACKYARD - Julie Buttery, Humbug Scrub

Lorikeets. Bright colours, often noisy, seem to fill the trees when they are feeding. Our lorikeets are part of the family of parrots. Two in particular are found in large numbers in the area.

Rainbow Lorikeet (*Trichoglossus moluccanus*) is the noisy one. They inhabit the whole of the east coast, extending into South Australia as far as Port Augusta. They form large groups and can be belligerent when in large numbers. With their distinctive purple heads and green backs they should be easy to spot but are actually quite camouflaged in the treetops. Inhabiting different locations, their lookalikes the Coconut Lorikeet and the Red-collared Lorikeet can be differentiated by the colours of their collars.

They feed on nectar, pollen and fruits but also take insects.

They migrate to food sources, hence why they are more common in certain seasons.

Rainbow Lorikeets are among the larger lorikeets, being about 160mm in wing span and 150 grams in weight.

The Musk Lorikeet (*Glossopsitta concinna*) is a much smaller lorikeet. With a wing span of about 130mm and weight of 60 to 90 grams, it is about half the size of Rainbows.

The Musk Lori is much greener, with red cheek patches and crown, and a flash of yellow on the side of the breast. It may be mistaken for three other species but the others are rarer and with different red patches. They occupy the east coast strip from about Brisbane to Adelaide. Their call is higher pitched than the Rainbow lorikeet. They eat nectar, especially from eucalypts. They also eat lerps, the insects that breed on gum leaves.

If there is a large population of rainbow lorikeets you may also be able to spot a few musk lorikeets, usually hiding higher and quieter in the crown of the same trees.

I admit I am biased. I was originally excited to see Rainbow Lorikeets here but now prefer to find the Musk.



KOALA RESCUE NEWS - Bronwyn Wilton

FOXES AND SARCOPTIC MANGE

It is thought that foxes with mange may rub themselves against trees to alleviate the itching, and then a Koala may pick it up while climbing up or down a tree with mites present. A Koala may then be able to pass mange mites among other Koalas through their interactions.

Foxes that have mange can also so suffer as severely as the wombats and Koalas who have mange.

The fox is likely to have some resistance, but it is probably fox-health and mite-dose dependent (i.e., if you get exposed to a lot of mites, resistance won't matter).


The mites that come off foxes and fall onto the trunk of a tree or drop on to the soil and if it rains probably do not live long on the tree trunks, as dry and warm conditions are sub-optimal for survival when they are off the host. In some cases scabiei mite can live in the environment for 3 weeks without a host.

Each female mite lays around 30 eggs in their lifetime (~2 months), so it can add up if an animal has a lot of mites. Animals develop crusted mange (e.g., koalas and wombats) and can have thousands to millions of mites on them.

The first clinical signs of mange develop 1–3 weeks after exposure to the parasites; more chronic signs appear after 4–5 weeks. In severe cases, death of the Koala may occur because of secondary bacterial infection 2–3 months after infection.

The severity of infection may vary with initial doses of exposure as well as the condition and health status of the Koala.

The mite life cycle lasts about two weeks and heavy infestations can build up rapidly.



Recreation park upgrade welcomes community
