Incident Report

Last month we attended a road accident on Black Top Road, just outside the western boundary of the township. Some injuries were sustained by occupants. The roadway took a while to be cleared and opened.

We assisted with a building fire at Ridgehaven, luckily, the Bulk Water carrier attended because it helped supply urgently needed water.

A reported chimney fire on the Gawler Scenic Route did not escalate and was controlled.

We had two callouts with trees falling down after strong winds again, we were called in to help with the extra workload. One site the "Phantom Tree" was not found, the latter tree down on Bassnet Road took nearly 3 hours to make the area accessible.

The Brigade has begun the pre-season training with "back to basics" leading up to the fire season.

Residents need to start planning for the approaching Fire Season. Have roof gutters been cleaned of debris, do you have a Fire Plan? What will you do in the event of a fire?

Local teenager Brianna Duncan-Coward has just returned from the United Kingdom after the trip of a life time where she was one of six riders selected throughout the country to represent Australia.

Riders were selected by a panel on previous achievements along with other requirements. Brianna has produced a number of different show horses and ponies to success at State and National level holding a number of accolades. She is also one of the States most consistent top placed riders in her rider class. This has been achieved because she has educated herself and her horses to carry her to much of her successes over the years. Recently she has been riding "Yorke" a track thoroughbred with whom she has done extremely well.

During her recent trip to the UK Brianna stayed for over three weeks with lots of sightseeing done around London, two days at the Royal Welsh Show, a week stay with a host family being the well renowned Julie Templeton Stables where she then kindly lent Brianna a horse to compete on. A week was also spent at the Royal International Horse Show, then it was off to Malvern where the Australian team got to compete over three days at the National Pony Society Summer Championships in the International Challenge.

The trip was organised through the Riding Pony Stud Book Society along with UK and New Zealand clubs. They all competed together at an International team challenge which included judging, dressage, led and ridden classes. New Zealand won the team challenge and Australia placed well in every class. It was an amazing opportunity and experience with a great team spirit held between the six girls.

Whilst away Brianna was interested in the opportunity to stay on in the UK to gain more experience in working in show stables until the end of 2016 but she ended up landing herself a new job working and riding for one of Australia's top show horse stables in Queensland.

Brianna was home for less than a week to get everything organised and then flew out for her next adventure where she will be able to continue with her passion of working and riding show horses at an elite level.

Brianna has spent most of her life in One Tree Hill and her nanna Helen Duncan has lived here for over 30 years.

After completing year 12 last year Brianna is pursuing her dream of horse riding.

Aluminium Foil



Do you know what Aluminum Foil does to your body?
After reading this you'll never stop using it!

Did you know that aluminum foil has many other uses than the ones in the kitchen, such as effective treatment of rheumatic pain and burns. It is interesting that Chinese and Russian natural healers commonly use aluminum foil in their healing practices. According to many alternative doctors as well as the results of some medical research, aluminum foil can be a great substitute for harmful and expensive drugs.

Many studies have confirmed that aluminum foil is extremely beneficial in the treatment of: muscular pain, back, neck, arm, leg and joint pain, burns, effects of inflammatory processes.

ALUMINIUM FOIL WRAPS AGAINST MUSCLE AND JOINT PAIN

Note: You can use this method to relieve neck, back, arms, legs and joint pain as well as using it to treat sciatica, rheumatoid arthritis, and heel pain.

Method: Firstly you need to wrap the painful area with aluminum foil, after wrapping you will need to secure the wrap with a bandage or perhaps just a band-aid or scotch tape. Leave it on overnight. Make sure to repeat this treatment for

10– 12 days and then take a one week break. Don't forget, if you still feel any type of pain, you should repeat this treatment.



ALUMINIUM FOIL FOR BURNS

Aluminum foil is able to ease the pain caused by burns which are the result of fire, hot water, oil, steam and other liquids.

Method: Expose your burn under cold running water for a few minutes. If the skin is not broken, you can dry it with some soft, clean towel. If the skin is damaged, you will need to absorb the water from the wound with the help of a sterile gauze swab. Smear a thin layer of ointment over the area, but make sure that you have dried the wound well, in order to prevent the gauze from sticking to the wound. If the burn is not open you should put aluminum foil over it. But if the wound is open put gauze onto it first and then apply the foil and fasten with tape or a bandage to keep the foil in place. Don't remove the foil until the pain is reduced.

FLU AND COLD TREATMENT

Some people want to avoid antibiotics when they have a cold, so aluminum is the right solution in fighting infections. A foil treatment can help you get over a strong cold in just a couple of days the completely safe and natural way.

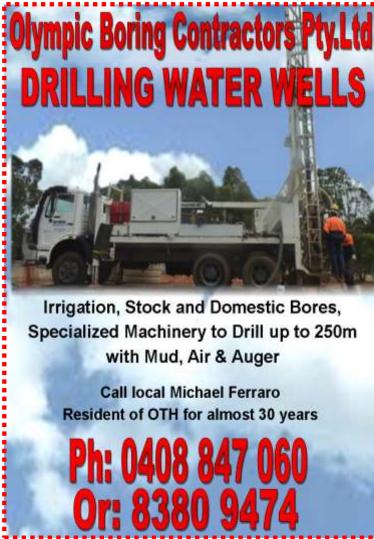
Method: Wrap you feet with 5 to 7 layers of foil putting a paper towel between the layers. Leave it on for one hour. Repeat the procedure 2 hours later using new foil. Again leave it for one hour. Repeat the same procedure after another 2 hour break. Continue this treatment for seven days.

Which Side to Use

Both sides of the aluminum foil are used, just in different ways. For warming and keeping the heat in the body part you are treating, use the shiny side directly to the skin. In the treatment for cooling and heat protection use the matte side down. Many health practitioners believe that both sides of the aluminum foil are just as efficient.

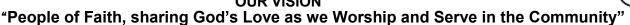
These suggestions do not replace getting a medical opinion in the first instance if burns etc. are serious. Continue to consult your Doctor if symptoms persist.

It's that time of the year again when we get all the jobs done around the house that we may have been putting off.

There are few rites of Spring more satisfying than the annual clean. For many people, however, the pleasure only comes after the work is finished. Your spring cleaning may never become effortless, but you can make the project more manageable - even enjoyable!

This checklist offers an overview of everything you need to know so you can zip through the process and arrive at the happy end.

After reading these tips and techniques, tailor the list to your home and yard. Create a realistic schedule, keeping in mind that a single weekend won't suffice, as you'll need several days for more involved projects, such as shampooing carpets and organising wardrobes etc. Whether you prefer to proceed from the outside or inside try to focus on one task at a time and be sure to enlist the help of family members.

Throughout the House: The tips below outline basic techniques that will help you clean almost every surface (or object) in any room. The tasks further in the article are broken down by location, including outdoor spaces.

Wipe down all walls and ceilings using a vacuum to remove dust first. Tackle any grime, especially in kitchens, with a solvent free degreaser.

Clean grouting to your tiles on the floor and walls with a toothbrush dipped in carb soda. Because the grout is cement based it is extremely porous and stains easily, it may be a good idea to apply a grout sealer once you have the grout clean.

Vacuum and shampoo carpets and rugs - Synthetic carpets and rugs with waterproof backings can be deep-cleaned with a rotary shampoo machine and hot-water extraction machine. Rugs without backings, including Orientals, require professional cleaning.

Dust books and shelves - Take everything off the shelves and brush shelves and books with a feather duster. Use the dust brush or crevice tool on a vacuum to reach tight spots. Wipe the spines of leather-bound books with a clean, soft cloth.

Clean upholstered furnishings - Take cushions from your lounge outside and gently beat them by hand to remove dust. If there are stains, check the pieces for care labels. Use a vacuum's upholstery and crevice tool to clean under seat cushions.



Polish metal door and window hardware with a liquid polish, if tarnish doesn't come off try a stronger product.

Wax wooden furniture - wipe furniture over with a soft cloth dampened with water and mild dishwashing liquid before applying the wax, buff with a clean cloth.

Ensure fire safety - Change batteries to smoke detectors and make sure the units are free of dust. Make sure that you review your escape plans in case of fire.

Wash window screens - Using warm water and a mild dishwashing liquid, scrub each screen with a brush and rinse thoroughly, let them dry off completely before fitting them back in place.

Clean window treatments - Check the labels on your curtains to see if they are machine washable. If they aren't you'll have to get them dry-cleaned. Wipe wooden blinds with a damp cloth, warm water with mild dishwashing detergent is safe for both metal and vinyl blinds.

Outside jobs to do include getting rid of cobwebs from your eaves and patio or pergola. Purchase a long handled cobweb remover and you'll be amazed at how easy it is.

Remember to give your clothesline a wash in mild detergent and warm water.

Garden pots tend to gather a lot of dirt and cobwebs throughout the year and because we don't tend to spend as much time outside in the winter they build up. Give your pots a gentle scrub with warm soapy water to give them an almost new look. You could always freshen them up with a fresh coat of paint once they are washed and dried if they don't clean up very well.

There is nothing like finishing off your jobs with a good cuppa, now you can sit back and admire all of your hard work.

Update on Olive Oil and some of the Benefits

Quality Olive Oil Matters

It's been quite a while since we did the article about olive oil, this is a revised article with updates and will make interesting reading for those who missed it last time.

The health benefits of olive oil are unrivalled, and research reveals more benefits nearly every day. In fact, we are only just beginning to understand how healthy olive oil is for us. Olive oil is one of the few widely used culinary oils that has approximately 75% of its fat in the form of oleic acid (a monounsaturated, omega-9-fatty acid). The terms "Pure", "Light" and "Pomace" that you might see on some labels are marketing terms and are not necessarily indicative of high quality or additional health benefits.

Olive Oil Health Benefits

- Heart-healthy fat: Olive oil belongs to a category of fats called monounsaturated fats. These have been proven to keep your arteries healthy, even as you and your heart age.
- Prevent strokes: Scientists have discovered that olive oil alone helps fight against osteoporosis. This is especially important for menopausal and post-menopausal women who have the greatest risk of losing bone density. That's why women in their 40s and 50s should start cooking with olive oil (if they are not already), to help prevent bone loss when their hormones change.
- ♦ Reduce risk of diabetes: Eating lots of olive oil is better at preventing diabetes than a low fat diet! How? Olive oil can help control blood sugar levels and reduce insulin resistance.
- Promote mental health: A high consumption of olive oil is associated with a lower risk of depression. (This isn't the only example of how your diet directly affects mental health).

But what if the oil you bought wasn't giving you all of these amazing health benefits? What if you thought you were cooking with olive oil, but you were filling your body with something else entirely?

Fake Olive Oil?

If you think you know better, you might be surprised that 70% of olive oils sold are actually not pure (and that includes oils

labelled "extra virgin")! Instead, most olive oils that are sold have been either mixed with canola or colza oil, or are blended with a cruder version of olive oil and then chemically coloured and flavoured.

How To Spot the Difference

The Taste Test: There are a couple of at home tests some people suggest for finding out if your olive oil is real. One of them involves simply tasting it. The problem is, fake olive oil has been sold so long, that even food experts can't tell the difference anymore.

One experiment was done with several different food experts. They tasted a wide range of olive oils (from discount stores to premium versions), and ended up approving one of the cheapest, least pure oils, while thinking the real ones were fake! If experts in olive oil can't use the sense of taste as a reliable tool for finding real olive oil, no one can.

The Fridge Test

Another suggestion some people make is to put olive oil in the fridge. This is because monounsaturated fats become cloudy in cold temperatures (even to the point of becoming solid, after a long time). So, if your oil looks exactly the same after being refrigerated for 2 hours, it's not real!

The problem is, olive oils that have been mixed with non-pure olive oil will still appear cloudy. Not to mention, some companies mix just enough of canola oil to pass this cold test. Ultimately, it's just not good enough to weed out most shop bought versions.

The Fool-Proof Test

But, the main problem with these at home tests, is that they have to be done at home! You have to buy them first before finding out if they are the real deal. So what's the only way to tell if you oil is real? Buy it from the right place.

You can purchase 100% pure olive oil, not mixed with anything else, from a trusted, local provider. There are several in the One Tree Hill area who resist the urge to make a quick sale of their product.

More Olive Oil Tips

If you don't have direct access to locally produced olive oil, here is what you will need to look out for when buying at the shops.

- Dark bottles keep oil from oxidizing, so avoid transparent containers, especially plastic.
- Look for a seal of approval from The International Olive Oil Council.
- ♦ Avoid "light" olive oil completely.
- Try to find a harvesting date on the bottle (most fake oils won't include this).
- Only buy cold-pressed olive oil (others are treated with chemicals and heat).

From The Past - Assorted Clippings From The Early Days

ONE TREE HILL CLUB - AUGUST 18, 1896

The annual meeting of the local cricket club was held at One Tree Hill on Friday evening, August 14th. The meeting was not largely attended and one or two innovations were duly sanctioned.

Mr. F.L. Ifould occupied the chair. The secretary (Mr. Geo Bowman) in presenting the yearly report congratulated the club upon the distinction it had achieved in winning the premiership of the Gawler Association for the first time after a creditable record as "runner-up". The treasurer's (Mr. Rudolph Fiebeg) financial statement which showed a credit balance of £5 4s 2d elicited laudatory comment, and was unanimously adopted.

The officers for the ensuing season were elected as follows: - President, Mr. E. L. Ifould; vice-presidents, Messrs F. Barritt, R. Patterson, T. Williams, F. and A. Thomas, W. Kelly, A. Kelly, J. S. Harvey, J. H. Elliker, and R. Loftes; Captain, Mr. Hermann Bischof; vice-captain Mr. F. L. Ifould; Secretary, Mr. Geo Bowman; Treasurer, Mr. R. Fiebeg; Delegates to the Association, Messrs G. Bowman, Bischof, and Ifould; Match Committee, Messrs G. Bowman, Ifould, and Loftes.

The retiring officers were heartily thanked for their services, and Messrs Bowman and Fiebeg suitably replied. A trophy to the be awarded by Mr. H. Bischof to the member of the club who is pronounced by his copeers the most deserving fieldsman was voted to Mr. Geo Bowman after a tie with Messrs F. Ifould and Bowman.

The last business the meeting had to dispose of was the historic dinner in connection with the club. The annual fete has had peculiar local interest, and cricket alone was erat- while enshrined by our forbears at the foot of the old gum tree contiguous to the cricket ground with an enthusiasm in keeping with the popularity and importance of the great national pastime. Subsequently the venue of demonstration has been placed to suit the convenience of the locality. It was decided that the festival this year should take place on the Friday next before full moon in October, when no doubt the traditions of the old Munno Para East cricket club will be revived.

Country News - Friday September, 1922

The scholars of the Precolumb school gave an entertainment in the Institute Hall on September 9th to raise funds for improvements to the school library.

Older children provided a table of fancy work which they had worked in their spare time, and parents and friends gave gifts of produce, etc.

All these goods were sold during the evening. In the concert in addition to choruses rendered by Joyce and Lilly Groth, Dorothy Dawson, Roma Fieby, Ada Harvey, Doris Dyer, and Charlie Charlson. Miss Fieby played for the children, and Mr. J. H. Groth, the chairman of the School Committee, presided.

The teacher, Miss J. M. Smith, and the members of the School Committee are well satisfied with the effort which brought in £16.

£21 From One Tree Hill Ball - Friday 23rd, September, 1949

A ball at One Tree Hill on 7th September raised £21 for the Back to Gawler fund.

Accompanied by his daughter, Mrs. Winter, the Mayor of Gawler (Mr. Louis Ey) addressed the gathering and referred to purposes of the fund.

Judges Mr and Mrs. O. McGilp and Mr and Mrs. H. Hallett, of Adelaide, chose Miss Mary Jeffs "Belle of the Ball". She received a silver cake dish from Mr. Hallett.

Visitors were present from Adelaide, Tea Tree Gully, Reeves Plains, and the Gawler district.

A delightful home-made supper was served.

Second Birthday - Friday July 24th, 1942

The One Tree Hill unit of the F.F.C.F. celebrated its second birthday on Thursday, July 16th when the meeting took the form of a social occasion.

Items were given by Mrs. Tamblyn, Misses Tamblyn, Chinner, and Maczkowiack with Miss Walter at the piano.

Afternoon tea was provided by the members. Mrs. Ifould, President, presented a birthday cake with two candles and this was cut, each member receiving a portion.

Election of officers for the ensuing year - Mrs. Ifould was unanimously re-elected President; Mrs. H. J. Hender, Secretary and Treasurer. Mrs. Chinner, who previously held of the office of treasurer, asked to be relived for the ensuing year.

During its two years work for the Fund, the unit has raised £369 13/6 and has forwarded to Headquarters garments as follows socks 278 pairs, pullovers 115, scarves 56, balaclavas 48, mittens 133 pairs, handkerchiefs 2,253, dilly bags 18, face washers 367, sea boots 3 pairs, stockings 26 pairs.

81 lbs. wool has been received from Headquarters and 198 yards of material for handkerchiefs and face washers.

Several members received letters from soldiers thanking the makers of articles forwarded to them from the Comforts Fund.

Country News - September 12th 1919

A very jolly social was held in the One Tree Hill Institute on Friday evening, September 5, to welcome all the local soldiers, who except the four who gave their lives, are all safely back, but two, who are on furlough in the Mother country.

The hall was packed, and though a happy time was spent, the audience, at the instance of the Chairman (Mr. G. Bowman) stood for a few moments with bowed heads as a tribute of respect to the fallen heroes.

The following spoke words of welcome, The Chairman, Mr. H. H. Blackham, Mr. Ifould, and Rev. R. Broadbent, while Dr. E. H. Lewis and Messrs. V. Bellchambers and J. T. Chinner responded for the soldiers, who each received a gold medal.

Nurse Shillabeer a gold Maltese Cross as an appreciation from the residents. Mrs. P. Ifould, Misses Blake, Smith, and Howell, and Messrs. Harry Parkes and Pomeroy gave some excellent musical and elocutionary items, and the local ladies eclipsed themselves in providing dainties of all kinds for supper. Mrs. E. A. Kelly and Miss Harvey, deserve praise for their work in decorating the hall, which has never looked better.

After supper followed the inevitable dance for which Miss. D. Ormsby provided excellent music.

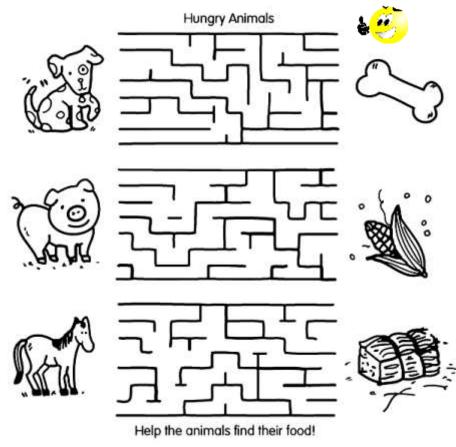
Hello, isn't it wonderful to see so much sunshine? The nights are still a bit chilly but it's perfect sleeping weather.

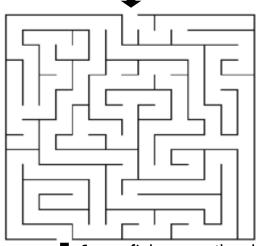

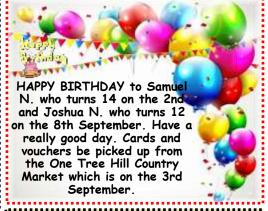

Horse Care - ROLLKUR

If you have been watching the Olympics you may have come across the term rollkur. What is it? Why are some people unhappy with its use? I have no experience of rollkur but here are some thoughts.

Rollkur, as practised today, is the hyperflexion of the horse's neck to the point of him touching his chest with his chin. While this is a common occurrence to chew away an irritating insect, it is not maintained for any length of time.

It was introduced as a training aid to encourage the horse to flex his neck into the "correct" dressage position. A horse that is resisting the signal of the bit may need to be pulled firmly into this posture – for about 2 seconds. This may remind him to give or soften to the bit. It also grew out of the idea of "long and low", being a reaching and stretching movement where the horse reaches down toward the ground. But they have been combined into the rollkur movement.

Some people see the shape the dressage horse has and thinks it is the same as the rollkur. It is not. In true dressage frame, the horse carries his head there because he is balanced and it becomes the natural place to put it. In rollkur it is held there by the bit and reins. The true test is to release the hold on the reins and see if the horse continues in the same position.

Rollkur causes massive strain on the ligament that holds the head up, stretching it beyond comfort. It triggers calcification of the joint where the head meets the neck (the atlas). It restricts breathing by closing the gullet and prevents swallowing (this is why horses in rollkur are slobbering).

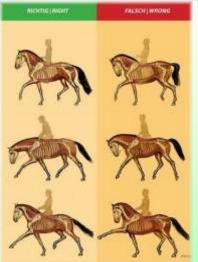

Nutrient Licks for Goats



Like other species, goats need a variety of nutrients. While they are free to roam large areas, they will find all they need. But confining them and bringing feed to them often means they miss out. Farmed feeds are frequently short on some minerals or vitamins and we need to supply them in another form.

This is where the nutrient or salt lick comes into good feeding. Most licks are based on common salt, but they have a variety of different minerals added. When selecting licks, it is best if we provide a selection of different ones. For goats, I like Ranvet's general lick (it contains copper and cobalt, two things that are missing from this area). Provide Olsson's Go-block (specially designed for goats) as well and you will have most of the minerals provided. These come in 2kg blocks, which are convenient for small numbers. If you happen to have large herds, I suggest you look at the 20kg ones as they are more economical, but do deteriorate over time.

The two 2kg blocks should last a couple of goats for 3 to 6 months. If they don't the goats were short of something and really needed them. The blocks can be hung on a sheltered wall (special mounts are available) or dropped into the feed bin.

I prefer to mount them as they will often flick them out of bins and then spoil them. Remember, the goat does not eat anything with faeces or urine on it.

Is it worth it? I know milk production goes up when the goats get their blocks. I have heard the quality of fleece also improves when the goats have free access to nutrient blocks.

Don't be misguided by the fact that you feed a "complete mix" as prepared by commercial manufacturers.

Unless you feed the amount they recommend, you will still be providing less nutrients than the goat needs. Very few of us actually feed the amount recommended as it would be expensive. Only those animals in high production will need the full recommended amount anyway.

Mistakes That Can Be Made With Natural Cleaning Products

From time to time we publish some home made cleansing products, while they really work well you should always be careful using them on some items.

Using non-toxic cleansers like lemon juice, bicarb soda and vinegar is much safer than using commercial cleaners, there are still a few things to keep in mind.

- 1: Don't scorch natural stone with lemon juice or vinegar. Lemon juice and white vinegar make great cleansers, but you can't use them on everything. Because they are both acids, they will damage natural stones like marble, limestone, onyx and travertine. These surfaces should only be cleaned with neutral cleansers like soap and water, or specialised cleaning products.
- 2: Don't go into essential oil based labour! While scented oils are a great way to make your home smell amazing, they do carry dangers. Peppermint oil, for example, should never be used around children under 6 it's been known to constrict their breathing. Similarly, if you are pregnant, jasmine and clary sage oils may trigger contractions, and sage and rose oils are known to cause uterine bleeding.

- 3: Don't inhale or splash onto skin. Just because a product is natural doesn't mean it can't hurt you (arsenic is natural, after all). Even non-toxic compounds can irritate your skin, eyes, and nasal passages, so be sure to clean in well-ventilated areas, and always wear gloves.
- 4: Don't use salt on carpets. Salt is often used on red wine spills, but beware; salt will actually help wine penetrate carpet fibres. Instead, use white towels to blot as much liquid as possible. Soda water is a stain lifting powerhouse due to its carbonation and its low PH profile. Pour the soda water over the stain until it disappears, then wash and dry as normal.
- 5: Don't get casual with ammonia. Ammonia is a powerful cleanser, but with great power comes great responsibility. When using it, ensure the area is well ventilated and always wear gloves, and even a face mask. Exposure can be irritating at best and corrosive at worst. And never (ever) mix

corrosive at worst. And never (ever) mix ammonia with bleach - the resulting gas can constrict breathing.

Uses For Drinking Straws

You can use straws for many unusual uses as well as for drinking from them.

- 1: Paint fun: Maybe you remember using straws to blow paint around in school, in case you have forgotten it's a lot of fun. Water based paint works best because it can be diluted with water to make a thin paint. Load a little in the straw and gently blow it to create a unique piece of art.
- 2: Flower holders: Fix droopy flowers by propping up the weak stems with thick straws. Alternatively, you can use straws as an extender to give your flowers new length in a tall vase. Clear or green straws work well for this.
- 3: Wire organisers/markers: In our digital age wire management is critical. Never unplug the wrong thing again by clearly labeling the device wires with a straw cut lengthways, then cut into small segments. Wrap these segments around wires and label them with markers.



4: Funnel Extender: Funnels are really handy tools, but the wide top doesn't always fit into tight spaces. Luckily most funnels have a tapered bottom that allows straws to be attached and extend the range of the funnel.

5: Straw Siphon (as a science exercise for kids): Joining two straws together can make a fun science experiment showing the action of a siphon. A siphon is an inverted "U" shape, which causes a liquid to flow upward above the surface of a reservoir, with no pump, but

To make a siphon, gently fold the end of one straw lengthwise and feed it inside the second straw, then roll the folded end with your fingers to undo the fold and create a seal between two straws. Mould, Fungus, Mildew!

Mould: Not all mould is bad - after all, it helps convert grapes to wine, milk curd to blue cheese and even contributed to medical breakthroughs like penicillin. But that's very cold comfort when this living organism has invaded clothes or ruined timber. Mould can grow on almost any surface at any time of the year and it's hard to destroy. It usually shows as black, brown or green spots, and this microscopic fungi can thrive in any damp, warm or humid environment. While mildew is technically a species of mould - you can't miss its strong odour! It grows most commonly as a fuzzy white build

-up in the bathroom. It clings to the grout between the tiles and it's a real headache. Mould and mildew not only affect houses, they can affect people too.

They release particles that can aggravate asthma and allergies and even cause headaches. So, to avoid these problems, here's how to seek and destroy mould and mildew.



How to banish mould: The key to preventing mould is reducing moisture, and the easiest solution is prevention. The first job is to have a maintenance check and fix any leaky pipes, dripping taps, roof leaks or foundation cracks. You also need to mop up any water immediately after a spill. If you have had common mould occurrences, check the walls behind the sofa or the bed to make sure no longstanding mould has settled in.

Air-conditioners and heating ducts can also harbour mould. If any moisture appears near a vent, or if there is a mouldy smell, hire a specialist. And during the warm, dry sunny days give your house a good airing.

In the bathroom, there are some quick daily duties to combat mildew build-up. Make sure all surfaces are free of dirt, grease and body oil, and spread towels so they can dry completely. A heated towel rail can solve the problem of damp towels too.

Keep in mind that the biggest mistake is just wiping mould away. Spotting mould is an early warning sign of a moisture problem inside the walls or ceilings. Finding and stopping the water source is the only way to prevent future problems or if you are not over confident, bring in a mould specialist.

If you have found mould on your clothes, throw them in the washing machine and add white vinegar to the rinse cycle. Vinegar also works well if you have any mildew on a hard, non-porous surface, such as porcelain or ceramic tiles.

To clean stained tiles or grout in the bathroom, use a mixture of half cup hydrogen peroxide to one cup water. Simply spray it onto a surface, allow to dry, them wipe with a damp cloth.

If the bathroom or kitchen wall is sound but the mould stains still won't go away, it's time for the big guns - re-grouting. It involves scraping out all the caulk and stained grout, then applying an antimicrobial treatment before re-grouting. But be prepared - this is definitely a job for a professional.

3: How about making a can koozie? Cans of drink can get too cold to hold sometimes. A novelty idea for odd socks is to use them over a can so your hand doesn't get cold. Simply cut off the foot area.

5: Icepacks are great but they can be quite cold against your skin. Use an odd sock to cover an icepack, simply cut off the foot and slip the icepack in.

6: If you need a hot pack for a sore spot, again odd socks will do the trick. Put rice in your sock, transfer it easily into the stretchy sock, don't fill it too full because it's nice to be able to mould it to the place you need to put it. Sew the end closed if you want to keep it as a permanent heat pack. Just microwave for about 30 seconds to get it nice and warm. Always check that it is not too hot before putting onto skin.

7: You can keep your washing soft without having to use dryer sheets or fabric softener by placing a ball into a sock. You can tie off the sock or sew it up and place in the dryer. It will also stop your clothes from getting tangled up.

8: Socks are the perfect leg and arm warmers. All you need to do is cut off the foot of the sock and you are set. If you have knee high socks, use them. If you want socks as arm warmers simply cut a hole for your thumb at the end of the sock.



9: Shoe freshener: Just fill a sock's foot area with baking soda and tie off or sew it closed. This will freshen up shoes when you aren't wearing them.

10: Skipping rope: This is really easy, but you will need quite a few socks depending on how long you want it. Tie them together with string or sew together for a rope for the kids.

11: Socks are a great way to store bits and pieces for the kids board games. You should be able to store dices, discs etc. in them so that they are not lost.

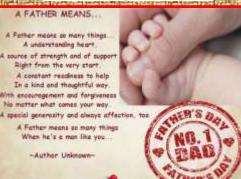
