

#### PLAYFORD COUNCIL - LOCAL COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Dear Fellow Ratepayers and Residents,

ensure rural voices remain represented.

I hope this edition of the Grapevine finds you well.

Council Elections & Ward Changes - Recent State
Government reforms have capped councils at 13
elected members. For Playford this means 12
councillors plus the mayor, down from 16. From 2026,
Playford will shift to four wards (not five) with three
councillors each. Our ward will expand to cover all of
Craigmore, Blakeview, and part of Elizabeth Downs—
likely renamed from Ward 3 to Ward 4.
This means our hills community must vote strongly to

State Election 2026 – Why It Matters Locally - The State Election in March 2026 will decide 47 lower house seats and half of the upper house. Cost-of-living, housing, health services, and economic stability will be key issues. These directly affect local government because State decisions drive council costs, red tape, and rate increases.

**The Need for Reform** - Councils are often forced to absorb costs from State policy. For example, in our rural ward, removing a few roadside trees for safety required expensive environmental reports and levies—pushing up rates unnecessarily.

We need reform at both council and state levels: less red tape, fairer cost-sharing, and stronger local advocacy.

In Summary - The hills and rural community must stay engaged. Your vote—both in council and state elections—matters to ensure representation that understands our community.

Community Spirit - One Tree Hill is my hometown, where I grew up and have lived most of my life, now residing in Yattalunga. My family settled in One Tree Hill around the 1840s, and I was raised in the semi-rural community where everyone chipped in for the good of the district. Over the years, my family has contributed to sporting clubs, the One Tree Hill Progress Association, the Pony Club, and many other local initiatives.

I extend a heartfelt thank you to everyone who has helped make One Tree Hill and the surrounding hills such a fantastic place to grow up and live. In particular, the dedicated members of the OTH Progress Association who, despite being few in number, continue to represent and provide for our community. It has been wonderful to see some newer residents stepping up in recent years, adding fresh energy and ideas. We even have a resident from Hillbank attending meetings and giving valuable input on Blacktop Road.

I attend monthly meetings as a councillor and encourage anyone with time to come along, share a coffee, and join like-minded people who care about our community. Growing the Progress Association will help spread the load, increase diversity, and strengthen the community spirit that has always defined One Tree Hill.

On a personal note, I'd like to give special thanks to **Pat**, for her tireless and dedicated service as Hall Manager over many decades. Your contribution is deeply appreciated.

#### CFS REPORT – JUNE/JULY 2025

Unfortunately we missed publishing an article in the last Grapevine. Since the last report, the brigade responded to 15 incidents, listed below:

23/6 – 3 cars burning at a property in Yattalunga. Police investigating.

26/6 - Rubbish fire reported at Whitford Road, Elizabeth.

30/6 – Requested to respond to a house fire in Elizabeth however cancelled shortly after.

7/7 – Oil spill near Riggs road. While we were cleaning up the oil, another job came in for a vehicle accident in Humbug scrub, a car was found that had hit a tree, but occupants had already left the scene.

15/7 – Report of unattended burnoff on Blacktop road, as there was no risk to property, no action was taken.

17/7 – Vehicle reported as smoking, we found the engine had failed and fortunately it did not catch file, just a lot of oil smoke.

24/7 - Vehicle into tree.

25/7 – Tree on road, then shortly after – another tree on the road, then followed by a flooding job, due to heavy rain and blocked drainage.

6/8 – 2 vehicles collided head-on on Blacktop road near Cornishmans Hill Road. No major injuries.

8/8 – Brigade responded to assist with a helicopter landing for a possible patient transport, while responding to that a vehicle fire was also reported on Kersbrook Rd. Fortunately the helicopter landing was not required and all brigade appliances assisted with the vehicle fire, which was only some minor smoking of the vehicle.

12/8 – Tree on road. This incident was the first ever incident that Gawler SES (State Emergency Service) responded to. Gawler SES are a new SES unit. Previously it was mainly Salisbury SES that would respond to our area. SES respond alongside us for tree down incidents, having the extra help is great especially for larger trees. SES are the primary emergency service for storm related incidents. While the CFS does respond to trees on road, if you have a tree on your fence or house, then SES will respond, not us. They also have more specific equipment for flood damage, like portable pumps and lighting.

Other activities:

24/6 – One Tree Hill CFS visited Salisbury MFS for a joint training night, consisting of Breathing Apparatus (BA) training, relay pumping and Entry Control.

3/7 – A junior primary class from One Tree Hill visited the

station. They had a lot of fun learning about the trucks, and climbing all over them as well as squirting water and having a tour of the station. One of the kid's members Dad is a volunteer with us, she made sure that we all knew about it and that she had visited the station many times!

5/7 – Our cadets combined with Tea Tree Gully cadets on a Saturday morning for a practical session at one of our member's rural property. The cadets were able to learn about the way different fuels burn under controlled conditions, and get more practice extinguishing the fire and operating the pumps.

4/8 – This was our Annual General meeting, and was a voting year. Various positions are available in the brigade such as administration, finance, management committee, and leadership roles (Lieutenants/Senior Firefighters). Members are nominated for positions and if multiple people are nominated, the position holder is decided by vote. Our current Captain, Mike Hawkey will continue in the role for another 2 years, with some changes to other roles. Congratulations to all the new position holders. Being a position holder generally means some extra work, and meetings to attend, however there are also many other members who while not holding an official position, contribute over and above what is expected of them, so thank you! The brigade enjoyed an awesome meal cooked by our "Kitchen Krew" with options of curry or pasta.

The brigade is still looking for new members, recently we welcomed our newest firefighter, Emily to the brigade, who will shortly do her "Basic FireFighting Course" and be able to respond to incidents. We have room for more members, so if you are interested please contact the Duty phone on 82807055 for more information.

#### WHAT'S FLOWERING IN MY GARDEN

The daytime temperatures are starting to creep up on some days whilst on other days the Winter cold chills us to our bones. Spring is coming but I do hope that plentifull rains come during Spring as some dams are not overflowing. Pretty flowers can be seen on the Eucalyptus leucoxylon trees with colours ranging from a soft creamish yellow to a delightful pale pink with a hint of yellow. The Rainbow Lorikeets and all the Honeyeaters are enjoying the many bunches of nectar laden flowers on these trees. It's Wattle time with the local Wattle, Acacia pycnantha just coming into full bloom and creating a stunning scene of golden yellow flowers held against it's bright green leaves along our roadways and through our paddocks.

Acacia baileyana is flowering and it's many blossoms are a delight for the eyes. This large tree which originates from the Cootamundra area of New South Wales has been planted throughout the wetter areas of southern Australia on many house blocks, paddocks and parks. Unfortunately this Wattle is now classed as a weed in some areas and as a consequence of it's weed status needs to be closely monitored. Any unwanted escapee Cootamundra Wattles will be removed especially if the trees are adjacent to remnant native vegetation. The beauty of this wattle though is it's silver bipinnate foliage which is found along it's stems. Large bunches of golden yellow tiny balls of scented flowers clothe this majestic tree. When in flower this wattle is covered with many indigenous pollinators and Honey Bees. It can grow up to 5m high and 5m wide and live 10 years or longer. If the lower limbs are removed you have a living tree house for young children to climb into and have fun.

There are other varieties of Acacia baileyana that have purple leaves and sometimes available are prostrate forms of this beautifull Wattle. This tree produces copius amounts of very dark brown seed which is devoured by the brilliant red Eastern Rosellas and seed eating birds such as the Top Knot Pigeans and Bronzewing Pigeans. This stunning big tree is suitable for large blocks or parkland spaces and can be purchased from good nurseries. Prostrate varieties are suitable for rockeries, embankments and extra large pots. It is now 10 years since I lost my big Cootamundra Wattle to the Sampson Flat Bushfire but seed is still germinating. 2025 might be a good year for native seed germination; I'll just have to wait and see.

#### **BIRDS IN MY BACKYARD**

I have seen two species of cormorants, the Little Black and the Little Pied, in Humbug Scrub. They are close to the same size, the Black perhaps slightly larger maxing out at 1000 grams over the pied 830 grams.

grams.

Phalacrocorax sulcirostris, the
Little Black Cormorant, is easily
distinguished from the pied



by...the colour. Yes. The Little Black is all black possibly with a few short white plumes close to the ear in a breeding adult. The much larger Great Cormorant is also black but has a white face.

It is found all over Australia but always needs a water pool to hunt. Little Black cormorants sometimes hunt cooperatively, surrounding fish and holding the school while each bird has a chance to hunt. My photo shows one with a yabby – and what a meal it was, taking several gulps to get down.



Microcarbo melanoleucos the Little Pied Cormorant is not the same genus but is still in the same family. It is pied (black and white) by having a white throat and belly with black back and wings. It can take off at a

much steeper angle than most water birds, hence is able to utilise ponds with closer trees. It also forages in shallower

water than other cormorants. It is much more likely to be a solitary hunter than the Little Black.

Cormorants are unusual in water birds in that their plumage does not repel water like the plumage of ducks. This means they can dive more easily and to greater depths. The catch is that they the need to dry their feathers. Hence the classic pose with their wings held out, as my father used to say "hanging the washing out". They also need somewhere close to be able to perch while they dry their "washing". They float and swim quite low in the water.

This stealthy flatulence is rarely documented but observed in captive environments.





#### **ULEYBURY NATIVE WILDLIFE SANCTUARY**— Liane & Brent

Have you ever driven down Medlow Road and wondered what's behind those big fences and gates just before the final hill? Well, that's us — and this is our story.

It all started with two grumpy veterans (myself included) who had retired and were simply chasing a quiet, peaceful life. What began as rescuing and hand-raising orphaned kangaroo joeys soon grew into something much bigger — we established *Kangaroo Rescue South Australia*, a not-for-profit, taxdeductible charity.

After relocating to our property in Uleybury, we noticed something was missing. There was a noticeable absence of native wildlife, and the land had been stripped of much of its natural vegetation. So, we got to work — not just to give our kangaroos a safe place to thrive, but to build a true sanctuary for a whole range of native animals: Southern Brown Bandicoots, Brush-tail Bettongs, Long-nosed Potoroos, Fat-tailed Dunnarts, Tammar Wallabies, and Ring-tailed Possums.

But it didn't stop there.

Our mission grew into something even greater — restoring the land itself. We've planted over 11,000 native trees, shrubs, and grasses to bring the habitat back to life. This revegetation work is crucial, not only for the animals we care for, but for the pollinators, insects, and the overall

biodiversity of our region. Every plant we put in the ground helps rebuild a functioning ecosystem within the safety of our feral-proof fence, so our rehabilitated wildlife can live as close to their natural environment as possible.

We also love sharing this work with others. Through our **sunset tours**, which you can book on our website at <a href="www.kangaroorescue.com.au">www.kangaroorescue.com.au</a>, visitors can walk among our hand-raised kangaroos, see native wildlife up close, and learn firsthand why conservation and revegetation matter.

Uleybury Native Wildlife Sanctuary has become more than just a quiet retirement project — it's a beacon of hope. A place where people, animals, and the environment are all given a chance to thrive together. Whether you're an animal lover, an environmental advocate, or simply someone seeking peace in nature, we welcome you to share in this journey with us.






Testament to our recent drought conditions was our morning tea site in the bed of the dried out large dam, covered in newly sprouted Eucalypt seedlings.

#### Weed Watch - Help Stop the Spread

**Green Adelaide** is raising awareness of invasive weeds that thrive with winter rains and should be controlled early to prevent spring seed set.

#### O Declared Weeds to Watch & Control

#### 1. Cape Tulip (Moraea flaccida & Moraea miniata)

o **Type**: Toxic bulb weed

o Features: 1–3 strappy leaves, salmon-pink/orange flowers, up to 60 cm tall

o **Impact**: Displaces native plants, toxic to stock, spreads in pastures

o **Control**: Early intervention before spring flowering

#### 2. Coolatai Grass (Hyparrhenia hirta)

o **Type**: Dense tussock grass

o Features: Up to 1 m tall, grey-green leaves, V-shaped silky flower spikes

o **Impact**: Forms monocultures, hard to control in gullies, notifiable weed

o **Note**: Can resemble kangaroo grass—confirm ID before control

#### 3. Gazania (Gazania spp.)

Type: Escaped garden plant

Features: Bright yellow/orange flowers, clumping growth

 Impact: Spreads along roadsides, excludes native plants, herbicide resistance possible

o **Control**: Contain to gardens, avoid roadside spread

#### 4. Wild Artichoke (Cynara cardunculus)

o **Type**: Spiny perennial weed

o **Features**: Up to 1.5 m tall, large taproot, dense prickly growth

Impact: Smothers pasture, injures stock and people

o Control: Ongoing efforts have reduced its spread—keep up the momentum

#### **☑** Weed Control Tips

- Choose control methods suited to your site (pasture vs. native vegetation).
- Always read herbicide labels and confirm plant ID.
- Use iNaturalist to help with identification. <a href="https://www.inaturalist.org/">https://www.inaturalist.org/</a>


